SKETCHES OF PROMINENT TENNESSEANS compiled and edited by the Hon. William S. Speer. 1888. Reprinted 1978. Hard backs. 619 pp . Indexed. Order from the Southern Historical Press, c/o the Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., P. O. Box 783, Easley, SC 29640, \$37.50

This reprint is characterized by 40 pages of new index and contains some 220 surnames and biographical material for each. Some surnames appear more than once. These sketches list important events in the life of the subject, their noteworthy contributions, date and place of birth; names of parents and, if possible, ancestors are named; name of spouse and as much genealogical information about the spouse as was known; and names of children and their spouses. -HLB

The Goodspeed brothers worked throughout the South and Mid-West with similar publications for other states. They divided a state into geographical regions with several counties to each regional volume. All of the Goodspeed Histories have been reprinted except for four volumes which are now being issued by the Southern Historical Press. Each volume contains a history of the state plus a history of each individual county with statistical and historical material relating to persons of importance in the formation of each county. Because of the date of publication (1887) these biographies are of utmost importance to the person with "roots" in Tennessee. -HLB

In this book, a Bicentennial project of the Key Corner DAR chapter of Dyer Co., some thirty cemeteries are surveyed. A brief history, the location, and names in these cemeteries are listed: Atkins, Center, Church Grove, J. L. Cobb, Fairview, Fisher Family, Fowlkes, Gauldin, Hicks, Hurricane Hill, Jones, Meacham, McCorkie, McCulloch Plot, Mount Carmel, Mt. Pisgah, Murray, Neely, Newbern (negro), Oak Grove, Parker, Pettus Family, Pierce, Pleasant Hill, Poplar Grove, Poertner, Rehobeth Methodist Church, RoEllen, RoEllen (colored section), and Shaw. -HLB

The Limestone County Historical Society continues its services to genealogists and historians by publishing this Volume II of Limestone County, Alabama Cemeteries. This county has an illustrious past, being the last residence of many natives of the "Old Dominion" and important early Alabamlans. The county has been divided into four geographical areas and every located burial place fully recorded, even those with no identifiable markers are located and identified as clearly as possible. The book contains four very good maps, the copyists' comments on condition and location of the burial places, sketch maps, photographs, and quite a bit of additional history on some of the people mentioned. The tombstones recorded date from the early 1820's to the mid-1970's and, where necessary for complete records, cemeteries across the Tennessee ine in Giles County were copied. -EPH

This publication lists the names of the bride and groom with the date license was issued and returned, if available. This information is furnished only partially, i.e. sometimes only a license date, and sometimes a license and a return. A date (or dates) is listed for each couple. A bride and groom index increases the usefulness of this book, already well worth the cost. -HLB

SOME SOUTH CAROLINA MARRIAGES AND OBITUARIES AND MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION 1826-1854 compiled by Robert F. Simpson, Jr. and Mrs. Charles R. Barham, Jr. 1978. Soft backs. 209 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Charles R. Barham, Jr.. 1733 Union, \#502, Memphis, TN 38104. $\$ 10.00$

The information was obtained from the early newspapers The Greeneville Republican, The Greeneville Mountaineer and The Laurensville Herald. The Greeneville Republican was first published in 1826, then sold and the name changed to The Greeneville Mountaineer, its first issue being published in February 1829. SC did not require marriage licenses until 1911, so such sources as the newspapers are the best to be had, as most of the early church records are lost. Spelling of names were copied as found. Material in this work are from The Greeneville Republican/Mountaineer through December 1849, The Laurensville Herald, first issue 26 Nov 1845, abstracted 1845-1846 and 18531854, middle years available. -HLB

Itawamba County, located in the northeastern part of Mississippi, was created in 1836 from the Chickasaw Cession of 1832. The western part of the county and the eastern part of Pontotoc County were taken in 1866 to form lee County, so some of the 1860 inhabitants of the two countles would be found in the 1870 census for Lee County. The county seat and courthouse of Itawamba County is in Fulton where most of the early records are extant. This census is quite interesting in that few of the residents were Mississippi natives, most coming from the Carolinas, $T N$, $G A$, and AL. There was also a large group of immigrants from Ireland. -HLB

The author, because of her age, determined that this book would be the product of the people. Always she explained that the accuracy of the data sent to her depended upon the donor. Names and birth dates of husbands and wives, their parents, their ancestors, their children and marriage and death dates were requested. The book has over 30,000 names listed alphabetically. After a person's name, a coded reference indicates the book or books containing information about his or her family. The book may well prove to be the most helpful book ever published to aid Pee Dee families in tracing their ancestry. -HLB

The author has done a magnificent job of tracing his family from the Rhineland to PA, NC, GA, AL, TN and TX. He mentions many names of people who were related or connected to the family. Of course, not all of the family moved on to the next stop and he has names of families and their descendants who stayed in the old locations. He has an interesting and a very plausible account of the changes in spelling which accrued as a result of the translation from German to English spelling, -HLB

The indices are of brides, grooms and officiants. The officiants were Justices of the Peace and Ministers of the Gospel. Many of the records were loose leaf and the bound volumes were not numbered or indexed. Volumes had overlapping years as can be seen by the dates of 1824-1859, 18381845, 1845-1850, 1850-1855, and 1847-1877. The compilation was timely and preserved valuable records. -HLB

James T. $0^{\prime}$ Bryant ( $0^{\prime}$ Briant, $0^{\prime} B r i a n$ ) came to Kentucky between 1844 and 1849. He was born ca 1810 1814 in North Carolina. The 1880 census shows that both of his parents were also born in that state. The author has compiled a very informative volume concerning James and his descendants. These people were in the western part of Kentucky close to and next to the Ohio River in Hopkins, Davies, and Union Counties. -HLB

The compiler clearly states in her introduction that this is a selection of obituaries from deterforating scrap books. Entire newspaper obituaries of various residents of Ray, Clay, and surrounding counties in Missourl are copled herein with the date and name of the paper. Dating from the mid-1930's through 1977, many of these notices contain much earlier family information. Those searching for family connections in this area of Missouri could well save hours of reading newspapers on microfilm by perusing this publication. -EPH

More than just a book of tombstone inscriptions, this is a beautifully compiled and printed book containing in these gravemarkers much of the history of the birth of our nation. St. John's is the oldest Parish in continuous service in English-speaking America. It is amazing that the nearly 3000 tombstones recorded herein have survived time, weather, three devastating wars during which some of the stones were destroyed, and a period of disinterest from the Revolution to 1825. The present church building, constructed in 1728, is the fourth building on the fourth location for this Parish, which still owns two of its three former sites. The old stones from the third church at Pembroke Plantation are dated from 1697 to 1719 and are included. All of the legible tombstones from prior to 1701 through 1977 are recorded verbatim ac litteratim, alphabetically arranged as far as possible, and numbered to correspond with a plat in the Parish Office so the visitor, with the assistance of this Office, can easily locate any specific grave, Burials were not limited to Parish members and there are alsc records of graves moved from and to the present cemetery. The book is fully indexed, including maiden names where they appear on the stones. The reader will find a most informative section containing Addenda and Errata, and a Demography with Age Tables, Places of Birth, Rectors of St. John's Church and other churches. Many hours of painstaking transscription and preparation are reflected in this volume which would be a worthy addition to any collection. -EPH

This publication has about 100 pages of state history and includes personal sketches of the most illustrious families. All sketches were of worthy citizens from all classes. The book gives the most complete account ever written of the history of the early settlers of the northwestern part of Arkansas. The history covers the counties of: Greene, Clay, Fulton, Craighead, Randolph, Mississipp1, Poinsett, Independence, Sharp, Lawrence, Jackson and Izard. There are 90 pages of index. People are named. -hLb

HISTORY OF DECATUR COUNTY, TENNESSEE by Lillye Younger. 1977. Hard back. 452 pp, Not indexed. Order from the author, 212 Georgia Ave., N., Parsons, $\mathrm{TN}^{28363 \text {. } \$ 16.03 .}$

The book presents a mental picture of personalities and life in Decatur County from its beginning as an early settlement. The material was accumulated in several ways--some from old records, some from old newspapers, some from abstracts of early history, some handed dow by the citizens of the county, and some from former citizens. The family histories were compiled by a member of the fam11y. Genealogical searchers will be interested in the chapter on early Decatur countians. There are 150 pages of family histories, 34 pages of registrants, veterans and pensioners of the Civil War (with places of burial), WW I, WW II, Korean and Vietnam registrants. -HLB

The author has complled an interesting genealogy of her ancestor, Robert M. Bondurant, of Fayette Co. . TN. "Some Ancestors" dates back to the departure of the Huguenots from France before the American Revolution, the travels of this family and their migration from the Huguenots' lands in VA granted by England's King William III, up to Robert's arrival in Fayette Co., TN. The author's description of a Huguenot and the route of escape from France should be helpful for others searching for Huguenot ancestors. She has many names well documented. -HLB

It has an ease-of-living human interest style, and should be a priceless possession for people of the Scotts Hill area as well as for former citizens or others whose ancestors lived in the area. The book has original and unusual sketches and maps. There are thousands of names and many old and new pictures and genealogy tables or biographical statements of the early settlers. Family names found in the volume are: Austin, Duck, Eason, Clenney, Scott, Smith, Dyer, Goff, Murphy, Kennedy, Jones, Powers, Presley, Gilbert, O'Neal, Swift, Chumney, Mitchell, Turner, Anglin, Johnson, Caudel, Walton, Thompson, Rhodes, Hart, Maness, Medlin, White, Grissom, Stanfill, Woody, McCollum, Tucker, Minton, Edgin, Wylie, and others. -HLB

The first volume of "Your Inheritance" was published in 1972. It contained the Royal and Baronial ancestry of Joyce Hoo, Magna Charta lineage, and the Toke family in England; Tooke, Rives, Pepper and Harvell of VA; John Roper of Halifax Co., NC; Ezel, Wilson, and Rives of VA to Warren and Halifax Co., NC; thence to Clarke and Monroe Cos., AL.

Volume II contained the Campbells of Halifax Co. NC, Wilcox and Clarke Cos, AL; Jones and Blacknall of Granville Co. NC, and Clarke Co. AL; Gillis and McLeod of Barbour Co., AL, and TX; Miles of Baltimore Co., MD, Orange and Caswell Cos., NC, Hancock and Baldwin Cos., GA, Lowndes Co., AL, MS, LA, and TX; Davis of Hanover Co., VA, Wilkes and Morgan Cos., GA, and Autauga Co., AL. This family genealogy has run full circle in Volumes $I$ and II; comprehensive and easy reading. -HLB

FATHERS OF THE RIDGE by George Rowland. 1978. Soft backs. 156 pp. Not indexed. Order from the author, 101C Wilshire Manor, Poplar Bluff, MO 63901. \$10.00

The handy size and attractive cover of this book foreshow the quality of its contents. Mr. Rowland has divided his work into two parts: Part I consists of an excellent treatise on genealogical research in Greene Co., Arkansas which was created in 1833; and Part II contains alphabetically-arranged genealogical sketches of many of the early settlers of Greene Co., together with the 1840 Greene Co. census, the 1860 Greene Co. census with family numbers, ages, and states of births. There is a final section entitled, "Tennessee Tracings", which is the 1860 Greene Co., AR census cross-indexed with the 1850 census of Tennessee, and the 1860 Greene Co. slave schedule. -EPH

NORMAN GENEALOGY by william E. Norman. 1976. Plastic backs. 270 pp . Index of family names. Order from Wm. E. Norman, 6157 Westwood Terrace, Norfolk, VA 23508, $\$ 12.00$

This monumental work chronicles the Norman families of Witheridge, County Somerset and North Devon, England, traditionally descended from William the Conqueror back through Richard I, Duke of Normandy, 942-996, etc., from 1520 to 1976. The author traces in detail the ancestors in England, descendants and collateral relatives in America of his forebears, George Norman I, 1755-1815, wife Marthe Melhuish, 1757-1844, of Somerset, England, and their sons, George, James and Daniel, who immigrated to Canada and the United States about 1833. The book contains citations of source records, charts, reproductions of pages from authoritative heraldic and genealogical works, newspaper clippings, documents, letters, and a lavish number of quaint place and family photographs. There is an index of more than 1300 family surnames marrying into the Norman families, not including names in special sections or lists. William Ernest Norman in producing this work deserves to be recognized as an outstanding member of an ancient family of remarkable accomplishment. -EPH

LINCOLN COUNTY, TENNESSEE OFFICIAL MARRIAGE RECORDS 1838 -1880 complled by Helen Crawford and timothy Richard Marsh. 1974. Soft backs. Over 315 pp. Indexed. Order from Marsh Historical Publications, 912 Shelbyview Dr., Shelbyville, $7 N$ 37160. $\$ 12.50$

This book is another good addition to published Tennessee records. To fill the gap created by the lack of official records before 1838 the authors used newspapers and family records for unofficial marriage records. All official records are included, the black marriages being designated "col." as was the custom of the clerk. The original page numbering is retained and the marriages are arranged by date. The newspaper accounts are in a section at the close of the book and all names are fully indexed. -EPH

WILLIAM AND ELEANOR NUTT OF VIRGINIA AND CAROLINA, their Descendants and Allied Families by Irene E. Amato. 1977. Soft backs. Over 154 pp. Indexed, Order from the author, 14 Condor Circle, Carson City, NE 89701. \$16.00

This is a beautifully prepared genealogy and history of the descendants and allied families of william and Eleanor Nutt of Augusta Co., VA and Carolina. The book begins with one Willifam Nutt of the Northern Neck of VA before 1650 and includes present-day descendants of William and Eleanor Nutt. There is a section on "Nutt Records with Connections Unknown", appendices and a complete chart of references, plus a thorough index. The reader will enjoy this book due to the author's unusually good narrative style which denies the saying that history is "dull and dry." Highly recomended as to both content and style. Don't be surprised to find your long-lost ancestor in this book--perhaps he was a neighbor to the Nutt family in Virginia or up-country South Carolina. -EPH

ABSTRACT OF WILLS, LINCOLN COUNTY, TENNESSEE 1810-1895 compiled by Helen Crawford Marsh and timothy Richard Marsh. 1977. Soft backs. Over 144 pp. Order from Marsh Historical Publications, 912 Shelbyview Dr., Shelbyville, TN 37160. \$10.00

This most useful publication contains the will records of Lincoln Co., tN from 1810 through 1895. The information from the first five will record books is fully abstracted and arranged in chronological order with the decedent's name capitalized and/or underlined. The authors point out that some early administration and inventory records were destroyed during the occupation of Fayetteville by Federal troops. The book opens with a complete index to testators and closes with a complete index of all names contained therein. The searcher may be surprised at the number of nonresidents who died possessed of land in Lincoln County and the distant lands owned by residents. The original spelling was retained throughout, as witnessed by the transcription of the old longhand "ss" as " p ". The original record book page number is given so that copies of wills may be ordered from the clerk. -EPH

REV. CHARLES ROSE FAMILY OF SCOTLAND AND WESTMORELAND CO., VIRGINIA compiled by Christine Rose. 1976. Soft backs. Over 34 pp. Indexed. Order from Rose Family Bulletin, 1474 Montelegre Dr., San Jose, CA 95120. $\$ 5.00$

This book was written so that the family of Rev. Charles Rose could be distinguished from that of his more well known brother, the Rev. Robert Rose. The publication does not include biographical material, as the author's only purpose is to get the genealogical information to those interested. Many documents which are presented correct and extend previous information, some of which have been included in the appendices. -HLB

The volume is the second in a series of abstracts of colonial records. It contains abstracts of documents from Georgia Colonial Book J, 1755-1762. This book is the earliest of eleven unpublished volumes containing recordings of miscellaneous documents. Five of the volumes date from the colonial period, the other six cover the period 1777 to 1829 . The instruments include affidavits, agreements, bills of asle, bonds, certifications, a charter of affreightment, deeds, instruments of manumisaion, letters, marriage records, powers of attorney (letters of attorney), a will, and other documents. The documents are given in their entirety if the record seems to be one of unusual importance or interest or if the record is not clear except in its entirety. Georgia at this time had pronounced differences in its inhabitants. There were English, Italians, Germans, Puritans, Scotsmen; Negro slaves were everywhere and the Indians roamed the woods of Georgia. -HLB

This volume follows the well-compiled pattern of previous volumes. -HLB

This book was transcribed from C.099.50164 (NC Department of Cultural Resources, Raleigh, NC 27611) which was filmed 6-30-78. The author made every effort possible to transcribe the minutes verbatim. Wake County, which is in north central NC was formed in 1771 and was taken in order from Cumberland, Johnston, and Orange Counties. This book fills a tremendous gap in the court records. -HLB

These two sisters set out to prove the forebears of their children and grandchildren and to preserve a record of those forebears. They traced the Meeks from Pendleton Co., SC through Franklin Co., GA, Bedford Co., TN, Tippah Co., MS. Nathan Meeks married Sarah C. Jones in Lincoln County, TN before the Meeks family moved to MS. From there they went to Texas where connections with the Hughes family were made. The Hughes family was first found in Union Co., SC. From there they moved to Asheville, NC. Thomas and brother William came to Texas and settled in Bastrip County, but later moved to Burleson (now Lee) County and settled at the Knobbs. As many as four generations of the Hughes-Meeks families are recorded as having lived at the Knobbs. -HLB

The Auter and Quick families were of Dutch origin also. The Engels were of Palatine origin. The author has named other families, some on which she has given some information, others very little information. Most of the early arrivals were of Germanic origin. From the above-named colonies and states the family moved westward to many states. Her family arrived in Arkansas from Kentucky. -HLB

THE GOODBARS OF TENNESSEE<br>By Miss Carmen E. Clark, B.S; B.L.S. Rd. 2, Box 224, Lexington, VA 24450

[Editor's note: Material in this article will be included in Miss Clark's forthcoming book, Goodbars I've Found: 1774-1978. She is a graduate of Longwood College, Farmville, VA, and of the Univ. of NC. A librarian, now retired, she has held positions at Longwood College, Air Univ. Maxwell AFB, AL, and U.S. Army War College Library, Carlisle Barracks, PA.]

Joseph Goodbar was born in Rockbridge County, Virginia, 3 January 1786, to Willian and Sarah (Pearman) Goodbar. 1 At age 18, he left his parents' home and joined a group of emigrants pushing southwest through the Shenandoah Valley, and became one of the very early settlers in Middle Tennessee. About 1804, he located in Jack son County near Monroe, which part of Jackson County in 1806 became Overton County. ${ }^{2}$ Monroe was the county seat until 1835 when the courthouse and county government were transferred to Livingston. ${ }^{3}$ On 13 September 1808, Joseph Goodbar married Nancy Masters, born in North Carolina, 26 August 1788,4 daughter of Hillary and Mary (Davies) Masters then residents of the Mt. Gilead Community of Overton County. ${ }^{5}$

Joseph and Nancy (Masters) Goodbar, progenitors of the Goodbars of Tennessee, reared a family of seven sons and four daughters. Joseph was the recipient of land grants along Roaring River, ${ }^{6}$ owned slaves, and later was a merchant in Livingston for several years prior to his death on 9 December 1859. His store was located on the southeast corner of the public square. 7 On 7 January 1848, Joseph Goodbar deeded as a donation to the elders and trustees of the Christian Church lot no. 90 in the town plan of Livingston (West Main Street). 8 A log building with open fireplace on one side was erected on this lot. The building was burned during the War Between the States and was rebuilt about twenty years later. ${ }^{9}$

Joseph's oldest son, William Pearman Goodbar, was sheriff of Overton County, 1840-44; circuit court clerk, 1844-50, when he moved to White County, ${ }^{10}$ There, he was a successful merchant and served as the fourth president of the Branch Bank of Tennessee at Sparta, During the War, fearful that the bank should be robbed by guerrillas, he ordered J. G. Mitchell, a former president of this bank, with two guards to take $\$ 43,000$ to Chattanooga where the money would be safe. Mitchell and his guards were met by bushwhackers and robbed. ${ }^{11}$ William Pearman Goodbar died 24 October 1878. His son, James Monroe, and his grandson, James Bright, were

[^1]successful businessmen and influential citizens of Memphis. James Monroe Goodbar was honored by the City of Memphis in having Goodbar Avenue named in his memory. 12

Joseph's second son, Hillary Masters Goodbar, born 25 February 1814; died 24 July 1843; married 27 August 1837, Tennessee Mangold. 13 Hillagry was postmaster at Livingston 1837-3914 and was a trustee of Overton Academy. ${ }^{15}$

James Madison Goodbar, 1816-1905, was a large landowner on the west fork of Obed's River about 12 miles from Livingston. ${ }^{16} \mathrm{He}$, too, owned slaves and was a rabid secessionist on 8 June 1861.17 He engaged in merchandising, farming, and stock raising. He also served as postmaster at Walnut Grove 1850-60. After the War he moved to Lebanon where he was a merchant. About 1870 he bought the Governor Jones Home with two hundred acres located $11 / 2$ miles north of Lebanon on the Cumberland Pike where he resided until his death on 2 February 1905.18 James M. Goodbar, his wife, Verlinder (Cullom) Goodbar and nine of his children are buried in Row D, Privilege 34, Graves 1-14, Anderson Lane, Cedar Grove Cemetery, Lebanon. His son, Alvan Burr Goodbar, 1849-1937, was a member of Goodbar \& Co. wholesale boot and shoe business, Memphis, for many years. About 1890 he moved to St. Louis where he became president of Goodbar Shoe Manufacturing Co, and was associated with the Boatmen's National Bank in the liquidation department. 19 Alvan Burr's son, Alvan Jo'y Goodbar, 1883-1970, was a very prominent lawyer in St. Louis for more than fifty years; He was Lay Chancellor of the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri from 1939 to 1962.20

Andrew Jackson Goodbar, 1826-1862, was a merchant who also dealt in slave trade and real estate. He was postmaster at Livingston 1855-57. He was killed in the Battle of Perryville, Kentucky, 8 October 1862.21 He and his wife, the former Susan Jones Cullom, born in 1830, died in 1865, are buried in the Cullom plot, Bethlehem Cemetery, Overton County, Tennessee. ${ }^{22}$ Andrew Jackson and his brothers, James Madison, and Thomas Porter, all married daughters of Judge (and Congressman) Alvan and Susan (Jones) Cullom.

Joseph Lafayette "Fayette" Goodbar, born 12 April 1829, was for many years associated with his brother, Andrew Jackson, in mercantile business in Livingston. In 1850, Joseph L. was living in the home of his brother, Andrew Jackson. ${ }^{23}$ In 1860 he was living at Roberts' Inn, Livingston. His occupation was listed as 'Negro Merchant' with personal property evaluated at $\$ 11,000,24$ He enlisted 11 November

[^2]1861 and served as 2 Lt . Co. D. 4th Regt. (Murray's) Tennessee Cavalry until his resignation 18 July 1863.25 J. L. Goodbar was associated with Goodbar \& Gilliland, Memphis, 1866-1876, and with his nephews, James Monroe and Alvan Burr, in the firm of Goodbar \& Co., Memphis, 1876-1883.26 The Goodbar Bible has no record of his marriage, and his nephew, Alvan Burr, states that he never married. 27 James Alonzo Goodbar, born 17 September 1851, Overton County, and married there on 9 June 1869 to Lean Cope, 28 told his children that his father's name was "Fayette", and James Alonzo who died 11 March 1934 at Mineral Wells, Texas, had a son named Alonzo Lafayette. 29

Jesse Franklin Goodbar, born 11 Juñ 1831, was also a merchant in Livingston before his marriage and move to Sparta. ${ }^{30}$ Two of his grandsons were outstanding in their respective fields. Dr. Joseph Ernest Goodbar, 1890-1953, financial expert and lawyer, graduate of Harvard Law School, instructor at Boston University Law School, lectured on radio and was the author of two books, Managing the People's Money and A Creative Capitalism. ${ }^{31}$ As of this date, Joseph Ernest is the only Goodbar to have been included in Who's Who in America. The Reverend Fritz E, Goodbar, 1889-1975, a graduate of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, TX, was a pioneer in Arkansas Baptist educational work, first president of the statewide Sunday school organization, and was described as a man of remarkable natural ability and amazing dedication to his tasks as minister. 32

Thomas Porter Goodbar, 1834-1910, was listed as a merchant in Livingston with personal property evaluated at $\$ 8,000$ in June 1860.33 He was postmaster at Livingston 1871-72. Later; he also moved to Lebanon where he, his wife, Sarah Ann (Cullom) Goodbar, and five of their seven children are buried in Row G, Privilege 25, Graves 1-13, Bone Lane, Cedar Grove Cemetery. 34

Three of Joseph's daughters married into rather prominent families. Mary "Polly" Davies Goodbar, born 1 March 1819; died 21 November 1895; married 19 July 1835, Stephen Decatur Burton, born at White Plains, Putnam County, 8 October 1813; died 17 March 1892. He was well-educated and inherited large landed estate $\bar{夕}_{3}$ several slaves and other personal property, being a nephew of William Quarles. 35

Julyann Ford Goodbar, born 16 August 1821, married 20 December 1842, Burton Marchbanks.

Emily Wakefield Goodbar, born 26 March 1824, died 30 June 1898, married 19 May 1850 Edward Bradley Draper. Many of her descendants are Iisted in Draper Families in America.

[^3]Although the first Goodbar family of Tennessee had an important role in the early history of Overton County, no person of the GOODBAR surname has lived there during the last hundred years. Goodbars moved to various parts of Middle Tennessee. From about 1884-1905, there was a post-hamlet, GOODBARS, in Warren County, near McMinnville. 36 Nashville has a GOODBAR Drive. 37 In 1884, Lonoke County, Arkansas had a post-hamlet, GOODBARS. 38 Descendants of the Goodbars of Tennessee have been found in Missouri, Arkansas, Texas, Ohio, California, Georgia, Maryland, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. No one bearing the surname, GOODBAR, has currently been located in the entire state of Tennessee.

Until 19 May 1977, GOODBAR wasn't listed in the genealogical index of the Manuscripts Section, Tennessee State Library and Archives. Except for sketches of individuals in various biographical dictionaries and an unpublished record prepared by the late Alvan Burr Goodbar, 1849-1937, nothing has previously been written about Goodbars of Tennessee. Mr. Burr Goodbar's compilation was based chiefly on facts related by his father, James Madison Goodbar. Except for his father, no birth or marriage dates for the children of Joseph and Nancy (Masters) Goodbar were included. On 16 May 1977 while researching in Livingston, I learned from Mr. Robert L. Eldridge that Mrs. Cleo (Draper) Sayre had a Goodbar Bible. Mrs. Robert L. Goodpasture directed me to the present owner.
