

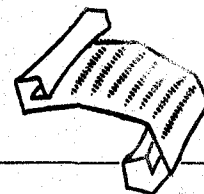

THE END OF THE TRAIL

It is with pride in my success and with some sorrow in finishing a "work of devotion", that I come to the "End of the Trail", that genealogical spoor that lead back to my very elusive ancestor, Pocahontas. When I say elusive, I mean just what the word implies. Many other researchers will bear me out in this statement because they, like myself, have been on her trail for years and, I am sorry to say, some of them are still lost in a maze of traditions, published data with errors, and collections of data that, at present, will in no way fit into their genealogical puzzle.

My great interest in this genealogical game or science, stemmed from the fact that in my family, my father's mother, Trisa Bowlin Burns, was supposed to be a descendant of Pocahontas through the Robert Bolling that married the granddaughter of Pocahontas, Jane Rolfe. During my school days I took pride in bragging about this tradition, but when I grew older, I begin to wonder if this tradition was really true. So, I started out to prove this tradition to be either true or false. I didn't at the time realize that it would be such a herculean task, but now after several years of personal research, also writing hundreds of letters to other descendants and researchers of the Bolling line (some 45 to one descendant), and placing queries and advertisements in genealogical magazines and other mediums, I found that it was one of the hardest and most enjoyable tasks, that I ever tackled and accomplished.

It did not take me long to find out that the father of my grandmother, Trisa Bowlin Burns, was Rodney Bowlin(g), born 8 June, 1784, and who married 1807 in Rockingham County, North Carolina, one Tricy Harris, born 1791, in Rockingham County, North Carolina. Knowing that they married in Rockingham County, North Carolina, I searched the 1810 census of that county for the surname Bolling (any spelling). Only TWO Bowlings were listed. There was my Rodney with his wife and two daughters which was right according to Bible Records. The other Boling was a Jarrott Boling, listed with wife and no children. He was an older Boling, just the right age to be the father of my Rodney. From the record, I guessed him to be born 1766 which was close as it turned out that he was born 1765. I then proceeded to search the 1800 census of same county and there was only one Boling listed, Jarrot Boling with his wife and one child, a male that was just Rodney's age. I was positive that this Jarrot Boling was the father of my Rodney Bowlin(g), but how to prove it was the next question.

If I was ever LUCKY in my genealogical research, it was the day that a lady Judge in Greenville, Mississippi (only lady Judge in Mississippi) noticed my Query in the November, 1957 issue of "ANSEARCHIN'" NEWS and wrote to me in October, 1959 about her Bolling line, stating that she had a Rodney Bolling, born 1785, in her Bolling line, and that she was almost positive that this Rodney was mine. Right then and there I could have claimed this Rodney as mine and had the connection back to Pocahontas, BUT I did not get carried away with the possibility because I still believed that the census records showed some proof that the father of my Rodney was Jarrott Boling of Rockingham County, North Carolina. So I wrote Judge Price again in January (this year), stating my reasons for not believing that the Rodney she mentioned was mine and then I gave my idea on who I thought might be the father of this Jarrott Boling. She had sent me a list of the children of Major John Bolling, all 21 of them, and from this list I selected about four possibles - but I put emphasis on a Rodney Bolling, that was born 1742. A couple of months passed and I was beginning to wonder why no reply. And then here it came, a seven page, typed letter with additional information. The reason for the

delay was because she was corresponding with an elderly Bolling relative who possesses a trunk full of notes and manuscripts on the Bolling family collected by her father years and years ago. This data was taken from old faded sheets, having been in the family well over 100 years. This new data informed me that my Rodney Bolling married 19 November, 1807 to Trissy Harriss, and that he was an ONLY child of Jarrott Bolling, born 15 July 1765, died in North Carolina, married 1 September 1783 in Pittsylvania County, Virginia, to Anne Rone, who was born in Pittsylvania County, Virginia, 10 October, 1767. The data goes on to show that Jarrott Bolling was the son of Rodney Bolling, born 18 September, 1742 in Henrico County, Virginia, he married 10 August, 1764, Elizabeth Anderson. This Rodney Bolling, born 1742, was the 14th of the 21 children born to Major John Bolling, born 1700 and Elizabeth Blair.

My great-grandfather, Rodney Bowlin(g), was the father of 16 children. The oldest son, Roan, was no doubt named after Anne Rone (Roane), his grandmother. Another son of Rodney Bowlin(g) was named John ANDERSON Bowling, maybe the middle name after his great-grandmother, Elizabeth Anderson, who married Rodney Bolling, his great-grandfather.

My genealogical line from Pocahontas down to the present time, including my grandchildren is as follows:

Pocahontas, married John Rolfe.

Thomas Rolfe, married Jane Poythress.

Jane Rolfe, married Col. Robert Bolling (born 1646).

Col. John Bolling, born 1676, married Mary Kennon.

Major John Bolling, born 1700, married 2nd Elizabeth Blair.

Rodney Bolling, born 1742, married Elizabeth Anderson. (His descendants spell the name Boling, Bowlin, and Bowling).

Jarott Boling, born 1765, married Anne Rone (Roane).

Rodney Bowlin(g), born 1784, married Tricy Harris.

Trisa Bowlin, born 1828, married Tarance Burns.

Roan Madison Burns, born 1866, married Birdie Lee Baines.

William Arthur Burns, born 1903, married Elma Lee Bullard.

Dorothy Lee Burns, born 1926, married Lt. Col. James Cannon, USAF.

Children: James Leslie Cannon, born 27 January, 1947 at Anchorage, Territory of Alaska.

Joanna Lee Cannon, born 30 January, 1951 at Falls Church, Va.

I also have the Bolling Pedigree of England taken from the "Official Handbook of Bolling Hall", published 1947, which takes the name of Bolling back 16 more generations from Robert Bolling, born 1646 in England, emigrated to America; arrived 2 October, 1660; married 1675, Jane, daughter of Thomas Rolfe; and granddaughter of Pocahontas. The first Bolling listed in the Pedigree is: 1. William de Bolling, fined in 1165 -- another genealogy gives him as Wm. de Bollingse (born ca 1140). So from this first Bolling down to my grandchildren, it is 27 generations.

Just because I came to the "End of the Trail" on what I started out to find, connection to Pocahontas, it does not mean that I am finished with genealogy. Far from it. I will still welcome letters from all the other Bolling researchers and will try in every way possible to help them reach their goal, also. And I will continue to always be a member of the Memphis Genealogical Society so I can always have on hand our very fine magazine, "ANSEARCHIN'" NEWS!

(Editor's Note: We thank you for the kind words about our publication. The lady Judge mentioned by Mr. Burns is Judge Zelma Wells Price, P. O. Box 78, Greenville, Mississippi, whose road to the Mississippi Legislature and fame was a feature article of the Memphis Commercial Appeal on April 4, 1960.)

PETITIONERS OF SUMNER COUNTY, TENNESSEE

In our quest for our ancestors with "Tennessee Beginnings", the record to follow is part of the answer, and the original will be found in the Tennessee State Archives. This material was secured for me by Dr. Robert H. White, State Historian. The signers of the petition later found themselves listed as residents of the newly formed county of Wilson on October 26, 1799. Three years had elapsed since "The Territory South of the Ohio" had been declared the State of Tennessee.

Ruth H. Duncan (Mrs. I.G.) Research Director

To the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee

The petition of the Inhabitants of Sumner County living on the South side of Cumberland River Humbly Sheweth that your petitioners have now a Suficiant number of Effective men to entitle them to a new County. Your petitioners trust that your Honourable body will grant them a new County bounded on the North by Cumberland River from Davidson County up to the Confluence of the Cany fork then East to the Indian boundary which will leave a suficiant bounds for the County of Sumner and a new county to the East of it which will leave the South side of said River in the Situation that would be proper for a better Division which will be Necessary in a Short time. Your petitioners further pray that if any such attempt should be made that your Honourable body will not Suffer the County of Sumner to Cross Cumberland River and your petitioners as in duty bound Shall ever pray.

July 25th 1799
