Dear Tennessee Genealogical Society Members,

We are quite excited over budding plans for our Genealogical Seminar to be held in Memphis on August 24-25-26, 1967. Complete plans will be announced in our next issue, but we want you to put this date on your 1967 calendar now.

This will be a seminar designed to upgrade the quality of genealogical research by setting guide lines for research methods, genealogical analysis, and disposition of material (that is - as to publication or placement in a genealogical depository.)

We believe this material will appeal to the Family and Semi-professional genealogists and perhaps be of most help to more of our members than any other subject.

Our booth at the Mid-South Fair in September created much interest. We believe the time and energy spent was well worth the trouble. Cleo Webb (Mrs. Bunyan) brought copies of LDS Pedigree Referral Sheets for all members present and explained how to fill them out. This should be helpful to all concerned. Betty Goff spoke of our plans for the seminar. Lillian Gardiner (Mrs. L.B.) passed around a form Mr. J. Hobart Bartlett had left with the Gardiners when he visited them here, and explained the plans for publication of the 1850 Tennessee Census. Members agreed to help with this project when they could. Judith Julian (Mrs. Scott) told graphically of her search for her Huguenot Ancestor in the Weaver-L'Orange line to which all roads seem to point, but for which no real proof has developed. The group contributed a few ideas for her continued research.

Mr. and Mrs. Gardiner, Mrs. L.D. Bejach and Mrs. Bunyan Webb appeared before the Arkansas Genealogical Society on October 3, 1966. Mrs. Gardiner's talk was about Source Material in East Tennessee. Mrs. Bejach's subject was Middle Tennessee. Mr. Gardiner discussed West Tennessee with the exception of Shelby County. Mrs. Webb presented a genealogical records tour of Shelby County. The program was well received.

October is an open meeting at 7:30 p.m., Memphis Public Library, Peabody and McLean. Guests are welcome. Jerry Blair (Mrs. W.R.) will come down from Nashville and review the book recently off the press OUR FAMILIES by Jace Young (Mrs. Charles G.) and Virginia Tucker Oliver (Mrs. A.C.). Ruth Duncan (Mrs. I.G.), one of our first Presidents, and who is moving to Winston Salem, North Carolina, will review her book THE CAPTAIN AND THE S.S. HUNLEY which has had wide acclaim. Other members who have had books published recently have been requested to review them at this time. We look forward to a pleasant evening.

Crawford, our Librarian, Mrs. Bunyan Webb, and I have stuffed and sealed, sorted, and tied some thousands of envelopes. Mrs. Augusta Brough set up the queries for the first three quarters of 1966, and was then forced to resign because of her business schedule. We wish her well in her new work. Mrs. Robert Louis Cox accepted the task of indexing for 1966. I really do not know all of our members who helped with proofreading. There were many, and among them were: Mrs. Gardiner, Mrs. L.D. Bejach, Miss Margaret Bell, Mr. and Mrs. Crawford and Mrs. Henry N. Moore. We have proof-read so much this year (1954-1959, 1960 and 1966) that I cannot say who read what.

We have encl_{Os}ed with this issue two pages furnished us by Mr. Bill R. Linder, Editor of Publications, The Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, Inc., 107 South Main Street, Salt Lake City, Utah 84111. One of these pages is a registration form for the Pedigree Referral Service file of their society, and the other is a page of instructions for completing the registration form.

Only a few new books have been announced recently:

ASHTREE ECHO is the new publication of the Fresno Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 2042, Fresno, California 93718. It is a bi-monthly magazine, price \$2.50 per year. This first issue contains some thirty pages of California and New England records. Among the records they plan to publish are those of the 1852 census of Mariposa County. That census contained 8000 or more names of miners, prospectors, etc., who had come to the great 1849 gold rush. Many stayed in California, and many returned to their homes in the East.

RECORDS OF PUTNAM COUNTY, GEORGIA contains 1813 Tax List, the 1820 and 1830 records of Heads of Families, the county residents drawing land in the Lottery of 1832, and the Index of Wills, 1808-1856. Putnam County was erected in 1807 from Baldwin County. The volume is priced at \$6.50 and may be ordered from Frances Wynd, 2009 Gail Ave., Albany, Georgia 31705.

Mrs. Emma Robertson Matheny, 1718 Glenview Road, Richmond, Virginia 23222, has announced publication of two books: Highland County, VIRGINIA, 1850 CENSUS, price \$6.50; and 1850 CENSUS OF WARWICK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, price \$3.00. Warwick County, established in 1643, is unique in that it was the only county never subdivided except for minor adjustments. Highland County is on the border of West Virginia and was formed in 1847.

REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS BURIED IN MISSOURI is a compilation of records secured from the different DAR Chapters of Missouri. It is a volume of 300 pages, price \$10.00. Order from Mrs. Hale Houts, 230 W. 61st St., Kansas City, Mo. 64113.

Our respected member, Mrs. Ellen Davies-Rodgers, is the author of two books of history of the Episcopal Church. They are THE ROMANCE OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN WEST TENNES-SEE and THE HOLY INNOCENTS, price of each volume, \$8.00. Our congratulations go to the Tulsa Genealogical Society, 1507 East 21st Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma 74114. They have recently issued Volume 1, No. 1, of TULSA ANNALS, a journal which will be published three times a year. Subscription price is \$3.00. This first issue contains data on eight cemeteries in Towa Illinois and Arkanssa and John we garding headright and bounty grants.

Mrs. William R. Parkes wrote and said many kind things about "ANSEARCHIN'" NEWS. She reminds us that she edits a genealogical column in the Jackson, Mississippi, DAILY NEWS, called "Family Trees", and welcomes all queries from our readers. The address is P. O. A new and enlarged second edition of THE NORTH CAROLINA GENEALOGICAL REFERENCE is now ready for distribution. Co-authors are Dr. Wallace R. Draughon and William Perry Johnson. The 570 page book contains information on county formation, courthouse hours and fees, libraries and genealogists, church and cemetery records, a surname index on over 8000 family lines as found in collections of six libraries in North Carolina, 16 pages of maps plus many other valuable data. EMIGRATION TO OTHER STATES FROM SOUTHSIDE VIRGINIA, Volume II, has been published by Mrs. Katherine B. Elliott, P.O. Box 353, South Hill, Virginia 23970. Price is \$10.00. This volume is a continuation of a series giving some information on some of the emigrants including the county and state to which they went.

Mr. Ralph L. Winters, 315 Commerce Street, Clarksville, Tennessee 37040, has published HISTORICAL SKETCHES OF THE WINTERS FAMILY. It contains not only family material but also data on early Davidson County, maps and petitions. Price is \$4.50, or \$7.00 for hard cover.

Mrs. Ursula S. Beach, County Historian, has published ALONG THE WARIOTO, THE HISTORY OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE. It may be ordered from the Kiwanis Club, P. O. Box 54, Clarksville, Tennessee 37041 for \$7.50.

The Genealogical Publishing Co., 521-23 St. Paul Place, Baltimore, Maryland 21202 has announced the reprinting of PENNSYLVANIA GERMAN PIONEERS, a publication of the original lists of arrivals in the port of Philadelphia from 1727 to 1808, price \$25.00 for the two volumes. HISTORY OF SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA, 1746-1786, by Lewis Preston Summers has also been reprinted and may be ordered for \$17.50.

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Questions have been received from time to time about the release of the 1900 and later census records. Mr. Jonathan Kennon Smith has provided us with the answer from the Department of Commerce:

> "Under provision of Title 13 of the United States Code, records of the 1900 and later Censuses are not available to the general public. Certain information from these censuses may be furnished, however, under conditions set out in Sections 8 and 9 of Title 13, and the rules and regulations of the Bureau.

"In addition to the legal restrictions of Title 13, Presidential Proclamations have been issued prior to each of the last six decennial censuses assuring the American people that there need be no fear that any disclosure would be made regarding any individual person or his affairs.

"Prior to 1900 none of the Census Acts contained express language making Census information confidential. However, Section 21 of 30 Stat. 1014, which authorized the 12th, or 1900 Census, charged all Census employees with responsibility for non-disclosure of Census information, except as might be authorized by the Director. Penalties were provided for violation of this provision. The language of Section 21 is the precedent for the present section 9 of Title 13."

Persons interested in these census records should write the U. S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, Personal Census Service Branch, Pittsburg, Kansas 66762.

BOOK REVIEWS

OUR FAMILIES: TUCKER-SCOTT (1965, by Virginia Tucker Oliver and Jane Young. The Revilo Press, Proctor, Arkansas. \$25.00)

Genealogies are of many kinds. This recent acquisition of the Society is a tribute to the parents of one of the authors, and as such traces the ancestry of each parent to the earliest proven progenitor. Succeeding generations are included to the present date, and as each new family surname is introduced through marriage, an effort is made to indicate the lineage as far as possible. Charts for each generalogical segment provide help in understanding the relationship of each generation. One overall chart showing the relationship of all the subjects treated might also have been helpful.

Serious genealogical research over a 30 year period provided the early ancestral connections. Documental proof is clearly given and wherever family tradition or supposition is given at all, it is clearly indicated as such. The book is a delightful melding of the lovingly prejudiced family member tempered by the cool analysis of the skilled genealogist. It is a collection of family anecdotes and memorabilia which will be preserved for the generations yet to come, providing for them more than an outline of the family tree, giving them also a warm appreciation for the forbears they will come to know through this book.

Jane Young is a member of The Tennessee Genealogical Society and has served the group as Librarian, as Corresponding Secretary, and as Board Advisor. She has conducted genealogical training schools for both novice and advanced members and has also given generously of her time in helping members work out their problems. It is therefore most rewarding to see the fruition of her years of effort and those of Virginia Oliver so beautifully presented, published and preserved.

INDEX OF REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSION APPLICATIONS (1966, National Genealogical Society, 1921 Sunderland Place, N.W., Washington D.C. 20036, price \$27.50 (\$22.50 to N.G.S. members.)

For many years the National Genealogical Society OUARTERLY carried an index to all of the Revolutionary War applications for pensions and bounty land. These original records have their permanent home in the National Archives in Washington, D.C. This monumental work, with its supplements, is by far the best handy-book for genealogists with many ancestors who participated in our War for Independence. It is as trustworthy as it is thorough. This book is indexed by pensioners (alphabetically arranged) and supplies the most vital information abstracted from the original records. A code number is given, so that one may send to the National Archives for a definite soldier. A typical notation reads:

<u>Peabody</u>, Joseph, Mass., Dis. No papers. See American State Papers, Vol. 9, pp. 59, 110 and 162. This sold. was wounded by a musket ball, which entered Enl. 4-15-1777, dis. Apr. 1780.

Thousands of widows applied for pensions as a result of their husband's services (Act of Congress, July 1843). Such an application would be noted as:

Thompson, Charles (veteran), Va., Mary (widow) W 1514.

An indispensable period research aid -- this wonderful, wonderful index!

PETITION FROM FRENCH BROAD AND HOLSTON COUNTRY - SEPTEMBER 22, 1813

(Contributed by Mrs. James O. Maddux, Post Office Box 71, Rockwood, Tennessee 37381)

Citizens residing South of Frenchbroad and Holston between the Rivers Tennessee and Big Pigeon asking body as tender parent to extend fostering care to every member. The difficulty and inconvience to which they have been subjected in common with the rest of fellow citizens of Tennessee by the unjust agression of a vindictive and asspiring enemy upon lawful commerce --- petitioners who not withstanding their best efforts have been still had the mortification to find themselves incapable of easy money from any of the products of their labors. We now too find ourselves called on by our general goverment to contribute our primary aid toward carrying on a war for the defence and maintenance of some of our discint rights --- usupation of our ancient and inviterate foe -- a war to the support of which we are bound by every principle that can influence a people --- in our present situation we find it will be utterly impossible for us to contribute our proportion to the general tax and to rain money enough to pay even the interest upon our investments. We have not the among us --- and do with truth asure you that our coffers were drained even of their last cent. We could not rain --- Both policy and patriotism furnish a ready answer let the lesser object yield to the greater --- let us unite with all our energy to carry on our war with vigor and not by crippling any part to suffer on sinew of the body policie to be relaxed when the war is over and an honorable peace shall be established your petotioners will then with gratitude exert every faculty to comply with the demands of the state ---

PETITION FROM THE FRENCH BROAD AND HOLSTON COUNTRY - 1813

To the general assembly of the state of Tennessee at the session of 1813. The memorial signers citizens of the District South of the rivers French broad and Holston -they are indebted to the state for their lands, and since they have been indebted from the scarcity of spicie in the country and the reduced price of property and the feltered and stagnated situation of the commerce --- prevented their farm procuring so much money --- and further that nearly one half of the land for which owe the state would not sell for the debt --- that the state removing the lands would turn many hundreds of families out of the houses and homes they have had for many years --- many grants were issued by the state of North Carolina for lands in this district which cover nearly one half of the land ---

THOMAS H. MILLER of McLennan Co., b. S.C., Oct. 7, 1832, son of Charles and Rebecca Hamilton Miller. The father was son of Charles Miller, a Colonel in Rev. War. The father died during the war and the mother in 1876, age 81. Thomas H. moved with parents first to Alabama, then to Tenn. where he grew up, and he worked in Memphis until he enlisted in Co. A of 4th Tenn. Reg. in War Between the States in 1861, moving to Texas in 1870. He married in 1865 Miss Alpha O. Cox, b. Franklin, Williamson Co., Tenn., Oct. 20, 1841, dau. of M.G. and Elizabeth A. Cox. Father died April 16, 1878, age 72, and her mother age 66, Sept. 19, 1878, of yellow fever. Thomas H. had one child, Charles B. b. Nov. 3, 1867. (p. 697)

They had four daus. and 2 sons of which J.T. was the eldest. Jan. 15, 1874, J.T. married Rebecca J. Connor, and had Lonnie B., b. Feb. 23, 1875. He m. 2nd Mar. 28, 1888, Miss Elie West, dau. of John J. and Adeline (Curtis) West. Mr. West was b. in Ala., but moved to Texas, Montgomery Co. His second wife died July 17, 1889 leaving him with an infant son, John L. b. Dec. 26, 1888. (p. 502)

L. R. WADE was b. in Alabama 1847, oldest child of Robert J. and Martha E. (Moss) Wade, Virginians by birth, the grandparents were also from Virginia and among the pioneers of Franklin Co., Ala. The maternal grandfather was a soldier of War of 1812. Robert J. Wade moved to Tishomingo Co., Miss., in 1850 where his son L.R. joined the Confederate Army. After the war, L.R. moved to Corinth, Miss., then to Jackson, Tenn. for two years. In 1878, he came to Texas. In 1879, he married Miss Annie Green, of Ala., and they have Robie Lucile and Lucian R., Jr. (pp. 556-557)

Article from THE MEMPHIS PRESS-SCIMITAR, Memphis, Tennessee, September 13, 1966: "Indians Hunting Documents On Ancestry, Atmore, Ala. - (UPI) - Documents of ancestry from Creek Indian Nation members are to be hunted to help distribute nearly \$4 million paid by the U.S. for nine million acres of Indian land. The land was seized for the U.S. by Gen. Andrew Jackson more than 150 years ago. A meeting here Monday night of some six tribal leaders on the Nation's council adjourned quickly after they learned from an attorney the need to include documents in a congressional bill being prepared to handle dispersing the funds. The \$3,913,000 awarded last year is currently in the U.S. Treasury drawing interest. 'Thousands of people are involved,' said Calvin Mc-Ghee, chief of the Creeks east of the Mississippi, who led the battle through the courts for the award. He filed suit in 1951 after seeing a newspaper story that Congress had passed a law in 1946 allowing Indians to sue the government for lost lands."

Mrs. Elizabeth Gee was the widow of Nevill Gee. She was Elizabeth Andrews before her marriage in 1797 in Mecklenburg Co., Va.

Pages 109-133 June Term 1825: Benjamin Clark VS John Clark

John Clark and Parham Wall were security for Benjamin Clark to prosecute his case, bond dated 3 July 1821.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Supreme Court of Errors and Appeal sitting in Chancery at Knoxville, for the Second Judicial Circuit of the State of Tennessee.

Your Orator, Benjamin Clark, of Knox County, Tennessee, some short times before the 8 Oct 1818 ... John Clark of the same county (who has the same surname with your Orator, but is no relation) proposed selling to your Orator a certain tract of land, in said county on the waters of Beaver Creek ... Orator desirous to purchase a small piece to live on having but a short time before removed from North Carolina ... executed ... to said John, his several notes ... said John represented tract contained 225 acres ... (notes of \$300 due Nov. 1818; \$237.50 due Nov. 1819; \$237.50 due Nov. 1820. John Clark executed his title bond to Benjamin. John Clark agreed to pay back the initial payment if Benjamin found he could not make the second payment).. Your Orator paid ... a debt of \$300 due from said John to the estate of Thomas Humes deceased ... Orator agreed to build said John a house for \$100 ... Orator let the land go back ... John refused to refund any of the \$434.50 credits.

Answer of John Clark filed 19 Nov. 1821 ... says he did make a contract with complainant ... denies any fraud ... had sold the land to him when he could have sold it to Mr. Thompson ... price of land had taken a mighty and sudden fall ... Respondant states that Major John Calloway, Caleb White and Robert Marly also pressed Respondant to accede to the offer of Complainant ... Respondant was indebted to Robert Marly ... Marly offered to wait until the sale of the Cherokee lands in November then following ... Mr. White also said he would lend respondant what money he might need, that he expected to obtain money due him from the estate of Aquila Low deceased ... Major Calloway was one of the executors of the estate of said Low ... Mr. Greer offered to the buy the land ... sold fifty acres to James Scott for \$2.00 per acre ... John Clark swore to the facts stated 19 Nov. 1821.

John Clark a witness for Compalinant deposed that some time after his Father the Complainant and John Clark the defendant had been talking about the terms of the contract ... deponent passing that way called and stayed all night with defendant...

The family of complainant (Benjamin Clark) at the time of the compromise consisted of himself and wife, one grandson ten or eleven years old, one granddaughter six years old and three daughters grown ... complainant was fifty five to fifty eight years old ... William and Matthew Clark who are witnesses ... were present when the writings were executed ... John Calloway and James Scott were in the house ... Thomas Baldwin was present at another conversation concerning it at the house ... Complainant undertook to build for defendant ... Deponent never told John McCaleb or any other person that there were \$900. coming to complainant in North Carolina, but state that money was due his father there ...

Thomas Baldwin a witness deposed ... I went to live with Complainant in Dec. 1819 lived there until the next November

John Martin witness for Complainant deposed ... William Morris a witness for Complainant deposed ... (both were acquainted with the land in dispute)... The defendant (John Clark) said the women of Complainant's family had paid some cloth ... wanted to pay them for it but his son, Hugh Clark, was opposed to it...

John Calloway witness for Complainant ...

... the land was on Eeaver Creek, running with James Scott's line across Hines Valley to a stake on the Black Oak Ridge ...

Elizabeth Barnett deposed that she heard John Clark, son of Complainant, talking about Complainant bringing \$1000 from North Carolina but it was in a jesting manner.

... decreed that the land be sold after ascertaining how much was owed by Benjamin Clark deducting for that sold to James Scott, paying John Clark the debt and giving Benjamin Clark the balance.

PETITION FROM MCMINNI COUNTY, TENNESSEE, SEPTEMBER 15, 1825

To the honorable the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee Your petitioner begs leave to show your body the situation in which your petitioner having purchased a quater section of land adjoining of the Rogers Creek ridges, in McMinn county and being

<u>Desireous</u> of building a mill on his own land and the strem of water runs through a vacant and unappropriated quater section of land which lyes enterely in the knobs and is not fir for cultivation your petitioner having spent a good or considerable sum of money in cutting of a road on ad vacant land, the land being unfit for cultivation and the stream of water a lone is the only object that any man could have in entering ad quater and that there is not fall sufficient on the vacant land for to set a mill but by extending the road on your petioners land there can be a mill built.

Wherefore your petitioner does believe that it will be more advantagious to the state to recieve taxes for the land than for it to remain vacant and unentered your petitioner prays your honorable body to grant him the said quater section of land to secure him the water so that your petitioner may proceed to build his mill your petitioner having forwarded his petition For your honorable body's Information humbly hopes that the result will be favourable on the part of your petitioner the vacant land is situate In Range 3rd west of the meridian In Township 3rd North East quater of section 10th your petitioner as is duty bound will ever pray - September 15th, 1825
