Margaret is an excellent genealogist and in 1954 published the DELAWARE-WEST book which is primarily English genealogy. She is working on another book which will be published in the near future about her American ancestry. She has always had a consuming desire to know her immigrant ancestors better, so her new book will contain the genealogy of some thirty or forty early immigrants to America.

Our sincere thanks to Mrs. John J. Valentine for inviting the study group into her lovely home at 3551 Central Avenue for the September 20, 1965 meeting. Mrs. Valentine is a valuable member of the Fort Assumption Chapter of the NSDAR, as well as the Memphis Genealogical Society. Mr. Valentine is our auditor and legal advisor.

BOOK REVIEWS BY JONATHAN K. SMITH

A History of Mt. Pleasant, by Nat W. Jones (1820-1911), a reprint by the Maury County, Tennessee, Historical Society (1965):

This reprint of a charming local history should be read by all who plan to publish on like subjects. A small book, its contents are largely reminiscent and give every evidence of authenticity. The writing style is as comprehensive as the text is thorough.

Maury County was one of the most fertile of Middle Tennessee lands, and many persons of prominence and wealth settled there, having bought up the Revolutionary War claims there. Can one ever forget the Polks? Others of lesser means also settled in Western Maury County. These folk are the substance of this narrative.

The intent of the author was history-reporting, and there is no genealogy as such in the volume, but it is a source for discoveries of genealogical nature, as Jones describes the early settlers, churches, communities, etc., from an intimate point of view - as a spectator. It is an especially worthwhile publication.

These Sacred Places, by Hazel R. Collins Ivison (1965):

The compiler has expended a tremendous amount of labor in the preparation of this cemetery anthology. Its format is neat, clear, and well balanced; a solid saddle-stitch binding ensures a lasting quality for its 263 packed pages.

Intended as a tribute to Mrs. Ivison's parents, this collection of cemetery accounts supply the names of persons and their vital statistics, derived from tombstones in numerous Alabama, Louisiana, Georgia, and Mississippi locations. There are many old tombstone records in this volume, and many people should find this interesting compilation an aid to them in their an-searching endeavors.

One is further grateful for Mrs. Ivison's optimistic title that evidently conveys her own thinking as regards necropoli. Too often we emphasize a morbid idea in relation to cemeteries, a shortcoming that adults should not nurture.

Roane County, Tennessee: Abstracts of Estate Book A (1801-1824), by Marilyn N. McCluen (1965):

This is another of the high-calibre abstract books that are fortunately being published now. Certainly this is a soundly researched compilation, arranged with a researcher's convenience in mind. An adequate index is one of the nicer qualities of this book.

Roane County was one of the earliest counties of Tennessee from the standpoint of settlement and establishment. Thousands of people lived for a while in this county before moving further westward. Genealogists with ancestors in this East Tennessee area should find this a most helpful item, as a wealth of information is packed into its pages concerning estate inventories, wills, land grants, etc.

Gone To Georgia, by Wm. C. Stewart, National Genealogical Society (1965):

This fine 319 page (indexed) genealogical volume, with an inviting and appropriate title, is a literal gold-mine for those persons with ancestors in Jackson and Gwinett counties, Georgia, from 1796 to 1827.

The compiler has gone to great effort to give biographical sketches of persons resident in those counties during the early 19th Century. He has brought many Virginia, Carolina, Georgia and Alabama records into account. The content is well arranged and data well referenced.

LAWYERS IN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, WITH PLACES OF RESIDENCE IN 1834

A rare book of Tennesseana, a copy of which we own, is THE TENNESSEE GAZETTEER, or Topographical Dictionary; containing a description of the several counties, towns, villages, post offices, rivers, creeks, mountains, valleys, etc. in the State of Tennessee, alphabetically arranged, to which is prefixed a general description of the State: its civil divisions, resources, population, etc. and a condensed history from the earliest settlements down to the rise of the convention in the year 1834. With an appendix, containing a list of the practicing Attorneys at Law in each county; of the general and state governments, times of holding courts, and other valuable tables. By Eastin Morris, Nashville; published by W. Hasell Hunt & Co., Danner & Whig Office, 1834. (Among "Other Valuable Tables" is the Stage and Steamboat routes of Tennessee.) PETITION TO THE LEGISLATURE, SEPTEMBER 15, 1819

(Contributed by Mrs. James O. Maddux, P.O. Box 71, Spring City, Tennessee 37381)

To the honerable Legislatire now setting at Murphreys Borough your constuents and humble petitioners feeling themselves in critical circumstances and after encountering the different ties of selling the Chickesaw purchase west of the Tennessee River and on the waters of the same and the Mississippi are very desirous that the honerable would remember that our pushing out into this wilderness has been attended with much hardships and fatigue and we so think that it will and must be an advantage to the state to have the way broke for the country to populate and we as a small handful having takin on us to go and mark out and open roded which will be benifical to all that may wish to explore the country or move to it and under the difficulty of carrying our provisions at the distance from the Tennessee River to 75 miles to Raise corn for our benifit and those that may come after us we think fore these and many others reasons this honorable body nor no body else ought to think hard in giving us this privelege of saving a small tract of land where we have made our improvements so as not to let the rich who has so many warrints in their hands turn us off as our warrants that we hold in our possession at this time has to satisfied as well as theirs and we have been of this much benifit to them We hope that they will say that one good turn deserves another and let the Legislature grant them there request as there is but few of us and our labours so benifical to all and in so doing your honerable petitioners will ever pray and feel gratitude and at all times be willing to acknowledge their obligations.

TENNESSEANS IN CENTRAL TEXAS

(Extracted by Mrs. L. B. Gardiner and Mrs. J. A. Murphy from

Counties, Texas" published by The Lewis Publishing Co., Chicago, Ill., 1893.)

(Continued from Third Quarter 1965)

SOLOMON R. JONES, McLennan Co., was born in Dallas Co., Mo., Nov. 12, 1849, third of 11 children of Bills Jones and Daltha Randall. The father, native of Tenn., moved with parents to Mo. early, settling in Dallas Co. The mother, also native of Tenn., moved to Dallas Co. with her parents early, where her parents died. She died in Jan. 1874. Bills and Daltha had 11 children but only 7 survive. Solomon Jones came to Texas in 1875 and located within 2 miles of his present home at Ross. At age 19 he married Eliza C. Herd, dau. of George W. Herd and Sarah M. Drumheller. Mr. Herd, native of N.C., moved to Ill. early, later to Dallas Co., Mo., where they still reside. Mr. and Mrs. Jones had 11 children and 9 survive: Theodosia, Sarah D., Lem. J., Nancy V., George, Anna, Garshal B., Jessie, and Lelah E. Theodosia md. H. C. Jameson and has: Guy, Ora and Ula. Sarah md. D. L. Smith and has: Ray and Floyd. (p 578-9)

A. J. HOOSER of Ruth, Coryell Co., Texas, was born in Perry Co., Tenn., in 1846. His father, Alexander Hooser, was born in N.C., moved to Tenn. early, and died there when A. J. was an infant. At age 30 Alexander md. Julia Margaret, dau. of Allen Gates of Tenn. They had 4 children: Mary, wife of W. J. Day of Brown Co.; A. J., our subject; and two who died young. After her husband's death, Mrs. Hooser md. A. Wyart, of Tenn. They had: Parlee and Aslee, both decd., James and Sallie. The family came to Harrison Co., Texas in 1851, moved 2 yr. later to Upshur Co., moved in 1857 to Coryell Co., fled from Indians to McLennan Co. for 2 yr., then came back to Coryell Co. and located near The Grove. A. J. traveled for years then married in 1872 and settled down at present location. He married Missouri Hawkins, dau. of Pinkney Hawkins of Ark., who came to Bell Co. in 1867. She was the sixth of ten children. Mr. and Mrs. Hooser have: Laura, Luther, Edison, Mary, Harvey, Nora and Ora. (p 579-80)

DR. F. W. BURGER, Waco, was born in Tenn. in 1849, tenth of 12 children of Abraham Burger and Jane Gunter of Va. and Tenn. respectively. The father died at Murfreesboro in 1865 and the mother in 1886 in Texas. Dr. Burger lived at Wartrace, Tenn., and came to Texas in June 1875. After graduation from La. State Medical School, he located at Comanche Springs (now McGregor), then in 1887 moved to Waco. In 1876 he married Ada V. Smith, born in Miss. They have: Eddie L. (Dau.), F. Worth, Jr.; Rupert A.; Berta A.; Calvert; and Etherton (last two died in infancy). (p 583-4)

NEWTON B. MAXEY, Falls Co., was born in Ky. in 1832, son of William Maxey and Nancy Degraffenreid, both natives of Tenn. William married about 1817, moved to Ky., later to Mo., where he died in 1859. He had eight children: William, died in Mo. in 1856; John, decd.; Martha, decd., wife of Isaiah Hamilton; James, decd. in 1859; Vinson, decd.; Mary, wife of Peter Johnson of Mo.; Elvington, decd.; and Newton B., our subject. Newton B. came to Texas in 1854, locating first at Chilton, in 1856 moved one mile east, then came to present home in 1865. In 1852 Newton married Susan Wethers, native of Ind. and dau. of John Wethers and Elizabeth Sulenger, natives of Ky. They have: William C., Falls Co.; Amanda, wife of Benjamin Lockard; Stephen, Falls Co.; Dicy Jane, wife of David Hyden; J. D. Maxey; Martha, wife of N. J. Shields of Pan Handle; Albert G., Falls Co.; and two who died in infancy. (p 584-5)

MRS. CATHERINE McLENNAN DAVIS, China Springs, McLennan Co., was born in Fla. May 14, 1822, dau. of Neil McLennan, first settler of the county (see sketch in this work). In 1834 her father came to Texas, settling on Pond Creek, Milam Co. In 1843 she married Le Roy Davis, who was born in Tenn. July 4, 1809, and died Sept. 8, 1867, age 58 yr. He came to Texas in 1835. His previous wife and one child died not long afterwards. In 1842 (sic) he married Catherine McLennan. He and his father-in-law,

Mr. McLennan, came to the present location, where Mr. Davis died Sept. 8, 1867. He had a brother who lived and died in Washington Co. and also another who died in the Mexican War. Mr. and Mrs. Davis had 11 children: John, b. Feb. 17, 1844; William, b. Mar. 3, 1846; Richard, b. Dec. 10, 1847; Robert, b. Apr. 28, 1849; Thomas J., b. Nov. 15, 1850; James M., b. Jan. 30, 1853; Christian, b. July 24, 1855; Sarah, b. Oct. 28, 1857; LeRoy, b. Oct. 7, 1859; Jefferson, b. May 28, 1861; and Charles, b. Apr. 12, 1866. Christian d. Aug. 7, 1855; John H. was killed in Miss. Dec. 25, 1863, leaving 9 children; Richard went to Alaska in 1885 and nothing has been heard from him since. (p 585-6)

CYRUS EASTLAND, Bell Co., was born in S. C. in 1815, son of Ezekiah Eastland and Elizabeth Davis, natives of S. C. The Eastland family came from England to America prior to Revolution. Grandfather Eastland fought in the Revolution when Ezekiah was a small boy. The Davis family came from Ireland to America in colonial times. Ezekiah and Elizabeth reared six children: Permelia, wife of George W. Morton, died in 1890 age 90; David, decd.; Alford, decd.; Elizabeth, wife of Thomas A. Battles, died in 1890, age 82 yr.; Nancy, decd., wife of D. D. Roseboro, Bell Co.; and Cyrus, our subject. Mrs. Eastland died in 1845 in her 68th year and Mr. Eastland in 1846, aged 70. Cyrus lived in Ala. and Tenn. He left Tenn. in 1852 and came to Texas, locating on Cedar Creek in northern Bell Co. He married in 1846 Mary Trentham, of Tenn., dau. of John Trentham and Elizabeth Cunningham, natives of N. C. They have: James P., W. A., and Lee D. (p 586)

DR. J. S. POYNOR, Bartlett, Texas, was born in Tenn. in 1833, third of five children of John Poynor and Charlotte T. Stevens, of Va. and Tenn., respectively. The Poyyors came from England in colonial times; the paternal grandfather settled in Williamson Co., Tenn. in 1822; the maternal grandfather, John Stevens, was born in Tenn. and lived in Williamson Co. John Poynor died in Tenn. in 1851, but his widow lives in Dallas. Dr. Poynor lived at Franklin College, Tenn.; then practiced medicine in Tenn. until 1874, when he moved to Tarrant Co., Texas for 3 yr.; then moved to Thorp's Springs, Hood Co., for 7 yr.; then to Davilla, Texas, where his family still lives. In 1890 he began practice at Bartlett. Dr. Poynor married first in 1860 Eudora Butler, of Tenn. She died in Texas in 1877, leaving six children, four of whom survive. He married second in 1880 Virginia Felton, native of Ark., and they had six children, all living. (p 588)

F. M. GARDNER, Gatesville, was born in Weakley Co., Tenn., in 1840, son of Jesse Gardner and Priscilla Gunn, natives of Tenn. The paternal grandfather, John Gardner, was native of Va. and early pioneer of Robinson Co., Tenn. The maternal grandfather, Rev. Thomas Gunn, was native of N. C. who settled early in Tenn., dying there aged 99 yr. The town of Gardner, Tenn., was named for Col. John A. Gardner, uncle of our subject. In 1828 he moved to West Tenn. Mr. Gardner was born in Robinson Co., Tenn. in 1809, died there aged 83 yr. Jesse Gardner died in Tenn. in 1878 and his wife in 1870. F. M. Gardner lived in West Tenn., lived at Gardner, Tenn., until 1882, then came to Texas. He married in 1866 Lusetta, dau. of B. J. Miller of Obion Co., Tenn. They have: Maud, wife of W. S. Gillispie of Waco; Julia; Lillith Alleen; Marion; Leslie; and Ruth. (p 588-9)

HON. ANDREW C. GRAVES, Coryell Co., was born in Wilson Co., Tenn., in 1831, youngest of ten children of Lewis Graves and Rebecca Starnes, natives of S. C. The parents married in S. C., moved in 1818 to Wilson Co., Tenn., then in 1851 to Ill. where the father died in 1857 and the mother in March 1858. The Graves family are Welch. The paternal grandfather, Lewis Graves, emigrated from Va. to S. C. The Starnes family are Irish, and the maternal grandfather, Aaron Starnes, was a native of S. C. Andre C. grew up in Wilson Co., Tenn., then came to Texas in 1855, settling in Hill Co. He became a minister in 1866 and began service at Mt. Antioch, Hill Co.; then came to Coryell Co. in 1869 at Osage, then Coryell Church, Rainey's Creek Church, Beulah Church, and Sardis Church. He came to Gatesville in 1885, where he still lives. In 1852 he married Eveline Bennett, native of Wilson Co., Tenn., and they have: John B., of Limestone Co.; Christopher L., Coryell Co.; Cicero H., of Crawford; Sterling

Price, of Coryell Co.; William S. in army at Fort Logan; Edwin, of Gatesville; Daniel E., at Baylor Univ.; Josie, at Baylor; Andrew; and two sons who died as infants. (p 589-90)

ROBERT NEAL, of Bell Co., b. near McMinnville, Tenn., 4 April 1842. His father died when he was 5 and his mother brought him to Texas where she died about 1875. His grandfather, William Neal, lived in Tenn. His mother, nee Hannah Dennis, also had John and Elizabeth who m. Tom Wright of Temple, Texas. A confederate soldier he mar. 1866 Miss Margaret J. Dennis, b. Feb. 24, 1845, (dau. of Joe Dennis, who moved to Texas early from Warren Co., Tenn.) Their children are: Ellie b. 11 Mar. 1868; William, 22 Nov. 1869; Joseph, 23 Apr. 1872; Maggie, 25 May 1874; Robert, 21 Dec. 1881 and Isa E., 8 Nov. 1883. (p 590)

EDWARD ROTAN, b. White Co., Tenn., 9 Apr. 1844. After service in Confederate Army moved to Texas in 1866, McLennan Co. (p 592)

SION B. TRICE, a native of Wilson Co., Tenn., b. Nov. 5, 1836, son of Edward Trice, Tennessean. Sion and brother W. B. moved to Texas before Civil War, served in Confederate army. 25 Sept. 1867 m. Mollie Kennedy, and had Beulah, m. T. H. Brown; Hattie; Sion; Willie and Mary. He d. 2 Aug. 1879. (p 592)

COL. WILLIAM LAMBDIN PRATHER, of McLennan Co., b. near Paris, Henry Co., Tenn. 1 May 1848, eldest child of George W. and Lucretia P. (Lambdin). George W. b. near Knoxville, son of Benjamin of Va., near Lynchburg, who died in Tenn. 1852. George W. d. Waco 18 April 1874. His wife was a native of Ohio, moving to Wheeling, W. Va. with her parents when young. Lucretia's father was a minister and moved to Tenn., near Paris where she and George m. in 1845. Had Col. William, James C. and George McD. Col. Wm. moved with parents to Texas when 5 yrs. old. He m. 3 Feb. 1875 in Lexington, Va., Fannie, dau. of Rev. John L. and Mary (Turner) Kirkpatrick. They had: John K.; Mary Lu; William L., Jr.; Fanny and Grace. (p 593)

DR. WILLIAM A. HOWARD, of Waco, b. 2 Sept. 1854, Giles Co., Tenn., 12th child, 7th son of 13 children of Nehemiah and Rowena (Hammonds) Howard, natives of South and North Carolina resp. His grd. Stephen Howard of S. C., was from England. His mother from Irish stock. Dr. Howard m. 3 Nov. 1891 Fannie Thomson, dau. of Dr. E. L. Thomson of Dallas. (p 597)

DR. GEORGE H. RANDLE, of Waco, was b. 14 Dec. 1836 in Stewart Co., Tenn., son of John and Jane (Boyd) Randle, of N. C., where John was b. 1807 and he died in Tenn. 1848. Of their union 8 children were born including James R., William P., John T. and Dr. George H., our subject who moved to Western Ky., and Southern Ark. on Red River, and 1865 moved to McLennan Co. Pages 55 through 65: Henry Smith VS Pumeroy Carmichael and others. William S. Howell was Smith's security in filing his bill. In the bond, Henry Smith and William S. Howell are held and firmly bound unto Pumeroy Carmichael, David Carmichael, Hannah Carmichael widow, John and Robert Carmichael, Andrew Youst and Rachel his wife, Isabella, Pumeroy, David, James, Hannah and Ann Carmichael...sum of \$500. Dated 15 May 1820.

Your Orator...Henry Smith...of County of Knox and State of Tennessee...18 May 1789 a grant was issued from the State of North Carolina to a certain John McIntire for 640 acres of land in the county of Green, State of North Carolina, now in the County of Knox...Tenn...said John McIntire paid 50 shillings for each hundred acres...land in the grassy Valley lying on the head waters of Second creek...(description)...before 31 May 1816 a certain George Carmichael then of said county of Knox...(bought 169 acres of the tract)...was surveyed and set off to the said George Carmichael, 18 Sept. 1805, on Second Creek...(description mentions Tillery's line, McNutt's line).. George Carmichael between 1805 and said 31 May 1816 removed from said tract...settled in that part of the Country which is now included in the State of Alabama...while in that Country and before he left the county of Knox said George Carmichael had directed & requested his brother Pumeroy Carmichael who then resided in the county of Knox and still is residing near said tract...to sell & dispose of said tract...(two letters from George Carmichael to be exhibited)...Orator purchased the said tract of land...paid Pumeroy for the said George 31 May 1816...(\$400. and a note for \$500.)...has paid said note...(Pumeroy bound himself to make Smith a deed)...said George Carmichael did receive the \$400. 31 May 1816...that afterwards the said George Carmichael departed this life leaving his wife Hannah his widow & relict & John Carmichael his son of full age, Daniel Carmichael, Robert Carmichael, Rebeckah Carmichael, Isabella Carmichael, Pumeroy Carmichael, David Carmichael, James Carmichael, Hannah Carmichael, Ann Carmichael, and Rachel Carmichael who intermarried with Andrew Youst of sd County of Knox & still live together as man & wife, who are heirs at law of the said George Carmichael and all infants & minors under age of 21 except the said John & Rachel & that his agent Pumeroy Carmichael before named resides in County of Knox, that after the death of said George Carmichael he administered on his estate that before his death your Orator paid the sum of \$500. to said Pumeroy Carmichael his agent..... (Pumeroy is willing to make the deed but not having authority by power of atty. has doubts about making the deed, etc.)...(Henry Smith asks for a decree from the court that a title be made for him.)

Dear brother & sister

.....hoping that these few lines will find you & family all well...our new settled Country has officers appointed for to regulate Our Country in Civility, we have give in and paid tax, we have justices of Peace appointed and also Militia officers for to have Our men organised as well as all other parts. Our Country will be the greatest place of trade that we have ever had yet for they have commenced trade from the black Warrior to the Mobile already. Already we can get articles at a very reasonable price such as allum salt measured by the bushel at the falls 4 Dollars per bushel... they have went from the falls to the Mobile point & back to the falls in twenty days with a pero(?) with but three hands in it. I have not had any word from you since I left there. I desire you to write by the first opportunity to me concerning my place there...(asks if he has sold it or rented)...direct your letter to Huntsville by the first mail to brother Daniel Carmichael & he can send it to me at any time...remember

me to my friends & old neighbors & acquaintances remains your brother & sister to the last
from George & Hannah Carmichael

To Pumeroy & Nancy Carmichael

N B I will also state to you that tobacco is twenty dollars per hundred & cotton twenty five. Tobacco cotton skins fur home spun or any trade is better at Mobile point than the cash G. C.

Exhibit B - Letter

Dear brother

10 June 1816

I gladly embrace this opportunity of writing these few lines...(states they are all well and hoping this may find "you and yours the same.")....I want you to write to brother Daniel...what you have done with my land...whether to come up this fall or not, nothing more at present but remain your loving brother till death
(s) George Carmichael

(Pumeroy Carmichael made the answer for the heirs of George Carmichael. Their answer is to let the court decide saying that the minor children had no knowledge of the business deal of their father, being young at the time. Pumeroy goes on to explain who the heirs are.)

Pumeroy Carmichael as guardian of the minor heirs answers that Daniel Carmichael mentioned in the bill of complaint as one of the minor & lawful heirs of George Carmichael is no heir but a brother of the deceased and administrator on the estate... in Alabama. Robert a minor heir of said George has deceased since the filing of the bill in this suit, there is no Rebecca in the family, and Isabella has since inter-married with a certain John Meredith.....

(s) Pumaroy Carmichael

28 Sept. 1822 Pumeroy Carmichael guardian appeared before Hu Brown and made oath that the facts stated...are true.....

PP 62 & 63 (A restating of the case.)

Henry Smith VS Pumeroy Carmichael, Hannah Carmichael, John Carmichael, David Carmichael, John Meredith & Isabell his wife, Andrew Yoast & Rachel his wife, David, James, Hannah, Ann, and Robert Carmichael heirs and Representatives of George Carmichael deceased.

This cause being heard this 8 June 1825 before the Honorable Jacob Peck Chancellor &c....(Court reviews the case)...Complainant been in possession of lands since purchase....answer of David, James, Hannah and Ann by their guardian Pumeroy CarmichaelFrancis Yoast proves that George Carmichael removed in year 1815 that he heard said George state that he had authorized his brother Pumeroy to sell his lands...in the year 1816 he heard George say that he had received a letter from his brother Pumeroy informing him that he had sold his lands to Mr. Henry Smith he expressed his approbation as to the trade and said he would make Smith a title for said lands but died before the time he had appointed to come and make the title, that he lived in the house with said Carmichael at the time he received the letter.....

CHAPTER NO. 316
House Bill No. 606

(By Norvell, Pride, Mrs. Anderson, Cook, Galbreath,
Allen, Bradley, Wiseman, Mrs. Strong)

AN ACT to amend Title 15, Chapter 5, Sections 15-501 and
15-504 Tennessee Code Annotated.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee, That Section 15-501 of the Tennessee Code Annotated be and the same is hereby amended by striking the language of said Section in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"15-501. - County Public Records Commission created-membership. - The County Court of each county is authorized to create within the county a County Public Records commission, which when created shall consist of a member of the County Court designated by a majority vote of the County Court, a member of the Board of County Commissioners of the County, if there be a Board of County Commissioners in the County, a judge of one of the Courts of Records which holds Court in the County, the County Register of the County; the County Historian, if there be such in the county, and a recognized Genealogist, residing within the county, if there be such in the county, who is not on a public payroll. The judge of the Court of Records shall be selected and designated by a majority vote of all the judges of Courts of Record holding court in the county and his designation as such member shall be entered upon the minutes of each Court of Record in the county. If there be a Board of County Commissioners within the county, the county Commissioner to serve upon the Commission hereby created shall be designated by a majority vote of the Board of County Commissioners. The Genealogist to be appointed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners. All the members of the said County Records Commission shall hold office during the terms for which they have been elected to the office by virtue of which the several members became members of the said County Records Commission or until they are removed from such office by death, resignation, or otherwise, and shall be replaced upon the termination of their said terms or removal in the same manner in which the first members of said Commission were selected. If the judges of the Courts of Record which held court in such counties should fail for any reason within sixty days (60) from the establishment of such County Records Commission to designate a member of the Judiciary as a member of the said County Records Commission or should, when the position of the Judiciary member of the County Records Commission become vacant, fail to designate a successor within sixty days (60) then the county court shall select a member of the judiciary holding court within the county to fill such vacancy. Likewise, if no member of the County Records Commission as designated by the Board of County Commissioners within sixty days (60) from the creation of the County Records Commission or than sixty days (60) after the death, resignation or other removal of the member previously designated by the Board of County Commissioners, as the case may be, then the county court shall select the member of the Board of Commissioners to fill the vacancy."

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That Section 15-504, Tennessee Code Annotated, be and the same is hereby amended by adding the following as a second paragraph to the aforesaid Code Section:

"The Tennessee Archivist shall be required to compile and have printed from State funds, a Tennessee County of Records Manual, to be used as a guide by all County Records Commissions within the State of Tennessee, setting out which records shall or may be destroyed, and those which shall not be destroyed, after photographing, photostating, filming, microfilming, or other microphotographic process, and that until such manual is available the respective County Records Commission shall use in lieu thereof, the North Carolina County Records Manual 1962, by H. G. Jones, North Carolina, State Archivist. The County Records Commission shall have the right to

authorize the lamination of certain original records such as wills, will books, deeds, deed books, marriage licenses, marriage bonds, marriage Registers, and other records which are to be permanently preserved."

Section 3. Be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

FROM THE OBSERVER, FAYETTEVILLE, LINCOLN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, SEPTEMBER 9, 1875

(Contributed by Mrs. John R. Barnett, 106 McTighe Drive, Bellaire, Texas 77401)

Colonel William B. Robinson has an old family bible printed at Cambridge University Printing House 1643. His ancestors were Scotch Presbyterians during their persecution by John Graham, the son of William Graham, the Earl of Claverhouse, and an officer of King James II. Colonel Robertson's ancestors came from Scotland to Antrim County, Ireland. Joseph Robinson (the Colonel's grandfather) emigrated from Ireland and came to Pennsylvania to settle near Lancaster, where he and all his children died, except one son. His widow afterward married a brother of General Montgomery, of Revolutionary fame. This son of Joseph Robertson, William, came from Pennsylvania to Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, in 1750, and afterward moved near Guilford Courthouse and was living there when that battle was fought. From Guilford he came to the Watauga settlement in E. Tenn. in 1781, and in 1806 he came to Jackson County, Tenn., and settled on the Caney Fork. In 1807, the Robinson family came to what was then Bedford, but now Lincoln County, and settled on Cold Water Creek where Colonel William B. Robinson was reared and lived until a few years back. Colonel Robinson also has a Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechism that was published 1743 by Benjamin Franklin at Philadelphia.

On this 12th day of May AD 1855 personally appeared .. Benjamin Coward aged 43 years a Resident of Roane County in the State of Tennessee who ... declares that he .. was a soldier in the Company Commanded by Captain John Chiles in the Regiment of Tennessee Volunteers Commanded by Richard G. Dunlap in the service of the United States in the Removal of the Cherokee Indians that he volunteered in Anderson County Tennessee on or about the first day of June 1836 for the term of Twelve Months and continued in actual servis of the United States for the term of fourteen days and was honorably discharged in Anderson County Tennessee on or about the 6th day of August 1836.....

William N. McKamy stated that he volunteered and entered the service at the same time and belonged to the same company during the term of service.
