A reverse image search engine

You submit an image to find out where it came from, if modified versions exist or to find higher resolution versions. It uses image identification technology, rather than keywords. It does NOT do facial recognition in that it cannot find different images with the same people or things in them.

Google has an image search page - interesting – can look for similar images
