THE FILE BOX Jerry Blair (Mrs. W. R.)

In the years 1914 and 1915 questionnaires were sent to all known living Tennessee Civil War soldiers and a revised form was sent out again in 1920. These questionnaires contain information regarding date and place of birth; date and place of enlistment; war service, including descriptions of battles, prison life, and other war experiences; economic and social status of the soldier and his family; genealogical data; educational and religious data; occupation before and after the war; and other items of personal and historical value. The veterans were encouraged to write fully of their experiences both during the war and afterward. Many of them sent additional pages of material. There are 1466 Confederate questionnaires in the collection and about 115 Federal questionnaires. All of these are filed in the Manuscript Section of the Tennessee State Archives in Nashville. File Box wishes to remind readers that in these records is to be found a veritable treasure trove of genealogical information. Anyone searching for Civil War ancestry will do well to look into them. The State Library published an index to these questionnaires in 1962, listing the name of the soldier, his county, company and regiment.

A reader sends the following copy of a historical sketch of TRINITY METHODIST CHURCH, Nut Bush, Haywood County, Tennessee, by W. F. Greaves, Sr. The sketch was distributed to the members in May 1923 when they gathered to decorate the graves and pay tribute to the Confederate dead buried in the adjoining cemetery. We quote from the sketch: "Trinity Church was erected in A.D. 1853 from lumber sawn by slaves. The church was dedicated in 1854 by the Rev. Thomas Joyner. The land was given and deeded by Mrs. Rachael Greaves to the Methodist Church, and a part thereof reserved for a cemetery.

Among the noted preachers who preached in this church before the Civil War were: Bishop William Capers, Bishop Moses Brock, Dr. E. Davie, James J. Allison, Edwin Greaves, Dr. Collins, Dr. Rivers, Dr. Gilfort Jones, Dr. G.W.D. Harris, Dr. Thomas Boswell, Dr. William Harris, Dr. Fontaine E. Pitts.

Among the presiding elders of note since the Civil War are W. C. Johnson, Dr. R. H. Mahon, Dr. H. B. Johnston. Some of the Circuit preachers who have preached here were Arthus Davie, John Randall, J. M. Scott, C. J. Mauldin, Bryant Medlin, W. A. Cook, C. T. Peeples, W. J. Simmons, L. D. Hamilton, G. W. Evans, W. F. Acuff, B. T. Fuzzell, V. D. Humphreys, G. H. Martin, Mr. J. S. Renshaw, W. D. Dunn, R. L. Norman, T. E. Foust. The preacher on this circuit in 1854 was Robert Gregory.

The first burial in the cemetery was that of Frank Greaves, who was born ca 1788. He was buried here several years before the church was built. Much of the history of Trinity Church is lost, due to the fact that no records were kept, or they were lost; however, it has stood the storm of war, and the blessing of peace. Its shadows fall upon the dust of many who loved it, and who struggled for it; and many of those living today will rest in the shadow of its portals. The hills and homes about have changed as the years went by, but this landmark remains almost as it did in the childhood of old, gray-haired men who now hobble here to worship.

Trinity Church History: "About a hundred years ago the early settlers of this neighborhood (the Methodists) the Walkers, Alisons, Greaves, Barbees, Holoways, Powells, Rices, Capers and others built a church of logs about a mile from this one, named Trinity, better known as Buckhorn from the deer-horns that were put in the trees for hitching horses to during services. Everybody rode horseback in those days.

"This old church was right in front of the Barbee's front lawn and was used until the present site was given and Old Trinity erected in 1853. In the year 1835, a cemetery was laid out here, starting as a family burial place but after the church was built and all deeded to the Methodist Church by Mrs. Rachael Greaves, most of the members buried their dead here. Frank Greaves was the first to be buried here; then in the spring of 1861 the first Confederate soldier was buried here. Since that time the number of Confederate graves has grown to 43 and we are here today to decorate the graves and pay tribute and respect to the Confederate dead." Signed/W. F. Greaves, May 1923.

Here are some Holloway inscriptions copied from the tombstones in the Church Yard of Old Trinity Methodist Church, Haywood County, Tennessee:

"Sacred to the memory of C. (Crowder) Holloway Born November 23, 1800 Died April 3, 1853."

"T. (Thomas) 0. Holloway Born Oct. 7, 1844 Died Nov. 18, 1929." "Mary B. Holloway Wife of Crowder Holloway Born Dec. 23, 1811 Died Nov. 18, 1890."

"William H. Holloway Born March 19, 1850 Died March 9, 1902."

1850 Census Schedule, Haywood County, Tenn., No. 288, p. 45:

"John Holloway, age 38, born N.C.
Martha Holloway, age ..., born N.C.
Ann E., age 13; Elizabeth, 11; Anna, 10; Martha, 8; William, 6; Harriet, 4; Mary, 2; Emmily, 5 mos. All born in Tennessee."

The same reader sent some DAVIE deeds in Haywood County, Tennessee:

DINWIDDIE COUNTY, VIRGINIA DATA, 1752-1865. Compiled by Thomas P. Hughes, Jr. 1975. Soft covers. Over 135 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, 4140 Chanwil Ave., Memphis, Tenn. 38117. \$15.00.

Dinwiddie County was formed in 1752 from Prince George County, Va., but most early court records were destroyed during the Civil War. The author has collected data and transcribed records from microfilm to give the researcher this helpful source book. He has taken information concerning the early records from a Dr. Walker's book which is owned by the Virginia Historical Society. Transcriptions of documents include the Dinwiddie Co. marriages from Books I-VI, Personal Property Tax Lists from 1782-1830, and the Surveyor's Plat Book of 1755-1865. Also included are abstracts of old letters and the genealogy of Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Low Weaver.

THE DODSON FAMILY OF WARREN COUNTY, TENNESSEE and Allied Families, by Catherine Gaffin Lynn. 1974. Hard backs. Over 290 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, 140 North Central Ave., Centerville, Tenn. 37033. \$12.00.

The Rev. Jesse Dodson was probably born in Fauquier Co., Va. Nov. 12, 1752 and died Nov. 22, 1843 in McMinn Co., Tenn. He was the son of Thomas Dodson and Elizabeth Rose Dodson. He married Ruth Dodson, his first cousin (dau. of Elisha and Sarah Everett Dodson of Pittsylvania Co., Va). Further information may be secured from the books on the Dodson-Dotson Families compiled by the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr. 1966, Ga. Besides being a Pioneer Baptist preacher who helped establish several churches in Warren, White and McMinn Counties, the Rev. Mr. Dodson had the distinction of being one who freed his slaves before his death.

WADE, WAID, WAIDE, A REASEARCH BOOK, by Mrs. Jeff Wade, Jr. and Sons. 1975. Soft covers. Over 260 pages. Not indexed. Order from the authors, Rt. 1, Box 66, Bragg City, Mo. 63827. \$11.00.

This valuable publication for Wade genealogists is exactly as stated, a reasearch book, but what a pity it is not indexed! The contents are primarily census, cemetery and court records from Ala., Ark., Ga., Ind., Ky., Mass., Miss., Mo., N.C., Okla., S.C., Tenn., Tex., and Va. Other topics of great value are: Wades in the 1790 census for eleven states...Obituaries for Wades...Heraldry of 23 Wade families...War records of Wades from the Revolution through the Civil War...Census of Wade Pensioners of 1840...Post offices whose names were derived from "Wade"...Book reviews of Wade or related families...Extracts from publications...unpublished manuscripts...Wade researchers and their lines. This book contains a wealth of information.

BIBLE RECORDS OF WESTERN KENTUCKY AND TENNESSEE. Collected and published by the Fulton Genealogical Society. 1975. Soft backs. Over 100 pages. Indexed. Order from the Fulton Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 31, Fulton, Ky. 42041. \$7.50.

The Fulton Genealogical Society is to be complimented on its valuable contribution to searchers in Hickman and Fulton Counties, Ky. and Henry and Obion Counties in Tenn. In addition to the birth, marriage and death records contained in the Bibles, there are notes from contributors of records wherever additional information was available. The mineographed pages are easy to read and evidently carefully proofread, as there is a later section of additions and corrections included.

GAFFIN FAMILY, <u>Statistical and Biographical Sketches</u>, by Catherine Gaffin Lynn. Soft covers. Over 80 pages. Not indexed. Order from the author, 140 North Central Ave., Centerville, Tenn. 37033. \$12.00.

"This is the story of my father's family, its trials and its triumphs." James Gaffin, a Rev. Soldier from Schagticoke, N.Y., married about 1768 Catherine Van Deusen dau. of Hartman and Margrieta Dyckman Van Deusen. Their children were Mary, Johannas, Abraham, Margarethe and Johanna. This genealogy is that of the lineage of Abraham who married Anna Carpenter about 1800. The family moved to Canada and then to Leaf River, Ill. where Abraham died. Of their children only three are known: Alvah, Abraham, Jr., and Horace. Alvah was the father of Morris, born 1838 in Leaf River, Ill. He married Jane Clark Ziegler. In 1886 Morris Gaffin moved his family to McMinnville, Tenn. The family tree is traced through 2 more generations to the author. The genealogy expresses a love for and dedication to family, and it is very well done.

MARSHALL COUNTY ALABAMA MARRIAGE RECORDS 1836-1848, Vol. I by Christine Pendleton Jones. 1974. Soft covers. Over 65 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, Buck Island Road, Guntersville, Alabama. \$10.00.

Marshall County was erected Jan. 3, 1836 from Jackson and Blount Counties and a Cherokee Indian cession. It is fortunate to be one of the few counties with nearly all of its original marriage documents. All of these were scanned in preparation of this compilation. The material is very well-organized with grooms listed alphabetically and brides, bondsmen and officials listed in separate indices. The author has included a list of alternate spellings and one of other names mentioned. This is a handy and useful reference book for Alabama searchers.

AMBROSE N. COX SR., DESCENDANTS, 1772-1972, by Elza B. Cox. 1973. Hard covers. Over 626 pages. Indexed. Order from Author, Rt. 7, Box 324, Lexington, N.C. 27292. Price \$20.00 p.p.

Matthew Cox Sr. was probably the son of the Matthew Cox who was listed in Botetourt Co., Va. and who was born about 1685 in England. William, the eldest son and brother of Matthew Sr. was also born in England. Matthew Sr. sold land 2-18-1722 in Henrico Co., Va. Their father died 1735 in Goochland Co., Va. The author believes all of his children were born in Botetourt Co which at that time consisted of present Alleghaney, Craig, Roanoke and Bath Counties. Matthew Sr. fought at Great Meadows in 1754 with Geo. Washington's Regiment during the French and Indian War. He was in Montgomery Co., Va. in 1779. His wife was Lucy Dickerson, daughter of Griffith Dickerson of Halifax Co., Va. Matthew Sr.'s last move was from Surry Co., N.C. to Wilkes Co., N.C. Children mentioned were: Carter, Mastin, Ambrose, Aris, Braxton, Delphy and Matthew. This book is well compiled, and its large print ia a boon to the reader.

CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI CEMETERY INSCRIPTIONS, VOL. VI. Compiled and published by William A. Yates. Soft backs. Over 85 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, P. O. Box 1687, Rifle, Colo. 81650. \$5.50.

Mr. Yates has published much data on the Yates family, however, this additional publication holds interest for many other searchers in that it is a record of many cemeteries in Christian Co., Mo. (See the author's Vols. I-V for other cemeteries.) Mr. Yates invites anyone with Bible records which supplement the data in this book to correspond with him.

SETTLERS BY THE LONG GREY TRAIL, Some Pioneers To Old Augusta Co., Virginia, and Their Descendants, of the family of Harrison and Allied Lines by J. Houston Harrison. 1975. Hard backs. Over 680 pages. Indexed. \$25.50. Order from - C. J. Carrier Co., P. O. Box 1114, Harrisonburg, Va. 22801.

This publication is a history of the early settlement of the Shenandoah Valley and a genealogy of the Harrison family which had its origins in England. The long Grey Trail is the great road by which the many people from the Northern Colonies and the great ports of entry went south to escape the French and Indian Wars and to the warmer and rich lands of the South and Southwest. The author presents much information concerning the English origins of the Harrisons. The name originated among the Danes and was brought to England in the form of Aryson. The book is divided into sections in order of settlement. The first period is an introduction consisting of chapters I through XI. This consists of a description of 'The Long Grey Trail' and of the first settlers in the valley—Joist Hite, John Lewis and Isaiah Harrison. The Pioneer Period, chapter XII, is concerned with the family of Capt. David Harrison The Indian War Period, chapter XIII, tells the history and genealogy of Thomas Harrison. The Revolutionary War Period, chapters XIV through XXV gives the history and genealogy of Capt. Robert Cravens and Jeremiah, Samuel and Alexander Harrison. These genealogies are carried as far as the seventh or tenth generations.

THE ANDREW PHILLIPS FAMILY, by Mabel Phillips Baker. 1974. Soft covers. Over 62 pages. Not indexed. Order from the Author, Cantril, Iowa. 52542. \$7.50.

This is a noble little book concerning the descendants of Benjamin and Phoebe Walker Phillips in Randolph Co., Va. Their family of eleven children spread far and wide over the United States, especially to the west. The book is divided into eleven chapters, one for each child and their descendants. These were: Andrew Jackson, Elizabeth Ann, Mary Virginia, Francis Marion, William Howard, Randolph Garfield, Benjamin Nelson, Edward Jackson, George Anie, Thomas James and Lewis Garfield. It relates the achievements of the Phillips family in Virginia, Illinois, Missouri, Arkansas and Iowa.

NEELY, TWO HUNDRED YEARS IN AMERICA, <u>Descendants of James and Ann Neely and Edward and Susannah Goldsmith Neely</u>. Compiled by Marie Davis Wiles and Earle Harrison Davis. 1974. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Marie Wiles, Rt. 1, Box 257, Plattsmouth, Nebraska. 68048 \$15.00.

The Neelys are of Irish descent. Two brothers, James and Edward came from County Galway to America before the Revolution. James and Ann settled in Virginia, where their children were born, and where James became a Patriot of the Revolution. He went to Kentucky soon after that and settled, first in Jefferson County, then in Logan County, where he died. The authors have documented well the genealogy of a great family.

VOLUME III. THE LIGON FAMILY AND CONNECTIONS, by Earle Ligon Whittington. 1973. Hard backs. Over 225 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author, 1791 Peabody Ave., Memphis, Tenn. 38104. No price given.

This new volume of Ligon genealogy is a continuation of the work William D. Ligon in Volumes I & II. It gives individual family biographies, including that of the author, and presents family records of current interest which have come to light since the publication of the first two volumes. The 24-page index contains many names which could give a clue to many researchers.

HOW TO DECIPHER AND STUDY OLD DOCUMENTS, Being a Guide to the Reading of Ancient Manuscripts, by E. E. Thoyts (Mrs. John Hautenville Cope) Second Edition 1903. Republished 1974. Hard backs. Over 150 pages. Not indexed. Order from Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Mich. 48226. \$10.00.

The current interest in antiquities has created a demand for books treating upon such subjects. This one, originally published in England in 1893, explains "various kinds of documents which are likely to be found among the title-deeds of an estate, or among the archives of a parish or a corporation". Among the 12 chapter titles are these: Hints to the Beginner; Saxon, Norman-French and Law Latin; Law Technicalities; Manor and Court Rolls; Parish Officers and their Account Books; Old Letters. This should be a help to all researchers of original documents.

HILL AND ALLIED FAMILIES OF CENTRAL OHIO, by John Neilson Furniss. 1974. Hard backs. Over 205 pages. Indexed. Order from the Author--John N. Furniss, Box 81350, Memphis, Tn. 38152. \$10.00.

The compilation is from family manuscripts and legal documents. One John Hill (ca 1760-1834) from County Donegal, Ireland came to America ca 1790-95 with a son, Charles, and settled in western Penn. By 1800 he was living in Ohio Co., Va. (now W. Va.) and was still there for the 1810 census. By 1820 he was in Knox County, Ohio. Charles, his son who came from Ireland with him (and was married there), has been lost to the family knowledge. Known issue are: Johnston Hill, Robert Hill, Jane Hill, Susannah Hill and Anna Hill whose family histories constitute a chapter of this genealogy. There are also chapters on these allied families: Wheeler, Keys, Gapen, Higbie, Varney, Ewalt, and Douglass.

BURRIS ANCESTORS COMPILED, by Arthur Price Burris. 1974. Soft covers. Over 210 pages. Three page ancestor index. Family group charts. Pictures. Order from the author, 3952 Ewing Ave. South, Minneapolis, Minn. 55410. \$8.00.

This genealogy is concerned with the ancestors of Barbara Jane Burris (Mrs. David Pearsall Platter), Virginia Ann Burris (Mrs. Charles Albert Roach), James Salter Burris II traced through their four grandparents, Florence Louise <u>Bailey</u>, Lewis Howell <u>Merritt</u>, Sara Edith <u>Price</u>, James Salter <u>Burris Jr</u>., and allied lines. The Author has used narrative, charts, and pictures to present the genealogy of his people. An assigned number system helps in coordinating the four different family stories. Allied lines are: Cheny, Emery, Holyoke, Jewett, Noyes, Putman, Thorne and Worcester.

OUR COURAGEOUS ANCESTORS, FACTS AND FABLES, 1600-1974, by Marie Erwin Detty. 1975. Hard backs. Over 135 pages. Not indexed. Order from Mrs. Erwin Detty, 707 British Woods Lane, Friendswood, Texas. 77546. \$20.00.

"A people cannot escape their history any more than a man can escape the powerful influences of his childhood and youth." Mrs. Detty has caught the spirit of the pioneers to Texas and has so wonderfully expressed this spirit here in her little book. Her early and happy life with her parents are expressive of the faith that these pioneers had in Texas. The Erwins were from Scotland. William, Arthur, John, Hugh, Nathaniel and Alexander were six Erwin brothers who came to Penn. and Va. about 1730. The author's people came by way of east Tenn. to the Southwest. The last 38 pages contain information on collateral lines of Adams, Allen, Baxter, Burton, Erwin, Peacock, etc.

Notes in the family Bible indicated that Joseph Burks, the father of John W. Burks, Sr., was born the 5th of December, 1805 and died in the early 1860s. Lucretia Burks, his mother, is reported to have been born the 22nd of November, 1808.

Died 2nd May 1943, Corsicana, Tex.

Born 8 Apr. 1876, McNairy Co., Tenn. Did not marry.

Jessee Fulton Burks

John W. Burks, Sr. was born in McNairy Co., Tenn. and was the son of Joseph and Lucretia (Castleberry) Burks. He was a farmer and cobbler by trade, but as a young man (prior to his marriage in 1852 to Louisa N. Tucker of nearby Hamburg) he taught school at Morris Chapel and Saltillo in Hardin Co., Tenn. In December of 1848 and July of 1849 the names of his students were: William Hughs, Joseph Wilkinson, N. Morris, L. W. Harbert, Nicholas Haddon, John Drake, Cordy Parrish, Franklin Tidwell, Silas Mullen, John Frost, Nancy Parish, James Meck, William Odam (or Adam), and W. McElyeady.

After his marriage, he homesteaded in McNairy County, six miles from Pittsburg Landing. His home was near the Shiloh battlefield, and when it was taken over by the Confederate Army to be used as a hospital for wounded soldiers, the Burks family moved eastward to escape the war zone. They returned when the war was over to find their home in ruins. Nevertheless, they rebuilt; and in 1872, John W. Burks, Sr. was elected Justice of the Peace for the 9th Civil District, an office he held until 1894 when he retired.

One of the young soldiers who had been with General Albert Sidney Johnston's Confederate Army at the Battle of Shiloh was A. J. Anderson, who returned to Shiloh after the war and stayed with the John W. Burks family while serving as pastor to the churches on the Shiloh circuit. The Battle of Shiloh took its name from the Shiloh Methodist Church, which was located on the battlefield and was destroyed in the battle. After the war, John W. Burks was named trustee for the church and was instrumental in reorganizing and restoring the building.

John provided for his family by farming cotton, peanuts, watermelons and corn.

His account book for his cobbler's trade in the year 1863 shows the names of D. T. Atkins, Joseph Duncan, T. J. Campbell, Frank Pack, Thos. Bird, Wm. Reed, James Frazier, Berry Shull, Wm. Counce, J. R. Bird, John Woods, W. W. Harris, J. W. Lowell (or Iowell), Nancy Atkins, Isaac Castleberry, Rebekah Blagg, Rebekah Harris, Sarah Harris, Wm. Harris, N. M. Aldridge, Julia Burks, W. M. McDaniel, G. W. Pratt. All these people were in the McNairy County, Tennessee area.

A REPORT OF THE SHILOH METHODIST CHURCH PROPERTY Nov. 6th, 1868

State and Condition of Shiloh Church Property. There is four acres of land that was deeded to the Methodist Episcopal Church South on the twenty third day of December, 1851 from J. J. Ellis to five trustees for the aforesaid land upon which ground there was erected a good church house which was destroyed by the Army in 1862, which left a naked lot of land, and in 1867 there was erected a common arbor which is the only improvement on said land at this time.

And by death and removal there is but one Trustee for said land who has the deed in possession and has keep the same from the time it was made in 1851. The members of the aforesaid church ask that a board of Trustees be filled out by this conference. The foregoing deed is duly registered in the County of Hardin, State of Tennessee in Book J and Page 37 and 38, October 29, 1852.

John Yates' will is recorded in Caswell Co., N.C. Book A, p. 64. He commissioned Thomas Kilgore, Sr. to sell his 640 acres of land. It has been handed down that John Yates was killed by Indians in 1779 while exploring with Thomas Kilgore, Sr. James Yates, son of John, married Lydia Ann Kilgore, July 22, 1784 in Caswell Co. They came to Robertson Co., Tenn (now the Cross Plains area) with the Kilfore family and settled across the river from Kilgore cave. It was in this cave that Thos. Kilgore, Sr. lived while waiting for his corn to mature before going back to N.C. to claim his 640 acres of land under the Pre-empt law. James and Lydia Yates were the parents of Charles Yates, whose Bible records are given here.James Yates died 1844 in Robertson Co. (Will Book A, Pg. 210-212, 1843-1846, Robertson Co., Tenn.)

Mrs. Carpenter does not know the connection of Boliver Rondolph unless he could be the son of Lieucinda Yates, who married Richard Rondolph. Mrs. Carpenter is descended from Robert Yates who married Sally Pope, and their son Robert Foster Yates.

THE SPARKMAN CEMETERY

The Sparkman Cemetery is located at Boston, Tenn. in Williamson County. It is about 12 miles southwest of Franklin near the old Natchez Trace. Most of those buried here are descendants of William and Roxanna Williams Sparkman of Bertie Co., N. C., who came to Boston, Tenn. shortly before 1800. William and Rosanna are said to be the first couple to be baptized in the Territory South of the Ohio. It is believed that William was a soldier in the American Revolution.
