VIRGINIA LAND PATENTS OF THE COUNTIES OF NORFOLK, PRINCESS ANNE AND WARWICK FROM PATENT BOOKS "O" AND "6"-1666 to 1679. Transcribed and edited by Alice Granbery Walter (1972). Soft cover, over 67 pages, indexed. Order from the compiler, 275 Victoria Place, Lawrence, New York 11559.

An excellent abstract of certain land patents pertaining to Lower Norfolk, Norfolk, Princess Anne and Warwick Counties. The patents were taken from Reel 321 of the Virginia State Land Office obtained from the Virginia State Library.

ROBYNS/ROBINS - COUNTY NORTHAMPTON, ENGLAND, 1377-1620, ACCOMACK COUNTY, VIRGINIA.
CARRAWAY-FOSTER-WILLIAMS(ON) AND BARTHOLONEW HOSKINS, 1601-1706, both by Alice Granbery Walter (1971). Genealogical charts. Order from the compiler, 275 Victoria Place, Lawrence, New York 11559.

These charts are the product of much labor and a genuine talent for such research. The new world locale is Virginia. The compiler's comments concerning probable happenings are excellent.

DESCENDANTS OF MICHAEL MOULTON HARRISON AND RELATED PIONEER FAMILIES OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS, INCLUDING REAMS, HUTSON, JACKSON, HEFFINGTON by Mrs. Sallie Stewart Harrison and Mrs. Ethel Stewart Cole (1972). Soft cover, over 280 pages, not indexed. Order from Mrs. Wayne R. Harrison, 4715 Canal Street, Houston, Texas 77011. \$10.50.

By tradition, the Harrison family was from Dublin, Ireland, by way of "Big Bend River" in Virginia. It is thought that Michael Moulton Harrison was born in North Carolina. The first proved record of him was in Hinds County, Miss. Here also was James G. Heffington, whose descendants intermarried with those of M. M. Harrison. Harrison went to Texas in 1838, followed soon thereafter by Heffington. The book is a record of the family in the Republic and State of Texas, and contains records of other early families in the state.

THE HISTORY OF BUTLER COUNTY, ALABAMA, FROM 1815 TO 1885 by John Buckner Little (1885). Hard cover, over 271 pages, indexed. Order from John G. Little, 108 Brookside Drive, Greenville, Alabama 36037. \$8.00. Reprint.

Butler County, in historically-rich South Central Alabama, was formed in 1819 from Conecuh and Monroe Counties, once part of the Creek Nation. This is a famous book about early Alabamians, and gives accounts of early communities, prominent people and events.

THE HOUSE OF SHANNON (SHANNONHOUSE) AND RELATED LINES by Edna M. Shannonhouse (1971). Soft cover, over 177 pages; surnames in the table of contents serve as an index. Order from Mrs. Norman K. Shannonhouse, 402 North Road, Elizabeth City, North Carolina 27909. \$10.00.

This Southern history is rich in names and vital statistics of births, deaths, and marriages. Pictures and bits of intriguing family and local history make for interesting reading.

URIAH SUTHERLAND FAMILY by James Logan Sutherland (1971). Soft cover, over 248 pages, indexed. Order from James Logan Sutherland, 308 Benton St., Windsor, Missouri 65360. \$5.50.

The Sutherland family of Scotland had its origin in Frederick County, Virginia in 1787 in the persons of Uriah Sutherland and Rebecca Bently. Members of the family subsequently moved to Lincoln, Casey and Logan Counties, Kentucky, and to St. Clair County, Missouri. This is a typically pioneer story, containing much genealogy.

THE LAST WORD, VOLUME I, by Edward P. Moore, Jr. (1972). Soft cover, over 80 pages, not indexed. Order from the author, Box 112, University of Mississippi, Oxford, Miss. 38677. \$5.00.

The Last Word is an interesting publication of photographs of tombstones and of epitaphs, mainly stones in the state of Mississippi. You will agree with the author's comment: "Mississippi tombstones are perhaps more colorful than those of her sister states in form and words."

KENTUCKY CEMETERY RECORDS, VOLUME IV, compiled and edited by Malle B. Coyle and Irene B. Gaines for the Kentucky Research Committee, D.A.R. (1972). Soft cover, over 207 pages, indexed. Order from Kentucky Society, D.A.R., Kentucky Records Research Committee, 407 Foster St., Florence, Ky. 41042 \$10.00.

The fourth volume of records, compiled under the auspices of the Kentucky Society of D.A.R., includes cemeteries in the counties of: Allen, Anderson, Barren, Boone, Bourbon, Bullitt, Campbell, Carlisle, Casey, Cumberland, Daviess, Estill, Fleming, Franklin, Gallatin, Grant, Graves, Greenup, Hardin, Harrison, Henry, Hopkins, Jefferson, Jessamine, Knox, Lee, Lewis, Leslie, Lincoln, Livingston, Logan, Marshall, Mason, McCracken, McLean, Mercer, Montgomery, Muhlenburg, Nelson, Ohio, Owsley, Pendleton, Perry, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Rowan, Scott, Shelby, Simpson, Taylor, Todd, Trigg, Webster, Whitley and Wolfe. Many family cemeteries have been surveyed, and some completions from previous volumes are included.

WAYNE COUNTY, KENTUCKY MARRIAGES AND VITAL RECORDS, 1801-1860, Volume I, Marriages H-J. Compiled and published by June Baldwin Bork (1972). Soft cover, over 364 pages, indexed. Order from the author, 17352 Drey Lane, Huntington Beach, California 92647. \$17.50.

Volume I lists grooms' names alphabetically. All other names are indexed. Other contents are: commissioners' reports; 50 cemeteries; 1820 census index; delinquent tax lists; guardian reports; county officials; list of ministers; old letters. Mrs. Bork has done a remarkable amount of painstaking work.

FEDERAL LAND SERIES - A Calendar of Archival Materials on the Land Patents Issued by the United States Government, with Subject, Tract and Name Indexes: Volume I, 1788-1810 by Clifford Neal Smith (1972). Hard cover, over 338 pages, indexed by surname, subject and tract. Order from the American Library Association, 50 East Huron St., Chicago, Ill. 60611. \$20.00.

The purpose of this series is to calendar and index the great mass of archival material in the early files of the U. S. Treasury, the U. S. Dept. of State, and the General Land Office, as well as the records of many district land offices, records such as those of Rufus Putnam and Richard Clough Anderson, records of land companies, legislative records of the

U. S. Senate and House of Representatives and many miscellaneous records concerning land grants of the United States. Serial entries calendar the original documents in the first section of the book. The other three sections contain name, subject, and tract indexes.

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN CRAWFORD, 1643, by Charles Barnett Lampkin, Jr. (1970). Hard cover, over 185 pages, indexed. Order from the author, Box 1022, University of Alabama, Tuscaloosa, Alabama 35486. \$10.00.

John Crawford, born in 1600, was a cadet of Kilbirnie Crawfords, who came from Ayrenshire, Scotland to Jamestown, Virginia in 1643. The text includes chapters on the royal and noble ancestry of the Crawfords and on the Meriwether and Bennett branches of the family. Here is much Southern genealogy of interest.

THE BUMPASS FAMILY FROM PERSON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, compiled by Anne Shirley Bumpass and James Richard Townsend (1972). Soft cover, over 163 pages, indexed. Order from Mrs. James J. Bumpass, 2717 Gray Circle, Columbia, Tenn. 38401. \$8.00.

Much material from Virginia, North Carolina, and Tennessee Archives and from Library of Congress and private collections is found in this book. The many names and places mentioned make for a genealogical treasury, and interesting "folk talk" brings a fascinating story to life.

THE FURCHES FOLKS by John Frank Furches (1971). Hard cover, over 215 pages, indexed. Order from Frank Furches, Box 128, Clemons, North Carolina. \$9.95.

Furches, a variant of the Franch Foulquier or de Fouquier, has been spelled Foucher, Fatcher, Furches, Firches, Furchase, etc. in America. Tobias Furches, a Huguenot and the first proven ancestor, lived in Kent County, Delaware, settled by people from Maryland and Virginia. His probable ancestor was Jacques Foucher, a passenger on the ship "Peter and Anthony" in 1700, that came to the James River in Virginia. John Furches of Delaware left Tobias II "all my rights and claims as a legatee of the last will and testament of my step-father Stephan Lewis in the State of N. Carolina." Tobias Furches II came to N. C. in 1781. The Furches moved west into Tenn., Ky., Mo., Ind. and farther west. This wonderful little family story is replete with genealogical gems and history.

LINKS WITH THE PAST, A Genealogical and Historical Account of the Albert and Related Families, by Ethel Evans Albert (1972). Hard cover, over 497 pages, not indexed. Order from the author, 2217 Cypress St., Kingsport, Tenn. 37664. \$15.00.

This is a fine family history written by Mrs. Albert about her husband's family for her children and grandchildren. The Albert family, of German extraction, originated in North Carolina in the person of James Albert, born circa 1780. By 1800 he was listed in the Montgomery County, Virginia, census, and the 1830 census shows him in Scott County, Virginia. He died Jan. 4, 1839 in Oak Forest, Tennessee. He was married to Nancy Agnes Glen in Montgomery County on May 27, 1810. Mrs. Albert traces this family in a very interesting and workmanlike manner.

TALES OF THE AMARUGIE HIGHLANDS OF CASS COUNTY, MISSOURI by Donald Lewis Osborn (1972). Soft cover, over 22 pages, indexed. Order from the author, 322 Willow Way, Lee's Summit, Missouri 64063. \$4.00.

This is an interesting history of a small part of Missouri. Historical facts about early settlers are mixed with local stories, the Civil War, and a family history or two.

THE FRENCH BROAD-HOLSTON COUNTRY: A History of Knox County, Tennessee by the Knox County Historical Committee, East Tennessee Historical Society, Mary U. Rothrock, Editor (1946, reprinted 1972). Hard cover, over 513 pages, indexed. Order from the East Tennessee Historical Society, Lawson McGhee Library, Knoxville, Tennessee 37902. \$20.00.

This is the only available history of Knoxville and Knox County and its thrilling and colorful story. The book contains accounts of the Indians in the area, the first county and city governments (when Knoxville was the capital of Tennessee), the first stores, roads, steamboats, railroads, newspapers, schools, churches, early communities, and the Civil War and Reconstruction period. Best of all for ancestor searchers, there are biographies of more than a hundred pioneers and civic leaders.

REGISTER OF THE GENERAL SOCIETY OF THE WAR OF 1812, edited by Frederick Ira Ordway, Jr. (1972). Hard cover, over 688 pages, indexed. Order from Alan Corson, Jr., Treasurer General, General Society of the War of 1812, 1034 Nicholson Road, Waynnewood, Pennsylvania 19096. \$15.00.

The Register is the first to be published by the General Society of the War of 1812, and consists essentially of brief sketches of Society members and their lines of descent. The book should be an extremely useful reference source for libraries and historical societies as well as for genealogists.

DESCENDANTS OF IRISH IMMIGRANT, JOHN WILKINSON (1726-1806), compiled by William Amel Sousaman (1970). Soft cover, over 102 pages, indexed. Order from author, 1525 North Third St., Springfield, Ill. 62702. \$7.50.

Accounts of many descendants of John Wilkinson are given in this book. John and brother William came to America with an uncle and two aunts, by whom they were reared. William went to Savannah, Georgia, where he died without issue. John sired 19 children by two wives; moved from Penn. to Virginia, then to Ohio, where he died. Mr. Sousaman has written a very interesting family history.

HISTORY OF CARROLL COUNTY by Mrs. Julian Devault (1972). Soft cover, over 193 pages, not indexed. Order from the author, Carroll County Historical Society, 135 North Broadway, McKenzie, Tennessee. \$4.00.

This is a very comprehensive and excellent history of one of the first counties created from the Western Purchase. The County was formed in 1822, and is the birthplace of former Tennessee Governor Gordon Browning. The County's participation in Tennessee events is related.

THE ANNALS OF TENNESSEE TO THE END OF THE EIGHTEENTH CENTURY by J. G. M. Ramsey, A.M., M.D. (1853, reprinted 1967). Hard cover, over 821 pages, indexed. Order from Mrs. Edwin M. Johnson, Secretary, East Tennessee Historical Society, Lawson McGhee Library, Knoxville, Tenn. 37902. \$25.00.

Dr. Ramsey in his great monumental work - The Annals of Tennessee to the End of the Eighteenth Century, Comprising Its Settlement as: The Watauga Association from 1769 to 1777; the State of Franklin from 1784

to 1788; a Part of North Carolina from 1788 to 1790; the Territory of the United States South of the Ohio from 1790 to 1796; the State of Tennessee from 1796 to 1800 - has recorded for posterity the spirit of The Watauga Association and the "Over-the-Mountain Men." Dr. Ramsey tells of these hardy pioneers, who left their frontier homes, unprotected from Indian attack, to join patriots from the older settlements in the fight to form a new nation. Much genealogy is included in relating the Tennessee story.

THE LIVELYS OF AMERICA, 1690-1968, compiled by Dr. John F. Vallentine (1971). Hard cover, over 892 pages. A supplement and index are due in 1973. Order from Mrs. Ruth Lively Warren, Box 696, McMinnville, Tennessee 37110. \$15.00.

There were five documented Livelys in America prior to 1755. Of Virginia origin, pioneer Livelys were found also in North and South Carolina and Georgia, and after the Revolutionary War, in West Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama, Ohio, and western states. The Pennsylvania Livelys seem to be unconnected with the Southern families. Traditionally, Ireland, England, Scotland, France and Germany are listed as points of European origin. A National Association of Lively Families is active.

TREXLER FAMILY AND RELATED KIN, compiled and published by John Trexler Warren (1972). Hard cover, over 339 pages, indexed. Order from the author, Box 68, Trexlertown, Pennsylvania 15087. \$20.00.

The book is a collection of memories of the Trexler-Drechsler family, of German origin, found in America as early as 1709. Listed in the book are 1228 surnames and 8122 individual names. A short historical and biographical section adds much to this fine little family history.

SONS OF THE CONQUEROR, DESCENDANTS OF NORMAN ANCESTRY by L. G. Pine (1973). Hard cover, over 289 pages, indexed. Order from Charles E. Tuttle Company, Rutland, Vermont 05701. \$7.50.

Leslie G. Pine has made a special study of Norman ancestry and of the history of the Norman period. He applies his wide knowledge of genealogy to "the existence among citizens of the United States of a large portion of Norman blood." He describes in detail the course of the Norman conquest, and deals with possible descents from the Conqueror. Families of the British peerage and landed gentry are analyzed, and numerous examples of known American Normans are cited.

WALTER MCGILL, PREACHER AND PENMAN by Lucille M. Bates (1971). Hard cover, over 110 pages, not indexed. Order from the author, Route 1, Box 55, Midway, Texas 75852. \$5.95.

Mrs. Bates has produced a remarkable biography of her ancestor, Walter McGill, in story form. Born in Rhea County, Tennessee in 1807, his life is traced from his farm boyhood through his early schooling, the Seminary at Maryville, Tennessee, the writing of two early books, the Civil War, and finally his removal with his family to Limestone County, Texas. Here he preached, taught school, and wrote another book in the last ten years of his life. He died in 1878.

Note by editor: Miss Jenny M. Higbee established The Higbee School for Young Ladies in Memphis in 1878, purchasing in 1880 the Robertson Topp mansion (built in 1841) at Lauderdale and Beale Streets to use as a dormitory. A classroom building was constructed in front of it. Prior to that, she had been principal of the Memphis High School (Memphis' only public high school at that time) from 1868 to 1875, when she became principal of the Presbyterian Grammar and High School.

To have been a student at The Higbee School was something to tell proudly to children and grandchildren. Miss Higbee attested to her pride in her students by including graduates of the three schools with which she had been associated in the 1891 Catalogue and Circular of The Higbee School for Young Ladies.

The fourth Monday in August, 1849, saw the formation of Prosperity Baptist Church, now Bartlett Baptist Church. In 1949 to commemorate its anniversary, C. G. Gowen wrote A History of Bartlett Baptist Church, a booklet containing abstracted records of the church. The new church had been "an arm" of the Egypt Baptist Church.

A presbytery was formed, consisting of Peter S. Gayle and Allen S. Wynn. Allen S. Wynn was appointed Moderator, and James Pruden, Secretary, to carry out the work of the newly-formed church. D. W. Moore and James Pruden were the first Deacons. Those constituted into the new church were:

The first minutes, dated 1851, show Brother S. B. Berryhill and Brother Joshua M. Kelly as Deacons. Brothers John Blackwell, James Pruden, Theodore Bland, B. H. Eddins, and S. B. Berryhill were appointed to a Building Committee. It was decided also to move the church to Green Bottom, but it was not until 1861 that the minutes show the church located at "Union Depot", now Bartlett.

In 1854 the minutes record that the 1850, 1852, and 1853 minutes were incomplete. A list of members, from the beginning of the church, was made from memory: 24 males, 41 females, and 15 slaves (with names of their owners). This list is not in the church files.

He was a private and volunteer from 1779 to 1781 and joined the army when he was aged 21 and residing in Burk Co., N. C. Served as an Indian spy. He remembers Capt. Coldwell, Capt. Samuel Davidson, Capt. McFarlain (McFarlan), Capt. Smith, Capt. Price, Col. Clark ("it will be recollected that Clark was what was called a refugee from the state of Georgia who came into North Carolina to recruit his men.") Also remembers a Col. Mills, Col. McDaniels, and "perhaps" a McFally.
