SURNAME INDEX OF 1967 SEMINAR is out of print. Surname Index for 1969 is in plentiful supply.

FIVE GENERATION CHARTS (sample in this issue), filled out and returned to the Society, may result in contact with someone working on your line. We do NOT furnish blank charts.

A SELF-ADDRESSED, STAMPED ENVELOPE must be included in correspondence with the Society if an answer is expected.

"ANSEARCHIN'" NEWS COVERS can no longer be sold separately. One cover is furnished with the first issue of every Volume.

BOOK REVIEWS

TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI MARRIAGE BONDS AND MINISTER'S RETURNS 1842-1861 Compiled and indexed by Thomas P. Hughes, Jr. and Jewel B. Standefer 1973. Soft covers. Over 217 pages. Order from Mr. Thomas P. Hughes, Jr., 4140 Chanwil Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee 38117. \$15.00

Old Tishomingo County, Miss. was erected Feb. 9, 1836, from lands ceded to the U.S. Government by the Chickasaw Indians, on April 15, 1832. Eighty-six sections of land from Tippah County were added, and this new territory was divided into Tishomingo, Alcorn, and Prentiss Counties. The courthouse at Corinth, county seat of Alcorn County, houses many of the records of Old Tishomingo County. Some miscellaneous records are still in the old courthouse at Iuka, the original county seat. The grooms are arranged alphabetically, and the brides indexed separately. A list of ministers and/or officials is included.

THE ROMANCE OF THE LONDON DIRECTORY by Charles Warering Bardsley, London, 1879. Republished by Gryphon Books, Ann Arbor, Michigan 1971. Hard covers. Over 162 pages. Not indexed. Order from Gale Research Company, Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$12.50.

Charles Bardsley was a leading authority in the 19th century on nomenclature. The origins of English surnames was prepared by a diligent examination of the London Directory for the earliest form of a surname. Various forms and conceptions of all types of personal names are discussed. The book deals with individualization and localization, divisions of London surnames, early pet names, the Bible and nomenclature, occupational names, and nicknames. Many historical sidelights on the development of English surnames are in the survey.

OLD PATHS AND LEGENDS OF NEW ENGLAND by Katherine M. Abbott. G.P. Putnam's Sons, New York and London, 1903. Reissued by Singing Tree Press, Book Tower, Detroit, 1969. Hard backs. Over 484 pages. Indexed. Order from The Gale Research Company, Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$13.50.

The book has many photographs and drawings of famous buildings, monuments, and scenes of Old New England. The author takes the reader over historic roads and brings to life early homesteads in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and New Hampshire. Towns described are Boston, Lexington, Concord, Tynesborough, Lynn, Andover, Byfield Parish, Hampton, Portsmouth, Jamaica Plain, Plymouth, Newport, Providence, as well as many other localities in the three colonies. This collection of legends and chronicles of 17th and 18th century authors and travellers makes an intriguing story.

OLD PATHS AND LEGENDS OF THE NEW ENGLAND BORDER by Katherine M. Abbott, G. P. Putnam's Sons, New York and London. Reissued by Singing Tree Press, Book Tower, Detroit 1969. Hard backs. Over 408 pages. Indexed. Order from Gale Research Company, Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48220. \$13.50.

A common bond of historical events, legends, and the natural beauty of the Connecticut and western Massachusetts area links early settlements on the colonial border. The chapters of the book arranged by towns, localities, and villages treat the lore of such places as Stockbridge, Saybrook, Lyme, Norwich, Sag Harbor, New Haven, Lenox, Litchfield, Shelter Island, and Tyringham. Chief landmarks and historical events are listed in each chapter.

CATALOGUE OF THE GENEALOGICAL AND HISTORICAL LIBRARY OF THE COLONIAL DAMES OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK compiled by Miss L. Green, 1912. Republished by Gryphon Books, a division of Gale Research Company, 1971. Hard backs. Over 518 pages. The Catalogue is alphabetized. Order from Gale Research Company, Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$28.50.

The bibliography lists holdings of the library and serves as an index to the contents of the books, magazines, and manuscripts in the collection. Approximately 7500 items are listed alphabetically by the authors of the works or by surnames of families. There are many subject listings and numerous cross-references.

RECONSTRUCTED CENSUS 1774-1810 OF BERKELEY COUNTY, VIRGINIA (now West Virginia) by Max W. Grove, 1970. Soft covers. Over 110 pages. Indexed. Order from Mr. Max W. Grove, 50 Bonifant Road, Silver Springs, Md. 20904. \$7.50.

This is the first issue of a quarterly magazine dedicated to local and genealogical history. The information for this book has been taken from five different sources, none of which is an actual census. The index covers about 30 years of Berkeley County history. The inhabitants are listed both by surname and given name. The publication has a Rent Roll and several lists of tithables. Berkeley is now in West Virginia.

THE 1820 CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR BERKELEY COUNTY, VIRGINIA by Max W. Grove, 1968. Soft covers. Over 80 pages. Indexed. Order from American Museum, Mr. Max W. Grove, 50 Bonifant Road, Silver Springs, Md., 20904. \$5.00.

This book is number 3 in a series of 10, spanning 1780-1890. The census for Berkeley County (now West Virginia) is divided into sections for Martinsburg, Darkesville, Middletown (Gerrardstown) and the rest of the county. A large part of Morgan County was taken from Berkeley County in 1820. Therefore, part of the 1810 census will not be in the 1820 census as Berkeley County.

THE 1810 CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR BERKELEY COUNTY, VIRGINIA by Max W. Grove, 1967. Soft covers. Over 89 pages. Listings are alphabetized. Order from American Museum, Mr. Max W. Grove, 50 Bonifant Road, Silver Springs, Md. 20904 \$7.50

This book is the second in a series of 10, spanning 1780-1890. The book contains an 1809 map of Berkeley County (now in West Virginia). Morgan County, Virginia was formed in 1820 from Berkeley and Hampshire Counties. This census will, therefore, contain a large portion of what is now Morgan County.

SUPPLEMENT TO LIVELYS OF AMERICA 1972 compiled by Dr. John F. Valentine, 1973. Hard backs. Over 200 pages. Indexed. Order from Mr. A. D. Lively, President, National Association of Lively Families of America, Route 1, Box 71-b, Butler, Alabama 36904. \$8.00.

The supplement makes corrections of errors in printing and in facts presented in Livelys of America, makes deletions where appropriate, provides additional information, and provides a personal name index for both the Supplement and the original publication.

WILLIAM BEAN PIONEER OF TENNESSEE AND HIS DESCENDANTS by Jamie Ault Grady, 1973. Hard covers. Over 350 pages. Indexed. Order from Jamie Ault Grady, 4404 Holston Drive, Knoxville, Tennessee 37914. \$12.50.

Jamie Ault Grady has put together a tremendous genealogy of the famous William Bean family of Tennessee. William Bean built Bean Station, the famous crossroads of the Daniel Boone Trail into Kentucky (Wilderness Trail) and the New Orleans-Baltimore stagecoach road (Rutledge Pike). From Russell Bean, the first white child born in Tennessee, and his six brothers and sister, has descended the famous Bean Family of Tennessee. Bean Station was in old Washington County. This is a rich, historical and factual genealogy of this great East Tennessee family.

CORRECTION!

THE FILE BOX by Jerry Blair (Mrs. W. R.)

Would you like to know more about some of your forebears? We recommend the book by Governor Gilmer called GEORGIANS reprinted in 1926 by the Americus Book Company of Americus, Georgia. It contains sketches of some of the first settlers of Upper Georgia and is written in a chatty entertaining style. In Gilmer's introduction he states that the first part of his book is an account of the settlement made by a number of Virginia families on Broad River, Georgia, immediately after the Revolutionary War. He gives an unvarnished story of many of these settlers whose descendants are now spread over the entire nation and especially the Southern states. Some of the families mentioned and written up in detail are: Harvies, Clarkes, Meriwethers, Taliaferros, Gilmers, Mathewes, Barnetts, Crawfords, Johnsons, Jordans, and McGehees. Practically every family has descendants living in Tennessee today. All emigrated from Virginia to Broad River in Georgia at different times from 1783 to 1790. The second part of the book describes the settlement made by North Carolinians into that part of Georgia which is now included in the counties of Wilkes and Lincoln. Many were prominent among the southern people in the struggle for independence. He mentions as particularly distinguished Clarke, Dooly, Hart, Jack, and Dabney. These sketches were drawn chiefly from the author's intimate social knowledge of his kinfolks and neighbors. Most libraries (genealogical) will have a copy of this book. Original copies are available in the Birmingham Public Library and the Alabama Archives Library in Montgomery, Alabama.

125 YEARS AGO Feb. 20, 1849

THE ORDINANCE dividing the city into wards has been passed by City Council. The first ward embraces all the city north of Jackson; the second from Jackson to Market; the third from Market to Market Place Alley; the fourth from Market Place Alley to Carr's Alley, between Adams to Jefferson; the fifth from Carr's Alley to Finley's Alley, just south of Court Street; the sixth from Finley's Alley to Union. All the lines extend east-west from the river to the bayou. The first ward votes at the schoolhouse, the second at City Hotel, the third at the Exchange Building, the fourth at American Hotel, the fifth at Commercial Hotel and the sixth at the Galt House.

Numbers following each name refer to the page number of the census as given on the microfilm. Given below are the pages which are included in each ward of the city.

MAJOR JONATHAN TIPTON'S APPLICATION Abstracted by Mrs. McAlister Elliott Edited by Betsy F. West

GSA reference: Jonathan Tipton W-1098 BLWT-36523-160-55 - applied from Overton County, Tennessee

Affidavit of Major Jonathan Tipton, dated October 29, 1832:

Major Jonathan Tipton is a resident of Overton County, Tennessee, aged 82 years, states he entered the service of the United States as a volunteer and served, as follows: February, 1777, he was commissioned 1st Magr in Washington County, then the State of North Carolina, now Tennessee, the place of his then residence; he took command of the companies commanded by Captain Gibson and Capt Trimble; he was placed under the command of Colonel Carter and was engaged in guarding the frontier of North Carolina; that Colonel Carter was shortly thereafter promoted to command of General and he continued under the command of General Carter until 1780; he commanded an expedition against the Indians and had battle at the mouth of Flat Creek on Chucky River. He was then placed under the command of General Campbell and marched to Kings Mountain and was in that battle, he thinks it was fought in the fall of 1780; General Isaac Shelby, General John Sevier, General Cleveland were also in the battle, with all of whom affiant was acquainted. He was then placed under the command of General Sevier and marched to the head of Boyds Creek, where the army met a large body of Indians, with whom an engagement took place. He was wounded in that battle in the left arm. He marched against the Indian Towns, then marched to the aid of General Greene in Southears (?) line under General Sevier and joined General Greene's army at Santee river and remained there until the capture of Cornwallis in September, 1781. He was acquainted with General Green, General Marion, General Mayham, General Sumpter, General Lee, Colonel Morgan, and Colonel Valentine Sevier. He was there discharged in the latter part of September, 1781, and his discharge was signed by Generals Green and Marion. He continued to serve in the army of the United States as Majr from the time he first entered until he was discharged; his discharge, with various other papers, was stolen from him about 10 years ago, but he can prove his services as stated herein by Abraham Sevier and

Questions and Answers: Major Tipton was born in Frederick County, Virginia, in 1750, and there is a record of his age at his son's in Bunkum (Buncombe) County, North Carolina, "in my father's old Bible;" he was living in Washington County, then N.C., when he volunteered, where he continued to live 17 years after the war, and then moved into Bunkum County, North Carolina, and lived there about 27 years, then moved to Overton County, where he has lived ever since. He was commissioned 1st Majr and the commission was signed by Richard Caswell, stolen from him, with the other papers, at Babbs in Green County, Tennessee. People in present neighborhood who can testify as to his character for veracity and good behaviour, services, etc.: Smith Ferrel, Abraham Sevier, Steven Lowell, Jacob Dillen, Esq., attorney at law, Joseph Griffin.

Then follow the affidavits of Smith Ferrell and Abraham Sevier, of Overton County, Tennessee, who state that they have known Major Jonathan Tipton for upwards of 60 years, and Smith Ferrell states that he served under Major Tipton for "near" two years and states positively that he served his country in the Revolutionary War faithfully.

Declaration of Lavina Tipton Widow of Major Jonathan Tipton, to Obtain Pension

White County, Tennessee, June 6, 1853; Open court in Sparta, the Honourable John L.

Goodall, one of the Circuit Court Judges, presiding. Lavina Tipton, a resident of White County, Tenn., aged 67 years, states that she is the widow of Major Jonathan Tipton who was an officer of the Revolution; that she was married to Major Tipton on the ____day of______1810 or 1811, at the house of Major Tipton in Buncombe County, North Carolina, by Colonel James Poteet (?), who was then an acting justice of the peace and who resided in Buncombe County, N.C.; that, before her marriage, she was Lavina Stephens and that her husband, Jonathan Tipton, died in Cumberland County, Kentucky, on January 18, 1833, as well as she now recollects. Testimony of William Stephens and Esau Tipton, who were present, can support her statements re marriage.

Affidavits of William Stephens and Esau Tipton:

They are residents of White County, Tennessee, and William Stephens is aged about 46 and Esau Tipton is aged about 54 years, that they were personally acquainted with both Jonathan Tipton and Lavina Tipton from 1810 or thereabouts and were both very young and personally present when Jonathan and Lavina were married and saw them married and that Jonathan Tipton died about the 18th day of January 1833.

Affidavit of Lavina Tipton dated September 8, 1855, White County, Tennessee:

She is aged 67 years, she was married to Jonathan Tipton on 6th or 7th of May, 1813 by James Poteet, in Buncome County, North Carolina, and her name was then Lavina Stephens; said Jonathan Tipton died on January 19, 1833, in Cumberland County, Kentucky.

Pensioner is blind and aged about 58. He lives with his two unmarried daughters on his son's land in Wilson Co., 18 miles southeast of Lebanon. Later he says his family consists of only one daughter aged about 22-23 named Polly. (Perhaps one daughter married while he was corresponding about his pension.)

William McMahan, aged 29, is a son of Andrew. William is "otherwise called" William McHaney and is a Baptist. Aug. 18, 1819.

Jesse Hodges, aged 65, knew Andrew McMahan in Pittsylvania Co., Va. He was acquainted with Andrew's brothers "known by the name McMahan." "After some time the name became adulterated and the young generation descended from these brothers were frequently called McHaney." Aug. 25, 1819.

Andrew enlisted in the Revolution from King and Queen Co., Va. in the winter of 1776 for 3 years. He served under Capt. William Campbell, Col. Gibson, Maj. Ellison, Col. George Baylor, Lt. Col. Wm. Washington. He was in the battles of Monmouth, Guilford, Camden, and Eustace Springs. He holds a note on Abner Watson. He owns 250 acres and negro boy Duk.

PITTSYLVANIA COUNTY VIRGINIA ABSTRACTS OF WILLS 1786-1800
Compiled and indexed by Thomas P. Hughes, Jr. and Jewel B. Standefer. 1973.
Soft covers. Over 141 pages. Order from Thomas P. Hughes, Jr.,
4140 Chanwil Ave., Memphis, Tennessee 38117. \$11.00.

The abstracts found in this publication were carefully copied by Kathleen Booth Williams from the original Will and Deed Books of Pittsylvania County, Va. The compilers have retained the colorful vernacular of the times and all the misspellings. The earliest record of a will was ca. 1768. The names of Testators and those of all persons mentioned, relationships, places of residence, locations of land and former places of residence are faithfully reproduced.

THE HOUSE OF CRAVENS by Ruth H. McConathy. 1972. Hard covers. Over 372 pages. Indexed. Order from Hallmark Services, P.O. Box 566, Charlottesville, Va. 22902. \$15.00

The volume is an historical and genealogical work on both the English and American lines of the Cravens family, dating from the 12th century to the present. Allied family histories have been followed as far as possible, such as Cabell, Davis, Earle, Field, Fry, Goodrich, Hallmark, Harrison, Hopkins, Lightfoot, Rives, Settle, Slaughter, Thornton, Towsend, Walker, Wright and many others. Material on these families has been gathered from libraries, county records & cemeteries in New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Virginia, Kentucky, and the Carolinas. This is a very elaborate and thorough genealogical record.

OLD STONE FORT by Alexander Kocsis, edited by Betty Anderson Bridgewater 1973. Soft covers. Over 55 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. John R. Bridgewater, Pres. Coffee County Historical Society, P.O. Box 524, Manchester, Tenn. 37355. \$5.50.

"Old Stone Fort" is an historical and archeological find of extreme rarity and good luck. That such a scholarly exposition was preserved and returned to cir-

culation is fortunate. The Coffee County Historical Society is to be commended. The genealogical information concerning the Kocsis, Calcote, Overton and Anderson families and the biographical section should interest many people as well as Alexander Kocsis' story, theory and description of the 'Old Stone Fort' and its builders, the 'Turtle Nation'.

THE HUNTER FAMILY OF BEDFORD COUNTY, VIRGINIA by Judge Walter M. Hunter 1973. Hard backs. Over 258 pages. Indexed. Six illustrations. Order from Hunter Book Fund, 546 Old Academy Road, Fairfield, Conn. 06430 \$15.00.

Judge Hunter died in 1969, but his book was prepared for publication by Dorothy Ford Wulfeck, Genealogy Editor for the Va. Gazette. The book was one of those intended to furnish material on early families of the South. It begins with a record of Alexander Hunter, Regulator leader of N.C. His son, Samuel, a distinguished soldier of the War of 1812 and an early figure in Texas History, was given special emphasis. Also noted are Pleasant Hunter, who established the family in Central La, the 1955 family reunion which was held at Eden Plantation in La., and allied families of Ketcher, Daniel, Ford, Prince, and Barry (Berry).

THE MCCLENDON'S, THE MACLENNON, MACKCLENDEN, MCCLENDON AND MCLENDON, a family history of the McClendon family as compiled by T. A. McClendon 1973. Hard covers. Over 418 pages. Indexed. Order from T. A. McClendon, 3301 Pacific Ave., Stockton, California 95204. \$11.00.

Genealogists have reported that records have been found showing that John Macklennon of Scotland was the father of Dennis Sr., the emigrant who came to N.C. early in January 1696. Dennis' wife, Elizabeth, came with him. She was the mother of Brient, Dennis, Francis, Thomas, and probably of Isaac and Jacob, believed to be older brothers. From North Carolina the McClendons moved with the tide of immigration through the southern and western states and finally throughout the nation. The author has recorded 13 generations of family history, a notable accomplishment.

THE DESCENDANTS OF JOSIAH AND KEZIAH NICHOLS WOOLRIDGE AND THEIR ANCESTORS by Wright W. Frost 1973. Hard backs. Over 221 pages. Indexed. Order from Wright W. Frost, Publisher, 730 Cherokee Blvd., Knoxville, Tenn. 37919. \$15.00.

The author has listed about 80 surnames of families who have 5 or more members. He names 200 other surnames with fewer persons as members of the family. The large number of names makes this little book a genealogical treasure for people whose ancestors are from Va., N.C., S.C., Ga., Ala., Ky., Tenn. and some other states. Carefully documented accounts of these families are found in the book. The index contains over 1800 names.

SCOTTISH BURGH AND COUNTY HERALDRY by R. M. Urquhart 1973. Hard covers. Over 224 pages. Indexed. Order from Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Mich. 48226. \$28.50.

The book contains an analytical table of contents, footnotes, drawings, appendix, bibliography, reference notes and a map of Scotland. The author has based his study on official files, correspondence with town and county clerks, local histories, newspapers and private enquiries. A record of some Scottish tradition is found in the first two parts, in which sixteen essays treat the history and development of the Burgh system and the counties with attention given to their heraldic achievements. Part three contains a detailed study of the coats of arms of 177 of the 201 Burghs and all 33 of the county councils. The 24 seals used by the 24 non-armigerous Burghs are also discussed. The author has produced a very descriptive and useful publication.

DESCENDANTS OF SPENCER MOODY AND SUSANNA HENDRICKS AND ALLIED FAMILIES, Tenn., Ill., Mo., Kans. Compiled by Pauline and J. W. Massey 1973. Soft backs. Over 118 pages. Surname index. Order from Mrs. J. W. Massey, 1001 Apache, Wichita, Kansas 67207 \$5.00.

Thirty years of research by Pauline and J. W. Massey have gone into this family genealogy. Spencer Moody married Susannah Hendricks in Tennessee in 1827. They moved to Illinois in 1837 where they made their home until 1866 when they moved to Kansas. Twelve children were born to them, ten of whom survived. There are 95 grandchildren in the family, and 62 great grandchildren. The ancestors of Spencer and Susannah are not known but some study and speculation has been made

CLINTON COUNTY OHIO NEWSPAPERS DEATH AND OBITUARY ABSTRACTS, 1838-1867 by Larry D. Mart 1973. Soft covers. Over 68 pages. Indexed. Order from Larry D. Mart, 621 Fairfield Drive, Lima, Ohio 45808 \$5.00.

A project originally intended as a search for early Mart and related family death dates was expanded by Larry Mart into a regional genealogical effort. Someone should thank Mr. Mart for his book. Newspapers he searched were The Democrat and Herald, The Herald of Freedom, and The Clinton, which were published on Friday of every week at Wilmington, Ohio. The original newspapers are in the Courthouse in Wilmington. They contain four pages, with the first two generally covering national news. Pages three and four generally reported local news and advertisements. There is no set page for the death and obituary notices.

THE NUTT FAMILY THROUGH THE YEARS, 1635-1973. By Merle C. Nutt. Hard covers. Over 271 pages. Indexed. Order from Dr. Merle C. Nutt, 2115 West Edgemont Ave., Phoenix, Arizona 85008 \$10.00.

The Nutt family is of English extraction from the counties of York, Kent, Sussex, Gloucester and London and vicinity. The name originated from the baptismal name of Cnut, originally Canute, and has many variations in spelling. James Nutt (ca 1631) came to America from England and settled at Dover, New Hampshire ca 1635. Miles Nutt settled in James City County, Va. in 1636. Many others of the name arrived thereafter. This family has produced members who contributed much to the formation of the nation, and the author has well marked their efforts.

THE BLEDSOE FAMILY by John T. Bledsoe 1973. Hard covers. Over 262 pages. Indexed. Order from John T. Bledsoe, 7101 Hillwood Road, Little Rock, Arkansas \$18.91.

The name Bledsoe originated in England, Bedfordshire and Northumberland. The first Bledsoes came to America in 1639 and established themselves in Virginia. George Bledsoe lived in Northumberland County, Va. in 1674. His will is recorded in the Culpeper Co., Va. Will Book A - 1749-1770. The Bledsoes emigrated to North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia, then onward to the Southwest and westward. This vigorous family's name is found among those who developed the new land. Many, many genealogical references are contained in this work.

MAJOR FRANCIS WRIGHT AND ANN WASHINGTON WITH ALLIED FAMILIES by Anne Read Ritchie. Soft covers. Over 336 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Anne Read Ritchie, 13360 S. E. Oatfield Road, Milwaukee, Oregan 97222 \$12.50.

This biography is one of the most fascinating family stories the reviewer has ever had the pleasure of reading. He recognizes the tremendous amount of research necessary to compile this record, and its extensive probe into the genealogy of the Royalty of England and of Europe is amazing. The author has traced the

branches of her family through well-known American ancestry back to England and to several Royal families which intermarried with the Royal families of Europe This is a family history which contains much colonial and English genealogy.

THE CIVIL WAR DIARY OF WILLIAM SPENCER HUDSON transcribed and edited by Weldon I. Hudson, President of Fort Worth Genealogical Society. F. Worth, Texas. Soft covers. Over 139 pages. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Floyd Stamps, 3145 Wellington Dr., Florissant, Mo. \$4.30 ppd.

William Spencer Hudson was s school teacher, farmer, politician, Mason and Methodist. He served as a 1st Lt. 31st Regt. Miss. Inf. His military record in the National Archives shows that he was given a medical discharge because of "chronic diarrhee". He was born Dec. 16, 1822 in Ala. and died Nov. 20, 1884 in Panola Co., Miss. His parents were Isaac and Peachy Norvall Hudson. His 7 brothers and sisters were all born in Ala. He married 1st Ruth Julia McDaniel Dec. 10, 1844; to them were born 4 children. He married 2nd Nancy Elizabeth (Church) Shaw, a widow with 3 children; to them were born 4 sons. The Diary gives some idea of life in the military and of civilian activities in wartime Mississippi.

NEBRASKA PIONEER, WILLIAM BUTLER, Ancestors and Descendants by Melda Haynes Shippey 1973. Hard backs. Over 166 pages. Indexed (general and place name). Order from Polyanthos, Inc., Cottonport, La. 71327 \$15.00.

William Butler was born in Burlington, Vermont March 11, 1832. He was seventh descent from John Butler of Connecticut (1669-1680). He and his wife, Jane Starr Butler, left St. Lawrence County, New York in 1855 to settle and farm in Summit Township, Marion County, Iowa, where was listed in the U.S. Census for 1860. The Colorado gold rush occured about this time and William got the 'fever'. He went to Colorado and staked a claim, then returned to Iowa and set out to the gold fields with his family. For some reason he stopped on the way and filed claim for land in Nebraska, where he reared a family of 11 children. The author has a chapter in her book for each of these children and their descendants. About 45 allied families are listed, including over 2000 persons and 740 place names. The author has included a selected Bibliography, an appendex with Butler and Starr pedigrees, wills, estate inventories, and other important records relating to this pioneer family and the many related families.

John Hoss, oldest son of Jacob Hoss & Mary Bohn (Boone), was a pioneer settler of Johnson City. He married Sarah Adams Williams, dau of Edmund Williams, early settler on Buffalo Creek, Carter Co. Their dau, Mary Ann Hoss, m Feb. 22, 1834 HENRY JOHNSON, who came here from North Carolina. He moved into Johnson City in 1856, bought land from Tipton Jobe, built a Depot & Water Tank for the newly constructed East Tenn. & Va. R. R. (Southern Railroad). Johnson City was named for Henry Johnson, the first post master.

THE FILE BOX By Jerry Blair (Mrs. W. R.)

A reader sends in some early Catholic records of baptisms at Memphis in 1839: Children of Basil and Catherine (Spaeh) Rapp; Michael and Mary (Murphy) Leonard; Patrick R. and Henrietta Bordley; and William and Pauline (Phiphs) Prince. The sponsors were Francis Scheller, Balina Prince, Catherine Calfield, P. McKeon, and Sophia Phobus. Father Clancy married Eugene Magevney and Mary Smyth on May 31, 1840, in perhaps the first Catholic ceremony in Memphis. It took place in the Magevney home, which still stands on Adams Avenue, near St. Peter's Church.

Father McAleer's first recorded baptism was that of Mary, the first child of Mr. and Mrs. Magevney, who afterwards became a Dominican Sister. The date was February 24, 1841. Other baptisms in the same year were of the children of Edward and Drusilla (Cherry) Read; John and Margaret (Clancy) Conagham; Thomas and Catherine (McCabe) Hogan; James and Mary (Gorman) Green; William and Margaret (Brady) McKeon; James and Mary (Warfel) McNamee; John and Margaret (Poland) Burke; and James and Annora (Hooligan) Nugent. The sponsors were Joseph A. White, Catherine Shaller, William and Mary (Dunn) English, James Kennedy and wife, Mary Larkin, William Bradshaw, Mary Conaghan, Patrick McKeon, Patrick Farrell, Michael Gaffney and wife, James and Mary (Quinn) O'Brien, Robert Burke, Mrs. Michael Kiely, and a Mr. Jones.

In 1842, parents of children baptized were: Frederic and Margaret (Bonninger) Udwig; Michael and Bridget (Handlon) Power; William and Mary (Quinlan) Irwin; Michael B. and Margaret (Murphy) Martin; Francis and Bridget (Foley) Coffey; John and Bridget (O'Connor) Burke; M. and Mary Agnes (Snyder) Miller; and Rudolph and Elizabeth (Armstrong) Davis. Godparents were Patrick Golden, Mrs. Davern, Thomas Costigan, Bridget Powers, Denis Kerby, Mary McCarthy, Thomas McKeon, John McMahon, Mary Haley, Bridget Archer, John Carroll, Joseph C. and Mary Ursula Snyder, Michael McNamara, Ann Reagan, and Peter Connolly and wife.

On October 29, 1841, Father McAleer received a deed from John Claybrook: " . . . deem it a pleasing duty to record . . . the magnanimous fact that the Church lot was in part donated to our Bishop for the Catholic congregation worshipping at Memphis, by the acting agent (Mr. Claybrook) of the heirs of Judge Overton's estate, the nominal price required by the agent being five hundred dollars, which our Protestant brethren very generously paid." (Records of St. Peter's) Henry and William Irwin had the contract for the woodwork; the firm of Hickman and Austin received that for the masonry. D. Morison was the architect. Simultaneously with the church, which faced on Third Street, Father McAleer built a rectory which stood at the rear of the church and fronted on Adams Avenue. Hardly had the church been completed than it was realized that it was much too small. In the CATHOLIC TELEGRAPH of Cincinnati, December 18, 1852, we read: "The Catholics of Memphis, Tennessee, are about to erect one of the most splendid edifices west of the Alleghanies . . . It is to have two towers, each one hundred feet high, surmounted by a chime of bells." (From records donated to the Tennessee Archives by Catherine Magevney Hamilton.)

Among the most noted additions to the Catholic community in Memphis was a nephew of Bishop Miles - Dr. George Murphy, a successful physician. The Catholic Advocate of January 24, 1846, notes his marriage: "Dr. George Murphy of Memphis, Tennessee, to Miss Mary Ann McManus of Bardstown, Kentucky, in the latter place on January 15."
