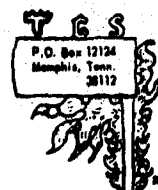

Publishable and non-publishable contributions are put on file in our library for the use of our members.

NOTES FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

There is such a wealth of material that could be published that it sometimes becomes a problem to decide which to choose for these 50 pages. Some records are well-preserved, but not widely distributed, such as documents which have been microfilmed and books which have been reprinted. Other records are in danger of being lost entirely because of fading ink, fire, disinterest or natural weathering. These are the vital statistics found in family Bibles, courthouse attics and cemeteries. "Ansearchin'" News would like to have such records - particularly Family Bibles - which may contain information found nowhere else. Once these records appear in print in this quarterly, those facts are placed in many libraries, including the Library of Congress. Your grandfather's birthdate can never be completely lost. We do have one stipulation - at least some of the dates must pre-date the Civil War.

We have received a complimentary copy (Vol. IV, No. 1 Jan. 1977) and are very much impressed with both the material offered and Ms. Sexton's presentation. Some of you may already be familiar with the magazine when published by the late Miss Ruby Martin. You say your missing ancestor couldn't have been in Indiana? Don't be too sure, as the settlers of the first counties in Indiana were from Virginia, Kentucky and the Carolinas; about 1830 came many Irish and German; about 1850, New Englanders and Quakers, abhorring slavery, from Tennessee and the Carolinas. Some of the top articles from this issue are: Clark County Marriages 1807-1815 (with bride's index), Order Book-Probate "A" 1817, and 1860 Census Washington Township; Excerpts from "The Western Eagle" (1813), paper printed weekly, Madison Co.; Washington Co. early land grants.

Membership charge of \$5.00 yearly includes free queries; quarterly Newsletter; lineage clearinghouse (send your lineage for Master File) publishing Pedigree Charts and a check of Master File (for SASE).

THE BRITISH COLUMBIA GENEALOGIST. Quarterly of the British Columbia Genealogical Society, address: The Library, Langara College, 100 West 49th Ave., Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada V5Y 2Z6. Several types of membership include Individual \$10.00 and non-membership subscription to quarterly only, \$6.00 annually. In addition to the various articles such as "Ontario Searching-Location of Resource Contacts", Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages Act., British Columbia 1872, and Queries, Vol. V, No. 4, Winter 1976 offers "The First Victoria Directory" (Mar. 1860). Directories are a wonderful source for establishing residence and occupation at a given time, especially between Federal censuses, and this one even gives a list of the voters in each district. As many of the pioneers who opened up this part of Canada were from the United States, you might try here for that elusive ancestor.

WEST-CENTRAL KENTUCKY FAMILY RESEARCH ASSOCIATION. P. O. Box 1465, Owensboro, KY 42301. To become a member, there is an initial charge of \$8.00, which covers a registration fee of \$3.00, paid once, and annual dues of \$5.00. Membership includes, not one but two, regular publications quarterly. THE BULLETIN publishes free queries to members, research helps, book reviews, Association news and Surname Index. KENTUCKY FAMILY RECORDS Series (a section of about 20 pp of the "volume-in-progress" is sent to members each quarter) contains Bible and cemetery records, family data and other records of permanent genealogical value sent in by members. Counties covered are Union, Henderson, Webster, Hopkins, Christian, Todd, Logan, Muhlenberg, Butler, McLean, Daviess, Hancock, Breckinridge, Ohio, Grayson, Edmondson, Warren, Simpson and Allen in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

ANCESTORS WEST. Quarterly publication of the Santa Barbara County Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 1174, Goleta, CA 93017. \$1.50 per copy; \$6.00 annual subscription; \$7.50 annual membership. Continuing their purpose of "covering two worlds, Santa Barbara County and Genealogy-at-Large, the No. 1 issue of Vol. 3, March 1977, gives you the finishing segment of Santa Barbara Co. Census 1852; the beginning of 1890 Death Records, listing age, birthplace, etc. (found two Tennessee natives: Thomas C. Martin, age 75 and Sevier Stringfield, age 90); 1864-65-67 Marriage Records; Finley Family; Queries.

JOURNAL (of the) Genealogical Society of Okaloosa County, Fla., P. O. Box 1175 Fort Walton Beach, Fla. 32542. To be published quarterly, subscription is included in membership fee of \$6.00 a yr. Although Okaloosa is a fairly "new" county (1915), it is taken from Santa Rosa (estb. 1842) and Walton (estb. 1824) and could very well provide unpublished material. For instance, the Society's first issue of the Journal, Vol. 1 (17 pp including index) offers Record of Marriages for Santa Rosa County 1869; Wills abstracted in Walton County 1890-1917; Baptisms of St. Mary's Catholic Church, Ft. Walton Beach 1914-1940, giving Mother's maiden name and sponsors; Queries, always a good source. Congratulations and best wishes in your new endeavor, "Okaloosa".

Record Book 1; Wayne Co. Court Notes and Deed Book 1 (1801-1811); Pension Applications (for) War of 1812 Service; Lincoln Co. Order Books (1791-1794); Queries.

FAMILY FINDINGS. Quarterly published by Mid-West Tennessee Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 3343, Murray Sta., Jackson, Tenn. 38301. Subscription by membership, \$6.00 per yr. No. 1 of Vol. IX, Jan. 1977, includes Carroll Co. 1860 Mortality Schedule; Cemeteries in Haywood and Gibson Counties; Bible Records of Williams, McArthur-Wilkin and Hailey-Freeman Families; Madison Co. Newspaper Abstracts, 1833; Queries.

MARYLAND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY BULLETIN. Not available for subscription. Quarterly receipt of Bulletin is included in annual membership of \$7.00 per yr. No. 1 issue of Vol. 18, Winter 1977, presents a recent find in Maryland Hall of Records, "Tax Lists # 1, Anne Arundel Co., Seven Hundred, 1740"; Harford Co. Tax List, 1778; continued from Vol. 17, No. 4, the 1800 Census of Worcester Co.; Queries and answers.

THE VIRGINIA GENEALOGIST. Published quarterly by John Frederick Dorman, Box 4883, Washington, DC 20008. \$10.00 per yr., single issue \$3.00. No. 1 of Vol. 21 continues Fauquier Co., Va. 1800 Tax List, British Mercantile Claims 1775-1803, Some Delinquent Taxpayers 1787-1790, Prince William Co., VA Order Book 1759-1761 and Nansemond County Gleanings. There is also a very interesting article on James Kempe, grandftaher of Varina Howell Davis, the first lady of the Confederacy.

THE SOUTH CAROLINA MAGAZINE OF ANCESTRAL RESEARCH. Published quarterly by Lawrence K. Wells, Editor, Box 694, Kingstree, SC 29556. \$12.50 per annum. Although Mr. Wells is almost a year behind with his publishing, we don't mind waiting because the information is always worth it. For instance, in the 63 pages of Vol. IV, No. 1, 1976, are State Pensions to Revolutionary Survivors (1842-1846); Marriage and Obituary Notices from Greenville Mountaineer (cont.); Estate Partitions, Washington District Court Equity; Royal Grants, Vol. 41, 1734-1738; Early Wills of Camden District (cont.).

THE PIONEER. To be published quarterly by The Douglas County Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 3664, Lawrence, KS 66044. Membership dues \$5.00 annually, due July 1 each year. We congratulate this society, organized in Sept. 1975, on the first issue of Vol. 1, Winter Feb. 1977, of their new publication. If material presented in this issue is a fair sample of what can be expected to follow, they're off to a good start. A "Register of The Old Settlers' Meeting" (held at Bismarck Grove, Kansas, Sept. 15 & 16, 1879, is an excellent example. This is the beginning of a list with names (3000 of them), place & date of birth, place & date of settlement and residence (1879).

RICHARDSON FAMILY RESEARCHER AND HISTORICAL NEWS. Published quarterly by Richardson Heritage Society, P. O. Box 123 (944 So. G. St.), Broken Bow, NEB 68822. Subscription rate \$5.00 yr; \$1.50 per issue (of about 16 pp ea.). Offered as an aid for the Richardson and Allied Families Genealogist, and which has incorporated "The Moore Family Inquirer", this is in the form of a newspaper and should be of interest to all Richardson-Moore researchers. Queries free to subscribers. The "Rotogravure" pages in No. 1 issue of Vol. 3, March 1977, are really something to see.

THE GENEALOGY BUG. P. O. Box 155, North English, IOWA 52316. Published monthly by David and Karla Martin, subscription \$5.00 per yr, \$8.00 for 2 yrs. Formerly "The Martin Genealogist", David and Karla now wish to be of service to people working on ALL lines, not just "Martins", so they have taken the new name. The issue we have, in newspaper form, is Vol. 5, Nos. 2 & 3, Jul-Aug 1976, and is proof they are well on the way to doing just that. Best wishes to you.

VALLEY QUARTERLY. Published by San Bernardino Valley Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 2505, San Bernardino, CA 92406. The March 1977 Issue No. 1, Vol. XIV, continues the San Bernardino Old Pioneer Cemetery Records and also gives some marriages from Book "B", 1871-1877. The copier, Mary L. Lewis, is to be congratulated on the amount of family information she has given on each of the marriages listed. Of additional interest there are several biographies from "History of Mercer Co., Ohio and Representative Citizens". Each biography is complete, not an abstract, and really contains a lot of information.

YELLOWED PAGES. Quarterly of the Southeast Texas Genealogical and Historical Society, 2870 Driftwood Lane, Beaumont, TX 77703. \$7.50 yr., single issues \$2.50 ea. This publication does a very good job of covering several Texas counties. In the No. 1 issue of Vol. VII, Feb. 1977, are Liberty Co. Marriage Book "B" and 1850 Census (continuing); San Jacinto Co. Cemeteries; Jefferson Co. Deed Book "A: (cont.), Prater Cemetery and Pioneer Reminiscences; Jasper Co. 1850 Census (cont.); Newton Co. Commissioners Court Minutes; Sabine Co. Deed Records; Misc.

BULLETIN (of the) California Central Coast Genealogical Society, Inc., P. O. Box 832, Morro Bay, CA 93442. Membership \$5.00 per yr, includes receipt of publication quarterly. Vol. 9, Winter 1976-77, begins with a letter written in 1890 by Paul L. Smith in Creston, CA to his brother (does not say where). It is very descriptive of a trip to Yosemite and back, mentioning names of people met and visited along the way; continues with Index to Patents, San Luis Obispo Co, CA 1859-1923, and "Stereopticon" from San Luis Obispo Tribune, 1872-1874. Births, deaths and marriages reported in latter often mention areas other than California, such as "married - res. of bride's parents - Edwin B. Morris, formerly of Memphis, Tenn. to Miss Ellen Mallagh.

THE SOUTHERN GENEALOGIST EXCHANGE QUARTERLY. Nancy L. Parker, GRS, Editor, 4305 Coquina Dr. S., Jacksonville, Fla. 32250. \$10.00 per yr; \$18.50 2 yrs; \$27.00 3 yrs. As the name implies, it is "Southern", covering ARK, LA, KY, W. VA and all states south and east of them, a total of twelve. The latest issue received, Vol. XVIII, # 81, gives us abstracts from "The Southern Spy", published Bainbridge, Decatur Co., GA 1829-1830; Family Bible Records of Roberts, Sweat-Hutchison, Ledbetter-Bradley (No. Carolina), Hutichison-Kerce; Index to Registrants, Florida Armed Occupation Act of 1842, St. Augustine Office; and the Query section with it's own index.

ILLINOIS STATE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY QUARTERLY. P. O. Box 2225, Springfield, ILL 62705. Membership \$7.00 annually. A good source if researching in Illinois. Vol. IX, No. 1 issue continues the article on Illinois Territory Militia, War of 1812; offers "The Ladies of Jefferson Co., Illinois, Pray" (a petition with 218 names, about 1848); From Vermont and New York to Illinois in 1836; Genealogical Abstracts from Early Laws for Illinois 1783-1821; Queries and various mini-articles.

BOOK REVIEWS

LONG ISLAND GENEALOGIES by Mary Powell Bunker. 1895. Reprint Baltimore, 1976. Hard covers. Over 350 pages. Indexed. *Order from Genealogical Publishers Co., Inc., 521-523 St. Paul Place, Baltimore, MD 21202. \$15.00.*

Fifty nine families are given more or less complete genealogies through wills, deeds, Bibles and vital records from towns and counties of Long Island. All of the families are direct or collateral descendants of Thomas Powell. He was the seventh century forebearer of this 17th and 18th century group of families. The births, marriages and deaths of successive generations are treated and a brief sketch of the founders of each line is treated by means of deeds, probate records and tax lists as recorded. Several thousand names are listed. This publication is regarded as one of the best of the Long Island genealogies.

THE FAMILY HISTORY OF THOMAS MARTIN, SR., A NORTH CAROLINIAN AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER by Jenny Martin Fagg. 1976. Hard covers. Over 385 pages. Indexed. *Order from the author, 4314 Nenana, Houston, TX 77035. \$25.00.*

Thomas Martin, Sr. was a Revolutionary Soldier from North Carolina who took part in that crucial period of American History when the fate of the thirteen colonies hung in the balance. The ability of the colonies of GA, SC, NC and VA to withstand the British under Clinton, Cornwallis, Ferguson and Tarleton was due to such men as Thomas Martin, Sr. who joined the militia and took care of his family, also. The author has combined history, photographs, 565 surnames, censuses, deeds, licenses, letters, wills and maps to tell the genealogy of a first American in a very interesting and valuable way. Major allied families prior to 1900: Barnette, Bishop, Collins, Ellison, Entekin, Gammon, Goforth, Jennings, Lackie, Logan, McAfee, Moreland, Peeler, Pitts, Roach, Sepauch, Thayer, Washburn and Westbrook.

THE LEBOWS OF EAST TENNESSEE, Miscellaneous Information on John Lebow (1792(?)-aft. 1860), His Sons, Isham and Rial, and Their Descendants. Compiled by Ronald J. Seibert. Soft backs. Over 47 pages. Not indexed. *Order from the compiler, St. Thomas Lutheran Church, 21165 Detroit Rd., Rocky River, OH 44116. \$3.50.*

The author, through letters, wills, court records, deeds and family traditions, recalls the story of the Lebow family of East Tennessee. The name Lebow, Lebo, Leabow, LeBeau is Norman French or perhaps Huguenot. Jack Lebow and his brother, Daniel, came to America from France and to Claiborne Co., TN. Jack married Mary Jennings at Lone Mountain. The Jennings, Paynes, Thompsons and others came to the vicinity of Lone Mountain soon after 1775, under the leadership of Daniel Boone. As other pioneer families, they tamed the wilderness, established homes, and ultimately their descendants moved to other counties of Tennessee and to other states of the Union. The author has made use of family letters in an unique way to tell the family story.

JOHNSTON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY COURT MINUTES, 1805 THRU 1807, BOOK VII by Weynette Parks Haun. 1976. Soft backs. Over 135 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, 243 Argonne Drive, Durham, NC 27704. \$15.00.

This is the seventh book of the series that the author has produced. It is a highly useful genealogical source. The publication is well done and covers the court sessions from Feb. 23, 1805 thru Nov. 23, 1807. Many names of the inhabitants are listed.

JOHNSTON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA COURT MINUTES, 1808 THRU 1811, BOOK VIII by Weynette Parks Haun. 1976. Soft backs. Over 133 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, 243 Argonne Drive, Durham, NC 27704. \$15.00.

The author continues the transcribing of the court minutes of Johnston County with the same purpose--to keep and disseminate the genealogical information to be found in these minutes. She has followed the same format used in the preceding books. The book is well done and contains many names and much general information and insight to the people and their way of life.

BERTIE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA COURT MINUTES, 1724 THRU 1739, BOOK I by Weynette Parks Haun. 1976. Soft backs. Over 136 pages. Indexed. Order from the author, 243 Argonne Drive, Durham, NC 27704. \$15.00.

The author has done well, a very difficult operation, in transcribing her first book on Bertie County Court Minutes. Transcribing was done in the order that the pages were microfilmed. Such translations run into peculiarities of writing, spelling and lack of correct spelling. The conditions of the paper on which the records are written, and the lack of care have sometimes been treated. She has, nevertheless, made available much valuable genealogical information. Other books to follow.

DAWSONS IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR AND THEIR DESCENDANTS. VOL I. Compiled by Carol Ruth Dawson. 1974. Hard backs. Over 170 pages. Indexed. Order from the compiler, 1014 E. Grand, Eau Claire, WIS 54701. \$20.00.

This is a tremendous work (Vol. I) in which the compiler has added nine names to the seven that C. C. Dawson published in 1874. It was "Collection Of Family Records Of Various Families And Individuals Bearing The Name Dawson". The compiler used DAR, SAR and S/R records strongly. Each of the sixteen Dawsons is written up separately, lists the sources used, has its own index and is dated as to when written. She lists 448 Dawson surnames and 1492 other related surnames. The sixteen Dawsons were from: MASS, CONN, PA, MD, DEL, VA, NC and SC.

JAMES DAWSON FROM WALES AND HIS DESCENDANTS. Compiled by Carol Ruth Dawson. 1968. Hard backs. Over 204 pages. Not indexed. Order from the compiler, 1014 E. Grand, Eau Claire, WIS 54701. \$7.95.

James Dawson, b ca 1595 in Wales, d ca 1723 in VA. He came to VA ca 1723 and settled on the North Fork of the Potomac River. He married twice and fathered 32 children, 16 by each wife. He lived to be 128 yrs. old. His youngest child was 24 yrs. old when James died. Neither wife's name is known, nor are any names

of his thirty-two children known. A grandson, name unknown, who was born in VA, moved to KY at an early age and was killed by the indians. His only known issue, James R. Dawson, was born Oct. 10, 1794 in Bourbon Co., KY. At the age of 15 he left KY and went to OH, and there married in 1816. They were the parents of sixteen children. Mary died June 17, 1835. Sept. 26, 1832, the Dawsons moved to McLean Co., ILL. James R. fought in the War of 1812 as proved by his pension No. WC 26969. He married Mrs. Elizabeth Robbins and they became the parents of three children. James R. Dawson died April 11, 1848.

The ancestors of the author came from Morris County, NJ. Johnson Fancher's lineage was: Richard-1, Benjamin-2, David-3 and Johnson-4. He was born Sept. 14, 1806 in Sevier Co., TN. He married Frances Louisa Adams, born Jan. 1, 1810. They were members of the Little Pigeon River Baptist Church. According to the 1840, 1850, 1860 census he was a farmer and lived in Sevier Co. He died April 28, 1863. He and his wife were buried on the old home place, in unmarked graves, in a field now in cultivation. Richard Fancher was in CONN about 1725. He moved to Morris Co., NJ, where he died in 1764 and left a will. Benjamin, his son, was baptised in Stanford, CONN Congregational Church Oct. 19, 1735 and moved to NJ with his father. He then moved to Chester Co., PA and died in VA or NC about 1806. He was in TN with his family by 1782, where his sons, Richard, David and Samuel were listed as electors 1791. From Sevier Co., the Fanchers spread far and wide over the U. S., as did other pioneer families.

The six children of Oscar Herbert and Winnie Davis Raines were all born in Dallas Co., TX and were still living there in 1967. They know no other Raines but their father. They had been told that their grandmother Martha Izella Goforth had married Walter Raines but lived with him only a short time and returned home. The curiosity of these six brothers and sisters led them to a fascinating search for their father's people. This search took them to Cocke Co., TN and on to NC, VA & IRE. The unrolling of their search for their father's people is a story interesting and satisfying in the related discoveries.

FORSYTH COUNTY, N.C. CEMETERY RECORDS, VOL. II. Compiled by Donald W. Stanley, Editor, Hazell R. Hartman and Ann Ellis Sheek. 1976. Hard covers. Over 474 pages. Indexed. *Order from the author, 134 Stanley Dr., Kernersville, NC 27284. \$11.95.*

Vol. II lists internments in cemeteries found in Clemmons ville, Kernersville, Middle Fork, Lewisville and Old Richmond townships. These townships are located in the county as follows: Clemmons ville, extreme southwest; Kernersville, touches the eastern boundary, below Belews Creek and above Abotts Creek; Lewisville is on the western boundary of the county above Clemmons ville; Middle Fork touches the city and township of Winston-Salem on the northeast; Old Richmond is in the extreme northwest part of the county. The compilers have collected some 60,000 names from over 200 church and family cemeteries. Forsyth was originally part of Rowan County and later part of Surry, Stokes and Davidson (Clemmons ville township) Counties.

The old index contained misspelled names, names were omitted, three consecutive pages were found to be absent, and names in the index were not in the book. Also, there is a second book (part) of the Lottery which has been lost and never printed. This present volume contains over 30,000 names including those of about 3,000 Revolutionary Soldiers, as much new material was collected. This book is a most informative source to research.

A HISTORY OF WATAUGA COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA With Sketches of Prominent Families by John Preston Arthur. 1915. New material copyrighted by the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr. 1976. Hard covers. The author has given a most interesting description and discussion of the origins and the present of this mountain county of western NC. He lists names, families, marriages, children and descendants from the 1750's through the date of the book. He has been able, through living descendants, to authenticate the stories and events of the earliest settlements, the Revolutionary War and the Civil War. A most interesting history for all library shelves.

1860 AND 1870 U. S. CENSUS OF BENTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE. Transcribed by John C. and Catheryn C. Brown. Brocha Press, Memphis, TN. 1977. 436 pages. Order from *Colonel John C. Brown, Box 37, Eva, TN 38333. \$15.00.*

Col. and Mrs. J. C. Brown of Eva, TN have produced an exceptionally well-abstracted census account for the years 1860 and 1870 for the West Tennessee county of Benton (established Jan. 1, 1836). Practically all details given on each family unit are given in this transcription, including names of persons, their ages, places of their birth and their occupations, along with real and personal estate values. Also listed are the 1860 Mortality Schedule for this county, maps showing local civil districts and the 1860 slaveowners' schedule index. A survey of public and census records available on Benton County are also described. All of this data is presented with an attractive format, easily readable. Anyone with an interest in this section of the state should have this handy census book in his or her genealogical library. It might also serve as an excellent example-guide on the way county census abstracts should be printed.

LIBRARY NOTES

Since many of you are experienced genealogists who have visited libraries throughout the country, you are well aware that most libraries have special files and indexes which are extremely helpful to the family history researcher. As a result of years of work, these research tools have made materials in each collection more accessible to the library patron. Since the files are usually arranged by the alphabetical listing of the surname, it takes little time for a librarian or you, the patron, to check the listing for a particular ancestor. Over the years the librarians in the History Department of Memphis and Shelby County Public Library and Information Center have compiled three such indexes that should prove useful to genealogists throughout the country. Because they require a minimum of time to check, it is possible for the library staff to answer queries by mail for a particular ancestor.

The first of these files is the Tennessee Biography Index. For a number of years Memphis librarians have been preparing a surname index of persons appearing in the following books on Tennessee and Memphis.* It should be pointed out that for the most part persons appearing in this index are the subjects of biographical sketches. This means that in Goodspeed's History of Tennessee Dr. C. A. Hudson, who receives a biographical sketch will be indexed, but his parents, C. Y. and Mary (Pardue) Hudson, who are mentioned in the Doctor's biographical sketch will not be indexed. Nevertheless, we feel that this index has been of great assistance to genealogical researchers.

A second index that has been of much value to genealogists is the Confederate Veteran index. This is an index to the magazine which was published monthly from 1893 through 1932. Confederate Veteran, published in Nashville, reported news and presented feature articles which were of interest to surviving Confederate veterans. It contains numerous biographical sketches of living and deceased veterans. Furthermore, the magazine is replete with various lists and registers of veterans who served in the war. It often provides genealogists with valuable information on a family member. In so far as we are aware, we have the only surname and subject index to the magazine for the years 1893 to 1916.

The library's surname index was begun in 1976 and endeavors to familiarize patrons with research being conducted by fellow genealogists on a particular family. The library staff will check this file for those of you living outside the Memphis area. At the same time, by requesting the form used in the file, we shall gladly add the information on your family project.

TENNESSEE MEN WHO SERVED IN THE OREGON VOLUNTEERS INFANTRY AND CAVALRY DURING CIVIL WAR PERIOD

In 1961, the Genealogical Forum of Portland, Oregon, Inc., published Soldiers Who Served in the Oregon Volunteers, Civil War Period, Infantry and Cavalry, compiled by Mrs. M. A. Pekar and Miss Edna Mingus for Chemeketa Chapter, Daughters Of The American Revolution. The title page states that these soldiers "enlisted for the Civil War, but were used to police Indian Tribes in Oregon, Washington and Idaho."

The 76 pages of the volume list some 1800 men, with details of their service. For most soldiers, the only information provided is rank as private, dates of service and identification of company. In a few cases, additional information is provided: place of enlistment, promotion, desertion, state or country of origin, occupation and age. No officers are listed.

From this latter group, only about 15% of the total, are abstracted the data about men born in Tennessee. No responsibility can be taken for the accuracy of these details, and persons desiring further information should write to the State Adjutant General, State Office Building, Salem OR 97310. Copies of the book may be obtained from the Genealogical Forum of Portland, Oregon, Inc., Room 812, Neighbors of Woodcraft Building, 1410 S. W. Morrison, Portland, OR 97205, for \$1.00. There are doubtless many more Tennesseans listed, though not so identified, in the book.

BROWN - DAWSON - DUNLAP FAMILIES OF TENNESSEE

The saga of the Brown family began in TN ca 1780 with the arrival of John Brown at Fort Nashborough, now Nashville. In 1788, he founded Brown's Station which was located on Mill Creek near what is now the intersection of Thompson Lane and Murphreesboro Road in Nashville. John Brown was killed by the Creek Indians at Holly Tree Gap in Williamson County, TN on Dec 20, 1794.

- I. John Brown m Sarah Ervin of Rowan Co., NC, a dau of Christopher Ervin and Jane McDowell. Later, Margaret Ervin, sister of Sarah, and her husband, David McEwen, joined the Browns at Fort Nashborough. They later all moved to Williamson County. The children of John and Sarah Brown:
