CALVIT INFORMATION -- Mrs. Benjamin McFarland Hines, 546 Old Academy Road, Fairfield, Connecticut writes, ---"In the September, 1956 issue of "Ansearchin'" News on page 7 is a query inserted by me. Since then, and after years of hard work on the <u>Calvit Family</u> (of my query) the court records have proved the 1956 information <u>incorrect</u>. Many people working on the line have been able to prove beyond a shadow of a doubt that all connection between these French Huguenots who arrived in Goochland County, Virginia in 1704 and the English Calverts of Maryland was impossible, and although several generations in Louisiana made this error, it has at last been corrected in a book recently compiled by Mr. Francis Stuart Harmon of New York City called, <u>A GOOD INHERITANCE</u>. Copies have been distributed in many leading libraries including the Library of Congress, Washington, D. C.; Mississippi Department of Archives and History, Jackson, Mississippi; Mississippi Southern College Library at Hattisburg, Mississippi; Fish Public Library, Natchez, Mississippi; and Millsaps College Library, Jackson, Mississippi.

Mr. Harmon is a Mississippian by birth, a lawyer, historian, and one time newspaper man. He has written a wonderful chapter on the Huguenot Calvits, from whom he is also descended. He has used much of my research and has been most gracious in his appreciation.

Now my query in the 1956 issue gives so much incorrect data, in view of what we now know, that I would like to refer all people who are interested in this family to Mr. Harmon's book and perhaps just state that this Calvit family were never in Maryland at all.

The line has been proven step by step from court records thus - - -My grandfather was William Neal Calvit, son of James Anthony Calvit (and Minerva Neal) of Rapides Parish, Louisiana.

James Anthony Calvit was the son of Anthony Calvit (and Mary Mayes) of Natchez, Mississippi. He was born 1808 in Mississippi.

Anthony Calvit was the son of Antoine Calver (and his wife, Mary ?, who married secondly Daniel Higdon in 1762 in Johnston Co., N.C. and came to Mississippi with her Calvit sons and Higdon sons via the Holston River - lived and died in Mississippi).

Antoine Calver was the son of Jean Calver of France to Goochland Co., Virginia who arrived as a small child in Virginia with his father Jean Calver, 2 brothers, 2 sisters and his mother - so Antoine was born in France and brought to Virginia as a child (Goochland, Virginia Deeds).

There are many, many descendants, both Calvit and Higdon, left in Mississippi by Mary (?) Calvit Higdon and so I am sure learning this information will be interesting to many who have been mystified atour being able to prove the Lord Baltimore Myth."

GENEALOGICAL SOURCES AT TENNESSEE STATE LIBRARY

Mrs. Charles Embry of the Genealogical Department of Tennessee State Library in Nashville kindly furnished us notes of a speech made by her last October before our Society. We pass on this abbreviated version to you.

The Reference Department of our Library contains about 3500 volumes of published genealogies and about 100 volumes are added every year.

The County Court records of Tennessee, copied by W.P.A. in the 1930's number nearly 100 volumes. In addition to the Minute Books, Deed Indexes, Wills and Inventories, and Marriages, there are some church and cemetery and a few family Bibles and other records. The Court collection is not complete nor absolutely accurate always, but they are very valuable because of the convenience of having so many in one place. There is a nearly complete collection of printed county histories, many of them on microfilm.

A major project now under way is the microfilming of Tennessee newspapers. Old files have been located at every possible source, from the Library of Congress to attics in obscure villages. On microfilm in June 1960 were 6,567 reels. The list of these, with names of papers and dates of publication, is too lengthy to attempt to describe. For further information write to State Library Division, Tennessee State Library and Archives, Nashville 3, Tennessee. In July 1960, a mimeographed report of work done in this field was released. Some of these reports (or a more recent one) may be available for the asking.

Card files on Tennessee soldiers in these wars: War of 1812, Seminole War, Creek War, Mexican War, War Between the States; pension list of Revolutionary War soldiers living in Tennessee after the War. These records are incomplete.

Miscellaneous: A Biographical Directory of the Tennessee General Assembly, 1796-1960 is being compiled by Mrs. Gladys Bracy; file of newspaper clippings of deaths, Gold Star Mothers; county histories in newspapers; questionaire filled out by Confederate veterans alive in the 1920's; Lineage Books of D.A.R., D.A.C., Daughters of Founders and Patriots; card file of Bibles and cemetery records copied by Tennessee D.A.R. chapters; incomplete file of marriages copied by W.P.A., alphabetized, - helpful in locating name when county is unknown. Application papers of the following lineage societies: S.A.R. of Nashville, U.D.C.. Records of soldiers of World War I and the Spanish American War have been copied and bound into volumes.

The Archives Division of the State is separate from the Library and must be consulted for these records: Land Records, early tax lists, photostatic copies of records of War of 1812 Soldiers from Tennessee, Confederate pension records, and microfilms of "National Archives, War Department Indexes to Compiled Records of Confederate Soldiers in Tennessee. Alphabetically arranged". Mr. Robert Quarles, Jr. has charge of these and other records.

The Manuscript Division of the Library and Archives, under direction of Mrs. Harriett Chappell Owsley, has custody of a wealth of material valuable to the historian as well as to the genealogist. This material is too voluminous to attempt to describe here, but Mrs. Owsley has prepared a pamphlet of "Scope Notes" on the collection. Write to her for a copy of same.

Copies may be obtained of a check list of microfilm held by the Manuscript Section and the Search Section, Archives Division of the Tennessee State Library and Archives. The materials are described, approximate number of items given, inclusive dates, sketch of contents, number reels, location of originals, institution by whom filming was done. Those films listed as having been made by Tennessee State Library and Archives are availabe for purchase unless otherwise indicated.

The above is a brief sketch of research material available to the genealogist at the State Library and Archives Building, Nashville, Tennessee. The collection is being added to constantly. Many original court records are there, but as yet unclassified and indexed. Many history-minded people have deposited data of all descriptions there so that it is or will be available to future generations. The Library and Archives welcomes this material, and welcomes those who want to use it.
