BOOK REVIEWS

CERTIFICATE BOOK OF THE VIRGINIA LAND COMMISSION 1779-1780 by Kentucky State Historical Society. 1923. Reprint with new material copyrighted 1981. Hard Back. 367 pp Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, P.O. Box 738, Easley SC 29640 \$27.50

Many things contributed to the confusion in land titles in the early Kentucky settlements. A settler would build a cabin, return to Virginia for his family, and upon returning to the settlements find another pioneer's cabin in the same neighborhood. As the settlements multiplied, the situation became more complicated. So in 1779 the Virginia Legislature passed an Act authorizing the appointment of four Commissioners to sit as a Court and hear proof of claims. A certificate for a 400 acre settlement could be issued when the claimant's right was established. The certificate might also cover a preemption right of 1000 acres additional and adjoining. The Commission began its work in October and made several rounds of the various stations and settlements. The certificate book is the official record kept by the clerk.

CLAIBORNE COUNTY, Tennessee County History Series by Edgar A. Holt, edited by Joy Bailey Dunn and Charles W. Crawford. 1981. Hard back. 134 pages. Indexed. Order from Memphis State University Press, 38152 \$12.50

This book is a continuation of the series begun in 1979 with publication of histories of Anderson, Benton and Bradley counties in Tennessee. It is No. 13 of the series. Claiborne was erected in 1801 from parent counties: Grainger, Hawkins, Sullivan Knox, Green, and Washington. On its northern border with the state of Kentucky is famous Cumberland Gap through which settlers from southwest Virginia and North Carolina moved into Kentucky. In this county history are chapters on early and modern development, Civil War, and Legacies and Memories, which includes the lengthy wills of William Graham 1841 and Benjamin Sewell 1847. Many photographs of groups of people and buildings compliment this book.

1880 AND 1890 CENSUS CANADIAN DISTRICT CHEROKEE NATION INDIAN TERRITORY by the Oklahoma Genealogical Society. 1978. Soft back. 90 pp. Names in alphabetical order.

When one hears of the migration of the Cherokees one thinks of the "Trail of Tears." Actually the migration process started much earlier and had its beginnings in the Revolutionary War. The majority of the Cherokees were sympathetic to the British cause and with the defeat of the British, a group of them moved to southeastern Missouri in 1794. Following an earthquake there in 1811, they moved to west central Arkansas, where by 1817 they numbered about 2,000. In 1828 the Arkansas land was exchanged for land in present day Oklahoma and a part of the lands thus acquired lay in what was to become a portion of the Canadian District of the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory. Use this publication as an index to the original census records.

JOHNNY COBB: CONFEDERATE ARISTOCRAT by Horace Montgomery. 1981. Soft back. 104 pp.

Professor Montgomery became interested in the Cobbs while doing a study on Southern political parties at the University of Georgia. The family's prominence in Georgia politics during the 1840-50 period prompted him to do the monograph. Captain John (Johnny) Addison Cobb, CSA, was an aristocrat. He managed his uncle's seven plantations and eight hundred slaves in the year 1859, two years before Georgia seceded

from the Union. By the time Sherman torched Georgia six years later, John Cobb had at the age of 26 become the protector of family mansions in Athens, Macon and Americus and keeper of Cobb plantations throughout Georgia. Letters of his and his wife, Lucy Barrow Cobb, along with other records have been used to prepare this work. One sees how the men performed under battle conditions; how the family sought to preserve itself and how they behaved at the War's close.

YALOBUSHA CO. MISSISSIPPI CEMETERY RECORDS VOL. I by the Yalobusha County Historical Society. 1979. Soft back. 130 pp. Indexed. Order from the Society, Rt. 1, Box 15, Coffeeville, MS 38922. \$6.00.

When the Yalobusha County Historical Society was organized in 1976, one of the first projects suggested was the recording and publishing of the county's cemetery inscriptions. This has turned out to be a mammoth job. So, Vol. 2 exists and Vol. 3 is in the process of being printed. Included is also a volume on "Oakhill" cemetery in Water Valley, Mississippi. This volume contains some thirty cemeteries as well as 27 family cemeteries. In the early days of the county, before churches had been built and community cemeteries established, many families started their own. As a result, there are numerous small ones scattered throughout the county with less than a dozen graves in them.

FIRST LAND SETTLERS IN MARION COUNTY, ALABAMA 1820-1850 compiled by James C. Lawler. 1981. Soft back. 28 pp. Indexed. Order from Mr. Lawler, Rt. 6, Box 52, Hamilton, AL 25570. \$6.00.

Marion County is in northwestern Alabama and has a common border with the state of Mississippi. The county was formed in 1818 from Tuscaloosa County which in turn was formed from Cherokee and Choctaw Indian lands earlier in 1818. The book has over 400 names of early settlers and the date they entered or bought land in the county. The township, range and section numbers of this land is given with the certificate number for securing a copy of the land patent. Five maps of Alabama which show the development of the counties dating from 1818 to 1866 are included.

1860 U.S. CENSUS OF GREENE COUNTY, ARKANSAS by Una Pollard. 1980. Soft back.

1870 U.S. CENSUS OF GREENE COUNTY, ARKANSAS by Una Pollard. 1980. Soft back.

161 pp. Indexed. Order both from compiler, Rt. 2, Box 253, Piggott, AR 72454. \$10.00.

This 1860 census contains a map of Greene County showing the location of the seven townships, a schedule of the free white inhabitants, a schedule of the slave inhabitants, mortality schedules, and a complete family surname index. The enumerator spelled the names as they sounded, so pronounce your family name and check every phonetic spelling of it.

Many of the men from Green County went to the Civil War between 1860 and 1870 and some never came home again, leaving widows and orphans on this later census. Lots of these families and displaced children are living with relatives or other neighbors. This enumerator also gives a lot of information as to occupations. The county has grown to twelve townships since the previous census. This volume includes the mortality schedule of 1870. Together these two published records present a marvelous opportunity to study the residents' stability or mobility, growth within each family and neighbors.

YALOBUSHA COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI ORIGINAL LAND PATENTS BOOKS 1 AND 2, 1833-1853 compiled by Francis Marion Duke III and Chris B. Morgan. Soft back. 209 pp. Indexed. Order from either Morgan, 3428 Northmoor, Memphis, TN 38128 or Duke, 205 Alexander, Memphis, TN 38111. \$15.00.

Many researchers consider the Yalobusha County Original Land Patents to be high on the list of the county's most valuable tools for research. The books contain key information on the area's first settlers, much of which can be found nowhere else. The lands dealt with in these books, contained here in a single volume, were originally purchased by the United States by means of two separate treaties and subsequently divided into land districts. Sales started in 1833, and continued for years. Even by 1853 some large sections were still unsold. To simplify the use of this book its contents have been divided into three parts. Part 1 consists of the first volume and index; Part 2 is the second volume and its index; Part 3 consists of maps made exclusively for this book to aid the researcher in locating the purchases.

MARRIAGE RECORD BOOK I JANUARY 2, 1789- DECEMBER 13, 1837 DAVIDSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE Rev. Silas Emmett Lucas, Jr., Editor. 1979. Hard back. 200 pp. Order from Southern Historical Press, P.O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$20.00.

Davidson County was established in 1783; named in honor of Brigadier General William Lee Davidson of North Carolina, distinguished officer killed in the Revolutionary War. In 1790 Davidson County was one of seven counties in Tennessee and comprised a much greater land area than its present boundaries. Names of the groom and bride are listed, date license issued, page number of the original record book and in some cases the J.P. or minister performing the ceremony. The index includes the names of both the grooms and the brides. There is a separate index for the names of ministers, J.P.'s, etc. The marriage of Andrew Jackson and Rachel Donelson 17 January 1794 is on page 6 of the marriage record book. If you have ancestors in middle Tennessee during this period, this is a source you should consult.

ENGLISH WILLS by Peter Walne. 1964. Reprinted in 1981. Soft back. 62 pp. Order from Virginia State Library, 12th and Capitol Streets, Richmond, VA 23219. \$5.00.

This small volume is an excellent guide to probate records in England and Wales with a brief note on Scottich and Irish wills. It indicated possible locations of American wills that might have been recorded in England as late as 1858. The appendix to this latest edition has been revised to reflect changes in locations and addresses of pre 1858 English and Welsh probate records.

THE BONNER FAMILY RECORD by Kathryn R. Bonner. 1979. Soft back. 100 pp. Indexed. Order from author, Rt. 3, Box 61, Marianna, AR 72360. \$12.00.

This record is primarily of the Bonners of Surry and Sussex Counties, Virginia; those that went to Wilson, Madison, and Shelby Counties, Tennessee; and those that went on to Phillips County, Arkansas. Over twenty years of research is represented here. Included are census records, deeds, wills, Revolutionary War and War of 1812 statements, court records, cemetery notes, obituaries and letters. Some of the allied families are Belk, Bently, Brown, Ryan, Vaughan, and Walthall. These are just a few of the surnames found in this lovingly compiled record that Mrs. Bonner presented to her husband and his family.

MEMORIAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL RECORDS, COMPENDIUM OF LOCAL BIOGRAPHY by George Ogle.

Among the counties represented in this book on the Cumberland Region of Tennessee are Bledsoe, Van Buren, Sequatchie, Grundy, Cumberland and Marion. Extensive biographical sketches for over 200 persons are here and each sketch contains many, many names and a great deal of history. The biographical sketches contain some genealogical gems. For example, the Bright family is traced from Holland to England to Virginia.

MONTANA'S GENEALOGICAL AND LOCAL HISTORY RECORDS VOL. II by Dennis Lee Richards. 1981. Hard back. 363 pp. Indexed. Order from Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, MI 48226. \$36.00.

This research tool contains a selected list of books, manuscripts and periodicals concerning the types of records that exist for the state of Montana. Part one of the book groups together 24 subjects, such as: fraternal organizations, church records, ethnic groups and Native American articles and census. Part two lists sources found within each of the 57 counties, such as: a cemetery directory, dates county records began, and dates of newspapers. The book contains an author, a title, and a subject index. Much of the information is on microfilm and the location of the original or the filmed material is given when known.

LIFE AS REVEALED THROUGH EARLY AMERICAN COURT RECORDS, Including The Story of Col. John Custis of Arlington, Queen's Creek and Williamsburg compiled by Elmer Thomas Crowson. 1977, copyright 1981. Hard back. Over 181 pp. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, % The Rev. S. Lucas, Jr., P.O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640 \$17.50.

The original shire of the Eastern Shore of Virginia was Northampton which constituted all of the peninsula below the Maryland line. Later a great portion of the northern part of the peninsula was constituted as Accomack County. Although relatively isolated in the early history of Virginia this proved a blessing in that the wars that destroyed much of Virginia's early records did not come to this area. The oldest continuous county court records beginning in 1632 are presented here through 1715. Some are quoted verbatim, others are extracted or transcribed, but in every case the real meaning is not lost. The occasional recorded marriage or intestate death adds to the genealogical value of this volume.

FAYETTE COUNTY, GEORGIA, WILL BOOK 'A' 1828-1897 by Joel Dixon Wells. 1981. Soft back. 36 pp. Indexed. Order from Mr. Wells, Rt. 2, Box 895, Hampton, GA 30228 \$7.50.

Fayette County, Georgia was constituted in 1821 from Henry County and Indian Lands. Henry County was erected the same year from Walton County and Indian Lands. Walton County was erected in 1803. Therefore some records pertaining to Fayette County could be found in Walton or Henry Counties or some Indian records of the U.S. Government. The first probate date of the will book is 3 Nov 1828. The book is well done, giving page numbers for wills in the original will book and a good survey of the wills therein. The index cites every surname mentioned in the wills, which makes this book genealogically useful.

ALABAMA RECORDS, VOLUME 222, CHAMBERS COUNTY compiled by Pauline Jones Gandrud. 1981. Soft back. 104 pp. Indexed. Order from Southern Historical Press, P.O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640. \$10.00 plus \$1.50 postage and handling.

This is one of the 245 volumes compiled by Mrs. Gandrud, whose genealogical records are widely acclaimed by genealogists as basic for Alabama research. Bordering with Georgia, this eastern Alabama county was formed in 1832 from Creek Indian Lands. The publication contains selective records of early lawsuits, wills, and pensions of the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, and Indian War. An extraordinary content is the obituary of Mrs. Narcissa E. Heath.

THE DESERTED SYCAMORE VILLAGE OF CHEATHAM COUNTY by Lois Barnes Binkley. 1980. Hard back. 234 pp. Indexed. Order from author, P.O. Box 21, Pleasant View, TN 37146 \$21.50

This is the first comprehensive history of Cheatham County, Tennessee settlers and their work at the Sycamore Powder Mills to be published. A detailed and interesting narrative, it includes interviews with surviving mill workers and direct descendants of original settlers of the area, official court house records, newspaper accounts, personal letters, and attention to the development of education, industry, medicine, and agriculture in the area. This is a handsomely bound and beautifully illustrated volume which features more than 200 photos throughout the text.


INDEX TO THE 1820 CENSUS OF TENNESSEE compiled by Elizabeth Petty Bentley. 1981. Hard back. 287 pp. Indexed. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 111 Water St., Baltimore, MD 21202 \$21.50

With the exception of the 1810 census of Rutherford County, census records for Tennessee prior to 1820 no longer exist, The fourth federal census, taken in 1820, is the FIRST census that is available for the state. However, several eastern Tennessee counties are missing even from this census. They are: Anderson, Bledsoe, Blount, Campbell, Carter, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Greene, Hamilton, Hawkins, Jefferson, Knox, McMinn, Marion, Monroe, Morgan, Rhea, Roane, Sevier, Sullivan, and Washington. This book is an index to heads of household, some 35,000, listed in alphabetical sequence. Following the name is the county of residence and page number of the census schedule wherein full data on the household and its occupant may be found.

HINES AND ALLIED FAMILIES by Benjamin McFarland Hines. 1981. Hard back. Over 259 pp Indexed. Order from Dorrance & Co., 35 Cricket Terrace Center, Ardmore, PA 19003 \$20.00

The family genealogy presents first the Hines line of descent from William Hines of Sussex County, Virginia. Given in reverse genealogical order is a record of their principal allied families: Watson of Virginia and Mississippi; Shackelford of Virginia, South Carolina and Georgia; Nisbet of North Carolina and Georgia; and Kennon of Virginia. Presented in the appendices are various obituaries, memorials, diary excerpts, letters and court records. With photographs and a full index, this is a very neat and helpful compilation of these "Hines" connections.

SURVEY BOOK A, SHELBY COUNTY, TENNESSEE Abstracted from microfilm of the original by Jean Alexander West

The microfilm used in this abstract was taken from the original book, which is faded and worn, with many torn pages. A copy of the original book was made at some later date, and this, too, was photographed and placed on the same roll of film. The two versions were compared, and sometimes the missing information was replaced or questionable interpretation was clarified. Page numbers used here are those of the copy.

The entries in the Survey Book follow a set form, for the most part. A plat or drawing of the land surveyed is on the upper left corner of the document. The form the surveyor used to make his statement was fairly consistent. The first entry begins,

"No 8 State of Tennessee 11th District by virture of an entry No 29 dated the 7th day of December 1820 Founded on certificate No 1816 dated October 8th 1820 Issued by the Commissioners of West Tennessee to Martha Haywood for 200 acres, I have surveyed for John C. McLemore two hundred acres of land in the 11th District in Shelby County on the waters of Big Creek of Loosa Hatchie River in Section 4, Range 8. Beginning one hundred chains south, twenty chains west of said Section 4, Range 8....."

Then followed a detailed measurement by chains and links with notation of unnamed branches that were crossed and trees that were marked JCM. The form continues:

"....which tract of land is truly represented in the annexed plat, Surveyed January 18th 1821.

Joseph J. Nichols)

Walter Murray)C.C. (Chain Carriers) John Ralston, D.S. (District Surveyor)

This entry tells us that a certificate for 200 acres of land in West Tennessee was issued (sold, or granted?) to Martha Haywood by the Commissioners of West Tennessee. The certificate was #1816, and it was issued 8 Oct 1820, but no reason is given here for the issuance. Martha either sold, traded or gave the certificate to Jno C. McLemore, who entered it in the Land Office as #29 on 7 Dec 1820, then located the land he wanted, and requested the District Surveyor to survey and record it. The 200 acres was located on branches of Big Creek, a tributary of Loosahatchie River, in Range 8, Section 4 of the 11th Surveyor's District. The surveyor gave the tract his own number, No 8, and recorded in his book that he surveyed it 18 Jan 1821. The two assistants who carried the measuring chain served as witnesses to the survey.

In order to save space in our abstract, we have omitted some details and retained what seemed to us to be the most important facts. They are:

- 1. the original certificate
- 3. the number of acres surveyed
- 2. to whom it was issued and date 4. for whom and on what date surveyed 5. location of the land

In almost all cases the certificate was issued by the Commissioners of West Tennessee, and that fact will not be repeated on each entry. Whenever another agent issued the certificate, that fact is included here. There were only two surveyors in this segment, John Ralston and William Lawrence. The chain carriers who appeared here were:

MOSELEY RECORDS - Contributed by R. F. Simpson, Jr., 4522 Garnett, Memphis TN 38117

These records are based on the George Moseley Bible published in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1795. It is in possession of Mrs. Ida Bailey Mathews, Tyler, Tex. in 1963. George Moseley, Sr. was born in Colonial Virginia 18 Dec 1758. He was a farmer and served in the Virginia Militia during the Revolutionary War. About 1787 he and his family moved to Burke Co., N.C. where he lived for almost ten years. The land records of Laurens Dist., S. C. show he purchased a plantation in 1798 where he farmed with his family until his death in 1823. By his first wife, Lucy _____ b 27 Apr 1762, whom he married 9 Feb 1781, he had 7 children:

Second generation

John Moseley, Esq. (1785-1853), son of George Moseley, Sr. and Lucy _____. He and his first wife lived in Laurens Dist.,S.C. until December 1816 when they moved to Madison Co. in the Mississippi Territory which in 1819 became part of Alabama. He and two others bought the largest tavern in Huntsville. They remamed it "Bell Tavern" where they served Andrew JACKSON. He later purchased land between New Market and Hazel Green in Madison Co. where he farmed. He also was an attorney, served as a Justice of Peace for over twenty years, and was in the Madison Co. Militia. John Moseley married his first wife, Elizabeth ("Betsy") WAKEFIELD, who died 10 May 1839, January 1808 in Burke County NC. She was the oldest daughter of N.C. Rev. War militiaman, Thomas Wakefield and Lucy JOHNSON. She and John had the following ten children:

During 1836 he was Captain of a company that was ordered into Federal service to aid in the Cherokee removal. By 1843 he had been appointed to the rank of Brig. Gen. in the Alabama Militia. After serving a term as Tax Collector, he was elected High Sheriff of Madison Co. for 1846-49. During the Civil War he raised a company for the defense of Madison Co. After the war he moved his family to Mount Pleasant, Marshall Co., Ms. About 1875 he moved near Jefferson in Marion Co., Tx, where he farmed until his death 7 Jan 1880. Thomas married Minerva Jane LIPSCOMB 11 May 1854 in Huntsville, Ala. and they had the following children: John, Mary, Elizabeth, George F., Jane Beauregard, Samuel Lee, Booth and Charles F. Madison Moseley.
- 2. Lucy Caroline Moseley b 31 July 1810 in Laurens Dist., S.C.; d 14 Oct 1855. She married James THOMAS 29 Jan 1829 in Huntsville, Ala. He was a Tax Collector for two terms and High Sheriff 1849-1852. After his death 16 Oct 1852, Lucy moved to Cass Co., Tx with her children: Charles M., John M., James V. M., George W., Lucian W., and Lucy Carrie Thomas.
- 3. Dr. George Hamilton Moseley b 12 Aug 1812 in Laurens Dist., S.C.; d 8 Apr 1889. After becoming a physician in Madison Co., Ala, he moved in 1836 to near Mount Pleasant, Marshall Co., MS and then later lived in Hudsonville. He bought several large tracts of land and engaged in farming. In 1849, 1850 and 1851 he was High Sheriff of Marshall Co. and in 1861-62 he served in the State Legislature as a representative. Between 1870 and 1880 he moved to Shelby Co., Tn., where he farmed with his son, Jeff D., and operated the Merchants Eat House in Collierville, Tn. In early 1886 he and his wife returned to Marshall Co., Ms. where they lived with their son-in-law, Robert M. SIMPSON. Mary Ann E. TATE (b 3 July 1817 in Morganton, NC and d 14 Aug 1886) married Dr. George H. Moseley 25 Nov 1835 in Franklin Co., Tn.

Mary Ann E. Tate was the daughter of David Tate, Sr. and his second wife, Christana Wakefield. Their children were:

- 1. Mary Louise Moseley b 24 Dec 1839 at Hudsonville, Ms; d in Oct 1902. She married Robert M. Simpson (d Oct 1903) in Holly Springs, Ms. on 17 Nov 1858. His store on Holly Springs Square was one of those burned by Federal troops during the Civil War. After the war he engaged in farming on a large tract of land and built another store about 3 miles north of Holly Springs. BOBBITT 3 Apr 1890 in Holly Springs, Ms. and their children were: Hattie May, Elizabeth Louise, Emma Augusta, George Clifton, Louise, and Gussie Moseley.
- 4. Charles Pulaski Moseley b 25 Nov 1860. He married, Mary E. Davis, in Holly Springs, Ms. on 11 Feb 1889 and their only child was Martha Moseley.

George Hamilton and Mary Ann Moseley had the following six other children who died before the age of six years: Lucy Sophia, Thomas G., John Tate, Emma Christiana, George H., Jr. and Emma B. Moseley.

- 4. Nancy Eveline Moseley b 16 June 1814 in Laurens Dist., S. C. She moved from Madison Co., Ala. to Marion Co., Tx, where she died single in May 1860.
- 5. John Augustus Robertson Moseley b 30 July 1816 in Laurens Dist., S.C. and died single in 1867 in Franklin Co., TN. He was an ensign in Madison Co., Ala Militia and was living in Holly Springs, Ms. in 1860.
- 6. Samuel Fountain Moseley b 15 Nov 1818 in Madison Co., Ala.; d 23 Feb 1878 in Marion Co., Tx. After being admitted to the bar in November 1842 in Huntsville, Ala., he practiced for a short while in Memphis, Tn. before going to Bowie Co., Tx. where he specialized in real estate law. He was a representative to the State Legislature from Bowie Co. in 1847-48. He married Caroline Pink FORTUNE and had eight children: Elizabeth W., Frank S., James B. (twins), Charles F., Jr., John A. R., Susan Z., Samuel T., and Eudora A. Moseley.
- 8. William Hilary Moseley b 26 May 1824 in Madison Co., Ala. He married first, Elizabeth C. TAYLOR in Madison Co., Ala, and they had four children: Margaret E., John T., Wm. Mc, and Mary Caroline. He married second, Mary F. SMITH on 23 July 1863, and they lived in Arkansas before moving to Texas. Their children were: Frank S., Daniel Hilary, John W., Mary F., Suebet Pink, Andrew J., and Augustus A. Wm H. Moseley died at Smithland, Tx. 19 July 1903.

He was the son of William Gracey, whose will dated 26 Apr 1827 is recorded 15 Feb 1828 White Co., Tn. Will Book 1810-1828 p. 297. He was married first on 10 Nov 1821 to Mary JONES - b 27 May 1804, d 30 June 1835. She was the daughter of Zachariah Jones. He married second on 18 Aug 1835 to Ann HITCHCOCK - b 15 Nov 1815.

Grimes, and dated (we believe 28 June 1886). He describes this as "the best farming land" he ever saw, giving the bushels per acre produced of corn, cotton and wheat. He promised to write to George W. (Y?) J. and J.H. soon.

Sallie A. Grimes added some family records: John A. Grimes - b 19 Oct 1855; Sallie A. Grimes - b 8 Aug 1856; Emma Lee Grimes - b 31 May 1878, d 25 Sept 1885; Richard Alonzo Grimes - 31 Aug 1880.

It is therefore considered & ordered by the Court that said Eperson Freeman be exhonerated from the payment of said poll tax and that the Collector have a credit therefor with the State & County Treasurer on copies of this order.

(In 1850 they also had Indiana 18 and George M. living with them. By 1870 Lewis Sr had died and Mary 67 was head of Family #125, Dist 4, with Joseph and Thomas; Mary H. BROWN 17, was house-keeper and Lott A. ANDERSON 17 worked on the farm [he lived with James McBRIDE, Family #455, in 1860]. Robert H. William, Sr, born 1811 in Rutherford Co, NC, was a son of Anderson Womack and Frances DOBBINS; his grandparents were Thomas Womack and Louvisa RICE and William Dobbins and Susannah COLLINS [she was from SC]. Celia, Sr, born 1811 in White Co, TN, was a dau of James W. KNOWLES and Nancy HARRIS and a granddau of John Knowles, Revolutionary veteran and reportedly the first sheriff of White Co. William's sister, Mary "Polly" Womack, married William W. Knowles, a younger brother of Celia. In the 1870 White Co census William Wamack was a

525-511 William TEMPLETON 56 NC, farmer, Lydia 54, Amanda 20 TN, Thomas J. 18, farmer, Pleasant C. 16. (Thomas J. Templeton served in the 16th Tennessee Volunteer Infantry and received C.S.A. Pension #10081. Family #548 in 1850 included William 45, Lydia 41, John A. 23, George W. 22, William L. 19, Narcissa L. 16, Amanda R. 14, Amanda S. 9, Thomas J. 7 and Pleasant C. 6. In 1870 Family #92, Dist 4 listed William, Lydia, Amanda R. 3 TN, Maranda CLENNY 30 TN, Samuel M. 5 GA and Joseph Templeton 44 TN [black].)

526-512 John A. TEMPLETON 33 TN, farmer, Helen L. 30, Rachel L. 8, John S.1, Benjamin M. GIBBS 18, farm laborer. (John lived with his parents, William and Lydia, in 1850. Family #94, Dist 4 in 1870 listed John A., Helen, Rachel, John and Lucinda L. 3. Benjamin M. Gibbs was a son of Barton Gibbs NC and Mary MARCUM TN who were married 3 Nov 1840 in White Co. In the 1850

White Co census, Family #617, they had five children. They do not appear in the 1860 census; however, Smith N. Gibbs 14 and Caroline Gibbs 8 [a sister?] lived with Family #595, Hannah FARRIS. A Jane Gibbs 14 [Charlotte J.?] is listed with Family #734, Andrew CRAIN.)

I do not find Abel in 1860, but in 1850 Family #545 in White Co showed A.C. Hutson 32 TN, farmer, Sarah 22, Caroline 10, John 9, Sarah L. 3, Lydia I. 10/12, Louisa HILL 25 and Margaret E. Hill 4. A marriage in Warren Co may be connected with this man--A.C. Hutson to Nancy MARTIN 15 Apr 1853.
- 4. Eleanor W. Hutson born c1816, married Reuben C. COTTON 27 May 1848 in White Co. Her cousin, Rev. Thomas E. Hutson, performed the ceremony. In the 1850 Warren Co census they had Mary C. Cotton 1.
- 5. Matthias Hutson, Jr born c1821, married Annie Jane GREEN 14 Feb 1843. See Family #524 below.
 - 6. A son [name unknown] born c1828.
- 7. Isaiah Asberry Hutson born c1826, married Sarah H. HUTCHINGS 5 May 1850 in White Co. See Family #515 below.
 - 8. Eliza L. Hutson born c1828 was home in 1850.
- 9. Levi L. Hutson born 1830, married Sarah E. CATHCART c1858 in White Co. See Family #514 below.
- 10. Reuben P. Hutson born 1832 was home in 1850 but not found in 1860.

Isaiah Hutson, Sr is the younger of two sons mentioned in the will of Rev. Abel Hutson dated 29 Oct 1845 in White Co, witnessed by John SWIN-LE/SWINDELL and Archibald Hutson and recorded 1 Dec 1845 by William LITTLE, clerk of the White County Court. Isaiah was named executor of the estate. The will left property to Sarah Hutson, the widow, and three children: Isaiah, Matthias and Juliann MASON. Juliann Mason was obviously the wife of John D. Mason. When the 1860 census was taken the family lived in Ballard Co, KY. See Family #331-317.)

(NOTE: the contributor has information about White and Van Buren Co families who moved to Kentucky during the 1850s and 1860s.)

Family #91, Dist 4 in 1870 was Asberry Hutson 44 TN, farmer, Sarah 43, Levi 15, farm laborer, Lawson C. 12, farm laborer, Amanda E. 10, Isaiah Asberry 5.)

530-516 S.A. PERRY 31 NC, tanner, Nancy 28 TN, Ambrose 10, William 7, James 5, Samantha 9/12. (Solomon Armistead Perry and Nancy FISHER married 29 Nov 1849 in White Co. Nancy, dau of William Fisher and Nancy CHISAM, was born Dec 1827 in White Co, died c1880 and was buried in Bardwell Cemetery near Bardwell, Carlisle Co, Ky. They moved to Ballard Co, KY about 1865. In 1870 Family #162, Dist 5 listed Solomon 46, Nancie C. 44, Ambrose P. 19 TN, William W. 17, James 13, Samantha J. 11, Susan J. 9, Forest 6. See Families #577 and #578 in this 1860 White Co census. A Fisher family book is in the Sparta, TN public library.)

Thomas J. 6/12. (The microfiche at LDS branch libraries shows John Green married Lydia Caroline WILLIAMS 8 Sep 1853 in White Co. I believe she was a dau of William and Nancy WILLIAMSON, Family #673 in this 1860 census. John was a son of Avery Green and his wife Mary of VA. See Family #421 of this 1860 census.)

Abel and Mrs. Sarah Hutson and John Knowles and Hannah of PA, married Annie Jane GREEN 14 Feb 1843 in a ceremony performed by Robert H. McMANUS, J.P. in White Co. She was a dau of Avery Green. In the 1850 census, Family #544, Thomas SWINDLE 5 lived with them, probably a son of Christopher Columbus Swindle and his wife Eliza or Elizabeth WEBB. Thomas Swindle probably married Mary Hutson.)
