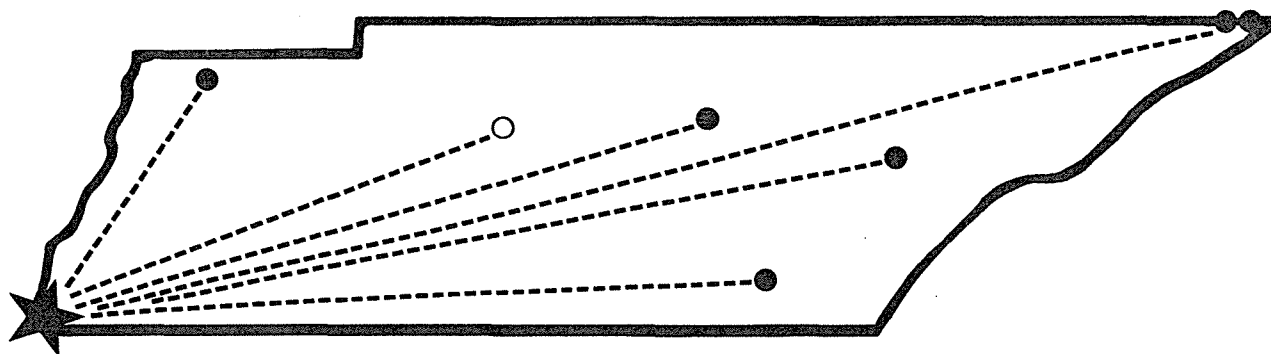

THE JAMES B. PHELAN ESTATE PAPERS AND WILL

Found among the Estate Papers of James B. PHELAN, Sr. were interesting letters and documents expressing the loyalties of that Irish family in the regional affairs of their adopted country. The will and other papers were part of the Probate Court records [folder #1593, 1873] of the Memphis/Shelby County, Tennessee Archives. Interesting excerpts from some of the letters, the family line which stretches from Ireland to Memphis, Tennessee, and an abstract of the will are included.

The oldest letter in the file was written by Mrs. Eliza Jones Moore Phelan, wife of James Phelan, Sr. to her sister Mrs. Olivia Moore O'NEAL. It was dated two years after the birth of James B. Phelan, Jr.

"My dearest Sister,

Aberdeen, Miss., Apr 5th '58 [1858]

I have been intending for an age to write to you, & I deem no other apology necessary than to apprise you that my silence toward you, is never the result of forgetfulness or indifference. I do not believe a day ever passes over my head, that my thoughts do not wander away over the "Bear Creek" hills to the home of my dear precious Sister. Why is it, I often say to myself that relatives who love each other, can't as well settle in the same town or county, as hundreds of miles apart? If you & I could be divided but by one street, what a delight it would be, and with old Syd across the corner, it would render this earthly pilgrimage so Eden-like that I fear the Heavenly Canaan would not be so greatly longed after.

Mr. Phelan returned home in somewhat feeble health but has improved very much since he arrived. He told me about seeing you all & what a pleasant night he passed with you and Sis Let. . . .

My darling little Jamie had an attack of croup last night & is still quite hoarse, but I trust will not have a return of it to-night. I have been giving him Hive Syrup all [day] & I hope it will prevent a recurrence of the cough. He is sleeping sweetly & seems to breathe perfectly easy. . . . " [letter incomplete]

In an undated letter to his son, James Jr., who was staying with a Mr. ELLETT while attending school in Memphis, James Sr. expressed concern about the smallpox epidemic in the city. The following excerpt was found:

"Do not expose yourself in crowds, ask Mr. Ellett if he would not recommend that you quit school, to avoid a contact with boys so scattered about the city?

Katie will return with me--barring the smallpox. I expect to learn on Thursday; but cannot tell. You promised to write to me. I am sorry to see you so dull with the pen; and you indulge your dislike. If you will not compose for criticism, do so in secret only for your own eye. That will greatly improve you and soon enable you to develop the faculty of composition.

Remember me to Mr. Ellett & Mr. DAVIS. I miss the company of both of them, more than I am willing to declare. God bless you

Your aff. father, James Phelan"

Editor's note: James Jr. must have followed his father's advice since he later published three works. *On Phillip Massinger*, Doctoral Dissertation, 1878 from the University of Leipzig, Germany; *History of Tennessee*, 1888; and *School History of Tennessee*, 1889. He was also the president of the Memphis *Avalanche*, newspaper.

A one page letter, dated January 6, 1880, from James Phelan, Jr. to his brother denotes a rift between them. It is assumed the brother was George Richard.

"My dear Brother

I have just received your letter and answer instead of obeying your request to ignore it. If I were to give vent to my feelings, I should write what would permanently estrange us. I have no defenses to make against your charges, especially none against those which relate to my vanity. As regards my failure, I hope you are premature. I leave the decision to time. My only object in writing is to agree to your proposition never to refer to my future again. Until your last letter, I believed in the sincerity of your interest. I do not now, and when you give advice I should be looking for other things than kindly interest. My conceit is especially wounded that you should have mistaken my forbearance with a dying mother for obtuseness and stolidity. You have at last gone beyond bounds and from now on we occupy different relations.

Family all well. Sister Kate here. Have no idea for how long.

Your aff. bro. James Phelan"

On 6 Aug 1881, James Phelan, Jr. wrote again to his brother, George Richard.

"Dear Brother,

I returned to Memphis a few days ago to my regret a day after your departure. I wished to see you among other reasons to tell you of my engagement & approaching marriage. The young lady in question is Miss Mary EARLY, daughter of Dr. Robert Early of Lynchburg, Va. She lacks none of the requirements and will make no exception to the rule that we always marry the sweetest & liveliest women. You especially, I think will love her very much & I hope she may be able to gain some part of that brotherly affection that I tried to make my own I hope my marriage may tend slightly to restore our own relations to a little more pleasant footing.

Give Sis Julia my love and tell her I am sorry to have been so rude as to appropriate her satchel. I did not expect to remain away so long.

I was out at your house a few days ago & saw your little flock. I suppose Mrs. Hunt keeps you advised of how they fare. Also on my way from Va., I remained a few days in north Ala. with Cousin Nellie at the house of her father. She is improving, sent you many messages of affection & cheerfulness. Your own health I hope is improving also. Your confounded temper tho', I have ceased praying for

Very aff. your brother

James Phelan"

The Julia referred to in the letter was Julia HUNT Phelan, the wife of George.

A letter from Ellis Phelan, cousin of James Jr. included seven half-pages of genealogical data written by John Dennis Phelan, father of Dennis. That letter was dated January 14, 1890. Correspondence dated Feb 14, 1890 from John O'HART of Queen's University, Dublin, author of *Irish Pedigrees*, published in 1875, established the ancestor of the Phelan family line.

PHELAN FAMILY LINE

O'Hart wrote that the earliest records of the family date to the period of 1685-1688, when James II was king. Malachi Phelan was the brother of James Phelan,

Bishop of the ancient Kingdom [Diocese] of Ossory, Ireland. John O'HART stated that the "Felan" line included Phelan in Ireland and Whelen in England. The Sluigan line came from sluigain, which means neck of a bottle, and he remarked the "man must have had a long neck!" The Lalor name was included in the Lynch family.

Malachi PHELAN married _____ and they had a son named John. The son married Miss SLUIGAN of Clonmacnois Castle, King's Co Ireland. Their son, Dennis was born 10 Oct 1741, Maryborough, Queen's Co Ireland. He married Mary LALOR the daughter of Richard Lalor Jr. After Mary's death, Dennis came to America with his son John. Dennis died in 1793 at Petersburg, Va.

John Phelan was born 5 Sept 1769, Maryborough, Queen's Co [Leix], Ireland. He was Captain of the Irish Volunteers, and removed in 1793 to New York with his father and two sisters, not named. He clerked in a Manhattan bank, and was cashier in the Bank of New Brunswick, NJ. He then moved to Richmond, VA. After that he moved to Huntsville, AL where he married on June 8, 1808, a widow, Mrs. Priscilla Oakes (Ford) MORRIS. Priscilla born c1781 had three children by her first husband John Morris: Mary b 28 Jan 1802, John b 19 Mar 1804, and Priscilla b 21 Mar 1806. Priscilla Oakes Phelan was the niece of Sir Richard Oakes of Scotland. John and Priscilla Phelan had three sons: John Dennis b 23 Mar 1809, Joseph H. [no date given], and James B. Sr. b 11 Oct 1821. John Phelan died 16 May 1850 at Tuscaloosa, AL, aged 79. Mrs. Priscilla Phelan died 13 Sept _____ at the age of 78 at Montgomery AL.

John Dennis Phelan was an Attorney-General of AL in 1830. He was the Speaker of the House of Representatives in 1839, and served as a Judge of the Circuit Courts of Alabama and of the Supreme Court of that State 1841-1865. He was an editor in AL. John Dennis married 16 Apr 1835 a Miss Mary Ann HARRIS who was born 26 Apr 1815 in TN. They had twelve children, four of whom were Captains in the Alabama Volunteers of the Confederacy. The two oldest sons lost their lives in the conflict. The Phelans were very proud of their adopted country and fought to protect their homes and way of life. Mrs. Mary Harris Phelan died 22 May 1870 at Montgomery, AL, "full of faith and sweet composure." John Dennis died 10 Sept 1879. Their children:

1. Thomas was born 22 May 1836, at Huntsville, AL. He was a Captain Co A, 8th Reg AL Vol. He died 27 June 1862, leading a charge at Gaines Mill, Va.
2. Watkins was born 22 Feb. 1838, Captain Co F, 3rd AL Vol. He died 2 Apr. 1865, Petersburg, VA, "where Grant finally forced our line."
3. Dennis (dear Denny) born 12 Dec 1839, died 27 Apr 1855 at Marion, AL, "full of faith and hope"
4. John (Jack) born 22 Nov 1841, Capt Phelan's Battery. He married in 1873 Miss Anna O. SALE.
5. Ellis was born 11 Aug 1843, in Marion, AL Capt Co A, 45th AL, married first, 17 Jan 1870, Miss Amy S. HAWKINS. His second wife was Miss Mary A. FINSHI whom he married 19 Oct 1882.
6. Priscilla was born 22 Apr 1845 in Marion, AL. She married Dr. George R. WILLIAMSON of Nashville, TN.
7. Mary Harris was born 1 Aug 1847. She married R. L. WATT of Montgomery, AL.
8. Anna King was born 29 Sept 1849 and married J. C. DERBY.
9. Sidney Harris I was born 19 Aug 1851 and died 31 Aug 1851, in Blount Springs, AL.

10. Sidney Harris II was born 11 Feb 1853 in Blount Springs, AL, and married Palmer GRAHAM.

11. Caroline Blount was born 26 Aug 1855. She married J. D. BEALE.

12. James Lalor was born 13 Aug 1859 in Blount Springs, AL. He married Sally TANKERSLY and moved to San Angelo, TX.

Joseph H. Phelan, the second son of John and Priscilla (Ford) Phelan married Laura POWELL. They had three children: (1) Powell, (2) Sidney, and (3) Charles.

James B. Phelan, Sr. was born 11 Oct 1821. He was a lawyer and public printer of Alabama. He moved to homes in both Aberdeen, MS and Memphis, TN. He was a State Senator in Mississippi and a Confederate Senator from that state. His first wife, whom he married in 1847, was Miss Eliza Jones MOORE. She was born 9 Mar 1828 and was the daughter of Dr. Alfred Moore of Huntsville, AL. She was also the sister of Mrs. Olivia Moore O'NEAL, wife of E. A. O'Neal of Geneva, AL. Mrs. Eliza Phelan died October 1860. James B. Sr. then married Margaret W_____. No children were given for the second marriage.

Five children were listed from the marriage of James B. and Eliza Phelan. A name in parentheses (Erasmus) was listed after the five children with no explanation.

1. George Richard married Julia HUNT. They had three sons: (1) William Hunt baptized 5 Dec 1878, (2 and 3) Julian Edward and George R. Jr. baptized 14 June 1879. [Baptismal records from St. Peter's Catholic Church, Memphis, TN.] Mrs. Julia Phelan was listed as a widow of George R in the Memphis City Directory from 1882-1890, living at 287 Beale, the old numbering system. The Hunt-Phelan home is now listed as 533 Beale and dates to the 1830s. George was a lawyer in the firm of Phelan and Rhett.

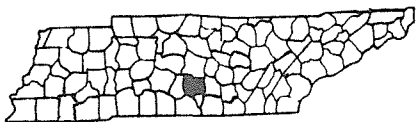
5. James B. Jr. was born 6 Dec 1856 in Aberdeen, MS. He became an author, Member of Congress, and he practiced law in Arkansas, Mississippi, and Tennessee. He was president of the Memphis *Avalanche*, a newspaper in 1890. His law office was at 56 Court. James Jr. married Mary EARLY the 15th of October 1881. They had two sons: James Phelan, III born 21 Feb 1883, and baptized 14 Jun 1883; and Robert Early born 11 Dec 1886, and baptized 21 Nov 1887. [Birthdates and baptismal records from St. Peter's Catholic Church, Memphis, TN.] Charles Dudley WARREN of Hartford, CT wrote James Jr. 27 Dec 1886 congratulating him and Mrs. Phelan on the birth of their son, Robert Early, admonishing that James "Try to keep him out of Congress and make a nice son of him." James B. Phelan, Jr. died in 1891.

OTHER FAMILY NAMES

Mark Moore of North Carolina was the father of John Moore.

John Moore was born 1 Jan 1758, Northampton, NC and was ordained by Bishop Asbury in 1784 as a Methodist preacher. John moved to Davidson Co, TN in 1807. In 1818 he moved to Limestone Co, AL where he died in his 95th year on 28 Apr 1852. He was the father of Dr. Alfred Moore.

Sydenham E. Moore, no dates given, was a Judge, Brigadier General, Member

BEDFORD COUNTY TENNESSEE DEEDS - 1808
*Abstracted from Tennessee State Library
 and Archives Microfilm - Record Book A*

Bedford County was cut from Rutherford County on 3 Dec 1807, and the Clerk, Thomas MOORE, was keeping his record book by 8 Feb 1808. Most of the land records had been in the legal process for twenty or more years, but when they lay within the new county they must be recorded there, therefore North Carolina and Tennessee land grants bear earlier dates. Deeds made prior to 1808 may refer to land as lying in Rutherford or Williamson County when actually it lies within the boundaries of the new county. Lincoln County was not cut from Bedford until 1809; therefore some of the land, referred to as lying in Bedford, then became a part of Lincoln. By 1836 Marshall and Coffee Counties had claimed some of Bedford, and in 1871 Moore County took another slice.

This area is described in the record book as Territory of the United States South of the River Ohio, Middle District; it is also in the Second Surveyor's District of Tennessee. North Carolina grants may refer to "our Middle District", and one 1808 record calls it Mero District. Thousands of acres in Bedford County were bought up by land speculators, absentee owners who never intended to settle there; but occasionally the survey of their grant refers to the Occupant Entry of someone who has already established a claim. Chain Carriers for the surveyor were frequently local young men, and there were enough permanent residents to warrant making a new county, so the abstract of Record Book A is important to persons researching the early Bedford County families.

In the following abstracts, all locations are in Tennessee and all persons are from Bedford County unless otherwise noted. Abbreviations used are: ack = acknowledged; A = acres; adj = adjoining/joins; beg. = beginning; B/S = Bill of Sale; C.C. = Chain Carriers; Co = County; P/A = Power of Attorney; pro = proven; R = Range; reg = registered; S = Section; trans = transferred; wit = witness.

- p. 1 - 10 Mar 1808: Robert BUCKHANNON of Williamson Co to John Buckhannon of Logan Co KY for \$1.00, 640 A of a 1280 A grant dated 17 Dec 1794. Wits: Jas OVERTON, William BLACK, Jas Buckhannon, Robt EDMUNDSON. Proven by Wm Black & Robert Edmundson. Thos MOORE, Clerk.
- p. 3 - 8 Feb 1808: Certification of Malcom GILCHRIST, Deputy Surveyor under Wm P ANDERSON, Surveyor General for the 2nd District of TN, that he surveyed a tract granted by North Carolina to John Gray & Thos BLOUNT...beginning at the mouth of Wartrace fork..."at a stone marked CB&CTP&P&D running thence west crossing The Garrison or fork of Duck river...crossing THOMPSON's Creek...Laben RICE/REED and Leas MCFADIN, Chain Carriers.
- p. 4 - 8 Mar 1808: Alexander OUTLAW of Jefferson Co to Benj BRADFORD of Bedford Co 770 A on Wartrace fork of Duck River...mentions CONWAY's southwest corner, KNOTT's line. Grant #222 was made by North Carolina to John Gray & Thos BLOUNT. Wits: Thos MOORE, Thimothy ONEAL, John DRAKE. Pro by ONEILL & Drake.
- p. 7 - 7 Mar 1808: Alexander OUTLAW of Jefferson Co to William KNOTT of Bedford Co 200 A on Wartrace of Duck River...mentions James NORVELL's corner. Wits: Benj BRADFORD, Wm Norvell, John Norvell. Pro by all wits.
- p. 9 - 3 May 1806: Alexander OUTLAW of Jefferson Co to Joseph AKE of Rutherford Co

- p. 15 - 27 Mar 1797: Amos BALCH of Logan Co KY to Thomas LOVE of Greene Co 1000 A "in the Middle District on the north side of Duck river above the mouth of Sugar Cr"...mentions William GILBREATH & Jeremiah CHAMBERLAIN's corner on Samuel PAT-TON's s w line, Robert HAYS corner. Wits: T S Phi Love, Andr BARNETT. On 7 Mar 1798 Philip Love made oath to Judge Archibald ROAN that Balch had signed the deed. A copy of the North Carolina Grant #23 dated 10 Jul 1788 to Amos Balch follows.
- p. 21 - 17 Dec 1794: NC Grant #320 to John EDMUNSON...by virtue of a Warrant from the North Carolina entry takers dated 3 May 1784, William BLANCK surveyed for John Edmunson Jr, 640 A on the south side of Elk River opposite an Indian camp near the lower end of Thomas Edmunson's purchase from Edward HARRIS. Thos Ed-mundson and David BUCKHANNON, C.C.
- p. 23 - 1 May 1806: Andrew JACKSON of Davidson Co to Charles HARRYMAN of same 640 A in Rutherford lying on the waters of the Wartrace fork of Duck River. Beginning at the southwest corner of a 1000 A tract sold by Andrew Jackson to Nathaniel HAYS, on which he is now living...mentions two Indian bark houses. Wits. John FIELD, John TATE. Ack by Andrew Jackson before Judge John OVERTON 19 Dec 1806.
- p. 26 - 10 Jul 1788: NC Grant #16 to George MARTIN, Richd. Martin, Amos BALCH & associates, 3234 A on the south side of Duck River and on both sides of Sugar Cr. ...mentions James BRATSHAW's, Charles McCOMMON's, Amos Balch's corner. Surveyed 5 Sep 1785 by R WEAKLEY; John FRAZIER & James RYLEY, C.C.
- p. 29 - 25 Oct 1802: NC Grant #391 to David JUSTICE, 2000 A on both sides of Duck River 3 or 4 miles above the mouth of Cainy Spring Creek. Begins "about two miles above the mouth of Rock Creek"...entered 29 Oct 1783, surveyed by Robert WEAKLEY 15 Aug 1790; Wm NASH & David Justice, C.C.
- p. 31 - 20 Apr 1808: TN Grant #149 to William HENRY and Thos EASTLAND, assignees of Henry M RUTLEDGE, 5000 A in Rutherford Co in Second Dist, R5,S2 on both forks of Mulberry Cr. of Elk River...surveyed 21 Sep 1807. Signed by Gov. John SEVIER.
- p. 33 - 17 Mar 1807: Alexander OUTLAW of Jefferson Co to George STRONG of Rutherford Co, 420 A in Rutherford Co on Wartrace Fork of Duck R....mentions KEER's corner... wits: Thos MOORE, John McCHANDAIN, John WHITEHEAD, Stephen [X] LEE...pro in Bed-ford Co court by Moore & Whitehead.
- p. 35 - 4 May 1806: Alexander OUTLAW of Jefferson Co to John WHITEHEAD of Rutherford

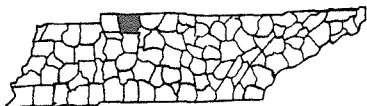

ABSTRACT OF THE WILL OF JAMES B. PHELAN SR

"I, James Phelan, of Shelby Co, Tenn. make this my last will and testament, revoking all others heretofore made. My son George R. Phelan not needing any portion of my estate, I do not will to him any portion of my estate."

James Phelan added that he bought with his own money the house and lot on Linden Street, where he resided at the time, for which he paid twelve thousand dollars, and spent three thousand dollars for furnishings. The title to the Linden property he had previously made to his present wife, Margaret W. Phelan. He further stated that he was "not in debt one hundred dollars." He named three children, Eliza M., Kate O., and James Jr. who were to receive \$7,000 each, and he directed that a gift also of \$7,000 was to be given his wife. The residue of the estate was to be divided equally among his wife and the three children named therein.

He named his partner, Henry T. ELLETT, executor

Signed 1st day of Dec 1872

VIRGINIA COUNTIES: THOSE RESULTING FROM VIRGINIA LEGISLATION by Morgan P. Robinson. 1992. (Reprint of 1916 edition) Hard cover. 283 pp. 6x9. Index. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc. 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202-3897. \$25.00 plus \$2.50 S&H. (MD residents add 5% sales tax, MI residents add 4% sales tax).

Complete with maps, charts, index, and a "Genealogical" section, this is clearly an authoritative account of the origin of Virginia counties. There are at present only about 100 counties in Virginia, but at least 172 counties were created at one time or another by Virginia legislation. Some counties fell into Kentucky and West Virginia, some became extinct, merged with other counties or changed their names. Published originally as a Bulletin of the Virginia State Library, this book has the correct facts, backed up with documentary evidence and a series of maps delineating the evolution of Virginia counties up to 1775.

WILLIAM NORVELL (1746-1794) OF HANOVER CO., VA., HIS FOREBEARS AND DESCENDANTS. Compiled and published by Lucy Harrison Miller Baber with Co-compilers Sargent Ward Braden and Jaquelin Ambler Nicholas Harvey. 1992. Hard Cover. 8½x11. 216 pp. Full name Index. Order from author, Westminster Canterbury, #0503, V.E.S. Road, Lynchburg, VA 24503. \$30.00 plus \$3.00 S&H.

This is a family book devoted to William Norvell who died in 1794, his eight children and their descendants. The author includes references to Norvell forebears, outlines, charts, and some pictures. The numbering system is straight forward and there is a great deal of information provided. It is unfortunate that the quality of the printing is erratic with some pages very dark and some very grey, but all are legible. The verification of death dates with a sampler is a unique and interesting facet of this work.

A HISTORY OF THE CHURCH OF SAINT ANDREW by Jane W. Barnett. 1991. Hard Cover. 6x9. 126 pp. Full name Index. Order from the author, 827 South Tree, Collierville, TN 38017. \$17.26 plus \$2.50 S&H.

It is said that as we grow older we are less concerned with where we are going and like to look back to see where we have been or where we came from. Dedicated to the children of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Collierville, Tennessee, this is a lovely look back over the past 100 years of the evolution of the building and the people of the congregation. The family charts, anecdotes and pictures add great interest to this chronicle.

JACKSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE WPA RECORDS by James L. Douthat. 1991. Paper back with spiral binding. 8½x11. 97 pp. Indexed. Order from Mountain Press, 4503 Anderson Pike, P.O. Box 400, Signal Mountain, TN 37377. \$20.00 plus \$2.50 S&H.

Works Project Administration papers, copied from court house records and collected during the late 1930's and early 1940's, had not been previously published when found in an attic in Chattanooga. They should be of great value to those interested in Jackson County, Tennessee. Family records, obituaries, cemetery records and many others are published exactly as found.

THE A-Z GUIDE TO TRACING ANCESTORS IN BRITAIN by Pauline Saul & F.C. Markwell. Fourth Edition 1992. Soft Cover. 5½x8½. 256 pp. Indexed. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc. 1001 N. Calvert St. Baltimore, MD 21202-3897. \$17.95 plus \$2.50 S&H.

Originally published by the Federation of Family History Societies in 1985, it was called "The Family Historian's Enquire Within." Arranged alphabetically, it contains definitions, explanations, bibliographies, sources, addresses, and signposts pointing to every conceivable topic that could be of interest to the family historian.

In addition to the basic glossary, many valuable appendices are included, as are explanations of those curious British terms one encounters in British research. What is the "Poor Law", Letters Patent, State Papers? What do the GRO and the CRO have in common? Why are market towns so important in your search for an elusive marriage record? With this book in your possession, answers to these questions and to hundreds of similar questions will be at your fingertips.

HOW TO WRITE AND PUBLISH YOUR FAMILY BOOK by Genealogy Publishing Service. Soft back. 8½x11. 59 pp. Table of Contents. Order from publisher, 448 Ruby Mine Road, Franklin, N.C. 28734. \$9.95.

Have you dreamed of writing your family book - and wondered how to start? The publisher of many

of our genealogy books has put together a "how-to" book with extensive helps for the novice. From a glossary of terms for printing, to selection of paper and type font, from outline to finance, all the knowledge that you did not know you needed is organized for you. This could be a helpful resource for any author.

LEWIS COUNTY, TENNESSEE, WPA RECORDS *Jessie Clinton, Typist. Soft back. 8½x11, 66 pp. Full name Index. Order from Mountain Press, P.O. Box 400, Signal Mountain, TN 37377-0400. \$15.00 plus \$2.50 S&H.*

Many files were left over upon the ending of the Works Progress Administration project. This particular group from Lewis County came to light in an attic in Chattanooga and have been carefully typed from the original hand-written pages, complete with some phonetic spelling. Included are Bible Records, cemetery lists and letters written home during the War Between the States. Many family names familiar to Lewis County residents are found in this small book. Although the material is presented in a straight forward manner, there is great charm in the stories contained in some of the Bible records, the letters sent home by soldiers and the story of Meriwether Lewis' death.

THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN TISDALE (1614-1675) Colonial Massachusetts by Robert L. Tisdale. 1981. Hard cover. 6x9, 237 pp. Full name Index. Order from the author, 5411 W. Willow Highway, Lansing, MI 48917. \$17.00.

The Tisdale name is derived from "The Tees River and the dale lands of County Durhamshire in northern England." This family history begins with John Tisdale, who was baptised at Ripon in 1614, and continues through twelve generations. Fourteen hundred twelve direct descendants plus some seven hundred eighty-seven allied families are listed in the 4,140 name index. A colored illustration of the family crest adds interest and value to the book. The registered and numbered history will be autographed upon request.

THE HISTORY OF BELLE MEADE MANSION, PLANTATION, AND STUD by Ridley Wills, II. 1991. Hard Cover. 6x9. 383 pp. Order from Vanderbilt University Press, Box 1813-Sta. B, Nashville, TN 37235 \$27.95

The story of Belle Meade - of the Harding and Jackson families that called it home - necessarily involves the countless lives of neighbors and houseguests, soldiers and civilians, statesmen and common citizens, prewar slaves and postwar workers. The events at Belle Meade reflected the larger events of Southern history taking place simultaneously. In telling the smaller story of one family, their home, and their plantation way of life, this book also tells the larger story, placing planter, mansion, plantation, and stud in a cultural-historical context of which Belle Meade was a highly reflective part.

MALONE FAMILY HISTORY Andrew Jackson Malone, John Wesley Malone and Their Descendants of Lincoln County, Tennessee, Madison County, Alabama, Oklahoma and Texas, 1840-1990 by Royleta C. Malone. 1991. The Malone brothers of the book title settled in Lincoln County, Tennessee in 1865, after both had served the Confederacy for Alabama. The book includes copies of their war records, pictures, newspaper articles, marriage licenses and histories of many of the family members. A numbered and dated ten page descendency chart is included.

MY FINDINGS - VOLUME II by Lillian Brown-Johnson. 1991. Hard cover. 8½x11. 327 pp. Full name Index. Order from author, 200 E. Webster, #1115, Madison, TN 37115. \$40.00 plus \$2.50 S&H.

Many of the families portrayed in this volume resided at one time or another in Bedford County, TN, where court house records are very scarce. Listed are over forty family patriots from the French and Indian War to Vietnam. Major families include: Adams, Brown, Chamberland, Coble, Cunningham, Dickson, Dixon, Galbreath, MacLean, McAdams, McKamie, Smith, Troxler, Wallace, Whitsett and others. The book is divided into family sections and includes many family photographs.

The author's 1985 New Year's resolution was to devote that year to "write up" both of her parents' lineage. That innocent resolution led her in many directions and this big beautiful, gold lettered book is the result. The families allied to the Maidens and named in the sub-title are given in detail. Some information is also supplied on the Bickley, Biemesderfer, Dale, Day, Davison, Heussler, Manje, Van Liew, Vigne and Warthman families. The book is pleasant and easy to read and includes approximately 150 pictures, illustrations and maps. There is a master 13-generation pedigree diagram tying all lines together, three-generation diagrams at the beginning of most chapters, footnotes, and a three thousand name index.

SAMUEL MCGUIRE (1792-1858) OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AND DESCENDANTS by Lyle Keith Williams. 1991. Soft cover. 8½x11. 153 pp. Full name Index. Order from the author, 5000 Rock River Drive, Ft. Worth, TX 76103. \$17.95 prepaid.

Samuel McGuire was born in Pennsylvania, migrated to Illinois from Kentucky and married Nephany (Jackson) Farris, with whom he had eight children. This genealogy was written primarily for the benefit of their descendants. There are family outlines, stories and clearly reproduced pictures. Mr. Williams has done an excellent job of presenting the descendants of Samuel McGuire, any one of which would probably treasure this book.

Few objects possess the ability to transcend time as old photographs do. They are our single, most immediate link to the past, outliving memory and closing the distance of years. Though the streets still remain, many of the houses in which our ancestors resided have fallen victim to time. Photographs alone have endured. The challenge of identifying old family photographs is an intriguing puzzle that can be solved by following certain steps. Not only are these steps outlined in clear, concise detail, but much valuable information is given for the labeling and care of modern photographs. This is an interesting and valuable resource, well presented by an experienced genealogist.

1850 CENSUS OF ROWAN COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA: A Genealogical Compilation of All Six Schedules by Jo White Linn, C.G., C.G.L. 1992. Soft cover. 8½x11. Surname Index, 158 pp. Order from Rowan County Register, P.O. Box 1948, Salisbury, NC 28145-1948. \$26.00 postpaid. North Carolina residents add 6% sales tax unless exempt).

Selected statistics of genealogical value from the slave, agriculture, and manufacturing schedules are included with the household as shown in the population schedule. Editor's notes also include marriage bonds, parentage, citations of wills, and other details for many households. This format was selected because the editor would prefer to have all the information with the household when she is using the census rather than looking through six schedules separately. One could very quickly get spoiled with this system - would that it be available for all census!

The mortality schedule is presented separately along with some death dates from the Carolina Watchman and cemetery records. A description of each of the special schedules follows the population and mortality schedules.

A desk-top family reference for current and future generations, this newly published book is the history of James Martin and Sarah Cunningham of Warren County, Tennessee, and their descendants (1794-1991). Included are these allied families: Burnett, Dodson, Killingsworth, Lewis, Manire, Scoggin, Shipley, Stanley and Woodlee. Large, clear print, a generous supply of clearly printed pictures and an efficient and easily understood numbering system make this book a joy to use.
