

It reads as follows: To the Memory of/ David and Delilah A. McNair/ Who departed This Life/ The Former on the 15th of August/ 1836, the latter on the 31st of November/ 1838 -.-Their Children being Native of/ The Cherokee Nation/ And having to go with Their People/ To the West, leave this Monument/ Not only to tell their Regard/ For their Parents/ But to guard their Sacred ashes/ (From) the inhallowed intrusion/ of the White man. Are they related to MacNair family, Edgecombe, N.C.?
