During his ministry he kept a journal, listing all the people he baptized, funerals he preached, and all marriages he performed. The book was privately printed in 1896, and is available in most libraries.

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SOME TENNESSEE TRAILS IN SIMPSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Various states have their county and regional histories which are boons to genealogists. Tennessee seekers avidly search the pages of the Goodspeed volumes. In Virginia there is the Hardesty and Brock set, and in Kentucky it is the series by Perrin, Battle, and Kniffin which delights the climber of family trees. There are, of course, many others, but these are merely cited by way of illustration of the wealth of data available to those who long to know more of the folk of yesterday.

The writer is conversant with the Kentucky books since he was reared in the state of his nativity, and cut his genealogical eye teeth on the "Perrins" as they are commonly termed. There were issued in the 1880's and delivered to subscribers who thus paid for the privilege of inserting family sketches in the books. Time has taken its toll of these books and they have long since become collectors' items.

There is much misunderstanding about them and the writer has received letters from non-Kentucky libraries boasting of owning a "History" of Kentucky by Perrin et als. The fact that they issued them in editions by number causes libraries to believe that they have a fourth, fifth, sixth or eighth edition which is the sequence printing of the first edition. Such is not the case at all. Each edition concerned a different geographic locality and the numbers have no relation to subsequent issues of the first volume.

There has even been confusion on the part of Kentuckians as to these works. Some years ago I went into one of our fine libraries, The Filson Club, and found a first edition which covered the Purchase counties in the far western part of the Bluegrass state. I was particularly delighted since my mother's lines of Bailey, Williams, Milburn, Fleming, Drinkard, Byrd stemmed from this area. I made notes and later visited another splendid Kentucky library and asked if they had this first edition. The librarian was dogmatic in stating that there was no such book and got down the two finest Kentucky bibliographies to prove her point. Sure enough, neither of these authorities mentioned the first at all. I then returned to Filson to see if I had dreamed and found that there was in truth such a book on their shelves. I wrote to the Congressional Library and they, at that time, had no editions of the Perrins save the first. However, it contained only precinct histories and did not have the family sketches from which I got my data. Later my dogmatic librarian friend informed me that a rare book salesman had come in and offered her a first, and she snapped it up for her collection.

There is one mystery which has never been cleared up about these volumes. In the closing years of the series they put out two eighth editions. No explanation is given as to why this was done, but I know whereof I speak, for I have indexed both eighths. One is on Jefferson County and the other is on southeastern Kentucky.

Variations are to be found in the books, but this is too long a story to include here. Let it suffice to say that some contain precinct histories and then sketches by named counties. Some have the standard history of the state and then the sketches without giving a breakdown by counties, so that one must study post office addresses and other data in each sketch to locate the county involved. This is true of the fourth edition, for example. The history of Bourbon, Scott, Nicholas, and Harrison is apart from the numbered series and so is the trilogy on Christian, Todd, and Trigg. Perrin'also collaborated with Dr. Peters on Fayette County.

Some years ago I had a long talk with Bayliss Hardin who was Secretary of the Kentucky Historical Society. We agreed that it was bad that these books had no real index. The only indexes are for the history part and a listing of each person who has a sketch in the books. This means that hundreds of names appearing in the sketches are not given. I told Bayliss that I was just venturesome enough to tackle the job and he dared me to do it.

I started my intention and then began to carry it out, but I have never finished it. I doubt that I shall ever take up the task for I have become fascinated by the wealth of material that needs to be abstracted and released in Amherst County, Virginia, where I now reside. However, I did index the second edition (very long), part of the third, all of the fourth, fifth, and sixth. I have a partial index of the seventh and, as stated, both of the eighths. I have also done the three on Christian, Todd, and Trigg. I had an interest in Trigg since I served as pastor at Cadiz for five years. This county is on the Tennessee border.

I have only released to the public a mimeographed index of the sixth. This covers my home county of Shelby, Spencer, Trimble, Oldham, and Henry counties in Kentucky. My system of indexing shows each soldier and, when possible, each female is indexed for maiden and married names.

One is not to assume that the data given in these sketches is infallible. Each sketch is subject to human error and they creep in by way of wrong spellings and incorrect data. However, they are regarded as the best source of genealogy to be had by researchers on Kentucky in toto.

The writer owns several of these books such as the third, fourth, sixth and he has manuscripts of the Christian, Todd, and Trigg volumes. He also prizes the one on Bourbon and other counties for it was in this region that his paternal ancestors settled and many sketches of his family are in that work.

Tennessee genealogists should remember that the volumes dealing with counties on the border of the two states are full of Tennessee genealogy. The originals are hard to acquire, but several Kentucky libraries possess many or all of the set. The writer served as President of the Southern Baptist Historical Society for several years and during that time he had many of the books microfilmed. He had a film made of the standard history which begins most of the books and films of the sketches of those works which he could borrow and film. Tennessee folk are fortunate in that the film are within their state at the Southern Baptist Historical Commission Library, Dargan-Carver, Nashville, Tennessee.

Libraries have never realized that they can acquire these films for a nominal price, but someday, as the originals are better known outside of Kentucky, they will begin to seek them. Films are available on the second, third, fourth, sixth, one eighth, the trilogy, and Bourbon, etc.

Simpson County is the last county in Kentucky before one crosses into Tennessee on 31-W. Franklin is the county seat and the writer lived there for nine years. A fire destroyed many records so the Perrin sketches take on new significance. My index on Simpson sketches covers 35 pages of names which are single-spaced and two columns per page so one can realize just how many names are recorded and indexed. I made no attempt to index by states, but realize that this should have been done to facilitate the work.

The Simpson sketches cover pages 634 to 719 and are full of Tennessee names and families. I am not attempting to cover all of the pages, but simply ran through the data from A to Z with the primary intention of alerting researchers to the value of these Perrins. This book is known as the third edition and was published in 1886. These names are simply jotted down as I came to them by thumbing through the sketches in the section mentioned. Here are Tennessee folk as mentioned by counties and towns: Wm. H. and Margaret (Crawford) Adams - Robertson County; Chas. Adams, native of Virginia to same county; Henry Crawford, Virginian and pioneer in Robertson; Jno. J. Alderson, Sumner County, and other members of the same clan. Jno. G. Alexander sketch - Nancy Homes, daughter of Ro. and Majia Homes, Macon County; Mrs. Matilda Bradley, Sumner County, daughter of David and Rebecca (Granger) Bradley of Sumner; Hon. Henry C. Atkinson, born Jonesboro, Washington County; Wilton and Martha B. (McKin) of Tennessee; Rhoda (Blenkenship) McCary - Sumner County; Nancy (Harris) Baird - Wilson County; Henry Harris - N. Carolina to Wilson County; Elizabeth (Turner) Copeland -Sumner; Z. H. T. Boaz - Davidson County; Frances D. (Duke) Booker - Montgomery County; Jno. and Harriett V. (Woodard) Henry - Montgomery and Robertson Counties; James Boren - Sumner: Francis Boren - same; Eady Wimberly - Sumner; Noah Wimberly - same; Jas. Hammond, Simpson County, Kentucky, married Celete Hughs, daughter of Churchwell and Elizabeth (Durin) Hughs-of Sumner; Vincent M. Hammond married Sarah M. Lester, daughter of Wm. and Nancy (Webb) Lester of Wilson County; Wm. and Elizabeth (Stanley) Vineyard - N. Carolina and Virginia - to Tennessee from N. Carolina, then to Kentucky; Squire Jno. M. Norris, from Virginia to Pilot Knob, Tennessee: David Scoby, Indian fighter, killed in Indian battle on Caney Fork of Cumberland River; Jas. T. Slack - Davidson County; Jno. Smith, Sr. of N. Carolina married Elizabeth Bradford - Sumner County; and many, many more.

Let the Tennessee searcher realize that these old Perrin volumes may throw light upon some line long sought. It was common for the families to cross from one state to the other and to inter-marry. I have said nothing of Allen County which is next to Simpson, but the sketches from that county are just as full of Tennessee data as those cited in this article. Remember that some distant Kentucky kinsman may have given Perrin and his staff some data that will give you the tie you need.

Footnote:

Bailey Fulton Davis was born in Winchester, Kentucky; A.B. from Mercer University in Georgia; Th.M. from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary; one year of Law at Washington and Lee; Rotarian; Mason; Kappa Alpha; President of Southern Baptist Historical Society for four years; Director of Amherst Bicentennial in 1961; pastor of Clay Village, Cadiz, Springfield and Franklin in Kentucky; and at Amherst, Virginia, since 1957. Genealogical "Nut" (to quote the author) and compiler of various works.

Mr. Davis is particularly interested in Beverly Fleming - Sumner; Jas. and Mary (Koss) Fleming also Sarah Ann (Stuart) Fleming of Sumner - they are said to have come from North Carolina into Tennessee; Holcomb D. Bailey who married a Martha Drinkard in Prince Edward County, Va., dau. of a Fleming who married a Drinkard in the same county and a Beverly Fleming was on the bond. Mr. Davis has long sought light on an old marriage in an aged Byrd Bible in the Purchase country. Therein his ancestor, Jesse Byrd, is shown to have married Jane Crump. Tradition has it that they married "around Lebanon" in Tennessee, but he cannot find the data, although there are Crumps in that county in the records. He is also on the alert for Johnson and Bailey data, with some other lines, in Montgomery and has worked in that county in years past. Holcomb D. Bailey and wife, Martha, came into that county and it was there that his great grandfather, William Henry Bailey, married Martha Johnson, daughter of Abel Johnson of North Carolina. There are family legends as to Fraziers and Rhodes which Mr. Davis has been unable to establish.

PETITION AGAINST TIPPLING HOUSES, FRANKLIN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, 1837

TO THE HONORABLE THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

The Memorial of the citizens of Franklin county in said State, respectfully represent; That the evils which have grown out of the laws authorizing the Licensing and establishment of Tippling Houses, have become so alarming as to call loudly for legislative interposition. Previous to the act of 1831, allowing any person to retail spirituous liquors, upon the payment of fifteen dollars, for the use of Common Schools, perhaps no State in the Union could boast of a more temperate and orderly population. And it may even yet in these respects, be equal to any State; but it is useless to disguise the fact, the truth of which can be attested by any person who has been a citizen of the State for the last seven years, that in the moral caste of society, there has been a gradual and perceptible change for the worse - and your constituents cannot reasonably ascribe it to any other cause, than the increased number of Dram Shops. In every city, town and hamlet, throughout the State, they are to be found, in numbers greatly disproportionate to the wants of any sober community - And in many instances they are intolerable nuisances - particularly in the small towns, and in obscure situations in the country; where they are not unfrequently kept open on the Sabbath in defiance of law, and in utter disregard of public sentiment. And the injury done to the slaves, who resort thither to expend their little earnings, is incalculable. In truth, nearly every crime and misdemeanor can be traced directly or indirectly to some one of those low haunts of dissipation and idleness.

The limits of a memorial does not admit of that full satisfactory exhibit of the grievances sought to be redressed, which your petitioners would otherwise desire. All they ask for at the present, is, that a Joint Committee of both Houses may be raised, to give the matter a thorough investigation, and report accordingly. This being done they cannot fear the result. September, 1837 Very respectfully, your memorialists.

MT. SHEARON GRAVEYARD, Donelson, District # 3.

MT. ZION CHURCHYARD (CHURCH), Joelton, District #14.

MULLEN FAMILY BURIAL GROUND, Antioch, 18 miles Murfreesboro Pike. Jimmy Wilson Vaughan is buried there (Mar. 9, 1940, age 28 years), brother of S. L. Vaughan, Willie Vaughan, Curtis Vaughan, Mrs. Odies Carney all of Nashville, Gertrude Warpoole of Nolensville and Jonas Vaughan of Tenn.

MURRAY FAMILY GRAVEYARD, near Hermitage, District #4.

MURRELL GRAVEYARD CHURCH, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east of Una, District #2, land given by Capt. Murrell.

MYERS FAMILY GRAVEYARD, Madison, District #11.

NANCE (farm) FAMILY GRAVEYARD, on Burkett Road, District #5.

NAPIER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 7 miles Charlotte Pike, District #8 or 9.

NASHVILLE CITY GRAVEYARD (PUBLIC), south Nashville, on 4th Ave. and Oak St. and Rairoad, Nolensville or Radnor street car line, established in 1822, 23,583 graves on 27 acres. The City Cemetery was first used in 1822, but many graves show figures of death prior to that date. This is accounted for by the removal from other cemeteries. Among those buried there are: Gen. James Robertson, founder of Nashville, 1742-1814; his wife Charlotte Reeves Robertson, 1751-1843; Dr. Felix Robertson, "first white child born in Nashville," 1781-1805; his wife Lydia Robertson, 1788-1832; Ann Robertson Cockrill, taught school on the good ship, "Adventure." On a slab is a quaint testimonial to a beloved school teacher, Miss Pamelia Kirk. It shows a teacher surrounded by her pupils. Miss Kirk died in 1860. Col. W. B. A. Ramsey, historian, writer of Ramsey's Annals of Tennessee, 1799-1874; Alexander Porter, U.S. Senator, 1825-1905; Rev. John Rains, 1796-1879; Gen. Robert Armstrong, 1791-1854 (Gen. Jackson bequeathed his sword to Gen. Armstrong); Clara Cole, 1807-1883, author of Clara's Poems; Chas. Maddis, interpreter for Gen. Jackson at New Orleans, died in 1854; Capt. William Driver, 1803-1886, named flag "Old Glory;" Gen. Richard Stoddard Ewell, 1817-1872, commander of Lee's center at Battle of Gettysburg; Gen. William Carroll, Gov. of Tennessee for 12 years, 1788-1855; George Washington Campbell, 1742-1848, bought Capitol Hill for a cow and calf and pair of leather breeches - sold to the City of Nashville for \$30,000.00; Gen. Felix K. Zollicoffer, 1812-1862, a modest slab with only his name and inscription "To Our Father" are among the many well known figures of the past buried here. Nearby is John Marlin, with whom Zollicoffer fought a duel - Marlin was wounded but recovered and later he and Zollicoffer were close friends. Marlin died in 1854. A few of the families having vaults are: Curran, Shelby, Clark and McNairy. The McNairy vault is reputed to be the most populous containing 29 bodies. Judge John McNairy

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died in 1837 and is buried here along with members of the Rutledge, Harden, Smith, Alloway and other related families and family slaves.

Near the monument of Gov. Carroll is a large rock with ornamental iron work on top, no name or date can be found. It is said that a young girl living up the river had a devoted lover, and this rock was their favorite meeting place. They would watch the sun set or moon rise, but one day they quarrelled. To the girl this was the end of everything, so she jumped from the bluff into the river below. When her body was found and buried, the young man had the rock from the bluff moved and placed over her grave. He wanted no name or date upon it.

Near the main gate on the lefthand side is one of the most artistic tributes in stone in the entire cemetery, erected in memory of John Kane, "stone mason dying in the erection of the State Capitol," 1810-1848, by the surviving stone masons.

David Shelby is buried in the John Shelby vault. Alfred Hume, father of the public school system of Nashville, 1808-1853, is buried in this cemetery. A cedar head piece marks the grave of Joseph Coleman, first Mayor of Nashville. Some handsome stones, vaults, some weather worn and crumbling which were repaired a few years ago, and some wooden slabs mark the final resting place of earlier settlers of Nashville. Revolutionary soldiers buried in this cemetery include: Samuel Chapman, 1757-1826; Maj. John Cockrill; Anthony Foster, 1765-1825; A. Marlin, 1763-1818; John Bradford; Lipscomb Norvell, 1776-1843; Col. Joel Lewis. On the iron gate is an iron marker with the inscription, "Erected Nov. 21, 1909 in memory of James Robertson, the founder of Nashville, Charlotte Reeves, his wife, and the old citizens and Confederate Officers and soldiers buried within this sacred enclosure." The James Robertson Chapter, DAR, have the metery under its care and protection.

On one very old stone, still in good condition, is this inscription: "Here lies the body of Margaret Brown, she departed this life Sept. 17, 1801, aged 100 years, 5 months and 17 days. There is also the grave of Capt. John Wilson who died in 1870. In 1785, the people realizing the need of a minister of the Gospel, called Rev. Thomas B. Craighead, and established the first -186-

Presbyterian Church in Middle Tennessee, and this was called the Spring Hill meeting house. In the church yard they buried their dead. Thomas Craighead donated 10 acres of land for a graveyard. In 1813 the graveyard was conveyed to a board of commissioners. The commissioners appointed by Craighead were: John Goodrich, William Maxey, William Neeley, Joseph Phillips and Robert Weakley. Spring Hill is protected by a Trust Fund, which has steadily grown since the cemetery was incorporated in 1882. In 1929, Spring Hill Cemetery began the construction of the only sanitary mausoleum in Tennessee, being built entirely of marble and granite. They have now made it possible for a man of moderate means to purchase crypt space at a reasonable rate.

The Harding lot in Spring Hill was at one time in Belle Meade, but several years ago was moved to Spring Hill. The lot contains the graves of: Giles Harding, 1784-1843; Charlotte, wife of Giles Harding, 1790-1836; Eliza Davis Harding, 1813-1846; George Harding, 1818-1847; Charlotte Morris Harding, 1816-1835; Wm. Among the older graves are: Sister Gertrude O'Meara, July 7, 1864; Sister Mary Agnes McGary, May 8, 1871; Sister Mary Imelda Johnson, April 19, 1873; Sister M. Veronica Shea, May 4, 1874; Sister Mary Agnes Brown, June 12, 1877; Sister Mary Angela Carmody, June 12, 1877; Sister Hyacinth Rooney, October 12, 1881; Sister Mary Pius Oearl (?), February 22, 1883; Sister Charissima Murphy C.S.P., October 23, 1885; Sister Mary Gallagher, February 11, 1887, etc.

In the Spring of 1860, the Right Rev. James Whelan D.D., Bishop of Nashville, applied to St. Mary's Convent, Somerset, Ohio, for Sisters who would conduct an Academy for the higher education of girls in Nashville. This land was purchased for the Academy, and as it would also be a home of the Nuns during life, and also their last resting place, they set aside a plot of ground for the graveyard, which is well cared for. As time moves on, and the present plot fills up, it can be enlarged, as the Nuns own land on each side of the present plot. In the center of the plot is a crucifix, and 91 nuns sleep here with a plain stone cross, with name and date of death to mark each grave. Buried in this plot are two other graves, friends of the Nuns and guests at the Academy, Mrs. Ellen M. Weakley, February 4,1804-March 3, 1883, and Margaret Ewing, died November 20, 1888.

ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC CHURCH, 5th Ave., north and Cedar St., Nashville, established in 1860 by the Right Rev. Richard Pius Miles D.D., one in crypt under altar. The Right Rev. Miles was the first Bishop of Nashville (1791-1860).

STEELE FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 15 miles on Lavergne Road, District #2.

STEPHENS (GEORGE) FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 9 miles Charlotte Pike, approximately 25 graves.

- SULPHUR SPRING GRAVEYARD, in the neighborhood of "our Public Square" between the courthouse and the site of the Old Inn in Nashville. Established in the early settlement of Nashville, it was discontinued sometime before 1822, by the first settlers of the city. In the early settlement of Nashville the dead were buried in the open ground near Sulphur Spring bottom and at two or three county burial places in the neighborhood. Joseph Hay, the first member of the little settlement killed by an Indian, is buried a short distance to the east of Sulphur Spring. Other graves were: Robert Gilkie, the first to die from illness; Richard Chandler, 1st Lt. and Paymaster, 4th Regt. of Inf. in the army of the U.S. died December 20, 1801 aged 37 years. Thomas Crutcher who saw the lst burial said the earth was so shallow it was difficult to obtain enough to cover the coffin.

Stokes Vaughan, 1853-1886; Willie Porter Vaughan, 1885-1902; Eliza G. Wright, 1850-1888, wife of J. K. Wright; Hanrietta Gamble, wife of H. C. Cole, 1850-1895.

VAUGHAN FAMILY GRAVEYARD, Una, District #2.

- VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY GRAVEYARD, Nashville, on campus of Vanderbilt Univ., West End and 21st Ave., established by Board of Trustees of Vanderbilt, contains six graves. One large monument on the campus near the Calhoun Building marks the resting place of the following who played an important part in the history of the University: William McKendree, 1757-1853, Rev. soldier, ordained Bishop in 1808. Bishop McKendree was the first native born Methodist Bishop in America, and he helped to establish Methodism in Nashville. H. E. N. McTyeire, 1824-1889, ordained Bishop in 1866. It was through the personal influences of Bishop Holland N. McTyeire, that Commodore Vanderbilt became interested in the new institution. At first the school was to be called Central University of the Methodist Church, but when Commodore Vanderbilt became interested and donated \$1,000,000.00 to the cause, it was called Vanderbilt University. Bishop McTyeire's wife and the wife of Commodore Vanderbilt were cousins. Amelia Townsend, wife of Bishop Mctyeire, was born in 1827 and buried here in 1891. The three other graves belong to: Landon Cabell Garland, LLD, 1810-1895, first Chancellor of Vanderbilt University, 1875-1893; Joshua Soule, 1781-1867; and T. O. Summers, DD, LLD, 1812-1882.
- WADE (JULIUS C.) FAMILY GRAVEYARD, on the farm of Homer Gannon near Stones River, National Park, in a corn field. The grave of Julius C. Wade, 1820-1871, is the only one with a monument, all other stones have been removed.
- WALKER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 8 miles of Nashville on Elm Hill Road District #3.

WAGGONER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 7 miles of Nashville on Murfreesboro Road, District # 2.

WAIR FAMILY GRAVEYARD, near Antioch, District #5.

WALL FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 5 miles of Nashville on Whites Creek Pike, District #14.

WALLACE FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 11 miles of Nashville on River Road, District #8.

WALLER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 10 miles of Nashville on Edmondson Pike, District #6.

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- WALTON FAMILY GRAVEYARD, Goodlettsville, halfway between Louisville and Long Hollow Pike, on the Walton place, now the Utley farm. Among those buried there is Capt. Casper Mansker, who led the Long Hunters through the Cumberland Country in 1770. Capt. Mansker was the first white man in this section. He lived in a hollow of a sycamore tree, had big feet, went barefooted, and caused the Indians to flee when they saw his large foot-tracts. Capt. Mansker married the widow of Walton.
- WARD FAMILY GRAVEYARD, near Lebanon Pike on old Lebanon dirt road, on farm of M. W. Dodson, District #2. Among those buried there is Col. William Ward, one time candidate for governor. The Ward family were large land owners in this county for more than a 100 years.

WARDEN FAMILY GRAVEYARD, Antioch, District #2.

- WARE FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 8 miles of Nashville on Nolensville Road, District #2.

Deaderick Street was named for him. He died in 1816 at the age of about 65. J. Wheeler, 1821-1898, and Eliza A., wife of E. J. W., 1824-1897.

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WHEELER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 7 miles on Nolensville Road, District #6.

- WHITE FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 6 miles from Nashville on Couchville Pike, off of the Murfreesboro Pike, District #2, very old.

James Robertson Chapter, DAR.

Declaration of wife, Ann Mitchell, made June 20th, 1843, stating:

- 1. She was 81 years old at date of declaration.
- 2. David Mitchell was in the army of the revolution, sometimes as a private, other times as a lieutenant, from the beginning of the war in 1776 until the fall of the year 1781.
- 3. David Mitchell was in the battle of King's Mountain, Guilford Courthouse, etc.
- 4. Ann and David Mitchell were married the 13th day of June in 1782.
- 5. David Mitchel died on the 30th day of August, 1831.

Statement by William Mitchell, resident of Rutherford County, Tennessee, July 6th, 1843:

- 1. William Mitchell'was 78 years old at time of statement.
- 2. William Mitchell was a Revolutionary War soldier and pensioner.
- 3. William Mitchell was a brother of David Mitchell of Caswell County.
- 4. William Mitchell attended the wedding of his brother, David, to Ann at the residence of William Anderson, her father.

Statement by John Mitchell of Caswell County, North Carolina, made June 20th, 1843:

- 1. Verifies the pages of the family Bible attached to the Claim.
- 2. Verifies the death of David Mitchell.
