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BOOK REVIEWS

JOHNSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE WILL BOOK #1 1827-1860 by James L. Douthat. 1982. Soft back. 20 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 2504 Kell Rd., Signal Mountain, TN 37377. \$6.00.

Tucked into the farthest northeast corner of the state, Johnson County was formed from Carter in 1836; however the first settlement in this beautiful mountain area was made about 1770, or somewhat earlier, near the point where the Roane Creek emptied into the Watauga River. The first court met in 1836, but the first recorded will (that of Thomas Johnson of Carter County) had been written in 1827. Some of the early names are: Ward, Johnson, Wilson, Warren, Arendill, Robinson, Wright, Brown, Cole, Heath, Wagner, Dugger, Shull and others.

SAMUEL WRIGHT HANNAH AND DESCENDANTS by Curtis A. Hannah Jr. 1982. Soft back. 70 pp. Order from Mr. Hannah, 4058 N. Oketo, Norridge, IL 60634. \$25.00.

Samuel Wright Hannah, born in Green County, Tennessee in 1816, can be traced to Monroe County and Bradley County in Tennessee, then on to Texas and back to Arkansas by 1858. By 1863 he was dead, a result of bushwhacker activity during the Civil War. The people portrayed here are all descended from him by either blood or marriage. Wonderfully clear copies of original records and many fine old photos (from tintypes) have survived to be presented here.

EIGHTEENTH CENTURY PIEDMONT NORTH CAROLINA MAPS by Fred Hughes. 17 counties. 23" x 29" (Guilford 23" x 25"). Order from The Custom House, P.O. Box 549, Jamestown, NC 27282. Single maps \$4.00. Whole series \$62.00.

An exciting and completely new approach to history, these beautiful maps display roads, mills, Churches, schools, military routes, battle sites, Indian trails and many thousands of pioneers of Piedmont North Carolina. The maps give information compiled from the original source material, such as land grant records, deeds, wills, etc. Most of the people, more than 30,000, predate the 1790 census. More than 90% of this information has never before appeared in print. A master index is being prepared and will eventually be published. Counties now available: Davie, Guilford, Montgomery, Randolph, Rockingham, Stokes, Surry and Yadkin. Counties to be published spring 1983: Anson, Davidson, Lee, Moore, Piedmont, Richmond, Rowan, Stanly, Wilkes.

THOMAS WILLIAMS AND HIS DESCENDANTS by Rebecca Williams Harris. 1982. Soft back. 177 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 2396 Corning Ave., Memphis, TN 38127. \$8.50.

Thomas Williams of North Carolina came to Dickson County, Tennessee about 1810 and moved west to Fayette County, Tennessee somewhere around 1829. The author provides family charts, fascinating family stories and court records - all dealing with Thomas and his descendants. If you are of this line, she hopes to fill in gaps for you; at the same time, she asks for additional information from her readers.

HICKMAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE COURT RECORDS 1814-1829 compiled by Olgia Dotson. 1982. Soft back. 171 pp. Indexed. Order from compiler, Hickman County Courthouse, Centerville, TN 37033. \$12.00.

This publication consists of abstracts of deeds, land grants, plats, bills of sale, and many other interesting items. These records have been copied and abstracted over a period of several years and many are no longer to be found in the courthouse. Many of the records are loose leaf, and most are in bad condition and are very hard to read. Consequently, this work is a valuable researching aid to everyone interested in Hickman County, Tennessee.

GRUNDY COUNTY, TENNESSEE COUNTY HISTORY SERIES, Volume 31 by James L. Nicholson. 1982. Hard back. 134 pp. Indexed. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, TN 38152. \$12.50.

As part of the continuing state project, Nicholson in readable, free-flowing style, traces the history of Grundy County from pre-county times up to the present. He speaks of its mountain people (naming names), churches, soldiers, occupations, pastimes, specific families, special incidents, authors, schools, countryside, and other topics. Very interesting reading for those from Grundy County and also for those who are not.

DEED BOOK 2, AMELIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA DEEDS 1742-1747 compiled by Gibson J. McConnaughey. 1982. Soft back. 99 pp. Indexed. Order from Mid-South Publishing Co., P.O. Box 188, Amelia, VA 23002. \$10.50.

This book contains deeds for both the present day counties of Prince Edward and Nottoway. Some delightful references abstracted refer to "possession obtained by Wm. Hamlin by delivery of turf and twig". Another refers to "payment on demand of one peppercorn at the Feast of St. Michael". Principals, their relatives, neighbors and witnesses create a very early census for Amelia County.

INVENTORY OF KENTUCKY BIRTH, MARRIAGE AND DEATH RECORDS 1852-1910 (revised edition) compiled by Jeffrey Michael Duff. 1982. Soft back. 71 pp. Order from Public Records Division, Department for Libraries and Archives, P.O. Box 537, Frankfort, KY 40602. \$5.00.

Kentucky kept no birth, marriage or death records prior to 1852. In this year a new law required all clergy and other persons who performed marriages to keep a register and likewise all individuals who attended births and deaths. The inventory is a guide to these records which are available for research. It is not a name index, but rather descriptions of records by county and year.

McINTOSH/MACKINTOSH FAMILIES OF SCOTLAND AND AMERICA VOL. III by Walter H. McIntosh. 1982. Soft back. 100 pp. Indexed. Order from author, P.O. Box 214, Topsfield, MA 01983. \$20.00.

This third volume of McIntosh Genealogy is compiled from family records throughout the United States and Canada, as well as from county histories, manuscripts, state vital records, etc. The material is printed on acid free paper and is completely indexed in three ways: by McIntosh given names; by allied family names; and by geographical locations.

HALIFAX DISTRICT NORTH CAROLINA SUPERIOR COURT OF LAW & EQUITY 1785-1790 (Bills and Answers) 1797-1805 (Minutes) by Weynette Parks Haun. 1982. Soft back. 272 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 243 Argonne Dr., Durham, NC 27704. \$27.50. NC residents add 4% sales tax.

The Halifax District consisted of Halifax, Warren, Northampton, Franklin, Nash, Edgecombe and Wilson Counties, but many other counties in North Carolina are also mentioned in these records. Contested wills with many family names, lawsuits, inventory of estates, etc, are all listed here, along with the original index. A more complete index is offered also.

THE HODGE-HODGES BOOK, VOLUME I: Descendants of William Riley Hodge, M.G. 1982. Hard back. 178 pp. Indexed. \$13.50.

THE HODGE-HODGES BOOK, VOLUME II: Reference Source Book for Hodge-Hodges Research, Virginia-Tennessee-Arkansas by Thomas Allen Bruce, M.D. 1982. Hard back. 115 pp. \$13.50. Order both from the author, 4 Hillandale, Little Rock, AR 72207.

Volume I is about William Riley Hodge who was born in Virginia circa 1817 and lived in Gibson County, Tennessee, Butler County, Missouri and Fulton, Lawrence, Sharpe, Independence, Marion and Boone Counties in Arkansas. He was a farmer and itinerant Church of Christ minister. Major related family surnames are JAMES, DOWELL, KEELING, LAWHON, COPELIN and SMITH.

The companion Volume II contains pre-Civil War immigration lists of Hodge-Hodges, DAR Patriot Index, Virginia Census Records 1782-1830, Tennessee Census Records 1820-1850, Arkansas Census Records 1850-1900, early marriage and tax records, Arkansas Civil War Index, and much more on families with Hodge-Hodges surnames.

JOHN PANKEY OF MANAKIN TOWN, VIRGINIA and His Descendants, Volume 3 by George Edward Pankey. 1981. Hard back. 136 pp. Indexed. Order from author, Box 84, Ruston, LA 71270. \$11.50.

Volume I appeared in 1969 and Volume II in 1972; additional family records have since been acquired and are presented here. To further relate them to the family, and to identify other family connections, this volume reviews some very early Huguenot records from Manakin Town. Especially fascinating is the Americanization of Huguenot surnames. Some illustrations and portraits are included, and more than 3,000 names are found in the index. Five blank pages at the end of the book are reserved for a personal family register.

CANNON COUNTY, TENNESSEE HISTORY SERIES, Vol. 8 by Robert L. Mason. 1982. Hard back. 134 pp. Indexed. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, TN 38152. \$12.50.

This book is more than a statistical account of the past. Mason's CANNON COUNTY is chock full of names. Especially enjoyable is his description of the early settlers' lifestyle. He deals with the county's soldiers (names included) and stories of their feats; he discusses the different communities within the county and the churches found in those communities. Uncle Dave Macon from the Grand Old Opry claimed Cannon as his home.

FRANKLIN COUNTY ILLINOIS CEMETERY INSCRIPTIONS TYRONE TOWNSHIP by Chloe Davis and Ruby Henderson. 1982. Soft back. 122 pp. Indexed. Order from Chloe Davis, Box 442, Rt. 1, Mulkeytown, IL 62865. \$14.95.

The authors felt that it was important to record, preserve and publish the tombstone inscriptions in known cemeteries, some of which date to the early 1800's. Physical location and physical condition of cemetery is given where possible. Some war veterans' service records were researched and included with tombstone information. The authors welcome corrections and additional information. Some of the cemeteries are: Cook, Silkwood, Mulkeytown, Naylor and Ward.

THE FAMILY KEYS by Paralee Keys-Simpson Hoot. Hard back. 173 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, 6402 Malcolm Dr., Dallas, TX 75214. \$17.95.

Using the 1880 Keyes Family book by Asa Keyes as a basis, the author has brought her family history up to date. Some related lines are Trotter, Lohr, Kauffman, Shoeman, Hatcher and Standley. Part One of the book concentrates on Key families from Massachusetts to the Shenandoah Valley. Part Two covers the Simpson-Shinn lines and other related branches from England and Adams County, Pennsylvania to other states.

WEAKLEY REMEMBERED (WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE) VOL. III compiled by Pansy Nanney Baker and Charlotte Stout Reynolds. 1982. Soft back. 159 pp. Indexed. \$14.50. WEAKLEY REMEMBERED (WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE) VOL. IV compiled by Pansy Nanney Baker and Charlotte Stout Reynolds. 1982. Soft back. 137 pp. Indexed. \$16.50. Order from Mrs. Baker, Rt. #5, Box 17, Martin, TN 38237.

These volumes are filled with treasures for the Weakley County, Tennessee researcher. Vol. III contains an 1880 map which defines civil districts and gives approximate locations of churches, post offices and schools, many of which are now defunct. A list of state senators, representatives, and sheriffs begins with the year 1825. An index to the County Court First Minute Book 1827-1835, occupant entries 1827-1833 and partial land entry claims 1838-1885 are included. There is a list of Confederate and Federal Companies formed in Weakley County followed by a list of men who served in the military from the Revolution through the Spanish American War. Also included is a listing of legislative petitions and the 1850 mortality schedule.

Volume IV consists of 118 family and Bible records, some of which begin in the eighteenth century. There are many inter-family relationships noted with 70 pictures of family and school groups and individual portraits. These excellent volumes give a comprehensive picture of early Weakley County, Tennessee.

OUR BERRY PATCH by W. Rose Berry. 1982. Hard back. 531 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 3109 Garden Ct., Pontiac, MI 48055. \$29.95.

Our Berry Patch is subtitled Some Descendants of Reddick Hunter Berry of Western Tennessee; related families are descendants of Robert A. Tucker of Pope County, Arkansas, Asa D. Evans and William B. Whitaker of Clay County, Arkansas. The author has included an even mix of poetry, family stories, legends, and pertinent records, and hopes that you will find needed information in your search for Berry "roots and vines".

SPENCE'S HISTORY OF HICKMAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE reprinted 1981 by Edward and Olgia Dotson. Soft back. 224 pp. Indexed. Order from authors, Hickman County Courthouse, Centerville, TN 37033. \$17.00.

Spence's History, originally published in 1900, gives a vivid description of much of the early history of Hickman County and contains a wealth of information on many of the pioneer families of the county. Since the courthouse burned in 1865 and destroyed most of the county records, the book is a primary source material. A chapter on each of the fifteen districts describes the territory physically, names the people who settled there, and is full of anecdotes. There is also much material on the early militia, soldiers and Confederates.

THE EARLY YANDELLS OF NORTH CAROLINA AND SOME OF THEIR DESCENDANTS 1737-1982 by Velma Nancyann Yarbrough. 1982. Hard back. 499 pp. Indexed. Order from author, Rt., 4, Box 202, Shawnee, OK 74801. \$42.00.

Starting in the 1760's the early Yandells of North Carolina began to make their presence a matter of record in the deeds and court records of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina. They were four brothers: Andrew, James, William and Samuel, born circa 1738-1755. This comprehensive study gives hundreds of sources of information for the four main family groups, as well as for a relative, Samuel Yandle of Union Co., NC. The book is 8x11 inches, clearly printed on quality stock, and illustrated with copies of documents, family pictures and charts...truly a treasure.

DAILY ACCOUNT JOURNALS OF STIRLING FORD, M.D. AMELIA COUNTY VIRGINIA 1829-1830-1831 abstracted & compiled by Gibson Jefferson McConnaughey. 1982. Soft back. 160 pp. Indexed. Order from Mid-South Publishing Co., P.O. Box 188, Amelia, VA 23002. \$13.50.

These abstracted journals add information for a period where data is hard to find, and they contain records not generally found in ordinary county records. They mention names of plantation homes, overseers, governesses, ministers and other physicans, in addition to giving their medical histories. Dr. Ford made a number of personal observations that reveal much about his patients' character and personality. He treated members of families and their slaves and mentions social customs, the weather and mode of payment for his medical services. Added footnotes give many spouses' names, dates of marriages, and owners of homes that are mentioned in the accounts. Dr. Ford's practice extended to Powhatan & Cumberland Counties, Richmond & Petersburg.

GENEALOGY OF THE LECKRONE-LACKRONE-LECKRON-LEKRONE-LeCRONE-LaCRONE-LeCRON-LEGRON-LEKRON FAMILY by Mary Leckrone Mills Black. 1980. Hard back. 300 pp. Indexed. Order from author, P.O. Box 156, Brethren, MI 49619. \$30.00.

The Lecrons were dissenters (those who had a different faith from that of the rulers of France) and so being persecuted they fled into the Palatinate of Germany. The author has researched beginnings in Europe with the genealogy of the descendants of Alexander Lecron and continues with the Valentine Legron family; the family line of Michael Lecron who came to America in 1884; Daniel LeCron who came to America in 1741 and his descendants; Jakob LeCron who came to America in 1741 and his descendants; and Johann Leonardt LaCrone who came to America in 1753, settling in York, Pennsylvania.

BIOGRAPHY AND GENEALOGY MASTER INDEX, 1981-82 Supplement edited by Miranda C. Herbert and Barbara McNeil. Hard back. 2,052 pp. Order from Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, MI 48226. Three Volume Set \$225.00.

The eight volumes published in 1981 contain an index to persons listed in biographical sources. This year's supplement offers names added to new editions of those books, as well as over a million citations from an additional 140 biographical dictionaries. Each entry indicated the individual's name, dates of birth and death (when available) and source of information. A sample of the source books used includes various books of Who's Who, <u>Celebrities of the Century</u>, <u>Encyclopedia of the American Revolution</u>, <u>The Civil War Dictionary</u>, <u>Dictionary of American Medical Biography</u>, <u>Dictionary of Indian Biography</u>, and the dictionaries from which names were extracted cover such varied subjects as art, diplomacy, cabinetmaking, Methodism and many more. Libraries will find these books extremely helpful to patrons, and genealogists will have a comprehensive source at their finger tips.

1880 CENSUS OF ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS WITH NOTES compiled by Walterine H. Sharp and Sandra Haney Tedford. 1982. Soft back. 109 pp. Indexed. Order from SEARCH-N-PRINT, P.O. Box 777, Farmersville, TX 75031. \$12.50.

The 1880 census is particularly valuable since it was the first to record the birthplaces of the parents of the persons listed on the census. This volume also includes the mortality schedule and the index to Confederate Pension Applications of persons residing in Rockwall County at the time of their application. Another section is entitled "Notes": of the 546 households listed on the census, approximately 420 are included in the notes, which are a compilation of vital records found by the compilers.

HISTORY AND GENEALOGICAL DATA OF THE POYNOR, BURNS, MEADOWS, SUDBERRY AND CONYER FAMILIES by Marion Joyce Poynor. 1982. Hard back. 157 pp. Indexed. Order from the author, Rt. 8, Box 269, Columbia, TN 38401. \$15.25.

This is a history of five middle Tennessee families whose lives were closely connected by marriage. The genealogical data were collected over a period of twenty years, using census and military records from state and national archives, deeds and marriage records, cemetery inscriptions, family Bibles, interviews and correspondence. Each chapter of the book is a genealogy of one of the five families and includes photographs and stories of traditional events.

NEW JERSEY CATHOLIC BAPTISMAL RECORDS FROM 1759 TO 1781 compiled by Janet Drumm Dirnberger. 1981. Soft back. 62 pp. Indexed. Order from E. Simmons Books & Etc., 2242 West Bay Area Blvd., Friendswood, TX 77546. \$7.50.

The original baptismal registers were kept by missionary priests and were written in Latin in German script. The records in this book were translated by Rev. Joseph Flynn from the original in old St. Joseph's Church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Ms Dirnberger has indexed these early records alphabetically by surname and listed the location (county) where the baptism was performed. The date of birth, recipient of baptism, date of baptism, parents and sponsors is given under each surname entry.

FINCHER IN THE USA 1683-1900 by Evelyn Davis Fincher and Ann Wilson Fincher. 1981. Hard back. 626 pp. Indexed. Order from A Press, Inc., P.O. Box 8796, Greenville, SC 29604. \$26.85.

Francis Fincher, a Quaker from Worcester, England, came with his family and servants to America to escape religious persecution. They arrived in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on July 28, 1683, where he was a First Purchaser from William Penn and an elected member of the Pennsylvania Assembly. The descendants of this man, one of six known Fincher immigrants, are traced here. Also included are five other Fincher lines and unconnected Fincher names from Chester County, Pennsylvania to Orange County, North Carolina, Union County, South Carolina, and other states.

CONNECTICUT RESEARCHER'S HANDBOOK compiled and edited by Thomas Jay Kemp. 1982. Hard back. 755 pp. Order from Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, MI 48226. \$42.00.

The handbook is arranged in two major parts. The first covers works about the state in general, all arranged under 32 specific categories. The second part treats each of Connecticut's eight counties and more than 150 individual cities and towns. By focusing on specific towns and counties, researchers are provided with key sources of genealogical and historical information, including cemeteries and cemetery records, census records, church records, land, military, probate, school, tax, vital records, newspapers, etc.

COOPER FAMILY HISTORY 1730-1982 by Thomas R. Bryan and Christine Cooper Ellenberg. 1982. Hard back. 192 pp. Indexed. Order from A Press, Inc., P.O. Box 8796, Greenville, SC 29604. \$26.85.

This is the history of the Cooper family, descendants of Reuben Cooper I, a Welshman who moved to Delaware prior to the Revolutionary War. Two of his descendants served together in the Revolution under General Greene and settled in the Ninety Six area of South Carolina after the war. Today there are family members found in all the southern states as well as the eastern seaboard. Included are accounts of some lines descending from Charlemagne, Alfred the Great and William the Conqueror.

OLD ROADS AND GENEALOGY?

The Virginia Highway & Transportation Research Council has given the genealogist a marvelous tool for his trade - a series of books which give the history of early county roads and the people who were assigned to work on them. This series , <u>Historic Roads of Virginia</u>, is edited by Nathaniel Mason Pawlett, Faculty Research Historian for the project, which is a joint effort of the Dept. of Highways and the University of Virginia. The original idea was to compile a history of Albemarle County's roads, but it soon became evident that, in order to begin that task, the parent counties must be researched. Thus the series was begun in 1973.

Every genealogist who has tried to read the faded, yellowed, spidery pages of old documents will appreciate the abstracted and edited material in this series. Here in clean, clear black and white is a record of persons who were appointed to keep up the roads as early as 1728 in Goochland County, 1742 in Louisa and 1744 in Albemarle County. Many lists of persons who were petitioning for new roads are found in the Road Order Books. This puts a given person at a fairly specific place at a definite date, for example:

"9 April 1744 O.S. (Old Style) Page 102

On the Petition of Mosias Jones Willm Thompson James Merideth Robert Thompson for a Road to be laid off etc. it was Ordered that David Mills & John Cooke should view the same....." from Louisa County Road Orders 1742-1748

"18 June 1728 Old Style, p.9

William Mayo and Allen Howard Gent. are appointed to agree with Sarah Atkinson for keeping ffery one year of a Court day to set over foot people only to court...." Goochland County Road Orders, 1728-1744

The Road Order books are indexed by Personal Names, Bridges, Churches, Fords, County Government, Ferries, Houses, Mills, Mountains, Plantations, Quarters, Rivers and Creeks, Roads, Signposts, Road Surveyors Gangs and Miscellaneous.

The histories, while not giving as many names, contain detailed maps and pictures of buildings, houses and roads. Reading these volumes gives one the setting in which these ancestors lived. Genealogy cannot be separated from history.

Virginia (and Mr. Pawlett) has charted the way for the rest of us. Each county of Tennessee could add immeasurably to appreciation of its past with such a series.

MINUTES OF NEW HOPE BAPTIST CHURCH Decatur County, Tennessee Contributed by Freda R. Cox 717 Cedar Drive Knoxville, Tennessee 37919

New Hope Baptist Church is located on Beacon Road about two miles outside Decaturville, Decatur County, Tennessee. The church was organized September 25, 1842. Although the church minutes do not indicate that he was ever a member of the church, John S. SULLIVAN deeded six acres to the church for a building site (deed registered January 1848). In February 1851 the church traded one acre and 80 poles of land to William Griffin for an equal amount.

Only a few graves are in the small cemetery at the church because the ground is considered unsuitable for burying. Some of the members were buried at the Presbyterian Church nearby (formerly called the Campgrounds).

These minutes were filmed by the Southern Baptist Convention. The copy belonging to the church was made available for transcription by the present church clerk, Myracle WARD. Although the minutes continue intermittently to 1928, those entries past October 1886, after the death of L.P. Moore (church clerk from December 1853), are very difficult and in some cases, impossible to read. Only those bits of information felt to be of interest to the genealogist are included here.

The church usually met once a month on Saturday and Sunday following. When the pastor was absent, the church would appoint a member of the church to sit as moderator protem. Sometimes he would preach, sometimes he would have "prayer and praise", but in almost every meeting, no matter who presided, the church would "set in conference, invite visiting brethren and sisters to seats with them, open the door for reception of members, and call for the reference." Some of these substitute moderators later became pastors. After January 1851, another item was added to the service when they "called for the peace and harmony of the church." Usually the response was "all at peace."

The church would occasionally alter the time of the month or time of day for meeting in response to a need for change. Many winter months the church did not meet "because the house was too open" or on account of "rain, snow, or cold, bad weather."

In appointing committees to "bear the church letter and offering to the association", an extra person usually was appointed "in case of failure."

It is doubtful that the list of names which follows the church covenant is of charter members only. There are multiple listings for some members, such as James LOMAX, No. 5, "expelled", and No. 38, "restored"; and Malinda LOMAX, No. 8, "Excom.", No. 40, "restored", and No. 85, died". It appears that the church clerk added to the list as people became members or other events took place. So one should not assume that all these people were members of the church at the time it was organized.

State of Tennessee Perry County

Church Covenant. 1st We agree to be known by the name of United Baptist Church of Christ called by the name of Knew Hope. 2nd We agree to come together on a church rotation and indeavor by divine aid to keep inavoidable the disciplin of the church as held forth in the scriptures of the new testiment of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and also agree to maintain and support all the fundamental principals therein contained. 3rd We also agree to execute the government and disciplin of the church in watching over each other in love and so <u>indvour</u> to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace and that we take the new testiment as our only rule of faith and practice in all matters as it relates to the church. 4th We agree to covenant with each other and before almighty God to defray all the necessary expenses of the church agreeable to our several abilaties and therefore have called to our aid Elders L. M. STEAD and L. P. HILL to act as presbytry by which we are set apart as a church to keep house for the Lord and in conformation of our good faith and reception of the above articles hereunto assign our names Sept. 24th, 1842.

Oct. 1846 - New members received: Perry W. MYRACLE, Nancy ORTERY, and Nancy TIDWELL by experience.

Nov. 1846 - Church appointed two brethren to site Enos MOODY to church to answer complaint against him for drunkeness.

Jan. 1847 - Church took up the case of Brother Enos MOODY and "heartily forgive him for his transgression. Then took up the case of Brother William NORWOOD and expelled him for drunkiness."

Feb. 1847 - Church "took up the case of Brother Archibald MOODY and laid it over until the next church day and appointed Brother DUR and Brother AUTRY to site him to trial, then took up the case of Bro. Enos Moody and expelled him."

April 1847 - Church "took up the case of Bro. Archibald MOODY and received his acknowledgements and forgive him for his transgressions and chose Bro. GRIFFIN deacon." "Enos Moody was restored back to the church."

May 1847 - On the third Sunday night "the Lords supper was administered and a feet washing." New members: by experience, Mary HAINS and Mary TIDWELL.

June 1847 - New member received: James L. ONEAL and "Lexington church sent a letter requesting 3 members of our church to attend at Lexington church on Friday before the 3rd sabbath in July and we resolved to comply with their request and took up the case of Brother Elias BLOUNT and expelled him."

July 1847 - Church nominated Moses ONEAL , Stephen AUTREY, and James DUR to attend at Lexington church.

Aug. 1847 - Church "agreed to choose a pastor on the next church day to fill the resignation of our present pastor. Church then requested Brother L.L. MYRACLE to attend on Saturday before the 3rd sabbath in August and appointed Brother Wm. GRIF-FIN and Asa RUSHING to go and invite him to trial. Then called Brethren STEAD, WASHBURN, COLLINS, and Asa MARTIN as a committee to assist us in this matter and called for the assistance of sister churches, viz., Bear Creek, Union, and Fellowship, and gave Sister WARNER a letter of dismission."

Aug. 1847 - With J.C. MARTIN acting as moderator and the aid and assistance of the three churches, they "took up the case of Brother L.L. MYRACLE and expelled him and then appointed James DUR, Brother William HENRY, and Brother Robert MACKEY as a committee to demand of him his credentials...."

Sept. 1847 - With Brother BOND as moderator, "appointed Brother Moses ONEAL as a delegate to bear our letter to the convention together with a contribution of five dollars and next appointed Stephen AUTRY and Bro. William GRIFFIN as delegates to bear our letter to the association."

March 1848 - Granted Martha ONEAL a letter of dismission; Nancy JOHNSON expelled from the church.

May 1848 - Church appointed James DUR and Hansford Dur to invite Elizabeth JOHNSON to the church to "answer the reason of her absence for so long a time...."

June 1848 - "The committee reported the acknowledgement of Sister Elizabeth JOHNSON which was received by the church and the committee discharged."

July 1848 - Two new members: William HENRY and wife Ann Henry. "Then by request of Brother David MOORE we excluded him from the church for departing from our faith."

Aug. 1848 - "Church was called together for the purpose of contributing to the convention. We delegated our beloved Brother L.L. ONEAL to bear our letter and contribution of five dollars to the convention for home missions and then appointed Bros. GRIFFIN, Moses Oneal, and Bro. Asa RUSHING as a committee to invite Bro. Enos MOODY to answer for a charge reported against him."

Sept. 1848 - Case of Enos MOODY was laid over until next church day. "Then on motion appointed Brethren Moses ONEAL, Wiley Oneal, and in case of failure, William HENRY as delegates to the association to bear our associational letter and contribution of one dollar and on motion appointed Brethren E. WASHBURN, William Henry, and G.D. RUSHING as a committee to settle a difficulty between Bro. William GRIFFIN and Bro. Wiley Oneal."

HALL RECORDS AND ADAMS BIBLES - Contributed by Mrs. A. B. Thompson 1024 Beechwood Dr., Bastrop, LA., 71220

The earliest record of brothers, John and Hillard/Hilliard HALL appears on the Roane Co., TN tax list for 1805. Hillard is found in Haywood Co., TN in 1830 with his sons John, Alden, Robert H., William, and possibly Jeremiah. In 1844 William and Alden purchased land in Tippah Co., MS from John ALEXANDER of Haywood Co., TN. This land had been a dowery.

Alden (Aulden) Hall was born c1800 in Tennessee and married Rhoda Ann GREEN (?). Their children were:

- 1. Amy Hall married Washington COX (?)
- 2. Newton Green Hall born 1829 TN; married Sarah Jane ROBINSON 1850 in Tippah Co., MS (grgrandparents of Mrs. Thompson). They returned to Tennessee after 1850 but were back in Tippah County by 1870. In 1880 they were in Alcorn Co., MS. He served in the CSA and died in Poinsett Co., AR in 1884.
- 3. Jermiah Hall born 1831; served in CSA
- 4. Alden Carroll Hall born 1834 TN: m P. Elizabeth HALLEY on 6 Jan 1860
- 5. Ephriam J. Hall born 1837; m Paralee BROCK on 21 Jan 1858
- 6. Daniel Bass Hall born 1839; m Ellen GAY on 29 Dec 1869
- 7. Mary Elizabeth Hall born 1841/2; m David Oliver BROCK
- 8. Martha Jane Hall born 1843/4

Mrs. Thompson does not have information on the deaths of Alden and his father, Hilliard, but she thinks that John and Hilliard were possibly sons of Zachariah Hall, who is listed on the 1845 Tippah County State Census.

The bible of an ADDAMS/ADAMS family of Smith (later Macon) Co., TN was found in the home of Mr. Gilliam Fuqua and copied by Mrs. Thompson.

John Adams - born 27 Sep 1791 in North Carolina married Elizabeth A. ?, born 3 Sep 1799 in North Carolina. They were parents of W. (Wm) Thomas L. Adams, born 11 Jun 1835, who had the following children:

The pages were loose and missing from this bible, so there could have been other children. Mrs. Thompson was told other children were Catherine "Pattie" (married first, Lason JENKINS, second, Frank HUTSON/HUDSON), Elvira and Surville Adams. One wonders if Catharine "Pattie" might have been the Martha C. listed above, Elvira the Sarah E., and Surville the indistinct Santifoe as recorded above.

JAMES S. WARREN - EARLY SETTLER OF HICKMAN CO., TN - Contributed by Mrs. Richard H. Gilliam, Jr., 1708 Red Oak Road, S.E., Huntsville, AL, 35801

Mrs. Gilliam has used, <u>A History of Hickman County</u>, <u>Tennessee</u> by W. Jerome D. Spence and David L. Spence (published in 1900) as the basis of her research. She has added information from census and family records to piece together her family story.

James Stuart/Stewart WARREN was born cl760-70 and died cl844 in Hickman Co., TN. He was married in Halifax Co., VA on 15 Dec 1794 to Catherine BRANDON who was born cl775. She may not have been his first wife. Before taking up land grants in 1816, 1823 and 1825 in the First District of Hickman Co., he lived in North Carolina and Robertson Co., TN in 1806. All three of the grants were made by Governor William CARROLL from Murfreesboro, TN and were in the general vicinity of Haley Creek, Gray's Bend in the Duck River and adjacent to property owned by Thomas GEE, heirs of Elijah WALKER, Joe HAIL, William CASH, Jonathan F. ROBERTSON, John MORGAN and O. LEWIS. Census records give conflicting information on the states in which their following ten children were born:

- 1. John W. Warren born c1792 NC; married Jemina ?
- 2. David B. Warren became County Court Clerk of Hickman Co.; married Nellie PEERY, daughter of George Peery
- 3. Malinda Warren born c1802 NC; married Zachariah TOTTY
 - 4. Sina Warren born 5 Feb 1804 Caswell Co., NC; died 7 Apr 1848: she was the first wife of Pleasant WALKER (1804-1870) whom she married 21 Dec 1826 in Hickman County; both died there. He was a native of Rockingham Co., NC and became County Court Clerk and a member of the legislature from Hickman Co. They were parents of Emiline Warren, who married a SHIPP: Catherine

Brandon Walker, who married W. B. RUSSELL; Pleasant Walker, Jr.; Annice Walker; and Dr. Allen Walker, who was living in Humphreys Co., TN in 1880. By 1850 Pleasant Walker married Lucinda ? and they had a son, J. W. Walker.

- 5. Elizabeth Warren born cl806 in Robertson Co., TN ; died in 1872; married cl826 to James D. EASLEY, who was also County Court Clerk and a member of the legislature from Hickman County.
- Mahulda Warren born c1808; died 1878; married before 1830 to John "Jack"
 W. HUDDLESTON (1803-1873), who was sheriff of Hickman County.
- 7. ? Warren married John NIXON
- 8. Annis Warren married William S. SATTERFIELD
- 9. Stephen Goodloe Warren born c1822; married Eliza ?
- 10. ? Warren born after 1820; married Monroe M. BARNES

THE ELLIS CLAN - Sent by Mrs. Joe Ericson, 1614 Redbud St., Nacogdoches, TX 75961

From Eagle Creek, Wayne Co., TN, Solomon ELLIS wrote a letter to his son, Joshua, and wife, Artimisa. It was dated 14 Sep 1839 and was full of family news. "The resistless hand of death" had taken his two previous wives but he was well satisfied with the "widow lady, Mary COGGIN", whom he had recently married. Times had been hard, but the crops were good that season with corn in abundance at \$1 per barrel and wheat dull at 50 cents a bushel. His son, Templeton, "still lives with Mc-MURRY", and son, John "is still in Giles Co." At last report son, Franklin, was in Arkansas, "but rumor has it that he was one of the unfortunate sufferers in Texas with FANNING (sic) and his army." (Note: Records show a J. E. Ellis with Fanning at Goliad. Perhaps this should have been J. F. for James Franklin Ellis.)

Solomon Ellis was born c1770-80 and married his second wife, Nancy POWELL, on 4 Mar 1821 in Maury Co., TN. They moved to Wayne Co., TN in 1832 where Nancy died 17 Mar 1838. Solomon's son, Joshua Newton Ellis, was born 1810-20 and was married in either Tennessee or Cole Co., MO about 1830 to Artimisa BROWN, daughter of Henry and Ruth SMITH Brown.

Joshua went to Texas on a scouting expedition soon after the birth of their first son. He filed a claim for 640 acres on 21 Sep 1833 but returned to Missouri and lived there until 1845/6. At that time he went with several related families to Peter's Colony in Denton Co., TX. A son was born to Joshua and Artimisa soon after their arrival in Texas, but both parents died of unknown causes in 1847. The children had to be split up and Edward Smith Ellis lived in the household of his aunt and uncle, William Ransom LOVING. Three of the children lived with their grandmother, Ruth BROWN, and the remaining three were in the household of another aunt and uncle, Samuel Loving. In 1850 these families moved to Ft. Worth, Tarrant Co., TX. Ruth Brown had the distinction of being one of the first two white women in Ft. Worth, and Samuel Loving was the first carpenter in that city. The children of Joshua and Artimisa Ellis were:

1. Edward Smith Ellis - born 1832 MO: married c1856 in Ft. Worth, TX to Julia Ann HOWARD, born 14 Dec 1839 MO., daughter of James and Elizabeth Howard.

- 2. Hulda Merrill Ellis married Louise WETMORE
- 3. James Franklin Ellis born 28 Apr 1838 MO; married 1860 in Ft. Worth, TX to Delilah Jane ASBURY, daughter of Jeremiah Asbury.
- 4. S. E. (Josephine) Ellis married W. R. SAWYER
- 5. M. (male) Ellis born 1843 MO

- 6. Jasper Ellis born 1845 MO
- 7. Merida Green Ellis born Apr 1847; married 1868, Margaret "Jinkie" DARTER, daughter of Francis and Mary Darter.

Family tradition says that Edward Smith Ellis (son of Joshua) was a teacher at Old Ft. Worth and that Julia Ann had been his pupil. About 1870 Edward Ellis moved his family to Menard Co., TX, but in 1882 he became ill while on a picnic at the ruins of the Old Spanish Fort and died from "an attack of acute indigestion." The widowed Julia Ann and her children drove their cattle and moved all their belongings to Snyder, TX where they lived until her death 25 Jun 1902. The fifteen children of this union were: James N. Ellis, born 1857, married Alice BURNETT; William R. Ellis, born 1859, married Mary Elizabeth BRADFORD; Richard Ellis; John G. (Jack) Ellis, born 1869, married Luceal GAY; Jasper Ellis; Franklin Ellis, born 1872, married Velma THOMPSON; Smith (Doc) Ellis, born 1875, married Martha Jane <u>PRUIT</u>; Joe Ellis; Merida Ellis, married Birda Ray GRANTHAM; Edward L. Ellis, born 1866; Mary Maud Ellis, born 1867, married Joe RINEHART; Serena May Ellis, born 1863, married Wm Thomas <u>BAZE</u>; Julia Ann Ellis, born 1871, married Thomas Maxwell MAPLES; Ruth Ellis, died young; Joseph Ellis, born 1882.

James Franklin Ellis (son of Joshua) enlisted in Co. H., 17th Reg., Texas Cavalry on 8 Mar 1862, and served in the Confederate Army until discharged on 24 May 1865. He was engaged in the general mercantile business with William J. BOAZ in Ft. Worth. Boaz & Ellis closed that business in 1875 and became engaged in the lumber trade. They later purchased banking interests and Ellis built and owned the famous Ellis Hotel of early Ft. Worth. He died 23 Jan 1899 and Delilah Jane died on 16 Oct 1899. Both are buried in Pioneer Rest Cemetery, Ft. Worth, TX. The five children born to them were: William Jasper Ellis; Henry Merrill Ellis, who died in infancy; Jerry Franklin Ellis, who married Anna TIDBALL; James Merida Ellis: and Fannie Alta Ellis, who married L. H. DuBOSE.

Merida Green Ellis (son of Joshua) enlisted in the Confederate Army in February 1862 when not yet 15 years of age and served until the close of the war. For several years afterwards, he was engaged in the mercantile and farm implement business in Tarrant Co., TX. In 1882 he sold out to his partner and invested largely in land on which the city of North Fort Worth was later built. He was one of the founders of the original stock yards there. In 1891 he laid out what is now known as the "M. G. Ellis Addition." Five children were born to Merida and Margaret. They were: Minnie Ellis, born 1870, married J. W. LYNCH: Rosie J. Ellis, born 1874, died 1937, married H. C. McCART; Merida G. Ellis, Jr., born 1877, married Aline BLACK; Bessie Ellis married H. K. McCOLLUM; and Elmore Ellis, who died in infancy.

CONDLEY/RHEA/RAY RECORDS - Contributed by Mrs. Ross B. Johnson, 240 Quay St. Lakewood, CO., 80226

William CONDLEY, the son of a native of Ireland, was born in North Carolina but later moved to Halifax Co., VA where he farmed until his death. His son, Anderson Condley, born in 1792, married Elizabeth COBB, born in 1794, a daughter of Ambrose Cobb; all were natives of Halifax Co., VA. Anderson and Elizabeth moved to Giles Co., TN where they both died. The eldest of their six children was Elisha Thomas Condley who was born in 1814 in Hallfax Co., Va and emigrated with his parents when he was 16. He was married in 1837 in Giles Co. to Elizabeth BECK who was born there in 1823. Elisha then moved his family to Hickory Co., MO where he became a success-

ful hardwood merchant. He was a member of the Christian Church, a Democrat and a past master of a Masonic fraternity. He and Elizabeth were parents of:

- 1. Ann E. Condley married V. S. WILLIAMS
- 2. Calvin M. Condley died of smallpox aged 21 in St. Louis while serving in the Federal Army
- 3. Mary Condley married John B. IHRIG
- 4. Beverly Condley died aged 4 years
- 5. Martha Unica Condley married Eli Thomas RAY

Jordan Lorenza Rhea (spelled Ray in most records) was born c1825 in Tennessee to parents who were born in Virginia. He was married c1843 (possibly in Sumner Co.,TN) to Elizabeth Jane MASSEY who was born c1825 in Wilson Co., TN, daughter of Eli M. and Mary DAVIS Massey. He settled with relatives and friends in the area of North Prairie near Cross Timbers in Hickory Co., MO. He died c1890 and Elizabeth died c1889 at Fristoe, Benton Co., MO. In the 1850 Wilson Co., TN census, Jordan was living in the 19th Civil District. Family records indicate the family lived in Sumner Co., TN during the period of 1843-50. The 1860 Census of Hickory Co., MO gives their children as:

Miss Arnott supplemented the bible information with her research on the Arnott family. Jacob Arnot was born in Gap Mills, Monroe Co., VA (later West Virginia). He was a farmer and a smithy. While working at the forge in 1853, he was overcome with heat and died. Jacob and his wife Emaline are buried in the old Arnott Cemetery in Persia, Hawkins Co., TN.

Jacob Arnot was the son of William Minnis Arnot and Susannah BOWYER. William Minnis Arnot was born 1772 in Goshen, Orange Co., NY and died 1863 in Hawkins Co., TN. He moved from Goshen to Sussex Co., NJ and then to Gap Mills, Monroe Co., VA, and finally to Hawkins Co., TN where he was a large land owner and stockraiser. His nine children all born in Monroe Co., VA were: Elizabeth, Jacob, Nancy, Adam Bowyer, Frances, George Washington, Andrew, Susan and William Minnis, Jr.

William Arnott, Sr. was the son of John and Isabel (?) Arnot. John Arnot was born in Orange Co., NY and died 1824 in Jefferson Co., TN. He was the father of: William Minnis, Rebecca, John, Sabinah, Edsel, Holbert, Amelia and Marvin. John Arnot was the son of Peter Arnot/Arnout. Peter left a will in Goshen, Orange Co., NY dated 20 Mar 1764. In the will he lists his wife, Lenah and children: Cornelius, Jacob, William, Peter, John, Lydia, Hannah, Mary and Deborah.



SURVEY BOOK A, SHELBY COUNTY, TENNESSEE Abstracted from microfilm of the original by Jean Alexander West (Continued from Vol. 29, No. 4)

It has become evident that many of the landholders here were absentee owners, but some entries are called "occupant entry", which indicates that the owner lived in the area. Several of the entries include the words "an Act of the General Assembly of the State on December 30th 1829, providing for the relief of the occupants south and west of the Congressional Reservation line..." This Act stated that all who were bona fide residents might have any amount of land upon which they had settled or "made improvements", as much as 200 acres and no less than 25 acres, unless prior claims had precluded it. 
