

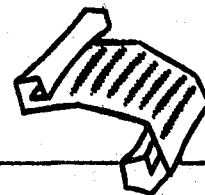

NEWS: The Library Committee has on order microfilm of the 1880 census schedules of Georgia, Mississippi, Alabama and Arkansas. These two books, and others as we acquire them, as well as the census schedules, will be available to all at Cossitt Library.

"Records of Onslow County, N.C." (2 Vols.), compiled by Zae Hargett Gwynn of Memphis is a work of monumental proportions and of priceless value. Recently published after years of painstaking effort, these volumes will serve to simplify search for family history in that early county for endless years ahead, and for innumerable grateful people. To have at our fingertips the abstracts of deeds of a county from the beginning to 1850, the marriages, wills, guardian accounts, land grants, 1790 and 1850 census - is the dream of every genealogist. The Memphis Genealogical Society is proud to be the recipient of these beautifully bound volumes.

NOTES: Mrs. Scott Julian and this writer each enjoyed visits to the famous New England Historical Genealogical Library in Boston in June. Mrs. Julian accompanied her husband who was "business bent", while yours truly shared with her husband the pleasure of reunion with the Class of 1911 of Harvard Law School. Of course, that library is a must for searchers in that area. Mrs. Willis Ayres is mapping out a visit to libraries and archives in Raleigh, N.C. and Richmond, Va.

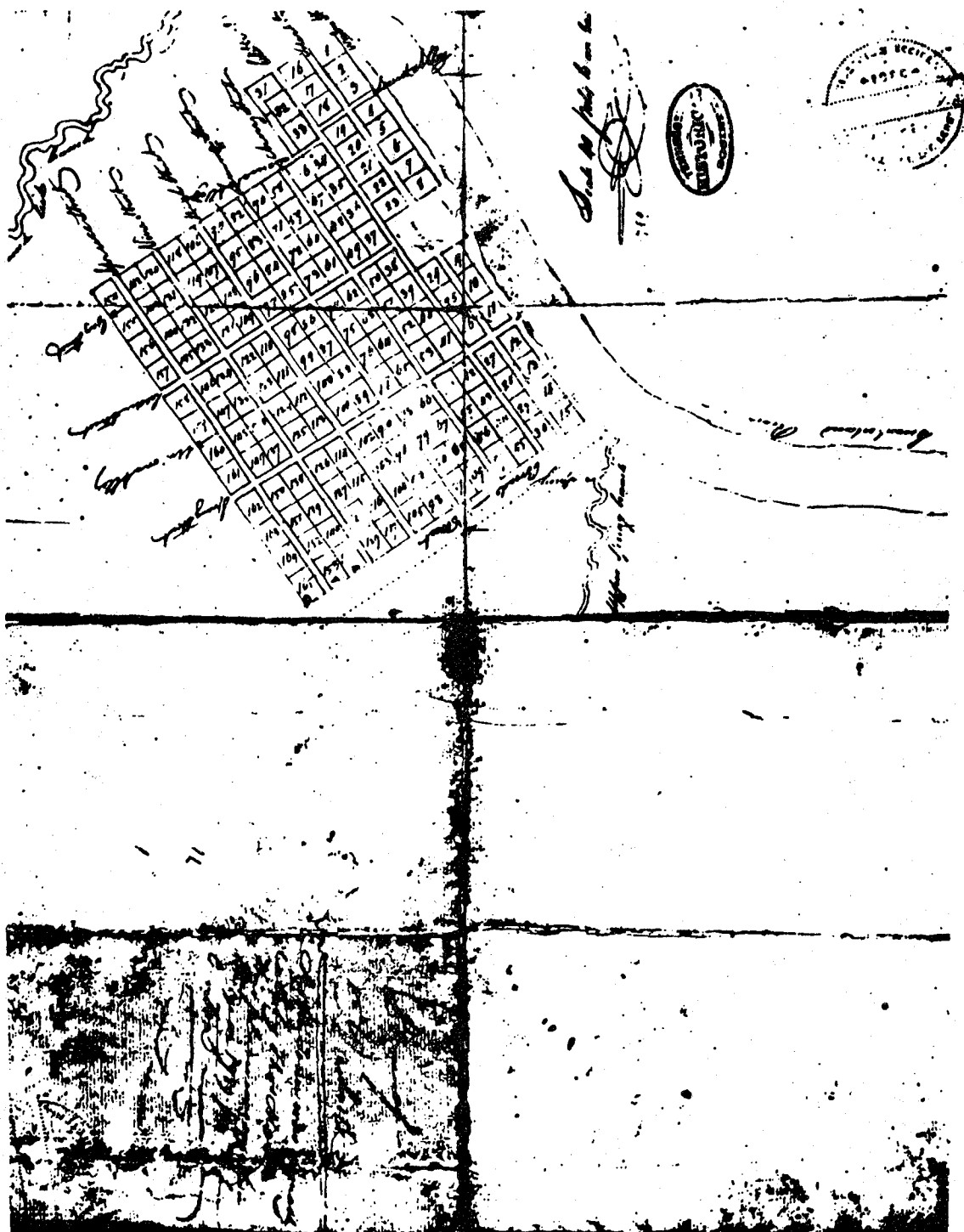

It reads as follows: To the Memory of/ David and Delilah A. McNair/ Who departed This Life/ The Former on the 15th of August/ 1836, the latter on the 31st of November/ 1838 -- Their Children being Native of/ The Cherokee Nation/ And having to go with Their People/ To the West, leave this Monument/ Not only to tell their Regard/ For their Parents/ But to guard their Sacred ashes/ (From) the inhallowed intrusion/ of the White man. Are they related to MacNair family, Edgecombe, N.C.?
