This is a very attractive publication with many names and much information including church information, cemetery listings, queries, index (S-Z) of Buffalo Co. homestead claims prior to 1880, article on Germans who came from Russia and settled in Franklin Co., and assorted other genealogical information.

THE PANOLA STORY, Pan-Gens Historical & Genealogical Society, Batesville, MS 38606. \$5.00 per yr. to Mrs. Norma Riser, Kyle St., Batesville, MS 38606. Vol. VIII-No.4. This issue includes extracts of early newspaper information in Panola County, historical highlights of Peach Creek Baptist Church, queries, a continuation of an abstract of records and an index for 1979.

THE SOUTH CAROLINA MAGAZINE OF ANCESTRAL RESEARCH, Box 21766, Columbia, SC 29221. Vol. VIII, No. 1, Winter, 1980. \$15.00 yr. This is a very attractive professional looking publication with 62 pages containing much genealogical information: marriages performed by Rev. Basil Manley, 1832 tax list for the town of Camden, marriage and death records extracted from various newspapers, court records, book reviews, and much more.

YELLOWED PAGES, Southeast Texas Gen. & Historical Soc., c/o Tyrell Hist. Library, P.O. Box 3827, Beaumont, TX 77704. \$7.50 per yr. Pub. Feb., May, Aug., Nov. Vol. X, Feb. No. 1. Features an article on the Westminster Presbyterian Church of Beaumont, including its history, names of members, and genealogical data on early Presbyterians in Beaumont. Also, has ancestor charts on Kalas, Phillips, and Ellison families, bible records on Jordan, Landrum families, tax list of Liberty Co. 1851, census information, marriage records, etc. and information on Claiborne West, born in Franklin Co., TN.

SEQUOIA GEN. SOC. INC. NEWSLETTER, P.O. Box 3473, Visalia, CA 93278. Vol. 6, No. 6. March 1980. Features cemetery records of Visalia to 1920 (T-W), miscellaneous information on Tulare County and queries.

SOUTHERN GENEALOGISTS EXCHANGE QUARTERLY, P.O. Drawer 50610, Jacksonville Beach, FL 32250. \$12.00 per yr. Vol. XX, Winter #92. This publication deals with information for Arkansas, Louisiana, Ky., TN, MS, AL, GA, FL, SC, NC, VA, and WV. This issue includes census information, mortality schedule, queries, etc. as well as an article regarding the growing incidence of theft of genealogical records and a discussion of ethics for all persons doing genealogical research.

GEURIN GAZETTE, 457A Manzanita Avenue, Santa Cruz, CA 95062. Vol. 2, No. 3, March, 1980. This continues to be a well written attractive newsletter on the Geurin family, and anyone with genealogical ties to this family would find it worthwhile.

THE PENNSYLVANIA TRAVELER-POST R. T. & M. C. Williams, P. O. Box 307, Danboro, PA 18916. \$12.00 per yr., pub. qtr. Vol. 16, No. 2, 56 pages. This continues to be an attractive, well-written publication with much genealogical information. This issue contains information on the following families: Daniel Williamson of Chester Co., Owen Richards of Berks Co., Joseph and Elizabeth Brown, and the Bradley family of Chester Co. Other features include Marriage Records of Rev. Alex Dobbin (1774-1808), Pension List, article on Moravian history, Turbut Township, cemetery information, confirmations of St. Peter's Luthern Church, militia information of Lancaster County and other genealogical material.

HENCKEL GENEALOGICAL BULLETIN (Hinkle, Henkle, Henkel), published by Mrs. Bert Harter, Editor, 3812 Flagler Ave., Key West, FL 33040. \$5.00 per yr. Spring and Fall issues, Vol. No 10, No.1 and No.2. The purpose of this bulletin is to make additions and corrections to the first six generations in the published genealogy of the Henckel family and to identify other Henckel immigrants of the Colonial period. If you are researching the Henckel or related families, this would be most informative as it contains much factual information.



## BOOK REVIEWS

ROSTER OF SOLDIERS AND PATRIOTS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION BURIED IN TENNESSEE

Compiled by Lucy Womack Bates. 1974. Revised 1979 by Helen Crawford Marsh. Published by Tennessee Society DAR. Soft back. 192 pp. Order from Mrs. Richard H. Frank Sr., Valley View Road, Brentwood, TN 37027. \$12.50

There is a wealth of information on most of the soldiers listed in this book. Birth and death dates, place of death, marriage and children are the most common data given. Included here are many names of Revolutionary Soldiers and patriots who have never been used in establishing DAR lines. Some are included who died outside Tennessee, perhaps because they moved to the homes of their children, or because they died while visiting in another state. At the end of the book is a section which gives general information pertaining to pensions and laws. If one has ancestors in Tennessee at an early date, this is an excellent book to use in research. RECORDS OF GREENE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI Compiled by Ben and Jean Strickland. 1980. Soft back. 62 pp. Indexed. Order from the compilers, 62 Simpson Lane, Milton, Florida 32570. \$9.00

In response to many requests for records of this county, the Stricklands have compiled Vol. I of the Tax Rolls of Greene County. This volume begins with the 1812 Territorial Tax Roll and continues through the 1820 State Tax Roll; however, rolls for 1813 and 1814 are missing. In 1816 a census was taken of all existing counties in Mississippi in preparation for statehood in 1817. This census is included in this volume. If you are looking for an elusive ancestor who came to Mississippi very early in the 1800s, be sure to check this one; the index contains at least 358 different surnames. EWG

BENTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE COUNTY HISTORY SERIES by Jonathan K. T. Smith, Esq. 1979. Hard back. 136 pp. Indexed. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, TN 38152. \$10.00

Memphis State University Press is continuing the publication of a history of each of Tennessee's ninety-five counties. The subject of this volume is Benton County. Located in West Tennessee, it was formed in 1835 from Henry and Humphreys Counties. A very valuable tool is an appendix surveying the available public records. Many maps and pictures help one in research, as does a discussion of land grants and occupant right claims (squatters' rights). The first white settlement was made in 1818 and many early settlers are named. We welcome this series and look forward to reading them all. This one is very well written and informative. EWG

THE WALLACE COLLECTION, VOLUME I by Ruth Petracek. 1979. Soft back. 195 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 935 River Lane, Santa Ana, CA 92706. \$19.50

The author has compiled a tremendous amount of available Wallace data from many sources. She hopes that you may locate your own Wallace connection through the various biographies given. On most of these, the name and address of the source is supplied so that you may pursue further any family pertinent to your research. She plans to publish an additional volume with more Wallace biographies. There are many photographs and reproductions of records, which are valuable sources for those researching in the Wallace lines. EWG

JOHNSTON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA ABSTRACTS: DEED BOOKS A-1, B-1, TRANSCRIPT-1, D, D-1 1759-1771, Vol. I. *Transcribed from microfilm and abstracted by Weynette P. Haun.* 1980. Soft back. 159 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 243 Argonne Drive, Durham, NC 27704. \$18.00

These very valuable records of colonial times are the earliest in existence for Johnston county, the previous fourteen years deeds having been destroyed in a fire. References to these "burned deeds" are made in later books, and Ms Haun has listed them separately with a reference number indicating where they may be found in this book. Many of the pages of the original are badly faded or mutilated, and considering the difficulty of old handwriting, we are indeed fortunate in having such an experienced interpreter as Ms Haun. The book titled Transcript-1 has been copied from an earlier book, but unfortunately the original deed book number is not stated. Deed Books D & D-1 contain some of the same transactions, therefore Ms Haun has edited them to avoid duplication. HLB

TREE CLIMBER NOTES, RAY COUNTY, MISSOURI *Soft back. 60 pp. Indexed. Order from The Family Tree Climbers, P.O. Box 422, Lawson, MO 64062. \$10.00*

Compiled by a group of ladies who are interested in genealogy, these notes are primarily concerned with Ray County, but they do include other records as well. These ladies have a project of cataloguing old cemeteries; some are included here, and we can look forward to more in the future. Other material in the booklet comes from court house records (marriages from Liberty, Casey County KY, and copies of Land Grants in KY to Edward Ward) and individual collections (the POINTER-WILKINS family), but the largest section, except for the cemeteries, is given to the 1877 Atlas of Ray County. Settlers are located by section number, and acreage is given.

BOOK OF OBITUARIES - MISSOURI, NO. 2 *compiled by Lucretia L. St. John. Soft back. 81 pp. Indexed. Order from compiler, Rt. 2, Box 316, Lawson, MO 64062. \$10.50*

This second book contains more obituaries from the Ray County area and surrounding counties. Most of the obituaries are from a scrapbook kept by Mrs. Ray Weaver of Liberty, MO, the former Miss Thelma Linville of Elmira, MO, who shared them with the compiler. Finding them to be a great source of information, she now shares them with you. For those with ancestors in Ray County, this book is a good place to find family relationships and vital statistics.

WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE CEMETERY LISTINGS *compiled by the James Buckley Chapter, NSDAR. 1980. Volumes I and II. Soft back. Indexed. 1073 pp. Order from James Buckley Chapter, NSDAR, P.O. Box 23, Sharon, TN 38255. \$20.00 each volume*

This collection represents the combined efforts of many members dedicated to the preservation of burial records and family history. It not only locates many "lost" sites in Weakley county, but includes borderline cemeteries for Obion, Henry and Gibson counties in TN and along State Line Road in KY. Following many of the listings, helpful genealogical data is included when possible. Cemetery record data gathered as part of a WPA Project in 1939 is included following the present-day listing. Some of the cemeteries in the 1939 project are not extant today, and this is valuable information for researchers. Twelve pages of maps are used in each volume. These maps locate cemeteries listed in both books. This work is a great contribution to genealogy, and the compilers are to be congratulated on it.

OLD ALBEMARLE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, PERQUIMANS PRECINCT COURT MINUTES, 1688-1738 by Weynette Parks Haun. 1980. Soft back. 184 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 243 Argonne Drive, Durham, NC 27704. NC residents add sales tax. \$20.00

Albemarle County was formed in 1663 as one of the three original counties of the colony. Located in the northeast part of the colony, it encompassed the first permanent settlement in NC. The court minutes have been transcribed as they appear in the original manuscript, even though they are not in chronological order. These very interesting records give a picture of every day life in colonial times, as well as genealogical data such as names of orphans and their guardians, names of persons transported to the colony by an individual, first name of the wife of a grantor, cattle marks recorded by a man for his son, and residence of a man at a given time. This is a very valuable tool for early North Carolina searchers. HLB

KELSO KIN AND ALLIED FAMILIES, COLLINS-HINES-JONES-CARNEY-NAYLOR-MOORE-LINK by Virginia Naylor Smith. 1979. Hard back. 386 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 1716 Temple Ave., Nashville, TN 37215. \$25.00 and \$2.00 postage

The author feels that if your name is Kelso, or if you have a femal ancestor whose name was Kelso, this book will interest you, and rightly so! The first chapter lists the Heads of the Kelso Clan in Scotland from 910 to 1910, a period of one thousand years. Her branch of the family came to America about 1748, and her immediate family is centered in Haywood County, TN. Many interesting events make this account quite readable, and the painstaking research and documentation are obvious. Family lines are brought down to contemporary members of today. EWG

THE RAPOPORT FAMILY TREE, A Record of its Origin in Fifteenth Century Italy by Joseph Rapoport, translated, corrected, and edited from The History of the Rapoport Family by Rabbi E. Carmoly, 1861. 1975. Soft back. 43 pp. Not indexed. Order from Morteus Press, Inc. 274 Madison Ave., New York, NY 10016. \$12.50

Rapoport is a common name among Jews in Italy, Germany, Poland and Russia. It is taken from the German word for "raven" plus a final syllable designating the town in which its progenitor lived. The original history was written in Hebrew and contained fourteen chapters. This version contains only eight as the other six dealt with persons who lived in Israel, Galicia, Germany, Moravia and Hungary in the eighteenth century. There are included, however, two chapters on the Yungetobin family. This book would be a valuable addition for genealogical libraries. HLB

MILLS FAMILY HISTORY, Quaker and Other Early Arrivals by Paul Mills. Soft back. 168 pp. Indexed. Order from Paul Mills, 808 Corby St., Woodburn, OR 97071. \$9.50

This book has been revised and updated from an earlier edition with the same name. Correspondants from many states sent additional material, and although much has been added, the author does not claim that it is complete and hopes that someone will continue to work on this family. John Mills, the immigrant, came to America from England in 1682 and married Sarah Harrold before 1688. He died in Philadelphia in 1704. His family later moved to VA and settled on Opekan Creek near Winchester. During "Braddock's War" and the Indian troubles, they, being Quakers, moved to Guilford Co., NC. By 1792 some descendants had moved to Lost Creek in Jefferson Co., Tennessee. From there some members of the family moved to Ohio and other states of The Northwest Territory. An interesting feature of the book is the use of personal references and quotations by various members of the family. HLB

OWEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY ABSTRACTS OF DEEDS, Book C 1827-1830, Book C 1830-1834 by Dorothy Merrifield. 1980. Soft back. Indexed. 105 pp. Order from Mrs. M. Boddie Pulling, 305 Moreton Bay Lane 1, Goleta CA 93017. \$16.00

These abstracts were made from microfilm of the original deed books, which was borrowed from the Library of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Salt Lake City, UT. Each book is indexed separately. Ms Merrifield's abstracts are excellent, and the comprehensive index makes her book easy to use. She has inserted marriage record data, where appropriate, relative to the persons named in the deed. This information was taken from books previously published by her. EWG

GALLATIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY MARRIAGES 1799-1820 by Dorothy Merrifield. 1980. Indexed. 41 pp. Soft back. Order from Cook-McDowell Publications, Inc. 719 East 6th Street, Owensboro, KY 42301. \$7.00

In 1977 Dorothy Merrifield published portions of this book under the title Gallatin County, Kentucky Marriages 1799-1918. The index included the name of the bride only. This book contains additional material consisting of names of parents, bondsmen, ministers, witnesses, expanded index and 126 more marriages which took place between the years 1800 and 1820. The index has been revised to include all of the names other than the grooms', which are listed alphabetically. Valuable information can be gleaned in this book, and it is well-worth checking for KY ancestors. EWG

THEN AND NOW - LEA COUNTY FAMILIES by Lea County Genealogical Society. 1979. Hard back. 580 pp. Indexed. Order from Lea County Genealogical Society, Inc., P.O. Box 1044, Lovington, NM 88260. \$25.00

This large in size and content book consists of three hundred and four family sketches of the early pioneers in Lea County, New Mexico. I found it fascinating reading, full of personal anecdotes, pictures and family history. The narratives are written by family members and are brimming with stories of frontier family life. This is a marvelous reference book for people known to have been living in the area and good reading for everyone. EWG

CEMETERIES OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS, VOLUME I published by Northwest Arkansas Genealogical Society. 1980. Soft back. Indexed. 106 pp. Order from the Society, P.O. Box K, Rogers, AR 72756. \$8.50

This book begins a series that will contain inscriptions from all known existing cemeteries in Washington county. This county was established in 1828, and some of the early settlements are still in existence. Names are listed in the order in which they were read, so that you may be able to locate a grave, should you visit. All family data found on the markers has been recorded as read. EWG

WILL BOOK 2, AMELIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA (Wills 1771-1780) abstracted by Gibson Jefferson McConnaughey. 1980. Soft back. Indexed. 109 pp. Order from Mid-South Publishing Co., P.O. Box 188, Amelia, VA 23002. \$9.50 (VA residents add .34 sales tax)

Will Book 2 contains estate divisions, inventories and appraisals, as well as wills and includes all persons and places named, with original spelling preserved. This book contains records of present day Nottoway Co., VA, which was not cut off until 1789. This is a welcome addition to records of Amelia County. EWG

GAFFIN FAMILY Statistical and Biographical Sketches by Catherine Gaffin Lynn. 1969. Soft back. 80 pp. Order from Catherine Gaffin Lynn, 140 North Central Avenue, Centerville, TN 37033. \$7.00

This Gaffin family originated with James Gaffin, who was a member of the New York Militia during the Revolutionary War. He married Catherine Van Dusen, and their children were Mary, Johannes, Abraham, Margaretha, and Johanna. Of these, Abraham married Anna Carpenter about 1800, and they moved to a spot near Toronto, Canada. Later they moved to Chippewa and Leaf River, IL. They are buried in Rice Cemetery, Ogle Co., IL. Their grandson Morris, (born 1835) married 12 Mar 1860 Jane Clark Zeigler. They lived most of their life in Ogle Co., but after a successful career as a teacher and farmer, he moved his family to McMinnville, TN in 1886. These two were the parents of the author. An ancestral chart and many pictures add interest to this well-written and informative genealogy. HLB

THE DODSON FAMILY OF WARREN COUNTY, TENNESSEE AND ALLIED FAMILIES by Catherine Gaffin Lynn. 1974. Hard back. 286 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 140 North Central Avenue, Centerville, TN 37033. \$12.50

Mrs. Lynn has gathered material from all the usual sources of family information, but she tells us that much of the material on the Dodson, Evans, Martin, McGregor and Hennessee families was discussed by her mother and a double cousin of hers while they cooked or washed dishes. Catherine was listening! Other allied families include Bonner, Bottoms, Chisum, Christian, Gribble, Jennings, Mitchell, Powell, Smith, Swann and others. EWG

BRYANS, HORTONS AND ALLIED FAMILIES by Elizabeth Cate Manley. 1978. Soft back. Indexed. 110 pp. Order from Mrs. Frank T. Manley, 1130 Highland Avenue, Cleveland, Tennessee 37311. \$8.00

This is the fourth family history that Mrs. Manley has researched and compiled, and she credits her grandmother, Betty Bryan Julian, with arousing her interest in family lore. BBJ, as she is called herein, delighted in Civil War tales, stories of the hard Reconstruction years, and her experiences as a pioneer school teacher in Bradley County, TN. Counted among the relatives are Rebecca, wife of Daniel Boone, and William Jennings Bryan. The early Hortons were Quakers, but two known descendants, Abraham, Jr. and Daniel, fought in the Revolutionary War. EWG

Decatur is a small county formed in 1845 from Perry County. It anchors the middle of the extreme eastern edge of West Tennessee. With only 9,437 people, according to the 1970 census, it is noted for cotton, corn and soybean production and for its natural resources. The 1850 census shows point of origin for most inhabitants as being North Carolina, Virginia and Tennessee, with some from Kentucky, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Illinois, New York, Germany and Ireland. Very intriguing is the author's account of the small communities such as Lick Skillet, Tie Whop, Sugar Tree, etc. The section discussing Wars includes the names of citizens who raised companies for both Confederate and Federal service. The county was divided in loyalties, and "there was no such thing as neutral ground".

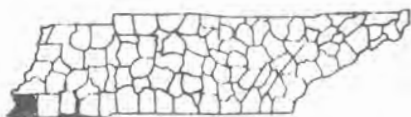

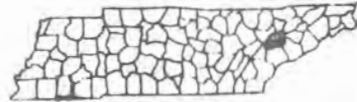

GEORGE T. and FELIX F. HUNTER, Confederate Soldiers - Information from Mr. Bill Sopher, 923 Avenue C., Ft. Madison, Iowa 52627

Confederate Army Discharge: F. F. HUNTER, a private of Capt. J. H. GOODWIN, Co. I of the 6th Regiment of Arkansas Volunteers, born in Union County in the state of Arkansas, aged 16 years, 5' 10" high, light complexion, blue eyes, light hair, and by occupation a Farmer was enlisted by N. A. HILL at Camden, Ark. on the 4th day of Nov. 1861, to serve one year, and is now entitled to discharge by reason of having been passed by Board of Com. & is under 18 years of age.

The said F. F. HUNTER was last paid by Maj. LANDERS to include the 30th day of April 1862, and has pay due from that date to the present date. There is due him \$20.00 traveling allowance from Tupelo, Miss., the place of discharge, to Pocohontas, Ark., the place of enrolment, transportation not being furnished in kind. Given in duplicate at Tupelo, Miss., this 25th day of July 1862. J. H. GOODWIN, Capt. Commanding Company.

Received of Maj. A. S. LANDERS, Q.M., C.S. Army, this 26th day of July 1862, fifty one dollars and sixteen cents, in full of the above account.

Company Muster Roll for Dec. 31, 1861 to Feb. 28, 1862, shows he was at Murfreesboro, Tenn. - by Hawthorn; present Feb. 15th but not paid; Copyist - J. VORKOEPER. By Feb. 28th he had been paid by Maj. LANDERS.

Company Muster Roll for Dec. 31, 1861 to Feb. 28, 1862, shows that G. T. HUNTER, Private, Co. I, 6th Reg't Ark. Infantry, was enlisted on Feb. 15th at Murfreesboro, Tenn. by Hawthorn; present but not paid. The next Muster Roll showed that he died at Courtland, Ala., 18th of March. Copyist - J. VORKOEPER.

There is a letter from G. T. HUNTER written from Camden, Ark., on 8 Jan 1862 to his Dear Mother and Brother which says in part - he and Felix and the whole company were doing very well. Some had deserted but they will elect L. W. MATHEWS, Captain. Colonel WRIGHT told him he wanted all our officers elected out of the boys who stayed here. A Sunday morning walk had taken him to a graveyard where the sight of so many graves caused him to think of the time when he would have to "lay in the narrow confines of a tomb". He signed himself, "Your wicked son, G. T. HUNTER".

Another letter written from Danville, Tenn., on Jan 26, 1862 said they arrived there yesterday after a 27 hour ride on a car from Memphis. It had been said when they left Memphis that the Yanks had this place, but they had run about 15 miles from here, so they did not have to fight. They found two Mississippi Regiments there, which is about 120 miles from Bowling Green. They were where Colonel R. LYONS got killed. He was then about 500 miles from home but felt safe because he knew that all wise providences of a just God would smile upon him. The company was all well except S. T. MARTIN, a fine and worthy man whom they left at Memphis sick with pneumonia. He sent word to the girls, if they cared anything for them, to write because it would do them much good. There is a letter written by both sons on Union University stationery, from Fayetteville, Tenn., with an illegible date. It was full of rumors: that General PRICE had had a battle, had taken old Gen. SIEGLE and other prisoners, that France had recognized the Independence of the South, and that they had been badly whipped at Ft. Donaldson. 5,000 were killed on the battlefield..."Father, I tell you fighting is no child's play; it is serious business". When he got up Sunday morning and saw the white flag and knew that the fort had surrendered, he, Felix, Lt. MATTHEWS, and several others went down to the hospital. They were encamped eleven miles from Fayetteville, but although their feet were sore from marching over mountains and rocks, he "reconned" they would march again tomorrow. It would take them about three days to get to Huntsville. He had received a letter from home delivered by GEORGE BIRD. HALE WILSON sends respects. Love to all connections and inquiring friends.

THE REED - GOLDEN WAGON TRAIN - Information from Mr. Tommy R. Trice, 211 W. Mississippi, Vivian, LA 71082

Mr. Trice has sent us a typed copy of a diary owned by his grandmother, Mrs. ESSIE M. REED of Goldonna, LA, and written by HENRY SLOAN REED while in a wagon train between November 6, 1868 and January 8, 1869. The REED and GOLDEN families started from somewhere in central Alabama, either in Macon County where the Reeds lived, or in Tallapoosa County where the Goldens lived. On their way to southern Arkansas they traveled through Marion, Greensboro and Newburn, Alabama crossing the Black Warrior and Tombigbee Rivers into Mississippi. They proceeded through Lauderdale Springs to Hillsboro, Mississippi in Scott County where some of the people in the train got so tired of the slow progress that they split up. Few, if any continued on to Arkansas.

The diary is a dreary account of winter hardships - endless delays caused by rain and mud, money and patience fast ebbing away, and another delay when Lucy had her baby. Wood had to be hauled for fires, guns had to be repaired, and food had to be obtained by turkey, squirrel and deer hunting. "A good 'Nig' in the morning, seemed the only bright spot on the Birthday of Christ. If they had a wish, it would be to be somewhere else.

The family of HENRY SLOAN REED and that of his father-in-law, Dr. WILLIAM G. GOLDEN, stopped at Damascus, Mississippi in Scott County where they were as late as 1870. In 1880 the REED family were living at Walnut Grove in Leake County, Mississippi and a few of the GOLDENS were there also. The GOLDEN family consisted of himself, his wife Mary ("Molly"), daughter Luella and a workhand BEN SHARP. About 1887 the REEDS and GOLDENS headed for Louisiana and settled in Natchitoches Parish. The town of Goldonna was named after Dr. GOLDEN. When they first arrived, they camped on a small hill where the graveyard is presently located. The REED land joined the GOLDEN's and they lived about a mile apart.

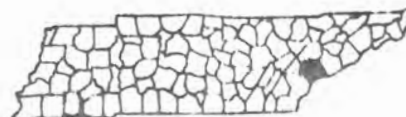
