

ANCESTORS ARE WHERE YOU FIND THEM

(Abstracted by Mrs. L. D. Bejach, 43 Belleair Drive, Memphis, Tennessee 38104)

Mr. and Mrs. Gene Walker, 2406 Clay Ave., Waco, Texas, are looking for former owners of a Bible they purchased recently in an antique shop. Internal evidence points to Memphis, Tennessee, in 1857 as being the home of a Roberts family. Records of Zachariah and Charles Whitefield Roberts are written therein, as are those of other members of their families. For further information see the QUARTERLY OF CENTRAL TEXAS GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, Fall Number, page 1, 1717 Austin Avenue, Waco, Texas.

GENEALOGICAL TIPS, Vol. II, No. 3, page 21, Tip-O'-Texas Genealogical Society, Harlingen Public Library, Harlingen, Texas, mentions Mrs. Loraine W. Allen as an early settler of the Lower Rio Grande Valley who was "b. Feb. 1849, Purdy, Tenn., d. Dec. 1951, aged 102 years."

From the same source, page 23, is to be found a long Bible record of "The Napier Family of Virginia and Tennessee", the earliest date recorded in which is "Patrick Napier was born Feb 1, 1713, died Aug 23, 1774."

THE ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN, Box 587, Conway, Arkansas, in Vol. 3, No. 1, page 7 contains extensive data on the Southern Pirtle-Purtle family, one branch of which lived in Hardeman County, Tennessee. Jacob Pirtle's will was probated there January 21, 1837 naming "children: Sally Gibbs and Rebecca Boutt; son Michael's three children: Sally, Elijah and Lewis; John, Priscilla (wife of Walter) Scott, William, Benjamin, Mary (wife of Isaac) Jones, Robert and Isaac. His wife Polly apparently predeceased him." Numerous other Pirtle ancestors from Hardeman County, Tennessee are mentioned in the article. Mr. Roy Black, member of Memphis Genealogical Society, from Bolivar, Tennessee, helped with the research on these families. Also, on page 19, Mr. Robert V. Wilkins wrote at length on the Shumate-Shumake-Shumaker family, some of whom came from Tennessee.

The MISSISSIPPI GENEALOGICAL EXCHANGE, Volume 9, Dec. 1963, No. 4, (Mrs. Jerome Esker, Starkville, Mississippi), Page 64, records: Agatha E. Cook, consort of John C. Cook. Born in Franklin Co., Tenn., May 11, 1829. Died Sept. 12, 1846. And also: Mrs. Mary Ann Dumas, consort of A.E.S. Dumas, born in Bledsoe Co., Tenn., Dec. 6, 1824. Died Houston (Chickasaw County), Apr. 6, 1850.

From the new publication of Santa Clara County Genealogical Society, 276 Terraine Street, San Jose, Calif., October 1964 issue, page 28: "Daniel Montgomery Drumheller . . . was born on a plantation near Gallatin, Sumner County, Tennessee, on the 25th of March 1840. His family left Tennessee when he was a baby and settled in southwestern Missouri, near Springfield in the Ozarks." The Drumheller diary goes on to tell of the trip to the West by young Daniel.

THE OKLAHOMA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY QUARTERLY, P. O. Box 16652, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, September issue, page 517 records important data on a Parks family of Weakley County, Tennessee.

A "Family Register" sampler "wrought by Hannah Moore, age 11, 1828," now in The Little Rock Museum, June, 1964:

TENNESSEANS IN CENTRAL TEXAS

(Extracted by Mrs. L. B. Gardiner, Librarian, from

"A Memorial and Biographical History of McLennan, Falls, Bell and Corvell Counties, Texas" published by The Lewis Publishing Co., Chicago, Ill., 1893.)

All genealogists and historians interested in Tennessee are indebted to Miss Mildred Dulaney of Fort Worth Public Library for making it possible for us to run this article. Her introduction puts us on the right track, and the vast amount of Tennesseanna will be of help as the book often mentions not only the persons who went to Texas but also their parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters, and children, even in many instances listing wives and husbands of the descendants.

Our first member to benefit is our President, Cleo Webb, who found her husband's great-grandmother for whom she had searched many years. We hope many other readers will be as lucky. It makes all the work seem worthwhile.

Of course, if you find your ancestor mentioned you will want to read the entire article so we will place the photostated pages in Cossitt Reference Library, Memphis.

In a recent article on 'The Continuing Significance of Local History' by Victor Hicken, he refers to the so-called "Mug" books....."Local or county histories, ponderous in size, which contained the pictures or "mugs" of locally prominent people".....and admitted that despite their faults these oversized volumes have a continuing value, including their handiness for small-town lawyers in land cases; for high school instructors who find them interesting reading for Social Science and English classes; and for Historians of all levels who find a splendid insight into the times in which they were published.

He forgot to mention their very real help as "leads" for avid Family Historians clutching at every thread of information that will help unravel their knotty problems, but it is for this very purpose that we are going to the expense and trouble to extract this huge volume so full of Tennesseans who 'went West'.

It is not possible to maintain the flavor or exact wording, for in the interest of brevity we must leave out such items as educational advantages, religious persuasions and political leanings. All names, dates, and most places, we have tried to include.

INTRODUCTION BY MISS MILDRED DULANEY, FORT WORTH PUBLIC LIBRARY

Most genealogists are familiar with the so-called "Goodspeed" biographical histories that were being published in the 1890's. Not quite so familiar are the publications of the Lewis Publishing Company of Chicago during the same period. In appearance, format, subject matter, arrangement, and style the two series of books are so nearly identical (as far as my limited experience with them goes) that it is necessary to look at the title page to see which company did publish the volume.

Since one company never seemed to cross the line into the other company's territory, one is led to wonder if they had a gentleman's agreement -- I'll take this state and you take that one! The Lewis Publishing Company seems to have covered the middle west and the southwest, while the Goodspeed Publishing Company

operated more to the east and the south.

There were several of the Lewis Company volumes on various counties of Texas. All of those which I have been privileged to examine are rich in sketches of former residents of Tennessee, and would justify the treatment being given this one volume.

For those unfamiliar with Texas geography, the four counties covered, McLennan, Bell, Falls and Coryell, are in the center of the state, with Waco the largest city. The unknown writers of the biographical sketches must have liked the area, for the title on the binding is "Pen Pictures from the Garden of the World".

One old gentleman once told me that he was a small child when the biographer came to his home to write about his father. To the best of his recollection, notes were made at the time and the sketch written later and sent in for publication without his father reading and correcting it. If this was the usual policy, it is easy to see that many errors may have crept into the biographical sketches. However, in many cases, they are known to be accurate in all respects. It would be advisable to use them more as clues subject to verification because of the possibility of errors.

It was admiration for the policy of the Memphis Genealogical Society to get into print in "ANSEARCHIN'" NEWS all Tennessee material that led to the suggestion that the wealth of Tennessee material in these Texas volumes be called to the attention of readers. It is sincerely hoped that some lost line or link in your family will be found through these sketches of Tennesseans who migrated to central Texas.

SOLOMON WHITE, of McGregor, McLennan Co., was born in Carroll Co., Tenn., Jan. 1, 1824, son of Jackson White, a native of Virginia, who died in Ark. in 1883; he married Miss Elizabeth Rider, a dau. of Thomas Rider, native of England but deceased in Tennessee. To this union was born five children: Sidney, wife of Rev. E. Sterman, a Christian minister of Texas; Solomon, our subject; William W., who moved to Calif. in 1850; Elizabeth, wife of John Stevenson of Ark.; Permetta, wife of John Mays of Johnson Co., Texas; 2 deceased when small.

Solomon White, our subject, removed with his parents to Shelby Co., Illinois, in 1838, afterwards to Arkansas where he grew to manhood. June 1846, he enlisted in Mexican War. 1852 moved to Stockton, Calif. 1872 returned to Texas first settling at Gatesville.

Mr. White was united in marriage with Miss Lucinda McCollum, (born June 10, 1828) dau. of Daniel McCollum, of Va., who resided in Ga. many years, then removed to Ark. He was father of 5 children, all of whom came to Texas except one son who went to Calif. He died 1884.)

Mr. and Mrs. White had twelve children as follows:

- Mary b. May 1851, wife of George W. Brown, of Calif.
- Daniel b. Aug. 4, 1853 resides at Gatesville, Texas

James W., b. Mar. 31, 1869 is at New Orleans

The wife and mother died Nov. 26, 1891 after 2½ years of consumption. (p 326)

JAMES R. HOLLAND, of Bell Co., was b. in Claiborne Co., Tenn., 1848, son of John and Louisa (Malticoat) Holland, natives of Virginia and Tennessee respectively. John Holland went to Tenn. with his father when a boy; he settled in Washington Co., Ark. in 1849; 1877 moved to Texas. He and his wife had eight children, namely: James R; Nancy, m. John Heaton; William H.; Adaline, m. Thomas J. Whitley; Franklin; Wiley; Houston; and Martha m. Sterling Denton.

James R. Holland left Washington Co., Ark. in 1874 for Belton, Texas and settled on DARS Creek. 1882 he sold his property to Mr. A. G. Lindamann and purchased land in Bartlett from W. G. Stockton, where he lived until 1887. He m. in 1867 Mrs. Marty T. Moore (nee Hutchins) dau. of Ellis and Mary (Shores) Hutchins, of Washington Co., Ark. Their issue: Mary, widow Elisha Gilliland; Ellis, Alice, Claud, and one deceased. Mrs. Holland has one dau. by first husband, Macy, now Mrs. R. B. Dickinson. (p 327)

JAMES W. WILLIAMS, of Falls Co. was b. in Alabama in 1850. His father, Jehu Williams, b. S. C. 1825, came to Tenn. when a young man, from there to Ala. and in 1869 to Texas, locating on Blue Ridge where he died 1890. He m. 1846 Martha Eden, b. reared and died in Morgan Co., Ala. in 1857, a dau. of James and Lucy (Walden) Eden, of Ala. They had James W., Lucy, m. Jacob Sumerell of Texas; Susan, widow Herod Freeman, Texas; Nancy Elizabeth, m. S. D. Hightower, Texas; Mr. Williams m. second Mrs. Amanda (McDowell) Herring, and had four children by her: Martha, m. J. P. Higgins, Texas; Judson, at home; Amanda, student; Hannah, at home.

James W. came to Texas with his father in 1869, in 1876 he m. Miss Ara Millerman, of Texas, (dau. of Sanford and Mary Millerman of N. C.), they have four children: Hugh, Irene, Julia and Ruth. (p 328)

RICHARD G. GRANT deceased pioneer of Coryell Co., Texas, was b. in Tenn., moved to Texas in 1848, after living in Pontotoc Co., Miss. 3 years. First settled Red River Co., then Rusk, and in 1850 Coryell. When the county was org. in 1854 he gave land for the county seat and established first store with Bill Alsup. He died Aug. 1858. His wife nee Adaline C. Fowler d. 1888. Their four children were: One d. y.; Malinda E., widow of John Cash; Martha P., widow of William Moore; John T.

JOHN T. GRANT, b. in Miss. Feb. 2, 1844, moved to Texas with parents. Married Jan. 8, 1867 Margaret E. Chaney, b. in Ark. and reared in Texas. Of their four children, only Lula A. and Walter E. are living. (p 329)

JOHN C. HIBITS was born in Ky., 1854, and reared in Monroe Co., Ky., His parents Andrew and Minerva J. (Dunlap) Hibits, were natives of Tenn. His father died 1882. At age of 24, John C. moved to northern Texas for 2 years, then to Bell Co., and afterwards to Hamilton Co., near Coryell. He m. July 1882 Miss Anna Bush of Salado, Bell Co., dau. of William T. Bush, early settler of Austin. They had three children: Bushey, John and Willie Hervy. (p 330)

JAMES THOMAS LAWRENCE, b. 1857 Nashville, Tenn., was son of George W. Lawrence. They both came to Texas in 1877, first Washington then Coryell Co. He m. 1886 Mrs. Mary S. Gardner (nee Cooper) and they have Eula and Vela. (p 330)

COLONEL STERLING C. ROBERTSON, Empresario of Robertson's Colony has a whole page

telling of his bold, daring and patriotic traits but little of his genealogy. (Note: All good students of Tenn. History know that Major Elijah Sterling Clack Robertson, was son of Col. Elijah Robertson and Sarah Maclin. Col. Elijah was son of John Randolph Robertson b. ca 1712 Scotland and m. 1739 Scotland Mary Gower, dau. of Captain Gower. They came to America and first resided in Brunswick Co., Va., where 8 of their 10 children were born) Major E.S.C. Robertson's son, General E.S.C. Robertson had his father's title and concession confirmed to him by The Republic of Texas. Colonel Elijah was brother of General James Robertson "father of Tennessee". (p 331)

W. L. AYRES, member of firm of Gardner & Ayres, merchants of Gatesville, Texas was b. in Buckingham Co., Va., 1851, son of M. L. and Martha R. (Hanes) Ayres, of Va. The paternal grandfather, John A. Ayres, Methodist minister of Va., was born and died there. Maternal grandfather, E. Hanes, died in Va. He was of French Huguenot descent. M. L. Ayres died 1854.

W. L. Ayres moved to Tenn. in 1867, and in 1870 was employed as clerk for a Mr. Gardner, of Gardner, Tenn., and became a partner. In 1882, he moved to Gatesville, Texas. He m. 1872 Miss Martha Chambers, native of Tenn., (dau. of John W. and Mariah Chambers, of Va.), and they have three children: M. L.; Corinne and Chambers. (p 334)

JUDGE X. B. SAUNDERS, attorney of Belton, Bell Co., Texas was b. Columbia, Maury Co., Tenn. in 1831, son of Joel Boone and Mariam Lewis (Kennedy) Saunders, natives of Ky. and Va. John Saunders, his grandfather m. Miss Sarah Grant, dau. of Gen. William Grant and wife nee Elizabeth Boone, youngest sister of Daniel Boone. His grandparents went to Ky. with Boone. Judge Saunders' maternal grandfather, Robert Campbell Kennedy, was b. Augusta Co., Va., son of William and Martha (Campbell) Kennedy, natives of Scotland. William Kennedy took part in the Revolutionary War. Martha Campbell was a Scotch lassie of house of Argyle, born at Ellerslie, country seat of Sir William Wallace. Her mother's maiden name was McGregor.

Judge Saunders' mother's mother was before marriage Miss Esther Edmiston, dau. Col. William Edmiston of Rev. and Henrietta (Montgomery) Edmiston. The Kennedys were Va. planters, and grandpa John Saunders was planter in Ky. (p 337)

JOEL BOONE SAUNDERS, educated Md., practiced medicine Millersburg, Bourbon Co., Ky.; Fayetteville, Columbia and Nashville, Tenn.; and later at Natchez, Miss., where he died Oct. 1833 at age of 37 years. Mariam Lewis Kennedy Saunders, his widow, died Mar. 29, 1846. Their children: Napoleon B., young lawyer died 1858 in Memphis; Joel Boone, lawyer, CSA wounded at Gettysburg, taken to Alabama where he died 1863. Sarah Grant m. Robert Weir lived in Germantown, Tenn.; Eliza Margaret m. Calvin L. Story of Lockhart, Texas.

XENOPHON ECONE SAUNDERS, educated Jackson College, Columbia, Tenn., read law Nashville, admitted to Memphis Bar 1854. 1855 moved to Belton, Texas, m. Dec. 17, 1857 Miss Annie E. Surghnor, dau. of John Surghnor of Leesburg, Loudoun Co., Va. Their six children: William Kennedy; Walter Cupples; Kathleen Shelly m. John T. Smither; X. B. Saunders, Jr.; Wilson M. Saunders; and Imogene Mariam who is attending the Athenaeum at Columbia, Tenn. (p 337)

THOMAS B. HOOVER, Bell Co., was b. in Tenn. in 1845, son of H. B. and Annie (Newhouse) Hoover. (For history of his parents see sketch of A. J. Hoover). Moved to Texas in 1866, lived in Lavaca and Williamson Counties. He and his brothers, A. J. and James settled in Hoover's Valley in 1870. Thomas B. m. in 1869 Miss Alta Gannaway of Texas, dau. of A. G. and Maggie (Whittenberg) Ganna-

Emily, m. Benjamin Hoover; James, Norvil, Annie and Thomas. Mr. and Mrs. Hoover have four children: O. B., A.J., Jr., Norvil and Maggie. (p 342)

JOE DENNIS of Bell Co., was b. Dec. 10, 1810 in Warren Co., Tenn. In 1836 he m. Miss Isa Seitze, of Warren Co., Tenn., b. Mar. 15, 1817. Three years later they moved to Madison Co., Ark., and on Dec. 10, 1848 started for Milam Co., Texas. Their 11 children are: Thomas died in the war; Disa Lambert died leaving six children, 17 grandchildren, and 1 great-grand child; Cleopatra Smith a widow with six children living, her oldest son Willie died leaving a widow and 2 children; J. Neal has six children. William N. has six; Sarah T. Elmore died leaving a husband and 5 children; Lawson Dennis has 5 children. Mrs. Allie Nall has 5 children. Isa m. Mr. Drake and died leaving 3 children. Mrs. Victory Drake has 7 sons and 1 daughter; Mrs. Mollie Hamrick, 3 children. (p 342)

COLONEL E. STERLING C. ROBERTSON, son of Sterling C. Robertson, was born in Nashville, Tennessee August 25, 1820. At the age of 12, he was brought to Texas He died on Oct. 8, 1879 leaving 12 children (Note: For more about his ancestors see his father.) (p 344)

J. W. POWELL, of Ruth, Coryell Co., was born in Maury Co., Tenn., in 1821, son of J. A. Powell, whose history appears in sketch of W. B. Powell. At age of 14 he moved to Miss. with his parents to Madison Co. In 1853 he came to Texas, Gonzales Co., moving in 1857 to Coryell. In 1858 he m. M. J., dau. of G. B. and Nancy Ann (Jackson) Medlin, b. 1833. Her father was b. 1801 in N. C. and came to Texas in 1836. Her brothers and sisters were: Samuel A.; John L.; Nancy Ann; Ester I. m. Columbus Basham; R. C. m. Mr. Reeves; Caledonia m. William Kinsie; and George Ann m. Mr. Grier.

Children born to Mr. and Mrs. Powell: G. A. m. Florence Harris; J. E. m. Lucinda Bradford; J. D. m. Lizzie Dixon; S. I. m. Josie Mohier; B. P.; Hibernia; Robert E. Lee; and Charlotte Jane, deceased. (p 345)

MACLIN ROBERTSON, Salado, Bell Co., was born in this county in 1860, son of General E. Sterling C. Robertson and his (second) wife Mary E. (Dickey) Robertson. General Robertson's family was composed of the following named children: Randolph; Louella m. Judge Z. T. Fulmore of Austin; H. P. of Temple; Marion of San Antonio; Maclin; Manie S. m. Richard Harrison of Waco; Walter L.; Birdie m. Senator Cone Johnson of Tyler; Imogene m. Jarchi Gamble of Marion; Lela and Celita. By his first wife (his cousin Eliza Robertson) he had one son, Sterling C. now of San Angelo, Texas. (Note: Some family histories say that Birdie, who m. Senator Cone Johnson was also a child of his first wife. LJG) Maclin Robertson married June 10, 1886 Alice Woods of Texas a dau. of Captain T. E. and W. A. (Wilkinson) Woods. Two children, Mary E. and Gladys, have been born to them. (p 345)

J. McDONALD THOMSON of Belton was b. Jan. 1843 at Old Nashville, Texas. His parents, W. D. and Pamela (Evans) Thomson were natives of Tenn. Alexander Thomson, paternal grandfather, was an early settler of Giles Co., Tenn., coming to Texas with the Robertson Colony and died 1863 in Burleson Co. at age of 82. He had six sons: W. D., father of J. McD., taught school in Tenn. and came to Texas in 1835, died in Austin 1866, where his wife died in Aug. 1888. J. McDonald Thomson m. in 1867 Miss Ellen Cammack, Arkansas native, but resident of Texas since infancy. They had 8 children. (not named). (p 346)

WILLIAM R. SYPERT (TOBE) was born in Shelby Co., Texas Oct. 5, 1841, son of William C. and Parmelia B. (Perry) Sybert, of Wilson and Smith Counties, Tenn., who married in 1838. The great-grandfather of our Wm. R. was wounded in Rev. War and his son, Lawrence was in War of 1812. The Sybert family was of German

descent. Mr. and Mrs. Sybert had 12 children: Samantha m. W. H. White, William R., Joseph M., Mary A. m. Dr. W. F. Sharp of Ovilla, Eliza H. m. G. T. Sharp of Sutton Co., John O. of Rogers, Sally D. m. O. W. Shertliff of Milam Co., Leila A. m. J. F. Williams.

Parmelia B. Perry was b. Oct. 6, 1819, a dau. of Ben Perry of N. C. who died in Tennessee aged 87 years. William Perry of French descent served in Rev. War.

William R. Sybert moved with his parents to Tennessee when 1 year old. In 1849 he returned to Texas, Nacogdoches Co., 1853 to Cherokee Co., and 1855 to Bell Co. He m. Jan. 1868 Miss Etna Reed, dau. of Jefferson Reed. They had 9 children: Irene m. T. D. Jones; Carroll P., Jefferson R., Victoria, Etna and Leonora. The mother born Oct. 11, 1845 died May 1, 1890.

Mrs. Patsy Reed, mother of Mrs. Sybert was b. in Ala. Jan. 6, 1823, dau. of Samuel Cobb of Ala., brother of Williamson Cobb. They came to Texas early. Mrs. Reed moved with her parents to Miss. In 1837 they came to Texas. In 1839 she m. Jefferson Reed who was b. Ala. July 5, 1818, and came to Texas with his parents in 1833. Their 10 children include: Amanda m. John Dennis, David C., Etna m. Wm. R. Sybert, John W., Mike, Thomas J., Patsey m. J. T. Goggins, Miley m. D. C. McLean, and Cobb. (p 347)

A. T. DOOLEY of Coryell County was b. in Patrick Co., Va., in 1847. His father, Alfred Dooley, native of Rockbridge Co., Va., b. 1818, was one of 20 children of his twice m. father. Alfred Dooley lived in Va. until 1858 when he came to east Tenn. At age of 21 years, he m. Margaret Angeline, dau. of Silas Taylor of Va. Their children: Nelson, William G. d. 1861, McHenry of Knoxville, Tenn., A. T., Robert O. of east Tenn., Mary Augusta, Lucy A., Thomas S. of Ky., Eliza E. m. Mr. Hitch of Indiana, Clinton L. of Knoxville, Alice and Emma d.y.

1870 A. T. Dooley went to Kansas then to Texas. In 1877 he m. Sarah E., dau. of Alfred Coop, who was killed in 1878. He was from Tenn., but lived in Ark. previous to his coming to Texas.

Mr. and Mrs. Dooley had: Virginia Ella, Emma May, William Alfred, James Thomas, George Mack and Benjamin Harrison and an infant. (p 349)

DR. LYCURGUS D. FORBES, deceased, was son of Dr. Robert Forbes b. 1806 in Tenn. came to Texas in 1853 to Falls Co., and died there on April 24, 1871. He m. 1832 Elzira Long of Tenn., dau. of Benjamin and Nancy Long of Ky. They had Dr. Lycurgus D. and Nancy who m. Wm. Peck of Freestone Co., Texas. Lycurgus D. was b. in Tenn. in 1835, moved to Texas when 18 years of age, m. in 1869 Mrs. Hollingsworth nee Sallie Scogin, dau. of Toliver and Caroline (Davenport) Scogin of S. C. and Ala. By her first husband, Richard O. Hollingsworth she had one child, Richie m. Samuel Peyton of Regan, Texas. By Dr. Forbes she had Lizzie, Carrie, Robert, Nannie, Walton and Edwin. (p 350)

J. R. BERTRAND of Pirmela, Coryell Co., is a native Texan born in Brazoria Co. in 1831. His father Peter Gabriel Bertrand, native of Island of San Domingo, West Indies, fled to Cuba, then came to N. Y. City and later Florence, Ala. He next located in Nashville, Tenn. until 1829 when he came to Texas. He m. Ann Offut in Lauderdale Co., Tenn. They had: Elizabeth Ann m. William T. Austin of Galveston, Thomas L. died 1857, G. A. died 1885, Peter died 1862, J. R., and F.O. of Duval Co. In Dec. 1869 Mr. Bertrand m. Mary F. Cayce b. 1851 in Texas, dau. of Col. H. P. Cayce who came to Texas from Tenn. early. The Cayce children were: George W., H. P., Charlotte V. m. J. R. Dickey of Gatesville, M. F. now Mrs. Bertrand, Gussie and Hallie deceased, Lillie m. W. H. Hanks, Bell m. J. C. O'Brien of McGregor, and Bose.

Mr. and Mrs. Bertrand have: J. R., F. H., E. A., Austin, Otis, Lillian, Laura E. and Richard Albert. (p 350)

A. R. ALLEN of Pidcock Ranch, Coryell Co., was born in Miss. in 1842. His father, John Allen, b. in Ala. 1817 came from Miss. to Texas in 1850 to Fayette Co., moved in 1861 to Lavaca Co., died in Confederate service 1862. John Allen, grandfather of A. R., also native of Ala., came to Texas, Cherokee Co. A. R.'s father m. at 22 Miss Cynthia Frame of Tenn. and they had: A. R., Mattie m. J. J. Tomlinson of Eastland Co., James, N. J., John, Addie m. Samuel Davidson, Fannie m. Joe Vancel.

1885 A. R. Allen came to Coryell Co., 1867 he m. Mattie Winters who died the next year without issue. 1869 he m. Mary Dockery and they had James W., Annie m. M. G. White, and Minnie E. His second wife died in 1873 and in 1878 he united in marriage with Miss M. J. Davis, dau. of David Davis of Tenn., and had: Ira D., William E., John Thomas, Albert L., George M. and Morgan J. (twins) and Henry Walter. (p 351)

NOAH FRANKLIN FOUTS of Gatesville was b. in Tenn. in 1858, son of N. L. and E. M. (Coxsey) Fouts, of N. C. and Tenn. Mr. Fouts' grandfather came from Germany when 6 years old stopping in Pennsylvania. His father died in 1868 in Tenn. Mother still survives. In 1878 Noah F. moved to Gatesville, Texas. His brother A. S. Fouts engaged in business with him. In 1887 N. F. married Miss Onie Copeland of Tennessee, dau. of Dr. W. J. and Onie Copeland of Tenn. They have one dau. Corrie Ione. (p 352)

PETITION - ROANE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, MINUTE BOOK "Q", APRIL 7, 1856

(Contributed by Mrs. L. G. McCluen, Rockwood, Tennessee)

A Petition of Sundry Citizens of Roane County were presented to the Court which is in the words and figures following, towit:

To the Worshipful County Court of Roane County at the April Session 1856 we the undersigned your petitioners respectfully represent and show to your worship that owing to the fact that the 13th Civil District has been lately enlarged and the election ground changed to the Post Oak Springs it has become very inconvenient for those living in the upper part of the District to attend the elections and tax giving in or gathering in said District, and in consequence of such enlargement and removal of the precinct of the 13th District a new District can be formed out of the upper part of the Territory and the 13th District and the lower part of the 14th District lying west of Little Emery towit, commencing at the mouth of Big Emery thence running up the same to the mouth of Little Emery thence up Little Emery to the county line in the Gap of the mountain above Dearmonds thence with the county line on top of the mountain west to Big Emery thence down Big Emery to Willis Durrett's mill thence a south direction with the road leading from Durrett's mill by Andrew Derricks and across the Pine ridge to the farm road where W. K. Reagle now lives thence eastwardly with the Ford road to A. L. Greens, thence up the road from his house to the mouth of Emery, the beginning, that the above boundry contain a population of about eighty five voters or thereabouts perhaps more or less. Your petitioners citizens residing within the boundry above designated pray your worships to make an order establishing the above bounds a new Civil District to be called District No. 16 or to No this District 14th and to change the No of the 14 to 15 and 15 to 16 and that the election precinct of this new District be located and established at Azariah Coopers at the most suitable house on his premises and in duty bound your petitioners will ever pray:

And there being two thirds of the Justices present on the Bench concurring it is ordered and decreed by the court that the prayer of said petitioners be granted and that the foregoing designated boundry be and it is hereby declared a Civil District and to be known as District No. 16 in Roane County with all the rights and privileges of other Districts in said county and that the election precinct therein be and the same is hereby established at Azariah Coopers in said District and that the sheriff of this county proceed and advertise to hold an election on the first Saturday in May next in said District to elect a county Judge and two Justices of the Peace and a Constable in said District according to the Constitution and Laws of the State.

REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS BURIED IN LINCOLN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

(Contributed by Mrs. John R. Barnett, 106 McTighe Drive, Bellaire, Texas 77401,
from OBSERVER, a newspaper printed in Fayetteville, Tennessee)

Jesse Woodruff: died October 13, 1826. Buried on the Chenault place four miles east of Fayetteville.

Benjamin Porter: buried at Stewart graveyard three miles south of Fayetteville, born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1762, moved to Lincoln County in 1809, died 1828.

Benjamin Rowe: buried in Stewart graveyard.

George Blakemore: buried in family graveyard on Gingerbread fork of Cane Creek.

Ephraim Dickey: buried on Mrs. Josie Lauderdale's farm three miles west of Fayetteville. Died 1840.

Captain Jacob Ritch: buried at Salem, died 1831.

Captain John Farrar: born in England 1750, came to America 1770, located in Lincoln County in 1810, died 1830. Buried in Farrar graveyard, now on farm owned by Mr. P. Hobbs.

Henry Moores: born October 9, 1744, died February 1, 1814. Buried on the Conger place at Mimosa.

Charles Berrier: buried at the Southworth graveyard between Lincoln and Kelso. Died 1850.

Lt. William Robinson: came to Lincoln County from Guilford County, North Carolina in 1807, died in 1813. Buried in the Wesley Blair graveyard on Coldwater Creek.

Captain Andrew Caruthers: came from Wytheville, Virginia in 1807, died 1811. Buried in the Wesley Blair graveyard. Kings Mountain was one of the battles in which he fought.

"Granddaddy" Gage: buried in the Billy Thomison farm in the 5th District, one mile east of Booneville.

Arthur Dudley: buried in the Amos Small graveyard, now known as the George graveyard, near Bellville.

Major William Smith: owned, lived and was buried on the Steve Buchanan farm near Howell.

Joseph Greer: came to Lincoln County in 1804. Sold goods in Philadelphia in 1791-92. Was standard bearer in the historic battle of Kings Mountain. State of North Carolina gave him 3000 acres. Married Mary Ann Harrison, had 5 boys and 6 girls. Lived on Cane Creek. Had twin sons Jake and Thomas. 2nd generation - a son of Mr. and Mrs. John Breast. 3rd generation - 2 sons of Mrs. and Mrs. George R. Gillespie. Joseph Greer had three brothers who settled in Bedford County.

December 4, 1764 died in Gibson County.

witnessed the surrender of Cornwallis. A descendant is Dr. W. W. McNelley of Fayetteville.

Alexander Meek: appeared in Court October 19, 1832, resident of Lincoln County, age about 68 years. Applied under act of 1832. Born in Cumberland County, Maryland, December 14, 1764. July 1779 lived in then Washington County, Virginia. Enrolled in Revolutionary War when 15 years old. Drafted and served three months under Major William Edmiston, Regiment of Colonel Archibald Campbell, company commanded by Sergeant John Robertson. September 1, 1780 in company commanded by Capt. James Dysert and Lt. Samuel Meek, my brother. Rendezvoused at Abingdon, Virginia, marched to Watauga River, joined North Carolina troops under Colonel Shelby. In battle of Kings Mountain. Pension record: S 7218 BLWt. #24827 160 acres '55.

Ralph Smith, Sr.: born 1762 in South Carolina. Died after 1850 in Lincoln County, Tennessee. Drew pension. See 1840 census.

W. C. Smith: born 1760, died August 15, 1846, age 86. Served in North Carolina line, drew pension in Lincoln County, Tennessee, lived with Larkin Smith. See 1840 census.

Alexander Forbes: born 1761. See 1840 census.

Micajah McElroy: born September 20, 1760 in Wake County, North Carolina, died after April 19, 1834 (signed deed) in Lincoln County. He and son, William McElroy, built the first courthouse of Lincoln County. Enlisted in Revolution in 1780 and 1781. Pensioned as a Private. S 2785 Certificate 7679 - Act of June 7, 1832.
