## THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

While in Spring a young man's fancy may turn to love, the zealous genealogist's fancy turns to the open road of adventure and the pursuit of Ancestors. Mrs. E.M. Standefer sailed for Europe on April 15th, and Mrs. Scott Julian left the 16th. They will visit the interesting and historical places of fourteen countries.

Virginia Walton Brooks returns to Europe for the 13th time when she joins the MAGNA CHARTA tour, composed of members of the Hereditary Order of the National Society of Magna Charta Dames. Virginia will attend a special service at ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL in commemoration of the 750th anniversary of the Magna Charta, and on June 15th, the group will attend ceremonies at RUNNYMEDE. There will be a special performance of John Arden's Magna Charta play at the Mermaid Theatre. As they tour the historical old towns, they will visit ancient castles and residences of the seventeen sureties for Magna Charta. As a member of the DESCENDANTS of KNIGHTS of the GARTER, Virginia will be privileged to attend QUEEN ELIZABETH's service to fill the vacancy of the late SIR WINSTON CHURCHILL. She proved her eligibility through her ancestry to King Edward III, founder of the Order.

Lillian Gardiner's "Genealogical Tour of England, Scotland and Wales", with extended continental travel, sounds like a genealogist's dream come true. Her travelling companions, Annie Rice and Katie Prince Esker, have spent much time abroad. They know their way among the myriad records in the British Museum, Somerset House, The Public Records Office in London, and many other depositories in Great Britain. With their aid, she anticipates finding some exciting documents. Lillian also plans to do research in the HUGUENOT records of old "THREADNEEDLE CHURCH", London, to check on her ancestor who was an early Mayor of Canterbury. She too will visit Saulsbury Plains in this Anniversary Year of the signing of the Magna Charta by King John. She will see Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip on May 14th, and attend the famous "DERBY" at Epsom Downs on June 2nd. A month on the continent, then HOME.

We wish to thank the program committee for the delightful and informative forum on the evening of April 19th, at the Main Library, McLean Boulevard and Peabody Avenue. Jackson Mobley Collingworth acted as moderator. Laurence Bridges Gardiner emphasized the importance of making family charts, with complete data on each member. Many times, the often repeated family names will give valuable leads to the ancestors you seek. He warned that if you don't start with family charts, you will find yourself going back to make them. Quinten Dowdy told, among other helpful ideas, about carrying a small tape recorder and a 35 mm. camera on your field trips. When the courthouse or library does not have a copying machine, this conserves precious time. Thomas Proctor Hughes, Jr. showed how he uses base maps, obtained from highway departments, in his research, and to show areas covered by the books in his valuable personal library. Both Mr. Hughes and Mr. Gardiner warned members about assuming that you are descended from the first wife that you find for your progenitor, because in early days, most men had several wives, due to the mortality rate of the women. Jonathan Kennon Smith keeps his material in interesting manuscript form. He uses photographs of letters, ancestors, and their homes, as well as drawings of floor plans of the houses. When possible he lists the books in their libraries, as all this reveals something of the character of the people and makes them real. A question and answer period followed. Our sincere thanks to each of these gentlemen.

As proof that our members do not hunt ancestors all of the time, Mr. and Mrs. William Crawford each won a trophy at the Bridge Tournament held recently in Memphis.

We shall be eagerly awaiting the return of our travelers and hope to share with you some of the exciting results of their trips.

THE BULLETIN of the Stamford Genealogical Society, 7 Fourth Street, Stamford, Connecticut 06905, March 1965 issue, contains several pages of definitions and examples of terms and expressions used in early documents and explains how their use may aid the researcher in determining family relationships and social position of an ancestor. The terms and expressions include: Sir, Esquire, Mr., Mrs., Gentleman, Deacon, Goodman, Goodwife, Freeman, In-Law, Cousin, Brother, Sister, Nephew, Natural Son, Natural Relations, Friend, Single Woman, Predecessor, My Now (or Present) Wife, Servant, Master, Senior, Junior, 3rd, 4th, 5th, Johan, and the Possessive Case.

The January-March 1965 QUARTERLY of the Central West Texas Genealogical Society, 1717 Austin Avenue, Waco, Texas 76701, has two pages about research in South and North Ireland.

G. K. Hall & Co., 70 Lincoln Street, Boston, Massachusetts 02111, lists three reference works that are of interest. They are INDEXES TO MARRIAGES AND OBITUARIES IN THE MASSACHUSETTS CENTINEL AND THE COLUMBIAN CENTINEL, 1784 TO 1840, compiled by the American Antiquarian Society. The Marriage Index, 4 volumes, \$180.00, contains nearly 80,000 names, alphabetically arranged, with a considerable number of marriage records for states in the South and West, as well as the Atlantic Seaboard. The Index to Obituaries, 5 volumes, \$230.00, comprises about 120,000 names in alphabetical order. QUAKER NECROLOGY, 841 pages, 2 volumes, \$185.00, contains references to death notices of Quakers in the Middle Atlantic region. Dates range from 1828 to 1960. GENEALOGICAL INDEX, The Newberry Library, 3915 pages, 4 volumes, \$275.00, contains well over 400,000 surnames arranged alphabetically in reference to sources in several classifications in which the name appears: town and county histories, published family histories, vital records and kindred works.

The Orange County, California, Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 1587, Orange, California 92669, QUARTERLY, Volume 2, Number 1, contains an abstract from a newly discovered Pittsylvania County, Virginia, "Estray" book, with data ranging from 1778 to 1852.

LIBERTY BELL ASSOCIATES, Box 51-MP, Franklin Park, New Jersey 08823, have announced a microfilm publication of a HEADS OF FAMILIES INDEX to the 1850 Census of the City of Philadelphia. It represents a volume of 480 pages. The price is \$19.50.

The Washington County Historical Society, Box 484, Abingdon, Virginia, reminds us that they reprinted their first eighteen bulletins in one volume last year. The price is now \$6.50. Areas of interest in the book include the State of Franklin, Sullivan County, Tennessee, the Holston Country, and Southwest Virginia.

From the MEMPHIS PRESS-SCIMITAR, daily newspaper, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 15. 'Where Does It Go? - Sheriff's Deputy J. D. Rogers today was trying to find out where this gravestone belongs. It was left last night on the doorstep of a home in Germantown. The sheriff's office is trying to locate the cemetery it was stolen from. The gray stone has this inscription: 'Thomas Wherry, born March 3, 1779, died July 7, 1858, age 79 years, four months and four days'."

We have efficient sleuthing forces in Shelby County. The April 22, issue of the same paper announced that the tombstone can be returned to its proper place, thanks to Mrs. Violet Hutcheson of Cossitt-Goodwyn Reference Library. Mrs. Hutcheson found that it was from Wherry Cemetery, consulted Mrs. H. W. Cooper, 10070 Highway 64 East, Memphis, who said it came from Chambers Chapel Methodist Episcopal Church, a private cemetery, still in use. It is one of the oldest cemeteries in West Tennessee, about 150 years old, two miles west of Eads, Tennessee, in Shelby County.

THE EVENING TELEGRAM, Rocky Mount, N. C., runs a column called "I'm Thinking" by an Old Reporter. We have discovered that the "Old Reporter" is Mr. Hugh B. Johnston, Jr., Rt. 4, Box 133, Wilson, N. C. Mr. Johnston is an expert on Wilson County, North Carolina, and of special interest to us is his knowledge of the families who migrated from that county to Robertson County, Tennessee, in the early 1800's. Clippings of the above column in our possession set forth anecdotes and statistics on the families of John Bell of Bell Witch fame, and his nine children and their spouses; Frederick and Kate Batts and their children, Benjamin and Elizabeth Farmer, Jesse and Keziah Johnston, Hugh Cravey, Josiah Fort, Sugg Fort, and others.

DAVENPORT AND SELBY CEMETERIES IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Contributed by Mrs. Ernest Hutcherson, P. O. Box 154, Rockwood, Tennessee 37854, who copied the inscriptions in December 1964. The notations are the words of Mrs. Thomas Wood, nee Ruth Davenport, great-granddaughter of Claiborne and Elizabeth (Tollett) Davenport. This is a complete listing of all inscribed stones of both cemeteries. Both cemeteries have some graves marked by field stones. They are located in the extreme head of Sequatchie Valley, in Bledsoe County until Cumberland County was formed in 1856, and are accessible only by walking two or more miles. The smaller Selby Cemetery is within sight of the Davenport Cemetery.

## THE BIBLE OF WATKIN WILLIAM WYNNS, 1742-1812

On August 18, 1964, while in Henry County, Tennessee, Miss Ellen Marie Venable of Houston, Texas, located the Bible of Watkin William Wynns in the home of distant cousins, Mrs. Stanley D. Williams and her sister, Miss Orene Wynns, Route 4, Paris, Tennessee. The Bible had been handed down to them through their ancestor, Samuel Wynns, who settled in Henry County, that part adjacent to, and once part of, the western end of Stewart County, Tennessee, in 1820-1821.

Samuel Wynns was the youngest son of Watkin William Wynns. Samuel's land indenture, found between the pages of the old Bible, is included here because of names, places, and dates mentioned.

The will of Watkins William Wynns, Captain in the Revolutionary War, is contained in Will Book No. 2, Page 220, Martin County, North Carolina. He was the son of John Wynns, and grandson of George Wynns of Bertie County, North Carolina. (Ref. N.C. Wills, 1663-1789, Vol. XXXV, Page 65 and Page 67.)

Mrs. Williams and Miss Wynns loaned the Bible to Miss Venable for restoration, photostating and microfilming, with the intention of many years in mind, i.e., to make these records available to interested persons.

The records given here are the result of many hours of painstaking work to bring out every name and date possible. It is hoped that they will be of help to many of those who are tracing their Wynn-Wynns-Winns ancestry.

Handling the crumbling, yellowed old paper with infinite care and patience resulted in almost complete recovery of the records. The special talents of the following persons were applied with the highest degree of skill toward the restoration. Many thanks to each of them.

David W. Bizzell, County Historian, Microfilm Department, Pulaski County Court House, Little Rock, Arkansas: Microfilms and technical advice.

Howard "Sonny" Watson, Graham Blue Print Company, Little Rock, Arkansas: Photostats of records, before and after restoration.

Joseph L. Jones, 359 Wilson Street, North Little Rock, Arkansas: for the delicate work of brushing on those names and dates too faint to show up on the first sets of films and photostats, and for designing and "antiquing" Bible cover.

Where names or words are enclosed with parentheses and underlined, it is to designate that these portions were supplied from some other record available to the transcriber, and not taken from the Bible records. Where there is a record

or entry too dim to transcribe, it is so stated at that particular point. The oldest records in the Bible were, by a strange twist of fate, generally in better condition than entries made in later years.

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## TENNESSEANS IN CENTRAL TEXAS

CHARLES DABNEY, Precinct 3, McLennan Co., was b. 4 May 1851 in Murray Co. (Maury), Tenn., only child of William Dabney and Sarah E. Sedberry. Father is physician of Lodi, Miss. Mother was native of Tenn. probably near Columbia. Charles M. Dabney came with parents to Texas when quite young and located at present home 7 mi. north of Waco. Grandfather Sedberry bought 557 acres of land in 1857 which subject inherited. Mr. Dabney md. 23 Dec. 1881 to Miss Ida T. Douglas, dau. of Judge Thomas C. Douglas and Frances N. Cantrell. Her parents came to Texas in 1868, settling near Waco on Brazos River. Her father also was County Judge of Sumner Co., Tenn., for number of years. Mrs. Dabney was b. 13 Sept. 1862 and came with parents to Texas. Mr. and Mrs. Dabney have 3 children: Sarah E., Mattie L., and Alice D. (p 383)

J. B. FAUNT LE ROY, Gatesville, was b. in 1828 in Shenandoah Co., Va., second of seven children born to Joseph M. Faunt Le Roy and Eliza Bowman, both natives of Va. The father moved to Tenn. about 1833, locating in Montgomery Co. Sold property in 1858 and moved to Ky., locating near Paducah. He died there in 1867 where his widow still resides. Joseph A. Faunt Le Roy, grandfather of our subject, was native of Va. and stayed there, as were the Bowmans. Grandfather Isaac Bowman was Revolutionary War soldier. Subject J. B. Faunt Le Roy came to Texas in 1872, taught school in DeWitt Co., then in Gatesville. He md. Miss Nannie Allensworth in 1859 in Ky., she was a native of Ky. They had 4 children: Stephen, who d. 1861; Jessie; Annie, wife of Hammett Smith of Ala.; and Emmett. Mrs. Faunt Le Roy d. in 1886 (p 386)

JACOB DENTON, McLennan Co. came to Montgomery Co. in Jan. 1870 for 6 yrs., moved to Waco, then to Hill Co., 11 miles northwest of village of West. Later acquired large acreage 1.5 miles north of West overlooking Alligator Creek. Mr. Denton was b. 11 July 1846, 8th of 12 children born to George Denton and Sarah B. Robertson, natives of Tenn. and Miss., respectively. The parents md. in north Ala. The father died in 1870 in Sumter Co., Ala. The mother died in 1891. She was Mr. Denton's second wife. Jacob Denton, first-born (sic) in family, md. 4 Jan. 1870 to Miss Sarah Fendall Neilson, dau. of Dr. Robert Neilson and Charlotte Warren. Her father was a physician, native of Augusta, Ga. The mother was from Ky. She died in April 1870 and her husband now practices in Northport, Ala. Her ancestors came from England and were men of note. Mr. and Mrs. Denton had 5 children: George N., William R., Earnest Lee, Frank E. and Alice. Only George N., William R., and Frank E. survive. Mr. and Mrs. Denton adopted an orphan girl, Alice Ashley. (p 386-7)

W. V. MILLER, Gatesville, was b. in Maury Co., Tenn., in 1856, a son of A. C. Miller and Minerva Akin, also natives of Tenn. The paternal grandfather, Vincent Miller, was born in N. C., was early pioneer of Maury Co., and died there. The maternal grandfather, William Akin, was a pioneer of same county in Tenn. A. C. Miller resides in Obion Co., Tenn. W. V. Miller was reared in Middle and West Tenn. and came to Texas in 1877, locating at Gatesville. He md. in 1884 Ora Murrell, native of Coryell Co., and dau. of Lemuel Murrell, a pioneer of this county, who was assassinated about the close of the war. Mr. and Mrs. W. V. Miller have 2 children: Raby and Bruce. (p 388)

W. B. HEDGPETH, Coryell Co., was b. in Tenn. in 1839, a son of J. W. Hedgpeth and Jane Beavers, natives of Tenn. The paternal grandfather, Jeremiah Hedgpeth, was born in N. C. of English ancestry and was a pioneer of Tenn. The Beavers family are of Welsh descent and came from Va. The grandfather, William Beavers, was also a pioneer of Tenn. J. W. Hedgpeth came to Texas in the fall of 1860, settled in

Coryell Co., and died there in July 1890. The mother died about 1876. W. B. Hedg-peth came to Texas in 1872 to Coryell Co. He md. in 1860 Miss Harriet Luna. They have 7 children: Frances J., wife of J. W. Tyson; M. G., of this county; W. L., of Coryell; Louisa, wife of E. P. Morgan; R. H. and J. D., in school. (p 388-9)

ELI WILLIAMSON, Coryell Co., was b. Washington Co., Ark. in 1835. His father, Stephen Williamson, was b. in S. C. in 1791 but emigrated to Miss. when a young man and md. Sarah, dau. of Dutton Sweeton. They had: Joseph, of Panola Co., Texas; John, of Glasscock Co., Texas; Sereno, wife of Wilson Patterson; D. S., of Lampasas Co.; D. M., decd.; Eli, our subject; Nancy, decd., wife of Albert Jones; an infant son who died in Ark.; Mary Ann, wife of M. Hampton; Rachel, decd., wife of W. R. Basham; Sarah, decd., wife of Wilson Rogers; W. R., of Lampasas Co. Stephen Williamson moved from Ark. to Miss. then came to Texas in 1833. Located first in Rusk Co., then in 1849 moved to Burleson Co., in 1850 to Bell Co., and in 1854 to Coryell Co., settling on Bee House Creek. Was killed in 1863 by Indians. Eli Williamson md. 14 Mar. 1860 M. E., dau. of Enos Bone of Tenn. Children are: John Henry, decd.; Stephen; Allie, wife of W. W. Robinson; Lucy Exar, wife of Bush Williamson; Mollie J., wife of Lewis Hill; M. W.; and Parcy. (p 389)

SAMUEL DILLIARD BURKE was son of Jesse Burke and Sarah Harland. Jesse Burke was b. in Tenn. in 1806, son of James Burke and Jane Dilliard, natives of S. C., he being one of 13 children. From Tenn. he moved to S. C., then to Ala. in 1836, to Ark. in 1859, to Texas in 1867. Jesse died in Falls Co. in 1873. Sarah was dau. of James Harland and Margarette Laughton, all natives of S. C. She died in Falls Co., Texas in 1877. Children of Jesse and Sarah Burke: Francis Marion, decd.; Eliza Jane, decd., wife of D. Dilliard (her 1st husband, J. L. Conner, died at New Madrid 3 Jan. 1862); Thomas J., drowned in Talladega Co., Ala. 17 Apr. 1842 at age 6; Geo. W., died 9 July 1861 in Ark.; Lucretia was fifth born; Mary L. living in Ark.; Henry H. lives Navarro Co., Texas; Samuel D.; John H. died 20 June 1890; William Z., whose sketch appears elsewhere in this work; Jasper N. died in 1871; Elias M. died in Ark. in 1860; Aaron Rufus of Navarro Co.; and Mary L., who died at age 4. Samuel D. Burke was b. in Ala. in 1843. Went to Ark. in 1862. Came to Texas in 1868 and located on Blue Ridge awhile. Was md. in 1865 to Tementia Webb, of Ark., dau. of Merideth Webb and Sarah Johnson, natives of Tenn., who came to Ark. early. Mr. and Mrs. Burke have had 11 children: Sarah Ellen F.; John R.; Cornelia C.; Jesse K.; Christiana O.; Jasper H. H.; James S.; William Z. M.; Lucretia T.; Mary M.; and Grover C. Sarah Ellen F. md twice. First husband John M. Burke, died in Ark. near Ozark 12 Jan. 1885; second husband John E. Millwer, native of Ark., now resides Falls Co., Texas. John R. Burke died 19 Nov. 1868 as infant in Dardanelles, Ark. (p 396-7)

SEVERE E. SNODGRASS, M.D., of West, McLennan Co., b. in White Co., Tenn. 5 May 1849, eldest of 11 children born to Thomas Snodgrass and Eliza Evans. The father's ancestors came from Ireland early and located in Va. Thomas practiced medicine in Tenn. about 25 years. Now lives at Crossville, Tenn. Thomas was one of 7 brothers: David, decd.; Robert died Chattanooga, Tenn.; John, killed at Franklin, Tenn.; Will, decd. near Sparta, Tenn.; Samuel, of White Co., Tenn.; Henry C. of Chattanooga. Eliza Evans is dau. of Col. Severe Evans of Tenn. To Thomas and Eliza were born 5 sons: D. L., of Tenn.; W. D., Pikeville, Tenn.; C. E., Crossville, Tenn.; J. W., Sparta, Tenn. Severe E. Snodgrass lived in Sparta until coming to Texas in 1882. Stopped for short time in Waco with Jo Willis and Curtis, then moved to West. He md. 5 May 1874 Miss Belle Marchbanks, dau. of Burton Marchbanks and Julia F. Goodbar. Burton Marchbanks was brother of Judge Marchbanks of Warren Co., Tenn. He died about 1868. Mrs. Marchbanks lives with her dau., Mrs. Snodgrass. Mr. and Mrs. Snodgrass have had 4 children: Lawrence, Katie Rotan, Thomas Burton and Martha Eddie. Our subject is 1st cousin of E. Rotan of Waco, also cousin of J. W. Throckmorton, ex-governor of Texas, and a nephew of Henry Snodgrass, Congressman from Tenn. (p 397-8)



W. A. COLE, Bell Co., was b. in Tishomingo Co., Miss. 11 May 1859, third of a family of 5 children. His parents, John T., and Sirena (Pigg) Cole, were natives of N. C. Andrew Cole, father of John T., was native of N. C. but removed to Miss. with his family. The maternal ancestors were also early settlers of the same state. John T. Cole came to Texas in 1881, now resides near Temple. W. A. Cole was 7 yrs. old when his parents moved to McNairy Co., Tenn. He was educated at Baldwin, Miss., and in 1881 came to Texas. On Aug. 17, 1886 he md. Miss Mary S. Davis, native of Ky. They have 2 sons, William Albert and Ernest Allan. (p 403)

J. F. BASHAM, Coryell Co., was b. in Giles Co., Tenn., in 1831. His father, Solomon Basham, was b. in Tenn. in 1796. He left Tenn. in 1835 and moved to Crawford Co., Ark., where he died in 1872. His father was Richard Basham. Solomon Basham was married at age 22 yrs. to Elizabeth Marler. Her mother's maiden name was Coffey. The result of this union was: Cynthia, wife of Jacob Miller; Coffey Basham, of Coryell Co.; John M., decd.; Susan, decd.; J. F.; Columbus, of Eastland Co., Texas; W. R., also of Eastland Co.; America, wife of George Camp; Jasper N., of Ark.; Thomas Jefferson, also of Ark.; Henry, of La.; and 3 daughters who died infants. J. F. Basham came to Coryell Co. in 1854. He was married in McLennan Co. in 1852 to Dicy Ann, dau. of William Wagener, of Tenn., and Julia Emory, dau. of Jesse Emory. Mrs. Basham's parents had the following children: Julia; Esabell, wife of Andrew Winn; Elizabeth, wife of Matthew Couch; Dicy Ann; Solomon; William R.; and John A. The children of Mr. and Mrs. Basham are: William, decd.; Solomon; Johnson, decd.; Lee, decd.; Leonora, wife of R. S. Rogers; Callie, wife of Joe I. Culp; and Leler, Wiley, and Kate. (p 403-4)

DR. RETURN JONATHAN POPE was born in Maryville, Blount Co., Tenn. in 1844, youngest child of Rev. Fielding Pope and Theressa C. Meigs, natives of Va. and Ky., respectively. The father died in 1867 and the mother in 1855. Dr. Pope's grandfather Pope was of Scotch descent and lived in Va. and Ky. His grandfather Return Jonathan Meigs was relative of Gov. Meigs of Ohio. His uncle, another Return Jonathan Meigs, died in Washington, D. C. in October 1891, aged 90 years. Dr. Pope spent the winter of 1865-66 in Ga., then came to Texas the spring of 1866. He first located at Springfield, Limestone Co. After graduation from Washington University, Baltimore, in 1870, he began practice in Jonesboro, Coryell Co. He was married in 1873 to Miss Fannie Crow, native of Texas, dau. of A. J. Crow. Her father was born in Miss., came to Texas at early date, and settled in Fayette Co. She died in March 1879. She was mother of Teressa, Thomas A., and Mahala, who died in infancy. Dr. Pope later married Miss Annie Crow and by her had Return Jonathan; Parthenia; Fannie, Etta and Kathleen, all three died in infancy; and Fielding. Mrs. Pope died in March 1879. (p 407)

DANIEL DUNN, Coryell Co., was b. in York dist., S. C., in 1828. His father, John B. Dunn, was also b. in S. C. about 1794, but moved his family to Cass Co., Ga. in 1847 where he remained until his death in 1864. He married Annie, dau. of Daniel Peeler, of S. C. They have 5 children: Daniel, our subject; Mary, who married Anderson La Losier, of Tenn.; Aaron, who died March 29, 1891; Moses, who was killed at Franklin, Tenn.; William M., of Rome, Ga. Mr. and Mrs. Dunn have 6 children: Rachel A., decd., who married Dr. Sanders and left 2 children; Mary W., decd., wife of Mr. Coleman, who left 3 children; John, married Lulu Touchstone of Coryell Co., who have 2 children; Elizabeth, wife of Rev. J. A. Hardin, has 9 children; Ella, wife of Patrick Walsh, has 4 children; Fannie, wife of Monroe Gloss, has 3 children. (p 407-8)

PROF. WILLIAM O. ALLEN, West, was b. in Shelby Co., Ala., April 28, 1839, eldest of 2 children of William S. Allen and Elizabeth Thweatte. The father was a native of S. C. but later moved to Shelby Springs, Ala. He died in November 1889. The mother was a native of Ala., dau. of John Thweatte, and Miss Manning. Mrs. Allen

died in Ala. in 1848 and in 1850 the father married Miss Sarah Norris, native of Md. They were parents of 2 children, one of whom died at age 6 years. This lady lives with her daughter, Mrs. Dixon, in Texas. William O. Allen came with parents to Texas at age 18. After the war, he taught school in Burleson Co. In 1876 he moved to Utah for 5 years, then came to Mart, McLennan Co., Texas. In August 1890 he came to West. In 1892 he moved to Waco, Texas. Mr. Allen was married January 3, 1867 to Mary L. Jennings, dau. of James W. Jennings and Mary Perry. The father was a native of Tenn., but moved in fall of 1865 to Falls Co., Texas, where he died in October 1881. The mother, Mr. Jennings' second wife, died in Burleson Co., Texas, in September 1873. Mr. and Mrs. Allen have 5 children: Laura and Lulu, twins; Mary Lelah; Stella, died age 4; and James William, who died in infancy. (p 408-9)

NAPOLEON B. HORNE, McLennan Co., was b. in McMinn Co., Tenn. in 1828, son of Riley Horne and Hannah Shockley, natives of Tenn. and S. C. respectively. The father was born in 1800. Great-grdf. Horne came from England to America during the Rev. War and settled in Wilmington, N. C. whence his children moved west over Tenn. and Ky. Riley Horne and his brother West were tanners in Athens, Tenn. He moved to Ga. and died at Tunnell Hill in the Civil War. Mr. Horne had lived in Polk Co., Tenn. after leaving Athens and before going to Ga. He and his wife had 8 children: Napoleon B., our subject; Harris H., died in war; Elkana, decd.; Samuel, killed at Fort Gaines, Ala. in war; Thomas, decd.; Mariah, wife of Joseph Finley, is decd.; Felix, supposedly decd.; Charles, decd. Mrs. Horne survived her husband until 1882, when he died in Texas at age 70 years. Napoleon B. Horne came to Texas in 1849 and located at Tyler, Smith Co. In 1854 he came to McLennan Co. His brother Horace was with him. Mr. Horne married in 1853 to Miss Caroline Shamblin, native of Tenn., dau. of John Shamblin and Sarah Schoffer. Mr. Shamblin died in Tenn. and his widow came to Texas with her family. She now lives with her dau. Mrs. Horne, and is 83 years old. Five of her 13 children still live: Margaret, wife of William Mayfield; Amanda, wife of W. B. Hancock; Caroline; Samuel, of Moody, McLennan Co.; and \_\_\_ McCelrey, wife of James Shoffer. Mr. and Mrs. Horne have had 13 children, all living: Almedia, widow of W. S. Tuttle; Robert; Alice, wife of James D. Hoy; Margaret, wife of L. C. Connelly; Samuel; Sarah; Elgiva, wife of Columbus Harris; Willis; Thomas; Clifton; and Mattie. (p 409-10)

J. M. SYPERT, Bell Co., native of Tenn., b. in 1843, fourth of a family of 12 children. His parents were William Carroll Sybert and Amelia B. Perry, also of Tenn. The father came to Texas in 1836, returned to Tenn. and married Permelia (sic) B. Perry. Returning to Texas in 1839, he settled in Augustine Co. In 1842 he returned to Tenn. again. In 1849 he came back to Texas but did not locate permanently until 1854 in Milam Co. near the Bell Co. line. He died there in 1886 but his wife survives. The paternal grandfather, Lawrence Sybert, was a native of S. C. and pioneer of Tenn. J. M. Sybert, our subject, was reared in Nacogdoches Co. In 1868 he married Virginia C. Reed, dau. of William Reed, and two years afterward moved to Bell Co. They have had 4 children: Mary H., wife of T. J. Sumrall; Permelia; Benjamin, Texanna, who died age 3 yrs.; and Leni Leoti. The family moved to Holland in 1886 where they still live. (p 410)

ZACHARY DAVIS, McLennan Co., was born in Dade Co., Mo., May 15, 1849, third of 5 living children born to Francis Davis and Rebecca Kendall. The father, native of Tenn., moved to Dade Co. at early date, where he married about 1844. In 1863, while the father was in service, the mother and family came to Texas. After several moves, they finally located in 1864 near Bold Spring, now the village of West, McLennan Co. Mr. Davis died in Baxter Springs, Kansas. In October 1870, the mother (a native of Ind.) moved with her parents to Mo. in an early day. In 1873 she married W. M. Oliphant, who died in 1886. The mother still lives with her daughter, Mrs. Marable, in Scurry Co., Texas. Zachary Davis was married June 13, 1871, to Fannie C. Martin, dau. of Patrick Martin. They have had 9 children: Francis P., who died March 2, 1890, aged 17; unnamed son died infant; John W.;

James T.; Fannie P.; Andrew Z.; Clifford J.; Ronda R.; and Roy B. (p 412-13)

SAMUEL H. BARTON, Bell Co., was b. in S. C. in 1854, second child of Dr. Welborn Barton and Louisa A. Cox. (See biog. of Dr. R. W. Barton, of Salado, this volume.) Samuel H. was a babe when his father came to Burnet Co., Texas. In 1865 they moved to Salado, Bell Co. Mr. Barton was married in 1874 to Miss Pinkie Garrett, of Bastrop Co., dau. of William Garrett and Eviline Blakey, natives of Va. and Tenn. respectively. The Garrett and Blakey families came to Texas at the same time and settled at Bastrop. Mrs. Barton's grandfather, L. S. Blakey, had a son Edward Blakey who was killed in 1839. His brother Lemuel Blakey, was killed at battle of San Jacinto. Mrs. Barton's father was drowned in spring of 1873, aged 58 years. He and his wife reared 5 children: Annie, wife of J. W. Aikin of Callahan Co.; Spill, decd.; Robert, of Coryell Co.; Pinkie, wife of Mr. Barton; and William, Callahan Co. Mr. and Mrs. Samuel H. Barton have 6 children: William, Randal; Blakey; Annie, decd.; Samuel, Jr.; and Susie. (p 413)

WILLIAM H. LANGDON, Jonesboro, Coryell Co., came to this county in October 1876. He was born in Dunklin Co., Mo. in 1851, second of family of eight children born to Edwin James Langdon and Sarah Ann Glasscock, natives of Vt. and Ark. respectively. His father was one of first white settlers in Dunklin Co. Mr. Langdon was married in 1871 to Mary Virginia Argo, native of Tenn., who died February 21, 1892. They had: Zuleika Ethel, Sarah Ann, Frank Argo, William, Edwin James, decd., and two others who died infants. (p 415-16)

W. C. NORTON, Coryell Co., was b. in Tippah Co., Miss. in 1861, third of seven children. His parents, Rev. J. W. Norton and Nancy C. Elliott, was born in Tenn. and Miss. respectively. At age 15 he came with parents to Coryell Co. In 1888 he married Blanche E. Smith, native of Texas, dau. of J. D. Smith of McGregor. Mrs. Norton is granddaughter of Reuben Ross. They have two children: Ruth and James Earl. (p 416-17)

STEPHEN E. OWEN, was b. Oct. 28, 1849 in Giles Co., Tenn., sixth of ten children born to Elijah Owen and Mary Carroll. The father was native of Va. but moved to Tenn. at early date and died there in 1867 about 50 years old. The mother still lives with a son in Wichita Co., Texas. Only five of her children still live, all sons. Stephen E. Owen came to Waco in February 1877, then to West, then in 1879 to Hill Co. He married Mary E. Mauk, dau. of William Mauk and Isabella Cobb. Mr. Mauk was born in Ga. and came at early date to Robinson Co., Texas where he was married. Later he came to McLennan Co. and now resides at West. Mr. and Mrs. Owen have 2 children: Edward Tilden, born Jan. 12, 1882; and Jefferson Crocket, born Dec. 5, 1885, who was killed June 11, 1892. (p 424)

DR. ROBERT W. NOBLE, Falls Co. His father, Moses G. Nobel, was born in Va. in 1829. In 1844 he went to Mexico in the war. He returned to Va. and in 1849 started for Calif., wintering in Mo., continuing to Calif. in spring. He returned to Texas in 1861, first in Hayes Co. After returning to Va., he came back to Texas at Harrisburg, then to Navasota until 1875, then to McLennan Co. where he now lives. The doctor's mother, nee Cornelia M. Noble was born in Hays Co., Texas in 1863. He moved in 1853 to Louisville, Ky. for some years, graduated in 1887 from Memphis Medical College, came to Barclay and settled. He married in December 1889 Mary Eunice Little, dau. of Lorenzo B. Little and Annie Moore, natives of Tenn. and Ala. respectively. They have one child. (p 424-5)

ROBERT J. GARRETT, Falls Co. His father, Thomas M. Garrett, was born in Giles Co., Tenn. in 1809 and moved to Anderson Co., Texas in 1839. In 1849 he moved to Falls

Co. and located on Blue Ridge, where he died in 1862. By his first wife, Manerva Reed, native of Tenn., he had three children: Mary Elizabeth, Cynthia Ann, and Robert J., only the last still living. Cynthia Ann died young. Mary Elizabeth married twice. She had no children by her first husband, John McDowell. By her second, William Erskine, she had two sons: J. F. and T. J., both of Falls Co. Thomas M. Garrett's second marriage was to Mrs. Cornelison, nee Brandon, whose parents were natives of Tenn. This union resulted in six children: Catherine, wife of B. F. Hickman, of Reynolds Co., Texas; James O., of Blue Ridge; Rhoda, wife of J. R. Hodges, of Ennis; Sarah, wife of D. R. Hodges, of Reynolds Co.; Thomas H., of Blue Ridge; Fannie, decd., wife of Edmond Stone, of Falls Co. Robert J. Garrett was born in Anderson Co., Texas April 14, 1841, and in 1850 came with parents to Falls Co. After war service, he located at present home in 1867. He married in 1863 Mary Smith, native of Miss., dau. of Ephriam Smith and Edith Smith, natives of N. C. Issue from their union is: Martha Ann, wife of J. A. Dunkum, of Marlin, Texas; Mary E., wife of Robert Jackson, of Kosse, Texas; Frances Luella, wife of Dr. G. P. Reeves, of Falls Co.; James T. and Gertrude, twins, the former of Iron Co., the latter of Tom Green Co., wife of H. K. FRANK B. BRATTON was b. in Robertson Co., Texas, in 1858. His father, Calvin W. Bratton, was b. in Tenn. in 1819. Calvin came to Texas in 1837, locating first in Robertson Co., then in Falls Co., where he died in 1876. Calvin's parents died when he was small, and he was reared by an uncle. In 1842 he married Sarah E. Graves, now decd., native of Tenn. and dau. of Dr. Ralph Graves. The doctor and his wife were both natives of Tenn. and emigrated to Texas early. Calvin and Sarah had 12 children: Mary N., of Kosse; La Fayette M., of Kosse; Ralph, decd., Sarah M., wife of J. R. Jarrott; Margaret O., wife of A. M. Fizer, of Falls Co.; Laura and Sally, decd.; Carrie, wife of E. P. Hearne, of Falls Co.; Calvin G., of Kosse; Frank B., our subject; and Emma and Alice. Frank B. Bratton married Mary A. Brown, native of Texas in 1880. She is dau. of J. P. and Mary (Bryan) Brown, natives of Tenn. They have 6 children: Calvin W., Mary A., Roy, Neal, Elba and Brown. (p 432)

DR. WILLIAM KILLEBREW, Marlin, was b. in Montgomery Co., Tenn., May 11, 1819, third of 8 children born to Edwin Killebrew and Mary Williams, natives of N. C. The father moved to Tenn. ca. 1800, where he married. He died Nov. 30, 1847. The mother died on Dec. 2, 1872, age 80. Dr. Killebrew moved in 1843 to Chambers Co., Ala. After father's death, he located near Hopkinsville, Ky. awhile, then returned home. In 1851, he came to Galveston, then to Indianola, then to Falls Co., arriving in June 1851. He married on Feb. 2, 1853, Jane J. Fortune, native of Greensboro, Ala., dau. of John A. Fortune and America Higgins, natives of Ky. The parents moved to Ala. early and on Dec. 24, 1851, settled in Falls Co., where the father died in 1863 in Marlin, and the mother in 1870, also in Marlin. Mr. and Mrs. Killebrew had 9 children, 4 living: America, at home; Susan, wife of C. T. Curry of Marlin; Mary, wife of William McComb; Willie, wife of Wm. Dubois. Mrs. Killebrew died May 1, 1873 and Dr. Killebrew on Jan. 9, 1892. (p 441)

WILLIAM R. KELLUM, b. Dec. 27, 1817, near Tuscumbia, Ala., eldest son of Edward Kellum and Karen Tabor. Edward was b. in Scotland late 18th century, emigrated to America, married Karen in Tenn., moved to Ala., then to Miss., and finally to Texas in 1851, locating in McLennan Co., where they died. They had 8 children: Elizabeth, decd., wife of W. F. Umbersom; Nancy, decd., wife of Louis Rheuson; William R., decd.; Smith, murdered on White Rock Creek; Polly Ann, wife of Dr. Kirkland; Edward, decd.; Maria, decd., wife of Willis Putnam; Emma, wife of Rev. John Puckett. William R. was married in Miss. to Jane Casper and they had 2 children: Edwin Parker, of Bosque Co.; and John Thomas Jefferson, decd. In 1851, Mr. Kellum accompanied father to McLennan Co. and settled. Mrs. Kellum died shortly after coming to Texas. On July 15, 1853, Mr Kellum married Mary E., dau. of James

C. and Elizabeth B. Journey, one of 9 children; James C., Jr.; Jane M., wife of S. F. Sparks; Mary E.; William F.; Reuben, decd.; John C., Sr.; Lucius J., decd.; Cyrus; Sarah A., decd.; and Nancy, decd. By his second marriage Mr. Kellum had 5 children: Emma J., wife of C. Falkner; Fannie H., wife of C. J. George; William C. whose sketch also in this work; Karen, wife of Walter S. Hurd; and James R., also in this work. William R. Kellum died 23 October 1890. (pp 449-50)

JOHN W. McDANIEL, McLennan Co., was born in Montgomery Co., Tenn., Jan. 28, 1827, eldest of 4 children of Joel McDaniel and Mahala McGuire. Joel was native of Tenn. and died there in March 1886, aged 85 years. In March 1870, John W. moved to White Co., Ill., where he lived until fall of 1873, then came to Hill Co., Texas. In December 1876, he moved to 2 miles northwest of West station. On October 25, 1851, he married Ann E. Small, native of Ky., dau. of Fredling Small and Mary Hill, natives of Va. Her parents moved to White Co., Ill. in fall of 1869, where the father died in 1872; the mother died in Tenn. age 65 years. Mr. and Mrs. McDaniel have one son, William A., born Nov. 25, 1854. William married in December 1876 Mary J. Smith, dau. of Robert Smith and Ursula Due, natives of Tenn. They have 4 children: William R., Eddy R., Warren P., and Alsa S. John W. and Ann also reared an orphan, Margaret Ashley. (p 455)

EDWARD R. EVERETT, Belton, was b. in Nashville, Tenn., July 20, 1864, son of E. F. Everett and Ellen Douglas, natives of Tenn. E. F. lives at Columbia, Maury Co., Tenn., and has 7 sons: Douglas, of Chattanooga; Thomas H., of Louisville, Ky.; E. R., our subject; Frank F., near Louisville; George W., of Nashville; William M. and H. S., twins, the former of Columbia, the latter at home. The Everett family moved to Columbia in 1864. Edward R. came to Dallas, Texas, in 1885 for a few months, moved to Austin for a year or two, then came to Belton in 1887. He married on April 29, 1891, Mayel Kegley, of Belton, a native of Bell Co. Her parents, Samuel Kegley and S. A. Carpenter, are natives of Ky. They have one son, Leland Stanford. (p 462)

ROBERT Y. VAUGHAN, McLennan Co., was b. in Hawkins Co., Tenn., June 27, 1824, but grew up in McMinn Co. He came to Texas in 1859, settled in Hayes Co., then in Polk Co. for 16 years, moved to Grayson Co., Bosque Co., finally to McLennan Co. near Waco, and now in that county near West. He married Martha A. Triplett, youngest of 12 children born to Joel Triplett and Jane Jones, of N. C. and Ky., respectively. The Triplett moved to Tenn. where Martha (Mrs. Vaughan) was born in 1836. After wife's death, Mr. Triplett moved in 1871 with family to Mo., where he died in May 1873. Mr. and Mrs. R. Y. Vaughan have 10 children: Thomas, John M., Tennie L., Sarah, Robert S., Flora M., Joseph M., Baesha A., Mary E., and Mattie Y. Mr. Vaughan's parents, Thomas Vaughan and Leah M. McCarty, were Scotch-Irish. The grandfather, James Vaughan, and two brothers, were from Va. Thomas Vaughan died May 1855. His widow died in November 1863. (p 462-3)

WILLIAM K. HAMBLLEN was b. in Lee Co., Va., Oct. 22, 1817, oldest son of Pascal Hamblen and Mary Williams, natives of Hawkins Co., Tenn. Pascal's father, Daniel H., was born and reared in Price Edward dist., Va. The family came from England and were among first settlers of Va. During 1812 Pascal B. lived in Lee Co., Va. He came to Texas in 1834. He settled on Chocolate Bayou in Brazoria Co., then moved to Oyster Creek until March 3, 1836 when forced to move, residing at Opelousas, La. a while, then returning home later. In 1837 they moved to Harris Co. until father's death in October 1844, age 55 years. Mrs. Hamblen died Dec. 5, 1878, 83 years old, in Milam Co. Pascal had 10 children: William K., John W., C. A., and Sarah lived to be grown; John W., Milam Co., has one son, Henry. C. A., decd., left a son, Joe. Sarah, decd., married twice. By first husband, Shylo Glasscock, she had William S., of Milam Co; by second, William Barge, she had John A. and Thomas J., both of Milam Co. William K. Hamblen came to Texas at age 17, lived in Montgomery Co. 2 years. In 1868 he moved to Salado and owns land in Bell and Milam Co. He has been married twice. On Nov. 22, 1855, he married Mrs. S. C.

(Medaus) Blakemore, of Tenn., dau. of James Blakemore and Sarah Potect. By her he had 4 children: J. P., of Williamson Co.; Sallie, wife of Dr. R. W. Barton, of Salado; John, decd.; and Mary, wife of L. H. Porter, of Milam Co. Mrs. Hamblen died in 1863. In 1864 Mr. Hamblen married Alice Gray, native of Miss., dau. of William Gray and Metilda Choat. Her father died in Miss. and the mother moved about 1849 to Texas. By second marriage Mr. Hamblen had 14 children: G. W., of Milam Co.; Sam, of Taylor Co.; Alice and John, twins, the former died in infancy; Bush, died Dec. 28, 1891, age 21; Vesta; Henry; Asa; Naomi; Emma; Ella; Annie; Rosa; Omega. (last two decd.) (p 454-5)

WILLIAM L. JONES, Coryell Co., was b. in Claiborne Co., Miss. in 1827, oldest of 13 children. His parents, Milton H. Jones and Kisiah Cubertson, were natives of Tenn.; moved to Miss. early; were married in Claiborne Co.; later moved to Yalobusha Co.; and in 1839 came to Texas and located in Shelby Co. Mr. Jones died Jan. 22, 1875 in Hood Co., his wife on Feb. 10, 1847. William L. Jones lived in Corsicana 1850-52, moved to Rusk Co., then to Mt. Enterprise, then to Bosque Co. In 1872 came to what is now Jonesboro. He married twice: in Bosque Co., Feb. 4, 1858, to Mary C. Loyd, native of Hempstead Co., Ark., who died April 25, 1864, leaving two children: Fountain E., of Arizona, and Allie K., wife of Thomas J. Atkinson, of Hamilton Co.; he married second Susan R. Thomas, native of Ala., by whom he had 3 children: Mary C. Hall, William L., and Wiley P. who died May 26, 1879. Alfred M., a son of the first marriage, died May 29, 1864. (p 471-2)

ELLIS A. BEAN, Coryell Co., was b. in Cherokee Co., Texas, Sept. 5, 1850. His father, I. T. Bean, resident of Bell Co., was born in Ark. Ellis P. Bean, his grandfather, was born in 1783 in Tenn. In 1801 he came to Texas but returned to the Eastern states until 1821, when he again came to Texas. Here most of his family were born and reared, but he (Ellis P.) died in Mexico. In 1847, I. T. Bean located in Bell Co. About 27 years he married Nancy, dau. of Kedar Boone, of N. C., and they had: C. A., who md. R. O. Jackson; Ellis A., our subject; James, of Bowie Co.; Almanto, of Indian Terr.; Mary, wife of Washington Collins of New Mexico; Thomas, of Indian Terr.; William, decd.; Joseph, of Bell Co.; Cornelia, wife of Jack Epperson of Bell Co.; Alice and Emma, single. Ellis A. came to Coryell Co. in 1882. On Sept. 3, 1875, he married Sarah Grimes, dau. of F. M. Grimes and Elmira Susan Farley. Her father was b. in Tenn., came to Texas in 1812, and lived many years in Washington Co., Texas, but moved to Coryell Co. and later years to Navarro Co., where he died. Mrs. Bean was b. in Coryell Co. in 1854, 8th of 11 children. Mr. and Mrs. Bean have: Henry, Elmira, William, Jesse, Joseph, and Charles. (p 472-3)

ANDREW FOUTS, Coryell Co., was b. in Tenn. in 1856, 6th of 9 children born to Noah L. Fouts and Elizabeth M. Coxsey. (see sketch elsewhere in this work.) He came to Texas in 1878, went to McGregor in 1881, returned to Gatesville until Sept. 1884, moved to Osage. Mr. Fouts married in 1884 Luella Bell Creasey, native of Texas, dau. of W. F. Creasey, a Virginian but a pioneer of Texas. They have: Creasey Noah, Andrew Bell and Bertha G. (p 479)

SAMUEL GREGG, Gatesville, was b. in 1838 in Sullivan Co., Tenn., son of James Gregg and Mary Johnson, second of 12 children. Both parents were born in Tenn. The father died there in 1866, the mother in Texas in 1882. Grandfather James Gregg went from S.C. to Tenn. early and died there. The Johnsons went to Tenn. from Pa. Samuel Gregg went to Iowa in 1866, then to Texas in 1867, located in Coryell Co. in 1870. In 1872 he married Phetna Newland, native of Ind., who came to Texas with her parents as a girl. They have: Florence, James Robert, Phetna Gertrude, Samuel Bertie, Emma Alma, and W. B. (p 486-7)

## ROANE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, CHANCERY RECORDS

(Abstracted by Mrs. Ernest Hutcherson, P.O. Box 154, Rockwood, Tennessee 37854)

The Chancery Court of Roane County, Tennessee, was organized in 1824. The first book contains cases between December 7, 1824, and the December Term of 1833. - Cases for the area had been tried at Knoxville, Tennessee, before the organization of this court.

Book 1, pages 1 through 22: James Wyly & Others vs. Baldwin Harle & Others.

Baldwin Harle & others had made bond December 31, 1819, with James Wyly, Arthur H. Henley and Jesse Wallace, security. (This case had probably been going on in Knoxville, Tennessee.)

## June Term 1825

The said James Wyly and Margaret Hall, Robert Wyly, Jane McCall, Martha Miller and Harris McKinley Wyly being children and heirs and Legatees of James Wyly formerly of Mecklenberg County and State of North Carolina deceased That the said James Wyly the Father resided in said county of Mecklenberg in the year 1771 and long before....possessed of a very large estate in lands, slaves and other property both in said county of Mecklenberg as well as on New River in what was then Botetourt County in the Colony of Virginia on the 31st day of Dec. in the said year 1771 made his last will and testament and appointed the Executors and executrix therein mentioned and died a few days or about a week thereafter....will proven and recorded in County of Mecklenberg at the next term...will, a copy which is hereunto annexed and marked exhibit number 1...at the time of the death of the said James the Father he left the said Martha a widow and eight children living as appears by said will the eldest of whom said John the son was then about 21 years the others proportionably younger down to the youngest the said Harris McKinley Wyly about two years old, That the then unborn child....died while a sucking infant...That the sons John and Thomas died within about a year after their Father's death, That Robert some time thereafter settled in Green County in what is now the State of Tennessee and married the said Dorcas, the said Robert died about 10 or 12 years ago and said Dorcas duly administered his estate....the said Jane shortly after the death of her Father was married while a minor to Francis McCall who since and but a few years ago died in West Tennessee the said Jane still living and residing in the Mississippi State, That the said Martha the daughter also shortly after her Father's death while a minor was married to Henry Miller and moved to Tennessee and in August last in 1819 the said Henry died, and his widow the said Martha resides in the county of Roane, That the said Harris McKinley Wyly is still living and resides in the State of Alabama, That about 1 or 2 years after the death of said James Wyly the elder his said widow and Executrix Martha Wyly intermarried with a certain David Miller who thereby became Co-executor in fact and in law....almost the whole of the personal estate.....came into the hands of David and Martha....(Names much property).....David Miller sold 15 or 16 valuable head of steers to Col. English ....sold a negro to Thomas Pope...further state that the said David and Martha his wife after living about two years on the estate of said James Wyly deceased in the County of Mecklenberg they removed into the said County of Botetourt in Virginia from whence they moved to Washington County in what is now Tennessee in or about the year 1780 or 1781 where they resided until about the year 1795 or 1796 when they removed to the said County of Blount where they continued to reside until their death; the said Martha dying about 14 years ago and said David in March 1819 died intestate. That the said David and Martha had three children during their intermarriage to wit Andrew Miller, who died without lawful issue,

Elizabeth who intermarried to Thomas Taylor, who are now both dead and have left a considerable number of children, the third child of said David Miller and his wife Martha being a daughter named Isabella, intermarried with a certain Baldwin Harle of Jefferson County in State of Tennessee, who at March term of said County Court of Blount immediately after the death of said David Miller, procured letters of administration upon his estate...said Baldwin...may be made parties and defendants to this Bill of Complainant....(much about what they had not received from the estate of James Wyly)...your Orator James Wyly acted as an agent for the other heirs frequently in the life time of their mother....David and Martha were growing old and desired they might enjoy the property during their lives....that their step father the said David who was become very old and infirm should enjoy said property during his life....(reason the heirs had not urged for a settlement)...Oratrixes further state that Robert Robinson and Robert Harris Junior two of those persons appointed Executors of the will of James Wyly the elder deceased resided in Mecklenberg County...have each departed this life.....

In the name of God amen. I James Wyly of the County of Mecklenberg in the province of North Carolina being sick in body; thanks be to God of perfect and sound mind and memory....Do make this my last will and testament, To wit,....I order dispose of and bequeath in the manner and form following to wit...I order my dearly beloved wife Martha the third part of all my personal Estate and a bed and the furniture thereon for her use and that she have the use of my plantation whereon I now live during her natural life or widowhood the better to support her and my children - I order that my Executors herein named do school my children...their mother do live on the land above until they arrive to age...(slave and other things to wife)...unto my Son John Wyly that five hundred acres of land on Reed Creek in Bortetot County in the Colony of Virginia...unto my Sons Thomas, James and Robert Wyly that tract of nine hundred and eighteen acres of land on Cripple Creek in Bortetot County...to be equally divided...(so that each would have his share when he came to age)...unto my youngest Son Harris McKinley Wyly the plantation that I now live on at his coming to age....I give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane my negro Female Slave named Dina...a mare worth twelve pounds a saddle and a bridle and such bed and furniture as they think proper...unto my Daughter Martha my negro Female Slave named Fanny...(also same as Jane, mare, etc.)...unto my Daughter Margaret the sum of fifty pounds proclamation money at her coming to age...(mare, saddle, bridle and bed with furniture as other daughters)...as it appears that my wife is now pregnant and near unto the time of her delivery, if it shall please God to spare her and the child when born...if a male I order my Son John Wyly to purchase a tract of land in the Colony of Virginia for him...if a female, I order ...schooled...furnish her with an equal dividend of my estate with my Daughter Margaret....if any of my sons die before they come to age...their share be equally divided amongst the survivors...any of my daughters die...be equally divided amongst surviving females...appoint my dearly beloved wife Martha Wyly, my Son John Wyly, my brother Robert Robinson and Robert Harris Junr...executors...subscribed and affixed my seale in my house at the County aforesaid this 31 December 1771.....

Proved Jan. Term 1772 in Mecklenburg County, N. C.

A committee appointed by the Court of Mecklenburg County met to settle the orphans' estate April 9, 1787, at the house of Robert Harris Sr..."the records respecting the estate of James Wyly Dec'd had been lost in the year 1780 by reason whereof we cannot certainly know..." They got together all the vouchers, receipts, etc. for



a new accounting.

In the answer of Baldwin Harle: ... Jane Wood left this country in 1808 or 1809 .....had a conversation with David Miller in 1809....Miller said Jane Wood whom this defendant supposed to be Jane McCall mentioned had made a demand on him before she went to the Natches....

In the Chancery Court Minute Book, First one, page 5, the case is styled thus:

James Wyly for himself as agent for Dorcas Wyly widow James her son for Jane McCall, Martha Miller and M. Wyly and as guardian for Elizabeth, Lucinda and four other minor children of Robert Wyly dec'd and James Hall and wife Margaret VS Baldwin Harle and Isabella his wife, David Taylor and Isaac Taylor, Carruth and Martha his wife, Montgomery and Isabella his wife.

Note: The defendants are the heirs of David Miller and his wife Martha, who was the widow of James Wyly. Isaac and David Taylor, Martha Carruth and Isabella Montgomery evidently are the children of Elizabeth Miller and her husband Thomas Taylor, who were said to be dead in the first account.
