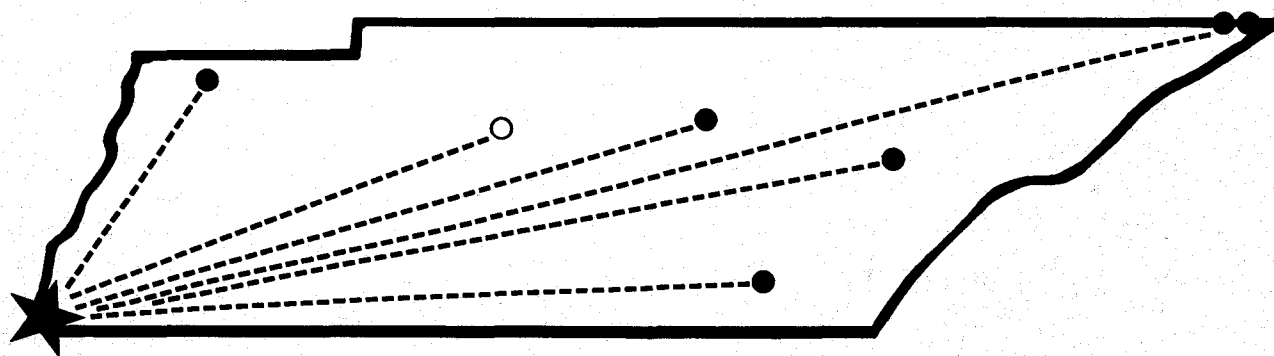

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OVER THE EDITOR'S DESK

The summer has been very dry and hot in Tennessee, nevertheless there is a breath of fresh air and new hope in the Tennessee genealogical world. A new source for the 1890 census gap has been announced by The Guild Bindery Press of Paris, Tennessee!

On January 21, 1921 fire destroyed the 1890 census records which were housed in the Commerce Department building in St. Louis. Less than 1% of all schedules are extant; no records relating to Tennessee survived. However, the Tennessee General Assembly had authorized a legislative reapportionment survey to be made at the same time, but independent of the census. Thus we have the Enumeration of Male Inhabitants of Twenty-one Years of Age and Upwards, Citizens of Tennessee, January 1, 1891.

Although this is not a federal government record, and it does not have the complete family data, it is considered to be reliable primary source material. The entire report is being transcribed and indexed by Sue Reed of Houston, Texas, and the data from it will be arranged by counties for publication. The division of the counties into books will be similar to the Goodspeed History series.

60-2-1812 Petition of citizens of Rutherford County to show that a majority of the citizens are pleased with the place the commissioners have chosen for the county seat. "We will also endeavor to get our patitioners in our own county _____ & Prohibit all school children from signing there names." Duplication of names may, or may not, indicate two persons of the same name signed the petition; sometimes four or five names seem to be in the same handwriting. When a surname is repeated in sequence, it usually appears to be by the same hand. 27 Sep 1812 (38 pages)

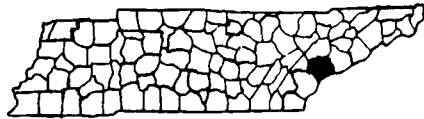

Court ordered sale of as much of the land as necessary to satisfy the debt of \$3 with interest from 4 Feb 1834. Samuel LEE, constable.

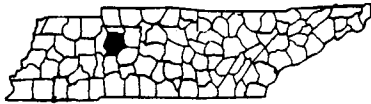

The obituary of David HASTINGS in the Memphis Evening Scimitar 12 Dec 1903 states that he was born 1828 in Dumfries, Scotland and came to Memphis, TN in 1866. He left a widow, Margaret (who died 23 Feb 1908 age 75) and one daughter, Mrs. William H. LANDIS of Wartrace, TN. He was a member of Cumberland Presbyterian Church. David left Scotland at age 20 and settled in Nova Scotia where he married. In 1868 he leased the Central Hotel on Adams between Second and Third streets for 5 years; then leased the Commercial Hotel on Jefferson St.; and six years later leased the Worsham House at Main and Adams streets. Robert Hastings of Holly Springs, MS is his brother.

The 10 Jul 1906 Holly Springs MS South gives the obituary of Robert Hastings, born 14 Feb 1824 at Thornhill, Dumfriesshire, Scotland and died 10 Jul 1906 at Holly Springs, MS. He left Scotland at age 18 and landed in New Orleans, LA. While on the way to the Northwestern States sickness overtook the family so they stopped in Memphis where they settled but eventually went to Mississippi, first at Wyatt then Holly Springs in 1855. In the Civil War he enlisted as purchasing agent of supplies for the Army with Capt. William CLARK of the Commissary Department. In 1863 he was transferred to Maj. MELLIN's command. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church. Robert's wife, Hannah WESTGARTH, born 23 Feb 1812 Gamelsby, Cumberland Co, England died 14 Sep 1878 Holly Springs, MS. They were married in England.

Mr. Lambert reports that the Bible was found in an old smoke house of an Aunt in Memphis, TN. It was published and sold by Daniel D. Smith, New York, 1820.

Amen, I, Lucy PETERS, of the County of Henry and State of Tennessee, being aged and of infirm body but of sound mind and memory..." The will, dated 29 Nov 1832, mentions her deceased husband, James P. Peters. She makes the following bequests: To my granddaughter, Lucy P. MORGAN, daughter of Susan McKISSACK, "my only daughter now living", her legacy "to be paid over as soon as may be after my death." To Susan H. ARTHUR, Thomas, George B., Lucy P. and James Peters, "children of my son James P. Peters", who is to act as trustee of the estate and property devised to them. After the specific bequests she wills the remaining real and personal property to also be held in trust by him for "the use and benefit of such of his children as I have not heretofore mentioned." Her son, James P. Peters, is executor. William ALEXANDER and Silas TRAVIS witnessed her signature.

In 1834 there was a Codicil which states that since the will Lucy has sold negro, Frank, and purchased others from William A. THARPE and James P. Peters. She bequeaths these to Maria Peters and Paulina S. Peters, infant children of James P. Peters. This was witnessed by Step FRAZUR and Silas Travis. The will and codicil were exhibited in open Court in the June term 1835 and the witnesses attested to Lucy Peters signature. She is deceased by June 1835. Terence COONEY and Benjamin C. BROWN attested to the handwriting of Stephen Frazur and other subscribing witnesses.

The Certified Copy was made 6 Jan 1843 by the County Court Clerk, William Porter. His signature was attested to by Samuel C. LOVE, Chairman of the County Court of Henry County Tennessee.

Bedford Co TN Deed Books microfilm was being read by Mrs. West when she found Bible Entries by Edward WADE who seems to have been County Court Clerk. The records were in two books: 1810-1812, p. 28, Tennessee State History and Archives Microfilm Roll #113; and 1819-1820?, p. 493, Roll #115. Mrs. West is not related to the Wade family and had no further information.

THE TUNNELL-HARLE TENNESSEE-TEXAS CONNECTION - Contributed by James B. Harle, M.D.,
P.O. Box 762, Bellville, TX 77418

Little did Robert and Elizabeth TUNNELL know when they started their family in Knox and Hamilton Counties in Tennessee that five of their daughters would eventually marry and move to Rusk County Texas. Robert Tunnell was the sixth child of William Tunnell and Mary MAYSEY. He was an Indian agent and fought in the War of 1812. Robert's father, William, was the son of William Tunnell and Lady Ann HOWARD.

Much of the following information is from Lady Ann Tunnell's family Bible and its owner, Mrs. George (Lucy) BALL who corresponded with my mother for a number of years. The other information comes from books, census records and the Rusk County Court House.

The Robert Tunnell children were as follows: James, Noble and William (who died without issue); Susan Tunnell married a Richard JOHNSON and lived her life in Tennessee; the remaining five girls all moved to Texas and lived and died in and around Rusk Co TX.

1. Matilda Tunnell was apparently the first to come to Texas. She married William REAGAN, the first tax collector in Rusk County. There is a William Reagan Survey in southern Rusk County south of the Jose Maria RODRIGUEZ Survey between Sulphur Springs and Glenn Fawn which I assume was granted to him. Their daughter Caroline Matilda was born 26 Dec 1836 in the Old Stone Fort at Nacogdoches, Texas; Dr. Noble Reagan was born 22 Mar 1839 in Rusk County.

2. Eliza Tunnell married Benjamin Bartlett CANNON 3 Apr 1828. They had eight children. The last child, George Douglas Riley Cannon, was born 4 Mar 1846 and died aboard a boat between the Muscle Shoals and Florence, Alabama on 4 Apr 1847 while Eliza and Benjamin were moving to Texas. Eliza died shortly after her arrival in Rusk Co TX at the home of her sister Matilda on 9 Jun 1847. Benjamin Cannon died in St. Augustine, TX on 8 Sep 1859 while organizing a Masonic Lodge. He was a member of the Texas Legislature during the fourth and fifth terms. He introduced a number of bills including a prominent one to establish a system of common schools 3 Jan 1853. He was known as "free school" Cannon.

I am going to postulate at this point that Emily Jane Tunnell, my great grandmother, came to Texas in 1847. Family history states that Robert and Elizabeth Johnson Tunnell were killed by Indians on the border of Arkansas and the Indian Nation in 1847, while returning to Tennessee from a visit to their daughters in Rusk Co TX. I suspect they made the visit as a result of their daughter's death and that Emily either came with them and remained to live with her sister Harriet Tunnell HARLE or she moved to Texas as a result of her parents death. In any event, she is listed in the 1850 Rusk County census as living with William Harle, M.D. and wife, Harriet.

3. Mary Louise Tunnell married William WOOLWINE, M.D. in Tennessee and they moved to Rusk County where he practiced medicine in Caledonia, TX which is in the southeastern corner of Rusk County. They had a daughter Harriet Matilda born in Caledonia 1 Apr 1844.

4. Harriet N. Tunnell married William Harle, M.D. It is said that they were in Texas in 1846. Emma Adeline Harle was born in Rusk County 23 Aug 1848. They apparently owned 500/600 acres in the Jose Maria MARTINEZ Survey. The homestead contained 422 acres. This was in south Rusk County between Glenn Fawn and Sulphur Springs. Harle family history lists him as a physician, M.D. Probate records in the Rusk County Court House show medical bills paid to his estate.

5. Emily Jane Mortimer Tunnell, my great grandmother, married James Wiley Harle 2 Feb 1855 in Rusk Co TX. As stated above, I believe she moved to Texas in 1847 and lived with her sister Harriet until she married. James W. Harle was living on the family plantation (1300 acres) near Morristown, Tennessee in 1850 with his brothers John Wesley and David Harle. J.W. had inherited about 465 acres of the place from his father Baldwin Harle II. I next found him in 1854 when he bought 369 acres of land in the Jose DURST Survey on the Angelina River. This is just east and near the Reagans and William Harles between Sulphur Springs and Mt. Pleasant. Emily died at age 40 in 1865. James W. died at age 55 in 1869. Two months before he died, he married Amelia (Millie) GOFNER. Grace McDAVID of Overton, TX, whose mother was Malinda (Lennie) Harle, states that Millie was J.W.'s housekeeper and that he married her because she "lived in" to take care of his four small children and it was considered improper under those circumstances not to marry. There was no issue between them. Grace also states that he farmed cotton and that each year he also hauled cotton to New Orleans with mule teams and wagons. On his return trips from New Orleans, he would bring back things to sell in Rusk County. Administration of his estate showed that he had some expensive mules, and one team and wagon sold for \$1,100.

6. Nancy Jane (Judson) Tunnell married Dr. James B. VAUGHT about 1850 in Rusk Co TX. They lived near Nacogdoches, TX which is about 50 miles south of Mt. Pleasant, TX. She died in Garrison, TX which is between Nacogdoches and Timpson, TX.

What is amazing to me is that five daughters of Robert and Elizabeth Tunnell moved from Knox Co TN to Rusk Co TX. Three of them married doctors and all of them, with their husbands, contributed significantly to the development of southern Rusk County Texas when it was a nation and when Texas joined the Union.

MEMPHIS/SHELBY COUNTY TENNESSEE ARCHIVES

This letter from a brother in Charlotte, N.C. to a brother in Memphis, TN does not give the name of the brother in Memphis but the only WOLF/WOLFE name in the 1850 and 1860 Shelby Co TN census who was born in North Carolina is Tobias Wolfe, born c1808.

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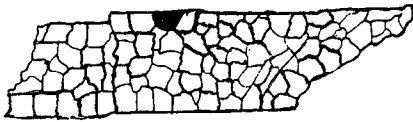
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NOTE ON APRIL 1862 MORTALITY by Patricia M. LaPointe

Memphis/Shelby County Public Library and Information Center

From 1859 when Dr. Robert Wood Mitchell was named Secretary of the Board of Health, the Memphis Daily Appeal regularly printed the monthly mortality statistics for the city. This report indicated the number of deaths for adults and children and also noted how many were citizens of Memphis and how many were transients. Civilian mortality in April 1862 was 49 (29 adults/20 children).

The dramatic increase in the April mortality was the result of deaths among soldiers sent to Memphis after the battle of Shiloh. The Avalanche of April 23, 1862 reported that many of these men were in a dying condition when they arrived at the military hospitals in the city.

CLAY COUNTY ARKANSAS MARRIAGES - EASTERN DISTRICT - 1893-1924 by *Una Pollard*. 1988. Soft back, 8½x11, 319 pp. Brides' Index. Order from the author, Rt. 2, Box 253, Piggott, AR 72454. \$22.50

Over 7500 marriages are listed in this compilation of the first twelve marriage books of Clay County, Arkansas. Clay County folk who were married in Greene County, Arkansas are included. Marriages are listed alphabetically by the groom's name giving the book and page numbers where it can be found; the age and residence of both bride and groom and the date of marriage are recorded. A Brides' Index will be an asset to researchers of this era. The author states that burned courthouse records prevent research in these counties prior to 1893.

WECFS II - ON THE WATERSHED OF ECLETO AND THE CLEAR FORK OF SANDIES II by *author/compiler, Karon Mac Smith*. 1988. Soft cover, 8½x11, 339 pp. Indexed. Order from author, Rt. 1, Box 190, Nixon, TX 78140. \$32.50

The first part of this book relates the histories and family stories of some pioneer families who came to Gonzales, Guadalupe, Karnes and Wilson counties Texas in the 1800s. It also contains numerous muster rolls, cemetery records, maps and pictures. The second part, or Appendix, contains statistical data from church and cemetery records, land grants, and marriage records. It also reprints newspaper articles, addresses and memorial speeches. Separate indexes for each division make the hundreds of family names easy to locate. Principal names are: Burris, Callison, Elkins, Littlefield, McCoy, Treadwell, West and Wiley.

GREENBRIER COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA COURT ORDERS 1780-1850 by *Helen S. Stinson*. 1988. Hard back, 6x9, 456 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 11521 Poppyglen Court, Moorpark, CA 93021. \$25.00

This book is transcribed from microfilm of the original orders, and is a "court of last resort" for finding clues to relationships in this county, as most court records prior to 1840 are missing. Buried in these records are death dates, names of children, widows, information about former residences, heirs at law, estate information when wills were missing, military service, naturalizations, lists of road crews, names of slaves and freedmen, certificates of manumission and a wealth of other historical information. The index contains over 30,000 references to more than 9,000 names. Ancestral connections in counties formed from Greenbrier's larger land mass may become apparent from the many clues given in this county's court orders.

THE HOUSE OF HOWSES by *Mary Ann Mitchell*. 1988. Hard back, 8½x11, 151 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. L. R. Mitchell, 70 Grassland Dr., Jackson, TN 38305. \$20.00

This well-documented history of the Howse Family is the result of a request from the Howse Family Association, which meets annually in Haywood Co. TN. The book begins with the story of Lawrence Howse I in 1727, and continues with his descendants up to the present time, including the related Hobbs, Stuart and Hazelwood lines. The geographic locations are Brunswick, Surry and Isle of Wight counties in Virginia, and Haywood Co. TN. Over 400 surnames of allied families are included. Among these are Bentley, Blanks, Cook, Davis, Hall, Crawley, Newsom and Nicholson. Numerous family pictures are included.

James and Mary (Veatch) Ellis are the progenitors of this Ellis family, whose story begins in Maryland in mid 1700s. They had 6 sons: Nathan, Samuel, Jeremiah, Jesse, James Jr. and Heskiah, all born in Maryland. This excellent record of their family is divided into four parts: Part I The Ellis record transcriptions of original documents, lists, accounts and excerpts from deeds, tax lists and County Histories; Part II Review and Analysis, a clarification of some contradictions, and an account of religious affiliations and participation in armed conflicts; Part III John Bennington Ellis, grandfather of the author; Part IV Genealogical charts through the ninth and tenth generations. A bibliography of 110 sources indicates the extent of research involved, and the maps and illustrations provide additional interest.

NEW YORK GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH by George K. Schweitzer. 1988. Soft back, 6x9, 254 pp. Order from author, 407 Regent Court, Knoxville, TN 37923. \$10.00

Concise, clear, and complete is an apt description of the information Dr. Schweitzer imparts in this volume, which will be helpful to those genealogists with roots in New York. Several maps showing geography, Colonial patents and grants, land tracts, and county formation and changes are a benefit. Beginning with the history of the state, he follows with the type of records available and their various locations. Then he continues with research procedure and extensive information of New York City and its five counties. He concludes with listings of published materials, microfilms, censuses, repositories, and societies of each of the remaining 58 counties. Dr. Schweitzer has also published genealogical aids for the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, the Civil War, each of the south eastern states and Pennsylvania.

EDWIN FAY OF VERMONT AND ALABAMA, 1794-1876: HIS ORIGINS FROM 1656 AND HIS DESCENDANTS TO 1987 by Mary Smith Fay, C.G. 1988. Soft back, 8½x11, 161 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 5403 Beverly Hill Lane, No. One, Houston, TX 77056. \$20.00

This is both a complete family history and supplement to Orlin P. Fay's Genealogy of the Family of Edwin Fay, which was published almost a century ago. The new book brings the entire family together in print for the first time. It includes 173 biographies of descendants of Edwin and Harriet White Fay. More narrative than statistical, this family history is well documented and the picture reproduction is particularly well done. Among the many allied family surnames are da Silva, Davis, Golson, Graham, Hubbard, Morgan, Stebbins, Stoddard, White and Yocum. The geographic range is from New England to Alabama and Texas.

UNION PRIMITIVE BAPTIST CHURCH BOOK 1821-1868, Name changed to Sweeten's Cove Primitive Baptist Church, Marion County, TN, transcribed by Jerry Blevins. 1987. Plastic comb bound, 8½x11, 125 pp. Indexed. Order from Jerry Blevins, P.O. Box 4417, Huntsville, AL 35815-4417. Soft back \$12.00, hard back \$27.00.

These records have been transcribed as accurately as possible from the original book in the rare documents section of the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Bicentennial Library in Chattanooga, TN. This book includes Abstract of Principle, and Rules of Decorum (which were strictly enforced by the church at that time), minutes, lists of first members, the Elders, Clerks, and other churches in the area. There is a picture of the church building as it stood in 1853 and remains today, virtually unaltered.

BARGER compiled by Jane Cook Hollis and Beulah May Barger Wagner. 1988. Soft back, 8½x11. Indexed. Order from Jane Cook Hollis, 3057 Egan Dr., Memphis, TN 38115. \$18.50

This book is based on a 1924 edition of The Barger Journal, which presented several branches of a very large family. One branch was selected, enlarged and updated to the present time. John Barger, an early Indiana settler, probably migrated from New York or Pennsylvania. The line in this book begins with John's youngest son, George born 1791, and continues for nine generations. Allied lines of Renfro and Christopher are expanded. The second section of this book is composed of individual records, arranged alphabetically, with all known information supplied and space left for further information as it comes to light.

GENEALOGICAL ABSTRACTS FROM TENNESSEE NEWSPAPERS 1791-1808 compiled by Sherida K. Eddlemon. 1988. Soft back, 5x8, 380 pp. Indexed. Order from Heritage Books, 1540 E. Pointer Ridge Pl., Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716. \$27.50

Eight of the earliest newspapers published in Tennessee are the original sources for the thousands of names found in this compilation. Not only are the names of permanent settlers, transient pioneers and Indian residents recorded with their dates and locations, but also events of historic interest and local concern, relating the spirit of the times. One entry may carry news from several counties in East Tennessee, from one or more of the Mero District counties of Middle Tennessee, and items from Virginia or Kentucky. Letters remaining in post offices and delinquent tax lists provide hundreds of names. These words draw a picture of Tennessee from pre-statehood through its first twelve years.

SEWARD AND RELATED FAMILIES by George C. Seward. 1987 6x10. Paperback. 130 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 48 Greenacres Avenue, Scarsdale, New York 10583. \$27.50 ppd.

Briefly summarizing early Seward genealogy from another source, the author concentrates upon his own line beginning with James Seward, Jr., born 1776 in New Jersey, who began the Seward westward migration to Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, Illinois, and Nebraska. Mr. Seward states that he has included "information not heretofore readily available about the ancestors of William H. Seward, Lincoln's Secretary of State, who arranged the purchase of Alaska." Twenty-eight pages of family portraits are provided. "Related families" are Sweger, Rugh, Kloenne, McKay, Eley, Day, Corbell, and Phillips.

EARLY SETTLERS OF LAFAYETTE CO., MISSISSIPPI by John Cooper Hathorn. 1980. 8x11. Paperback. 146 pp. Indexed. Order from Skipwith Historical and Genealogical Society, Inc., P.O. Box 1382. Oxford, Mississippi 38655. \$13.00.

Eighty-six persons comprise the list of original land owners of Lafayette Co., Mississippi at its organization during 1836/37. The author documented these families as a basis for his master's thesis presented in 1938 to the faculty of the University of Mississippi. Included in this manuscript are maps and charts which name 1850 and 1860 land owners, the acreage owned, and the value of the land. Also included is the value of farm implements, number of bushels of corn produced and the number of bales of cotton ginned. In addition to these subjects, Mr. Hathorn gives information regarding trade, industry, schools, churches, towns, communities, slaveholders, slaves, and non-slaveholders.

This century old book is a record of businesses and citizens of Jackson, Brownsville and Trenton county seats of Madison, Haywood and Gibson Counties, Tennessee. It also includes brief sketches of Milan, Denmark and Spring Creek and a first-hand account of post-Civil War Jackson. The Mid-West Tennessee Genealogical Society benefits from the sale of each book, the original of which may be seen in the Tennessee Room of the Jackson-Madison County Public Library.

THE SNEADS OF JOHNSTON COUNTY, N.C. & RELATED FAMILIES by Florence Roberta Walker Butler. 8½x11. Soft cover. 328 pp. Order from author, 202 Battley Rd., Hamlet, N.C. 28345. \$48.00.

Beginning with her earliest known ancestors, Mrs. Butler concisely traces the family from Alfred the Great of England to Richard de Aldithley, who first took the name of Snede and died in 1238. Sixteen generations later Samuel Snead brought his family from England to Virginia in 1636. This book emphasizes the John Snead who migrated from Virginia to Onslow County, N.C. It contains many photographs, marriage and death records, obituaries, census and Bible records, charts and maps. Chapter 2 is devoted to the Sneads of Tennessee and Chapter 8 to the Sneads of Florida. Related lines are: Ward, Dudley, Williams, Bryan, Needham and Smith.

Ten years before Tennessee became a state, Sumner County had been formed as one of the three counties of the Mero District. It included part, or all, of sixteen present-day counties. This fact alone makes Sumner County's early records of vital importance to researchers of the Cumberland area. The index is unique in that it covers 140 boxes of original papers which have been stored at the Tennessee State Library and Archives for about forty years, uncatalogued and unavailable for research. Mrs. Wilson and her team sorted the papers into four categories: Wills, Estates, Miscellaneous and Lawsuits. Indexes were entered into a computer, then the entire original papers were microfilmed. Wills are indexed by the name of the decedent, date of the will and number of the file. Estate records follow the same format, and the Miscellaneous category uses either the name of the principal party, location of the event, or topic of the paper. The Lawsuit portion is by far the largest collection of names, "see" references and dates of suits. Instructions for procuring a copy of the desired document are clearly explained in the Introduction of the book.
